 - 4. Should the collaborative activities arising from this Memorandum result in any potential for intellectual property, both parties shall seek an equitable and fair understanding as to ownership and other property interests that may arise.
 - Promotion of Joint Research Events: The two universities will promote collaborative research events including conferences, lectures and seminars, which will be conducted when the staffs of each institution find these mutually beneficial.
 - 6. Grant of scholarships: The two universities through their knowledge partners (where relevant) may grant scholarships to the students in their respective relevant domains for study in their constituent or affiliated colleges (where relevant). The terms of specific areas of cooperation shall be agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of any particular activity. Any specific programme shall be subject to mutual consent, availability of funds, and a budget approved by both parties.

- iii. Financial obligations for programs and exchanges will be discussed and agreed upon by both parties in each case and outlined in contract agreements
- iv. This agreement may be terminated by mutual consent. If termination occurs, the programs or exchanges in progress will continue until completed.

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- The details of each article of this agreement will be provided in other Memoranda of Understanding or contract agreements
- This agreement will be executed in English and each party will retain a copy of each version.



 - c) Exchange of information and publication on education and research
 - d) Implementation of cooperative education and research

2. Implementation

- a) In order to carry out the above-mentioned activities, detailed plans of the academic cooperation, strategies for the interactions, and mechanisms leading to the exchange of students and personnel shall be formed through consultation between the two institutions and expressed in academic agreements.
- b) Both institutions shall agree to seek financial support for the mutually agreed cooperative activities defined in the above from appropriate agencies of their respective government and other agencies.
- c) This Agreement will be effective for five (5) years after the date of signing. This Agreement is renewed automatically as long as neither party gives notice of termination to the other.
- d) The notice of termination of this Agreement needs to be given six (6) months in advance.

3. Confidential Information

Each party shall, at all times during the term of this Agreement and for a period of five (5) years after, keep confidential any confidential information received from the other party. Such confidential information will not be disclosed to any person, other than employees who need to know for the purpose of performing their functions, without the consent of the owner of the confidential information.

4. Return of Confidential Information

Upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, the parties shall return all confidential information to the owner.

5. Cooperative Research and Intellectual Property

Either party to this Agreement may propose to the other specific individual research projects for collaboration. Such proposals may be made at any time and an individual project agreement will be drafted for each research project. The protection and exploitation of any valuable intellectual property arising out of a research project will be addressed in each individual project agreement.

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TWO-WAY STUDENT LINKAGE AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY

AND

DONGGUK UNIVERSITY, KOREA

In the context of the Agreement to expand general academic cooperation, Punjab Technical University and Dongguk University hereby agree to the following Student Linkage arrangements to allow students from the home institution to study at the host institution and to enhance the educational experience in accordance with the principles and guidelines set forth below.

In the context of the student linkage agreement, the "home institution" will mean the institution in which a student is formally enrolled as a degree candidate, and the "host institution" will mean the institution that has agreed to receive student from the home institution for a period of study on a non-degree basis.

STUDENT LINKAGE CRITERIA

It is agreed that:

- 1. Students from home institution will attend an exchange programme at host institution, but will not study for a degree at host institution. Any home institution student may participate in the program. Host institution will not accept guest students from home institution except under the provisions of this Agreement.
- 2 On successfully completing any such program at host institution, participating students will normally qualify for credits towards their degrees at home institution. It will be the responsibility of each participating student to obtain official approval for such credits in advance.
- 1 Home institution students will study in host institution for a year. In addition, short-term exchange programs can be held during vacation. Before commencing their studentship, students may enrol in the host institution Language Centre's summer program.
- Students applying for the program will first be screened for eligibility by home institution. Home institution will liaise with host institution on admission requirements and enrolment constraints. Host institution will have final authority on admission decisions.
- Participating students will register at host institution as visiting students and will be exempted from paying tuition and fees at host institution.

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- Beginning in 2012 and continuing for each year during the term of this Two-Way Linkage Agreement, home institution will send to host institution up to Three (3) students annually. However, the number of students for short-term program will be decided after the two institutions take into consideration its purpose, curricular and other conditions. The number of students can be . extended upon agreement by both institutions.
- 7. Neither host institution nor home institution will be responsible for the costs of housing, board, travel, extracurricular fees, or other personal expenses, including books. Participating students will meet these costs from own funds.
- 8. Home institution will provide academic counselling to participating students, and so will ensure that the academic work that home institution students undertake at host institution is acceptable to home institution. Host institution staff will liaise closely with home institution colleagues in order to facilitate this process. Participating students will be responsible for supplying their programme of work to home institution.
- 9. Participating students will be governed by the same regulations and performance standards that pertain to other students at host institution.
- 10. Academic achievement reports will be sent to home institution at the conclusion of each term, not later than six weeks after the last day of term.
- 11. Host institution will assist participating students in securing suitable accommodation during their stay in host institution.
- 12 To the fullest extent possible, host institution will assist its participating students in obtaining visas and other documents required by the country of host institution.
- 13. In the event host institution pays the cost of immediate necessary emergency services to a participating student, home institution will reimburse host institution for such expenditures. Host institution will, if necessary, cooperate with home institution in obtaining repayment from the student or the student's insurance.
- 14. Monetary consideration exchanged between the two institutions will be limited to the extent provided for in this Agreement. There shall be no indemnities, reimbursements for expenses, or sharing of fees or profits arising from the linkage, except as provided for under Provision 16.
- Host institution reserves the right to require the withdrawal of any student whose academic standing or conduct warrants such action. Host institution will consult with home institution before finalising such action.
- 16. The parties agree to indemnify and hold one another harmless from any and all claim by participating students, their parents, survivors, or agents, arising from any negligent acts or omission on the part of either institution or any of their employees. The relationship of home institution and host institution under this Agreement shall be that of independent contractors, and a party shall not be deemed, nor hold itself out as being, a partner or agent of the other party. Neither host institution nor home institution shall be liable for acts of the other,

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- 17. Both institutions subscribe to a policy of equal opportunity and will not discriminate on the basis of race, gender, age, marital status, ethnicity, religion, national origin or handicap.
- 18. This agreement is valid for a period of five years from the effective date and may be renewed automatically, unless written notice is issued from either university . concerning revision or termination of the Agreement at least 6 months prior to the expiration of the Agreement.

PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, JALANDHAR, established by an Act of State Legislature, on the 16th of January 1997 for the promotion of the Technical education (herein after referred to as "PTU", which expression shall include its successor (s), administrator(s) or permitted assignees) of the first part. The University has a mandate to set up centers of Excellence in Emerging Technology (ics) and for promoting *Training, Research & Development* in the field of the applied sciences and technology. The University is well competently working for providing professional & skill oriented knowledge to the masses. PTU is also promoting a number of courses in different streams in both, regular as well as distance education programs.

AND

ASB Industries, Inc., Obio, USA, is a leading single-source provider of cold spray and thermal spray industrial coating services. Since 1946, it has been helping its customers to improve the efficiency and working life of their parts and equipment. (Hereinafter collectively referred to as "ASB" which expression shall include its successors-in-interest, permitted assignees and associate companies) of the second part.

Both PTU and ASB shall individually and collectively be referred to as "Party"/"Parties.

WHEREAS:

A. PTU is a Premier University engaged in education and research in science, pharmaceuticals chemistry, molecular biology, biotechnology, engineering technology, industrial technology, management, information technology, environment, planning, architecture and paramedical sciences.

ASB is a leading single-source provider of cold spray and thermal spray industrial coatings services and have its company based at ASB Industries, Inc., 1031, Lambert St.Barberton, Ohio 44203-1689

PREAMBLE

PTU and ASB are mutually interested to collaborate in academic and research related activities especially in the areas of Mechanical Engineering.

DEFINITIONS:

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"Intellectual property (IP)" means any know how, inventions, developments, discoveries, improvements, processes, compositions of matter, formulations, or methods of use, conceived or reduced to practice.

"Public Disclosure" means disclosure of IP or Know-How, as defined herein, to anyone who is not part of the PTU or ASB teams associated with work being done under the scope of the Agreement.

"Commercialization" means and includes manufacturing, marketing, promoting, selling and distributing the know-how by utilization of IPR, including making arrangements of any and all kinds with any entity or entities anywhere in the world including sub-licensing in respect to the know-how.

SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT AND OBJECTIVES 1.

The scope of collaboration on academic and research activities included in this General Agreement encompasses the following objectives:

- i. Enrollment of ASB scientist(s)/ employee(s) in a Ph. D program at PTU, as part-time students as per the PTU rules.
- ii. Exchange of graduate and postgraduate students of PTU in the disciplines of Mechanical Engineering for project work/training at ASB.
- iii. Sponsorship and pooling of resources for co-operative seminars, workshops and other scientific meetings on topics of mutual interest, as and when deemed feasible.
- iv. Exploring the possibilities of carrying out sponsored research project.
- v. Joint supervision of Ph.D students at PTU.
- vi. Assisting in the development of curriculum of Mechanical Engineering courses according to industrial/research lab requirements in order to make student more employable.
- vii. Enrollment of scientists of ASB as supervisors to guide Ph.D students at PTU.

EXCHANGE OF ASB SCIENTISTS FOR Ph. D PROGRAM (S) 2.

- i. Both the parties will consider working together in areas of mutual interest.
- ii. In the event both parties agree to work together; the concerned scientists of ASB and the corresponding faculty members of PTU will formulate joint Research Plan (s) for the joint work on a "case by case" basis, with due approval of the Steering Committee.
- iii. At any given time not more than 5 scientists of ASB will be registered for the Ph.D. program at PTU.
- iv. Requirement for enrolment/registration for Ph. D program for ASB scientists at PTU will be as per the ordinance for the doctor of philosophy program of the PTU.
- v. The supervisor for ASB scientists enrolling/registering for the Ph. D will be from PTU. However, there can be a co-supervisor from ASB, subject to fulfillment of the requirements of the ordinance (s) for the Doctor of Philosophy at PTU.
- vi. PTU shall provide experienced faculty for conducting the Ph. D program, conduct and monitor the research programs, carry out performance evaluation as per its Ph. D program. All/any examination (s) to be conducted by PTU shall be in the same manner as that carried out for other Ph.D. students admitted by PTU. The Ph. D. Degree shall be awarded by PTU.
- vii. PTU shall provide accommodation and other facilities for visiting Ph. D. students of required to pay actual boarding, lodging, electricity and other applicable charges, as per Miden CK PTU's rules.

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PTU will provide boarding and lodging facilities for the visiting official/s of ASB at its campus.

Selection of candidates for Ph. D Program would be as follows:

- Candidates sponsored by ASB will be registered for Ph. D as per the Ph.D. admission norms of PTU.
- The eligible applicants will submit their application/s as per the Ph.D. rules & regulations of PTU.
- The admission of the candidate would be through the recommendation by the admission committee at PTU along with an external guide from ASB.
- The recommendations of the admission committee shall be forwarded for the approval and further necessary action as required at PTU rules. Time to time the Supervisor from ASB will interact with the supervisor from PTU, in order to review the progress of the candidate (s).
- The approved candidates then would be required to pay admission fees (prevailing fees payable at PTU) as given in the rules and regulation for Ph.D.: to PTU to formally register for the Ph. D. programs of PTU.
- The report on the progress of the candidate (s) shall be submitted along with recommendations to PTU.
- All other rules and regulations of PTU for its Ph.D. programs, as stated in Rules & Regulations for the Ph.D. program, shall be applicable to the Ph. D. students at ASB.

3. EXCHANGE OF PTU STUDENTS/ TECHNICAL STAFF/ FACULTY MEMBERS

- i. ASB agrees to provide training to students, and occasionally to staff and/or technical personnel of PTU within the areas of mutual co-operation.
- At any given time not more than 3 selected students of PTU will be taken up for summer/industrial training at ASB.
- The duration of training period for PTU students at ASB will preferably be for either Short (6 weeks) or Long (3 to 6 months).
- The technical staff/faculty members deputed by PTU for training shall be governed by ASB rules of conduct.
- v. Research Exchange: In this scheme the PTU students will visit ASB for six weeks, get his/her specimens sprayed with all the spray process ASB have and will return back to PTU to analyze the specimens.
- vi. Industrial Training: In this scheme the students will learn all the aspects of thermal spray job shop at ASB. The duration of this training program will be of six months.
- vii. Students/staff/faculty undergoing training at ASB will execute an individual Confidentiality Agreement with ASB and PTU will take reasonable measures in order to ensure that the terms of Confidentiality Agreement are duly implemented and adhered to.

4. JOINT CONFERENCE/ WORKSHOPS/ COURSES

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i. Both the parties agree to consider the possibility of holding/conducting joint workshops, conferences, training courses etc., within the areas of mutual co-

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operation, whenever feasible.

ii. The host institution shall provide accommodation to the participating members.

5. ASB; SPONSORED PROJECT (S)

- ASB will consider carrying out Sponsored Research Project(s) with PTU in arcas of mutual interest, as and when deemed feasible.
- ii. In the event, parties agree to work on any sponsored project(s); the terms of the same will be negotiated and laid forth in a separate Agreement; on a "project by project" basis.

6. SHARING OF FACILITIES

 Host institute/industry will allow members of the visiting institute/industry to use their resources, such as library, R&D facilities and reagents/chemicals; provided there is no legal or third party restriction of such use.

7. AREAS OF CO-OPERATION

SB INDUSTRIES, INC., OHIO, USA

- i. The specifics regarding the areas of co-operation will be defined and modified from time to time by the Joint Steering Committee (JSC) set up for the purpose.
- Vice President, ASB or his nominee shall be the coordinator from ASB for each identified area of co-operation. The Vice President, ASB may nominate more than one coordinator.
- iii. The coordinator from PTU for each identified area of co-operation shall be the Head of the concerned department at PTU.
- iv. ASB will provide inputs from industry perspective for up gradation and updation of Master and Bachelor course (s) in Mechanical Engineering at PTU.

8. JOINT STEERING COMMITTEE (JSC)

- The following will constitute the Joint Steering Committee, to monitor and review the collaborative program(s) between the two institutions:
- a) Vice-Chancellor, PTU or his nominec.
- b) Vice President, ASB or his nominee.
- c) Coordinators from PTU and ASB.
 - ii. The JSC shall:
 - Review the progress of the identified program (s) (at least once in a year)
 - b) Consider the new R&D proposals for joint collaboration.
 - c) Consider the addition/deletion of areas of co-operation between the two institutions.

9. CONFIDENTIALITY

The parties agree that with respect to any business information of the Disclosing Party which is (a) marked as "confidential," "proprietary" or some similar indication; (b) is advised by the Disclosing Party to be confidential; or (c) which the parties would (collectively referred to as "Confidential Information").

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The party receiving the Confidential Information shall be referred to as the "Receiving Party" and the party disclosing the Confidential Information shall be referred to as the "Disclosing Party".

The Receiving Party hereby agrees to keep confidential, any Confidential Information provided by the Disclosing Party to the Receiving Party pursuant to this Agreement. Such Confidential Information shall be treated in the strictest confidence and shall not be disclosed by the Receiving Party to any Third Party and shall only be used for the proper performance of this Agreement and shall be treated as confidential for the duration of this Agreement and for a period of 5 years after its termination.

Confidential Information does not include information that: is or comes into the public domain otherwise than by breach of this Agreement by either party; is made known to the Receiving Party by a Third Party having the legal right to make such disclosure, or is independently developed by the Receiving Party without any aid of the Confidential Information of the Disclosing party.

10. PUBLICATIONS AND PATENTS

- All publications in the programs of co-operation shall be co-authored by the concerned scientist (s) of ASB and the Research Fellow/Faculty of PTU.
- ASB and PTU will be joint holders of the Intellectual Property Right (IPR)/ Patents arising out of any joint work.
- ii. ASB will have the first right of refusal for commercialization if any, of such joint IPRs.
- v. In the event the JSC decides that the joint IP may have some commercialization potential; ASB will have no obligation to commercialize it in case it deems such joint IP to be detrimental to its internal product(s)/ project(s)/ portfolio of program(s).

11. PUBLIC DISCLOSURE

In case of any joint research and/or sponsored project (s) taken up by ASB and PTU, no party shall disclose any part of the investigation in media in any form without any prior mutual, written consent.

12. DURATION OF AGREEMENT AND TERMINATION

i This General Agreement is effective from the date of approval/ ratification by the appropriate officer of each signatory.

ii This General Agreement may be amended at any time by mutual consent and shall continue in force and effect for three years and can be extended by mutual consent of both parties.

iii Participants from each of the parties, while in attendance at the other party's facilities, shall abide by the rules and regulations of that host institution/industry regarding the use of facilities and conduct, and shall be subject to the laws of the host industry/ institute.

In the event of material breach or default of any provisions of this Agreement, the non-breaching party will be entitled to call upon the defaulting party to rectify such breach or default within a period of 30 days from the date of such notice. In the event of failure on the part of the defaulting party to remove or rectify such breach or default, the Agreement shall stand terminated at the end of such notice period.

- iv. Any waiver of any breach of, or any default under, any of the terms of this Agreement will not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach or default and will in no way affect the other terms of this Agreement.
- Nothing in this Agreement shall create or be deemed to create a partnership, agency or joint venture between the parties.



- 7. Each university shall have the permission in advance from the host university when the home university selects its own exchange student(s).
- 8. Each exchange student shall be responsible for his/her medical and other forms of personal insurance.
- 9. This memorandum will become effective on the date of its signature and remain in effect for five years from the date it is signed. The validity of the memorandum may be extended when mutually agreeable to both parties.
- 10. Amendments to and termination of the memorandum must be done by a written agreement between National Taipei University of Technology and Punjab Technical University.





Agreement Details to be developed:

A. Co-operation on academic programs and pathways;

YU and IKGPTU agree to work towards an articulation agreement comprised of the following: An articulation from IKGPTU's Bachelor of Business Administration courses into YU's BBA Specializations. The goal is to create a seamless pathway for graduates and Alumni of IKGPTU into YU's BBA Specializations with credits that YU can grant for the courses completed at IKGPTU including what would be left to complete at YU (the residency requirement, which is a minimum of 60 credits). The articulation agreement may include special financial incentives such as (waiving of the application fee, a scholarship or bursary, or other incentives devised for such a pathway). An additional articulation of the BBA Degree courses of IKGPTU into YU's BBA General program (expected to be approved by DQAB in Fall of 2018.

B. Joint Marketing Activities

The development of joint marketing activities including Recruitment Fairs, Open Houses, Agent Nights, etc, YU and IKGPTU will work cooperatively so that YU's marketing team has access to IKGPTU campuses, Alumni and graduating students at specially created events and marketing initiatives so that students interested in transferring to YU are aware of the entrance requirements, courses, process, start dates, costs, etc. YU wants to be seen as a valued partner of IKGPTU and will focus on building this relationship through marketing, Open Houses and Agent Nights on a regular basis (such as every 6 to 8 weeks) are held so that students and agents are completely aware of all requirements.

C. Facilitate, University staff exchanges or mutual visits to both institutions;

Both YU and IKGPTU will work cooperatively to share staff expertise if required and conduct mutual visits to continue to build relationships with key staff and may look at offering courses at each other's facilities for the benefit of both schools and students.

D. International student training and development including student transfers;

Workshops, Open Houses, and Activities to develop student transfers to both YU and IKGPTU will be developed. Such activities may include joint ESL workshops for students needing extra help. It may include joint writing workshops by both staff and faculty of each school as an example or it might include the development of a bursary program for certain markets or for a certain period to help with joint recruitment and transfers.

E. Exchange of information, including the results of teaching and research collaboration;

From time-to-time, YU and IKGPTU agree to share information, teachers/administrators or research to help each other with issues or to illustrate to DQAB how institutions can partner for the benefit of students and staff. It could be as simple as sharing of marketing information in a particular country, offering a joint meeting to a foreign delegation, or be as comprehensive as jointly developing a conference for the benefit of teachers/faculty and involve scholarly activity beneficial to one or both parties.

F. Other activities viewed to be mutually beneficial. From time to time, YU and IKGPTU may collaborate on any activity designed to deepen the relationship to the benefit of both parties.

3.2. The designated Liaison Officers for the Agreement are:

- 4.1. Each Home Institution will send up to 1 Full Time Equivalent (FTE) to the Host Institution each Academic Year commencing with the 2018-2019 Academic Year. This number may be changed by the mutual consent of the two Parties.
- 4.2. For the purpose of accounting and managing the flow of Exchange Students each Exchange Student registered at the Host Institution shall be counted as one "Unit of Exchange" (0.5FTE) when attending part of or an entire normal academic term, or two "Units of Exchange" (1.0 FTE) when attending for a normal Academic Year. The

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Liaison Officers of the two institutions shall review the program annually to determine any imbalance in the FTE student count, and adjust the numbers of students exchanged to maintain a reasonable balance in the Exchange. The balanced is reached by an average number of students of each side, or the payment of the differences in tuition and international fees to the Host Institution by the Home institution.

- 4.3. The Home Institution shall nominate students (a "Nominated Student") for Exchange at the Host Institution who meet the following criteria:
 - Nominated Students shall be registered in a program of study at the Home Institution;
 - Nominated Students shall have an above average academic performance record at the Home Institution;
 - Nominated Students shall meet the language proficiency requirements of the Host Institution, which is to be communicated by the Liaison Officers each year;
 - d Nominated Students proposed programme of studies at the Host Institution shall be approved by the Host Institution.
- 4.4. Liaison Officers at the Home Institution shall submit Nominated Student applications to the Liaison Officer at the Host Institution no later than Host Institutions published deadline.

Nominated Student applications from the IKGPTU must be received by Concordia no later than May 1st for Nominated Students intending to commence studies at Concordia in the Fall (September) or October 1st for the Winter Term (January).

Nominated Student Applications from Concordia must be received by IKGPTU no later than 15th July.

4.5. Should either party to the Agreement wish to amend the application deadline as noted in paragraph 4.4, they shall advise the other party in writing of the new deadline and shall provide at least six (6) weeks notice of such change.

- 5.2 Exchange Students shall pay to the Home Institution full tuition and other required fees for the period of the Exchange in accordance with the fee payment schedule of the Home Institution.
- 5.3. Exchange Students shall not be required to pay any tuition, non-instructional or mandatory fees at the Host Institution for the period of the Exchange, regardless of where the fees are assessed, unless agreed upon in advance or otherwise noted in this Agreement (cf. point 4.2)
 - All visiting Exchange Students at Concordia who are not Canadian citizens or who are not permanent residents of Canada and therefore do not have public health care coverage from one of the provinces of Canada shall participate in the Concordia Health Insurance Plan and pay the required premiums to Concordia.

6. EXCHANGE STUDENT GENERAL TERMS

- 6.1. No Exchange Student shall have a term at the Host Institution which exceeds either two terms or the equivalent of one Academic Year.
- 6.2. Any extension of the Exchange beyond the number of Units of Exchange that were originally agreed on in regards to the specific Exchange Student shall be approved in writing by the Liaison Officer from each of Concordia and the IKGPTU.
- 6.3. The Host Institution shall provide the Exchange Student with an official transcript of his or her academic record as soon as possible after the completion of that student's Exchange. Exchange Students at Concordia must formally request that the Registrar's Office forward copies of their transcript to their Home Institution; transcripts will not be sent without the consent of the Exchange Student.
- 6.4. Exchange Students shall be considered non-degree seeking Students by the Host Institution, and:
 - Concordia shall provide visiting Exchange Students participating in an undergraduate program with a designation of visiting student;
 - IKGPTU shall provide visiting Exchange Students with a designation of visiting students.



- Nottingham Trent University of 50 Shakespeare Street, Nottingham, NG1 4FQ, United Kingdom ("NTU");
- (2) **I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University** of Jalandhar- Kapurthala Highway, Kapurthala-144603, Punjab, India ("IKGPTU"); and

Also herein after referred to as the Parties.

1. Aims

1.1 The Parties wish to explore further opportunities for collaboration in teaching and research. The aim of this Memorandum is to provide a framework within which the Parties will seek to develop a long-term collaborative relationship.

2. Status of this Memorandum

2.1 Other than paragraphs 6, 7 and 8, this Memorandum is not intended to be and is not legally binding. If, as a result of further discussion, the Parties agree to collaborate in any of the activities anticipated in this Memorandum, the Parties shall enter into a formal and legally binding agreement, setting out the rights and obligations of each party in relation to that activity.

3. Areas of potential collaboration

- 3.1 Subject to paragraph 3.2, the Parties will explore opportunities for potential collaboration in the following areas:
- (a) exchange of information on course development and teaching methods;
- (b) exchange of staff and students;
- (c) development of joint research projects;
- (d) development of progression routes from courses of IKGPTU to courses leading to awards of NTU;
- (e) any other areas which may promote the academic interests of the Parties in research and/or teaching.
- 3.2 The development of a collaborative relationship between the Parties is subject to:

- (a) the approval of the relevant authorities of both NTU and IKGPTU. In particular, approval by NTU of IKGPTU as a collaborative partner and approval of any courses leading to awards of (or credit towards an award of) NTU is subject to the procedures set out in NTU's Academic Standards and Quality Handbook; and
- (b) obtaining all necessary or advisable governmental, regulatory or other relevant approvals, consents or licences.

4. Financial implications

4.1 Each party shall be responsible for its own costs incurred in connection with this Memorandum. NTU and IKGPTU shall, where possible, explore opportunities for external funding of the collaborative activities anticipated in this Memorandum.

5. Exchange of information

5.1 Each party will exchange information with the other with a view to understanding whether it would be effective and practical for the institutions to work together.

6. Confidentiality

6.1 This Memorandum and any information provided in connection with it may not be disclosed to any third party other than (a) the parties' professional advisers; (b) as required by law or a relevant regulatory authority; (c) with the prior written consent of the other party; or (d) where the information has come into the public domain through no fault of the party wishing to disclose it.

7. Intellectual Property

7.1 Unless agreed otherwise in writing, any Intellectual Property rights belonging to the Parties, whether in existence at the date of this Memorandum or created during the course of it, shall belong to the respective Parties.

8. Publicity

- 8.1 The Parties will not include the name or logo of the other Party in any advertising or publicity material without the prior approval of the other Party on a case-bycase basis.
- 8.2 Neither Party will do anything which, in the reasonable opinion of the other, would damage the other's reputation and/or business.

9. Disputes

- 9.1 The Parties shall attempt to resolve in good faith any dispute arising between them out of the operation of this Memorandum. If the dispute cannot be resolved informally, it shall be referred to the Pro Vice-Chancellor International, of NTU and the Vice-Chancellor of IKGPTU.
- 9.2 In the event of any dispute regarding the performance of NTU's obligations under this Agreement the governing law shall be England. In the event of any dispute regarding the performance of PTU's obligations under this Agreement the governing law shall be India.
- 9.3 Any dispute arising out of the operation of this Memorandum shall be finally settled by arbitration under the Rules of Arbitration and Conciliation of the

International Chamber of Commerce by two or more arbitrators appointed under those rules. The place of arbitration shall be London and the language of the proceedings shall be English.

10. Duration, termination and review

- 10.1 This Memorandum shall commence on the date set out on the first page and shall continue for a period of 3 years. It may be extended by the written agreement of both Parties.
- 10.2 Either Party may terminate this Memorandum at any time by giving to the other not less than 6 months' notice in writing, or with immediate effect by written notice if the other Party fails to comply with its obligations under this Memorandum. - I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University Jalandhar of Ibban, Kapurthala-144603, Kapurthala, Punjab, INDIA ("IKGPTU"

Individually a "Party" and together "the Parties"

1. Background

- 1.1 NTU is a higher education corporation incorporated in the United Kingdom under the Education Reform Act 1988.
- 1.2 IKGPTU is a State Technical University Est. under Punjab Technical University Act, 1996 (Punjab Act No. 1 of 1997).
- 1.3 NTU and IKGPTU have agreed to enter into an arrangement on the terms set out in this Agreement whereby students of IKGPTU who successfully complete certain courses at IKGPTU are eligible for entry to the start of a specified NTU course.

2. Interpretation

2.1 In this Agreement the following words and expressions have the following meanings, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Academic a year beginning on 1 September of any calendar year and Year" ending on 31 August of the following calendar year;

"Confidential all secret or confidential commercial, financial and technical information" all secret or confidential commercial, financial and technical information, know-how, trade secrets, inventions, computer software and any other information in any form or medium, whether disclosed orally or in writing, together with all reproductions in any form or medium, and any part(s) of it;

"Force any event outside the reasonable control of either Party Majeure" affecting its ability to perform any of its obligations (other than payment) under this Agreement;

"IKGPTU the IKGPTU course or courses as set out in Schedule 1, as Course" amended and restated from time to time.

"Intellectual all inventions, patents, trade marks, registered designs and Property" any pending applications for any of the foregoing, unregistered design rights arising at common law, design rights, copyrights (including future copyrights), database

rights, know-how, trade secrets, Confidential Information and any other intellectual property rights;

- "NTU Course" the NTU course or courses set out in Schedule 1, as amended and restated from time to time;
- "Progress" progression by a Student from a IKGPTU Course to the start of a NTU Course, and "Progression" shall be construed accordingly;
- "Student" a student or students registered on the IKGPTU Course;
- 2.2 The headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and do not affect its interpretation.
- 2.3 References to clauses or schedules are references to clauses or schedules of this Agreement.
- 2.4 References to any statutory or other legislative provision shall be interpreted as a reference to that provision from time to time amended, extended or reenacted.
- 2.5 References to any governmental, regulatory or other similar body shall be interpreted as including a reference to any successor organisation.

3. Approval

- 3.1 This Agreement is conditional upon and shall not commence unless and until:
 - (a) NTU has approved IKGPTU and the IKGPTU Course as a progression route to the NTU Course; and
 - (b) IKGPTU has provided written confirmation, which is satisfactory to NTU, that it has obtained all necessary or advisable governmental, regulatory or other approvals or consents relevant to this Agreement.

4. Progression

- 4.1 NTU has reviewed the content and standards of the IKGPTU Course and agrees that Students who have successfully completed the IKGPTU Course shall, from the date of this Agreement, be eligible to apply to Progress onto the start of the relevant NTU Course as set out in Schedule 1.
- 4.2 The entry criteria, including English language requirements, for the NTU Course are set out in Schedule 1. NTU shall retain responsibility for the determination of entry criteria and the acceptability of the entry qualifications of all Students who seek to Progress to a NTU Course.
- 4.3 NTU shall consider all applications from Students to Progress on their individual merits, against NTU's admissions criteria and in accordance with any application rules or UK legislation. NTU's decision as to a Student's suitability for Progression is final.
- 5. Quality assurance

Dean (P&EP) I.K. Guiral Puniab Tech University, Jalandhar Kapurthala

- 5.1 This Agreement is based on the NTU Course as currently offered by NTU. NTU will inform IKGPTU about any changes to the NTU Course which may affect the Progression of Students.
- 5.2 This Agreement is based on the current curriculum for the IKGPTU Course, as approved by NTU. IKGPTU shall ensure that academic equivalency and comparable learning outcomes are maintained throughout the term of this Agreement
- 5.3 Any changes made by IKGPTU to the IKGPTU Course must be notified to NTU prior to the Progression of Students to the NTU Course. Any breach of this clause is a material breach for the purposes of clause 18.2(a).
- 5.4 IKGPTU shall provide NTU with a copy of the annual report for the IKGPTU Course as prepared under its quality assurance procedures, together with any other relevant information about the operation of the IKGPTU Course.

6. Monitoring and review

- 6.1 IKGPTU will keep such records relating to the IKGPTU Course and this Agreement as required from time to time by any relevant regulatory body and will allow access by NTU or those auditing NTU processes to such records for academic or quality audit purposes.
- 6.2 NTU will carry out an annual monitoring review of this Agreement. IKGPTU will at its own expense co-operate fully with NTU in any review process and will comply with any requirements imposed by NTU as part of that review.

7. Promotion of the NTU Course and other services

- 7.1 IKGPTU shall be responsible for promoting and marketing the opportunity for Students to Progress to the NTU Course and for providing information requested by Students wishing to Progress, but NTU may also, at its discretion, promote and market the opportunity for Progression.
- 7.2 IKGPTU will provide advice and guidance to Students wishing to undertake the NTU Course using only such official NTU promotional recruitment and admission criteria and information as provided by NTU to IKGPTU from time to time.
- 7.3 IKGPTU shall not present misleading or false information about NTU to Students or represent itself as acting as an agent of NTU.
- 7.4 IKGPTU will make Students aware that they are responsible for their own financial support including the payment of tuition fees to NTU.
- 7.5 IKGPTU will make Students aware that it is their responsibility to ensure that they meet the formal entry and extension (where appropriate) requirements set out in immigration legislation for entry into the UK prior to application and for the duration of their studies at NTU. With regard to entry into the UK, Students must provide the Visas and Immigration Control with appropriate documentary evidence to confirm their status.
- 7.6 NTU will provide information about accommodation in Nottingham for Students who are offered a place on the NTU Course, either in NTU halls of residence or in NTU approved private accommodation.
- 7.7 During the continuation of this Agreement each Party may use the other's name and logo in connection with Progression but in doing so must comply with any

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requirements as to the use of that name or logo notified to it by the other Party and shall forthwith on demand by the other Party cease any use of that name or logo which the other Party believes is damaging to its reputation.

7.8 Neither Party will do anything which, in the reasonable opinion of the other, would damage the other's reputation and/or business.

8. Arrangements for the admission of Students to NTU

- 8.1 On receipt of a formal application from Students who meet the entry criteria for the NTU Course, NTU shall inform IKGPTU of Students holding offers for entry to NTU.
- 8.2 IKGPTU shall provide accurate academic transcripts and inform NTU of Students' final grades, as they become available. NTU shall, after due consideration of those Students who do not meet the terms of entry or a conditional offer, provide IKGPTU with a definitive list of Students accepted for entry to NTU, subject to clause 8.3below.
- 8.3 NTU shall inform directly those Students who meet the required standards but whose International English Language Testing System (IELTS) examination score is below that required for entry to the NTU Course that they will be required to attend a pre-sessional English language course at NTU for an agreed period of time.
- 8.4 IKGPTU shall inform all successful Students that they will be required to attend the general NTU orientation course prior to the start of the academic year.

9. Exchange of information

- 9.1 The Parties agree to share statistical information on the number of Students who have Progressed to NTU from IKGPTU with a list of NTU Courses being studied which IKGPTU may use as part of its recruitment and marketing activities.
- 9.2 NTU will host agreed visits for staff and Students of IKGPTU (as agreed in advance of such visits between the Parties) to promote NTU's facilities to Students.
- 9.3 Each Party shall appoint a member of staff to act as the main contact with the other Party for the purposes of this Agreement.

10. Financial arrangements

10.1 Unless otherwise agreed between the Parties, each Party shall be responsible for its own costs and expenses incurred in connection with this Agreement.

11. Ownership of Intellectual Property

- 11.1 Unless otherwise agreed in writing all materials relating to the NTU Course and the IKGPTU Course (and any Intellectual Property rights in them), whether in existence at the date of this Agreement or created during the course of it, shall belong respectively to NTU and IKGPTU.
- 11.2 Any other materials relating to this Agreement (and any Intellectual Property rights in such materials), whether in existence at the date of this Agreement or created during the course of it, shall belong to the Party creating them. If any such materials are created jointly by NTU and IKGPTU those materials (and any

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Intellectual Property in such materials) shall be owned jointly by NTU and IKGPTU.

11.3 If either Party becomes aware of any potential infringement of the other Party's name, logo or Intellectual Property rights, or becomes aware of any allegation that any of the Party's materials infringe the rights of a third party, it shall immediately inform the other Party. Each Party will provide the other with such reasonable assistance as the other may request in connection with any action it may take in respect of such potential infringement.

12. Confidentiality

- 12.1 The Parties shall keep and procure to be kept strictly confidential all Confidential Information received or obtained as a result of entering into or performing this Agreement and shall use such Confidential Information only for the purposes of this Agreement.
- 12.2 Either Party may disclose information which would otherwise be Confidential Information if and to the extent:
 - (a) required by law or by any relevant regulatory body;
 - (b) disclosed on a strictly confidential basis to the professional advisers, auditors and bankers of that Party;
 - the information has come into the public domain through no fault of that Party; or
 - (d) the other Party has given prior written approval of the disclosure.

13. Data protection

- 13.1 Each Party acknowledges and agrees that the Parties will share Personal Data under this Agreement and as such each Party shall ensure that, prior to providing any Personal Data to the other Party, it has all appropriate legal bases (whether consent or otherwise) necessary to enable lawful transfer of Personal Data to the other Party. Once such Personal Data has been provided to the other Party, the Parties acknowledge and agree that each Party shall act as separate Data Controllers when Processing such Personal Data and:
 - 13.1.1 IKGPTU shall be a Data Controller where it is Processing Personal Data for the purpose of its relationship with each Student;
 - 13.1.2 NTU shall be a Data Controller where it is Processing Personal Data for the purpose of the NTU Course;
 - 13.1.3 the Parties do not anticipate that either will act as a Data Processor on behalf of the other Party and neither Party is authorised or instructed to act as a Data Processor on behalf of each other; and
 - 13.1.4 the Parties will not act as joint Data Controllers in common.
- 13.2 Each Party shall ensure that it complies with its respective obligations under the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679 and the Data Protection Act 2018 and any applicable local legislation.

14. Freedom of Information

- 14.1 IKGPTU acknowledges that NTU is subject to the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOIA") and of the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 ("the EIR") and IKGPTU shall assist and co-operate with NTU (at IKGPTU's own expense) to enable NTU to comply with these information disclosure requirements.
- 14.2 Where a request for information under the FOIA and/or the EIR is submitted to NTU concerns information held by IKGPTU, IKGPTU shall provide NTU with a copy of all the information requested in its possession or power in the form requested within five working days of the request for the information (or such other period as may be specified).
- 14.3 IKGPTU further acknowledges that NTU may be required to disclose information concerning IKGPTU and/or this Agreement in discharging its obligations under the FOIA and/or the EIR. NTU, having used reasonable endeavours to consult with IKGPTU and having considered its views, shall be responsible for determining at its absolute discretion, whether the information should be disclosed under the FOIA and/or the EIR or whether an exemption from disclosure applies.

15. Anti-Bribery

- 15.1 IKGPTU shall:
- (a) comply with all Relevant Requirements;
- (b) not engage in any activity, practice or conduct which would constitute an offence under sections 1, 2 or 6 of the Bribery Act 2010 if such activity, practice or conduct had been carried out in the UK;
- (c) have and shall maintain in place throughout the term of this Agreement its own policies and procedures, including Adequate Procedures to ensure compliance with the Relevant Requirements and this clause15, and will enforce them where appropriate;
- (d) procure and ensure that all of its Associated Persons and/or other persons who are performing services and/or providing goods in connection with this Agreement comply with this clause 15.
- 15.2 Breach of this clause 15 shall be deemed to be a material breach which is not capable of remedy.
- 15.3 For the purpose of this clause 15, the following terms have the meaning set out next to them:

"Adequate Procedures" shall be determined in accordance with section 7(2) of the Bribery Act 2010 (and any guidance issued under section 9 of that Act).

"Associated Person" shall have the meaning ascribed to it in section 8 of the Bribery Act and shall include but is not limited to any employees, agents and/or subcontractors of the relevant Party.

"Bribery Act" shall mean the Bribery Act 2010 (and any amendment thereto).

"Foreign Official" shall be determined in accordance with section 6(5) of the

"Relevant Requirements" shall mean all applicable laws, statutes, regulations, and codes relating to anti-bribery and anti-corruption including but not limited to the Bribery Act.

16. Prevent

- 16.1 IKGPTU acknowledges that NTU is subject to the Counter Terrorism and Security Act 2015 (the "**Prevent Duty**") which requires it to act to deal with the present and growing threat of terrorism within the UK, treat security with the utmost importance and recognise the need to tackle terrorism and, where possible, to prevent individuals including students from being drawn into terrorism.
- 16.2 Where NTU has any concerns about a Student or becomes aware of any other matters which may require it to take action in accordance with the Prevent Duty it shall notify IKGPTU, and IKGPTU shall at the request of NTU provide NTU with a copy of all relevant information which is available to it in the form NTU requires and shall provide all necessary assistance requested by NTU to report and/or take such action.
- 16.3 NTU shall be responsible for determining in its absolute discretion what action it needs to take and IKGPTU acknowledges that NTU may be obliged under the Prevent Duty to disclose such information following consultation with IKGPTU and having taken its views into account.

17. Regulatory

- 17.1 IKGPTU shall ensure that it complies with all local legislation and/or other regulatory requirements relevant to this Agreement, and in particular that all necessary or advisable governmental, regulatory or other approvals or consents (whether required at the time this Agreement was entered into or from a later date) are secured and maintained for the duration of this Agreement.
- 17.2 The Parties will comply with any requirements or guidance relevant to this Agreement issued by the Higher Education Funding Council for England, the Quality Assurance Agency or any other regulatory body.

18. Duration and termination of this Agreement

- 18.1 This Agreement shall commence on 1 September 2019 and shall continue for a period of 3 Academic Years until 31 August 2022, unless terminated before that time in accordance with this clause. After this period the Agreement may be renewed for the same or similar period subject to the joint agreement of both Parties.
- 18.2 Either Party may terminate this Agreement:
 - (a) by giving to the other not less than 6months' notice in writing;
 - (a) with immediate effect by notice in writing if the other Party commits a material breach (which may consist of a series of minor breaches) of the terms of this Agreement which (if capable of remedy) it fails to remedy within 30 days of receipt of a notice requiring such breach to be remedied;
 - (b) with immediate effect by notice in writing if the other Party is subject to a change of control, becomes insolvent, is unable to pay its debts as and when due or otherwise ceases to exist.

19. Consequences of termination

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- 19.1 If the term of this Agreement as set out in clause 18.1 has come to an end without it being renewed, or if notice of termination has been given under clause 18.2:
 - (a) IKGPTU shall cease to promote or market the IKGPTU Course as providing a Progression opportunity to the NTU Course;
 - (b) each Party shall cease using the name and/or logo of the other;
 - (c) unless agreed otherwise in writing, the Parties shall return at their own expense any documents and other materials relating to the Course to the relevant Party.
- 19.2 The termination of this Agreement, however it arises, is without prejudice to the rights, duties and liabilities of the Parties accrued prior to termination. The clauses of this Agreement which expressly or implicitly have effect after termination will continue to be enforceable notwithstanding termination.

20. Force Majeure

- 20.1 If either Party is affected by Force Majeure it shall immediately provide the other Party with details in writing and shall keep the other party fully informed of the continuance of the Force Majeure and of any change in circumstances.
- 20.2 If the Force Majeure continues for longer than three months either Party may at any time, whilst such Force Majeure continues, terminate this Agreement by notice in writing.
- 20.3 Save as provided for in this clause Force Majeure shall not entitle either Party to terminate this Agreement and neither Party shall be in breach of this Agreement, nor otherwise liable to the other, by reason of any delay in performance, or non-performance of any of its obligations due to Force Majeure.

21. Disputes

- 21.1 The Parties shall attempt to resolve in good faith any dispute arising between them out of the operation of this Agreement. If the dispute cannot be resolved informally, it shall be referred to the Head of College (Business Law and Social Sciences) of NTU and the Registrar at IKGPTU.
- 21.2 If the matter is not resolved through negotiation either Party may refer the matter to mediation, and the parties will attempt in good faith to resolve the dispute through mediation in accordance with the model procedure of the Centre for Effective Dispute Resolution.
- 21.3 The Parties agree to co-operate in dealing with or defending any claim by a third party arising out of the operation of this Agreement.

22. Law and jurisdiction

- 22.1 This Agreement and any dispute or claim (including non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of it or its subject matter or formation shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of England.
- 22.2 Subject to clause 22.3 any dispute or claim (including non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of the operation of this Agreement shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

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22.3 If IKGPTU has no assets within the jurisdiction of the English courts and is established in a jurisdiction which will not enforce the judgment of the English courts then any dispute or claim (including non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of the operation of this Agreement shall be finally settled by arbitration under the Rules of Arbitration and Conciliation of the International Chamber of Commerce by two or more arbitrators appointed under those rules. The place of arbitration shall be London and the language of the proceedings shall be English.

23. Indemnity and insurance

- 23.1 IKGPTU agrees to indemnify NTU against all actions, claims, proceedings, costs, expenses, loss or damage of whatsoever kind (including legal fees) sustained by NTU in respect of or arising out of any breach of IKGPTU's obligations under this Agreement.
- 23.2 NTU agrees to indemnify IKGPTU against all actions, claims, proceedings, costs, expenses, loss or damage of whatsoever kind (including legal fees) sustained by IKGPTU in respect of or arising out of any breach of NTU's obligations under this Agreement.
- 23.3 IKGPTU agrees to maintain appropriate insurance to cover its liabilities under this Agreement.

24. Limitation of liability

- 24.1 NTU shall not be liable to IKGPTU in contract, tort (including negligence) and/or breach of statutory duty for any loss or damage which IKGPTU may suffer by reason of any act, omission, neglect or default (including negligence) in the performance of this Agreement by NTU, its servants or agents, in a sum which is greater than the total amount of the fees paid by IKGPTU.
- 24.2 Nothing in this clause shall operate so as to exclude:
 - (a) NTU's non-excludable liability in respect of death or personal injury caused by its negligence or the negligence of its servants or agents; or
 - (b) liability for fraudulent misrepresentation.

25. General provisions

- 25.1 This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties in relation to its subject matter and supersedes all prior agreements, understandings or discussions between the Parties in relation thereto.
- 25.2 A variation to this Agreement will not be valid unless made in writing and signed by both Parties.
- 25.3 Any notice given in connection with this Agreement must be in writing and delivered by or by first class pre-paid recorded delivery (or international equivalent) to the address given in this Agreement, or to another address notified by either Party for the purposes of serving notices. A notice will be deemed to have been served two days after posting if sent by first class pre-paid recorded delivery (or seven days if by international equivalent). If notice is deemed to have been given on a day that is not a normal business day of the recipient, it shall be deemed to have been given on the next normal business day.

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- 25.4 The rights and remedies of each Party under this Agreement shall not be diminished, waived or extinguished by any failure or delay by that party to exercise such a right or remedy.
- 25.5 The provisions of this Agreement are severable and distinct from one another, and if at any time any provision is or becomes invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the validity, legality or enforceability of the other provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired.
- 25.6 This Agreement may be executed by each party on separate counterparts.
- 25.7 For the avoidance of doubt, nothing in this Agreement shall confer on any third party any benefit or the right to enforce any provision of this Agreement.
- 25.8 Nothing in this Agreement shall create or be deemed to create a partnership, joint venture or relationship of principal and agent between the Parties.
- 25.9 The Parties shall not assign, transfer or sub-contract any of their rights and responsibilities under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- 25.10 [The English language version of this Agreement shall be regarded as the authoritative version notwithstanding that it may be translated into another language.]

MEMORANDUUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** (hereafter referred to as "**MOU**") is entered into effect on 9th February, 2019.

BY AND BETWEEN THE FOLLOWING PARTIES:

I. K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar, established by an Act of State Legislature on 16th January, 1997, to promote technical, management and pharmaceutical education in the state at degree level and above, having its address at Jalandhar - Kapurthala Highway, VPO-Ibban,Kapurthala-144603, Distt. Kapurthala, represented for the purposes of the MOU by its Dean, Planning and External Programs, Dr. N. P. Singh (hereinafter referred to as "IKGPTU")

and

Leaders Institute Pty Ltd, ABN 605 807 305, a higher education provider in Australia, registered under the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency Act 2011, and whose academic programs are accredited by the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency, having its address at 76 Park Road, Woolloongabba, Qld, 4102, Australia; P.O. Box 73, Stones Corner, Qld, 4120, Australia, represented for the purposes of this MOU by its Chief Executive Officer Dr. Rodney (Rod) St Hill (hereinafter referred to as "Leaders")

IKGPTU and Leaders may individually be referred to as "Party" and collectively as "Parties".

PREAMBLE

Whereas, in accordance with a mutual desire between the Parties to promote further cooperation in education, training and research between IKGPTU and Leaders.

Therefore, it is hereby agreed as follows:

- 1. The preamble is an integral part of the present MOU.
- 2. 2.1 Both Parties agree on the following general forms of cooperation:
 - a) Joint educational, training and/or research activities.
 - b) Exchange of invitations to faculty, research personnel, graduate and undergraduate students (hereinafter referred to as "Scholars") for lectures, visits and sharing of experiences.
 - c) Exchange of invitations to Scholars for participation in conferences, symposia and seminars.

- d) Exchange of Scholars for study, training and research.
- 2.2 The details of cooperation for any of the above-identified fields may also be specified in the form of addenda or subsequent agreements to this MOU upon signature by appropriate representatives.
- 3. 3.1 It is agreed between the Parties that exchange of Scholars will be subject to the rules and regulations of the host Party and country. Scholars must fulfil existing visa requirements and submit evidence of adequate medical and travel insurances stating a waiver of subrogation against the host Party for any reason whatsoever. The above-mentioned documents are subject to a prior written approval from the host Party.

3.2 Each Party undertake on behalf of their Scholars (i) to comply with the other Party's policies and procedures regarding the use of their premises and facilities in a reasonable manner and (ii) to avoid any unethical behaviors.

3.3 Both Parties agree in their respective Bylaws or Policies on the principles of equal opportunity and non-discrimination. Neither Party shall impose criteria for exchanges of Scholars, which would violate the principles of nondiscrimination

- 4. Both Parties agree that this MOU does not commit either Party to financial liability and all financial arrangements that are necessary to implement this MOU will depend upon the availability of funds and will be subject to negotiations and separate written agreements.
- 5. The MOU is valid for a term of five (5) years from the Effective Date. All provisions will automatically expire if no specific agreement related to the above four areas of cooperation (cf. article 2) is not signed within 18 (eighteen) months following the Effective Date. Unless automatically expired, this MOU may be renewed before the termination date on 9th February, 2024; by virtue of an addendum to be signed in due course. Either Party may terminate this MOU by giving written notice of ninety (90) days to the other Party. In the event of early termination, the Parties will make good faith efforts to complete or terminate existing projects or engagements without substantial prejudice to the other Party. Subject to any applicable legal or regulatory requirements or restrictions, any existing project or engagement that is in effect at the time of termination shall not be affected by the termination of this MOU and will proceed as originally agreed upon until successful completion.
- For purposes of implementing this MOU, the contact persons will be as follows unless the concerned Party notifies the other in writing of a new contact person:

Each Party shall protect and keep confidential any documents and information exchanged between the Parties pursuant to this MOU and/or to subsequent correspondence, addenda and/or written agreements. Each Party shall in all respects treat such documents and information as carefully as that accorded to their own confidential information. At the termination of the MOU or within fifteen (15) working days of receipt of a written request, each Party will return to the other Party all documents and information disclosed to them under this MOU, including but not limited to all printed or reproduced material and information stored in electronic form or other form. This obligation of confidentiality shall survive the expiration or termination of the present MOU for any reason whatsoever.
- 8. Each Party shall not use the name and/or logo of the other Party in any publication, advertising, promotional material, press release, or other marketing material, without the express prior written consent of the other Party to each particular use of its name and/or logo.
- 9. If and whenever either Party is in breach of any obligation under this MOU and/or any subsequent addenda or agreement, the other Party shall send a written notice to the breaching Party in order to remedy such a situation within 15 (fifteen) working days. If the breaching situation is not remedied accordingly, the present MOU and/or any subsequent addenda or agreement shall be terminated on the full liability of the breaching Party who shall incur the damages against all losses, costs and/or expenses arising from or in connection with their breach.
- 10. Each Party shall not assign or transfer any of their rights and/or obligations under this MOU to any third party without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- 11. The present MOU is the entire understanding between the Parties and supersedes all prior understandings, correspondence and agreements, whether verbal or written between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. The terms of the MOU may be amended only by mutual written consent.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN NORTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY, DEKALB, ILLINOIS, USA AND I.K. GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, JALANDHAR, PUNJAB, INDIA

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the Board of Trustees of Northern Illinois University, located in DeKalb, Illinois, 60115 USA ("NIU"), functioning through its Division of International Affairs, and I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar-Kapurthala Highway, Kapurthala, Punjab, India (IKGPTU). NIU and IKGPTU are collectively referred to herein as "institutions" and individually as "institution".

NIU and IKGPTU wish to expand scholarly ties and promote closer academic collaboration and therefore agree as follows:

- 1. Both institutions are united by common interests and objectives in educational exchange, and they wish to maintain and promote channels of communication that permit those mutual exchanges.
- 2. This Agreement will govern the general framework for academic exchanges between NIU and University. Individual working agreements, should they arise, will be executed for specific projects under this Agreement.
- 3. The individual working agreement(s) referred to in paragraph 2 may be developed for, but need not be limited to, the exchange of faculty and students.
- 4. Each institution will be responsible for the travel costs of its own faculty or officials involved in mutual exchange activities under this Agreement.
- 5. Each institution will take action to make the substance of this Agreement known to its appropriate personnel, and will provide normal and reasonable assistance to such personnel in regard to the administrative details of exchanges and work agreements.
- 6. Each institution will appoint a liaison. The liaisons will, together, be responsible for tracking cooperative efforts, facilitating mutual assistance, and making an annual report to both institutions of the previous year's joint activities and the initiatives in progress for the next year.

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- 7. This Agreement shall commence on May 15, 2019 ("Effective Date") and terminate three years from the Effective Date, unless earlier terminated or renewed as provided for herein. This Agreement shall not take effect until it is signed by both parties. It may be renewed for an additional term of three years by an exchange of letters between the NIU Executive Vice President and Provost or Associate Vice President for International Affairs and the appropriate official of University (the "Authorized Representatives") or other document evidencing intent to renew signed by the Authorized Representatives. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon prior written notice to the other party.
- 8. Any modifications to this Agreement shall be in writing and signed by the Authorized Representatives.
- 9. This Agreement does not oblige either IKGPTU or NIU to undertake any financial expenditures or other contractual obligations.
- The assignment of this Agreement to any other party or parties is expressly prohibited except with the written concurrence by the appropriate authorities of both NIU and IKGPTU.
- 11. The English version of this Agreement shall be the authoritative version of the Agreement for all purposes. In the event of a conflict between the English version and any translation of this Agreement, the English version shall control.
- 12. The parties are independent contractors with respect to each other, and a party shall not be deemed, nor hold itself out as being, a partner, joint venturer, employee or agent of the other party.
- 13. Neither party shall issue any press release or other public announcement relating to this

Agreement or the activities contemplated by this Agreement or use the other party's name, logos, marks or any other trade designations (including, but not limited to, on its website, in printed materials or in any other manner) or any other intellectual property of the other party (collectively, "Institutional IP") without the prior written approval of such party, which approval may be withheld for any reason. Any approved use of Institutional IP shall be subject to compliance with all of the approving party's requirements, specifications and brand guidelines pertaining to the use of such Institutional IP. Each party shall comply with all reasonable requests from the other in the event any use of Institutional IP does not meet the reasonable expectations of the approving party. Neither party shall acquire or claim any right, title, interest or ownership rights of any nature whatsoever in any Institutional IP of the other party upon such party's request or upon termination of this Agreement. Any use of the other party's Institutional IP in a manner not authorized herein

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Dean (P&EP) I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar Kapurthala f

is a violation of this Agreement. Any and all goodwill that may result from use of the Institutional IP shall inure to the benefit of the owner of the Institutional IP.

- 14. The parties agree that a signature transmitted to the other party by electronic transmission shall be effective to bind the party whose signature was transmitted. The parties further agree that any xerographically or electronically reproduced copy of this fully executed Agreement shall have the same legal force and effect as any copy bearing original signatures of the parties.
- 15. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties; and any future agreement, understanding, or waiver, to be binding upon the parties must be reduced to writing and signed by the Authorized Representatives.

Term of MoU:



Also herein after referred to as the Parties.

1. Aims

1.1 The Parties wish to explore further opportunities for collaboration in teaching and research. The aim of this Memorandum is to provide a framework within which the Parties will seek to develop a long-term collaborative relationship.

2. Status of this Memorandum

2.1 Other than paragraphs 6, 7 and 8, this Memorandum is not intended to be and is not legally binding. If, as a result of further discussion, the Parties agree to collaborate in any of the activities anticipated in this Memorandum, the Parties shall enter into a formal and legally binding agreement, setting out the rights and obligations of each party in relation to that activity.

3. Areas of potential collaboration

- 3.1 Subject to paragraph 3.2, the Parties will explore opportunities for potential collaboration in the following areas:
- exchange of information on course development and teaching methods;
- (b) exchange of staff and students;
- (c) development of joint research projects;
- (d) development of routes for progression whereby course work completed at IKGPTU will meet some of the course requirements needed to earn designated Bachelor degrees at KU
- (e) cultural exchange programmes





- (f) any other areas which may promote the academic interests of the Parties in research and/or teaching.
- 3.2 The development of a collaborative relationship between the Parties is subject to:
- (a) the approval of the relevant authorities of both IKGPTU and KU and
- (b) obtaining all necessary or advisable governmental, regulatory or other relevant approvals, consents or licences.

4. Financial implications

4.1 Each party shall be responsible for its own costs incurred in connection with this Memorandum. IKGPTU and KU shall, where possible, explore opportunities for external funding of the collaborative activities anticipated in this Memorandum.

5. Exchange of information

5.1 Each party will exchange information with the other with a view to understanding whether it would be effective and practical for the institutions to work together.

6. Confidentiality

6.1 This Memorandum and any information provided in connection with it may not be disclosed to any third party other than (a) the parties' professional advisers; (b) as required by law or a relevant regulatory authority; (c) with the prior written consent of the other party; or (d) where the information has come into the public domain through no fault of the party wishing to disclose it.

7. Intellectual Property

7.1 Unless agreed otherwise in writing, any Intellectual Property rights belonging to the Parties, whether in existence at the date of this Memorandum or created during the course of it, shall belong to the respective Parties.

8. Publicity

- 8.1 The Parties will not include the name or logo of the other Party in any advertising or publicity material without the prior approval of the other Party on a case-by-case basis.
- 8.2 Neither Party will do anything which, in the reasonable opinion of the other, would damage the other's reputation and/or business.

9. Disputes

9.1 The Parties shall attempt to resolve in good faith any dispute arising between them out of the operation of this Memorandum. If the dispute cannot be resolved informally, it shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor of IKGPTU and KU.

The University is well competently working for providing professional & skill oriented knowledge to the masses. IKGPTU is also promoting a number of courses in different streams in both, regular as well as distance education programs.

AND

SPHAERA PHARMA PRIVATE LIMITED, a company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956, having its registered office situated at A 5/109, Indira Enclave, Neb Sarai, New Delhi-110030 and its corporate office situated at Plot No. 32, Sector-5, IMT Manesar, Gurugram-122051, Haryana; (herein after referred to as "SPHAERA PHARMA" which expression shall include its successors-in-interest, permitted assignees and associate companies) of the second part.

Both IKGPTU and SPHAERA PHARMA shall individually be referred to as "Party" and collectively be referred to as "Parties.

WHEREAS:

- A. IKGPTU is a Premier University engaged in education and research in science, pharmaceuticals chemistry, molecular biology, biotechnology, engineering technology, industrial technology, management, information technology, environment, planning, architecture and paramedical sciences.
- B. SPHAERA PHARMA is engaged in the business of drug discovery and development and have research labs at Plot No. 32, Sector-5, IMT Manesar, Haryana-122051

PREAMBLE

IKGPTU and SPHAERA PHARMA are mutually interested to collaborate in academic and research related activities especially in the areas of Pharmaceutical Sciences.

1. DEFINITIONS:

"Intellectual property (IP)" means any know how, inventions, developments, discoveries, improvements, processes, compositions of matter, formulations, or methods of use, conceived or reduced to practice.

"Public Disclosure" means disclosure of IP, as defined above, to anyone who is not part of the IKGPTU or SPHAERA PHARMA teams associated with work being done under the scope of the Agreement.

"Commercialization" means and includes manufacturing, marketing, promoting, selling and distributing the know-how by utilization of IPR, including making arrangements of any and all kinds with any entity or entities anywhere in the world including sub-licensing in respect to the IP.

2. SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT AND OBJECTIVES

The scope of collaboration on academic and research activities included in this General Agreement encompasses the following objectives:

- Enrollment of SPHAERA PHARMA's scientist(s)/ employee(s) in a Ph.D program at IKGPTU, as part-time students as per the IKGPTU rules.
- Exchange of graduate and postgraduate students of IKGPTU in the disciplines of Pharmaceutical/Synthetic Organic chemistry for project work/training at SPHAERA PHARMA.
- Sponsorship and pooling of resources for co-operative seminars, workshops and other scientific meetings on topics of mutual interest, as and when deemed feasible.
- Exploring the possibilities of carrying out SPHAERA PHARMA sponsored research project(s) at IKGPTU.
- Assisting in the development of curriculum of pharma sciences/chemistry courses according to industrial/research lab requirements in order to make student more employable.

3. EXCHANGE OF SPHAERA PHARMA'S SCIENTISTS FOR Ph. D PROGRAM(S)

Both the parties will consider working together in areas of mutual interest.

- In the event both parties agree to work together; the concerned scientists of SPHAERA PHARMA and the corresponding faculty members of IKGPTU will formulate joint Research Plan(s) for the joint work on a "case by case" basis, with due approval of the **Joint Steering Committee**.
- At any given time, no more than 5 scientists of SPHAERA PHARMA will be registered for the Ph.D. program at IKGPTU.

Requirement for enrolment/registration for Ph.D. Program for SPHAERA PHARMA's scientists at IKGPTU will be as per the ordinance for the 'Doctor of Philosophy' program of IKGPTU.

MANESAR

Dean (P&EP)

- The supervisor for SPHAERA PHARMA's scientists enrolling/registering for the Ph.D. will be from IKGPTU. However, there can be a co-supervisor from SPHAERA PHARMA, subject to fulfillment of the requirements of the ordinance for the Doctor of Philosophy at IKGPTU
- IKGPTU shall provide experienced faculty for conducting the Ph. D. program, conduct and monitor the research programs, carry out performance evaluation as per its Ph. D. program. All/any examination(s) to be conducted by IKGPTU shall be in the same manner as that carried out for other Ph.D. students admitted by IKGPTU. The Ph. D. Degree shall be awarded by IKGPTU.
- IKGPTU shall provide accommodation and other facilities for visiting Ph. D. students of SPHAERA PHARMA, who shall be treated similar to the other Ph.D. students of IKGPTU. Students shall be required to pay actual boarding, lodging, electricity and other applicable charges, as per IKGPTU's rules.
- IKGPTU will provide boarding and lodging facilities for the visiting official/s of SPHAERA PHARMA at its campus.

Selection of candidates for Ph. D. Program would be as follows:

- a) Candidates nominated by SPHAERA PHARMA will be registered for Ph. D. as per the Ph.D. admission norms of IKGPTU.
- b) The eligible applicants will submit their application/s as per the Ph.D. rules & regulations of IKGPTU.
- c) The admission of the candidate would be through the recommendation by the admission committee at IKGPTU along with an external guide from SPHAERA PHARMA, if appointed.
- d) The recommendations of the admission committee shall be forwarded for the approval and further necessary action as required by the rules at IKGPTU rules. From time to time the Supervisor from SPHAERA PHARMA will interact with the Supervisor from IKGPTU, in order to review the progress of the candidate(s).
- e) The approved candidates then would be required to pay admission fees (prevailing fees payable at IKGPTU) as given in the rules and regulation for Ph.D.: (Annexure: A, attached) to IKGPTU to formally register for the Ph. D. programs of IKGPTU.
- f) IKGPTU will review the background of the candidate for pursuing Ph.D. work in the proposed area and recommend the qualifying papers and any other course. The course work will be conducted at IKGPTU as per applicable norms of IKGPTU. It is hereby clarified and agreed between the Parties that the candidate will be solely liable and responsible for any administrative expenses to be incurred during the term of the Ph. D.program.
- g) The report on the progress of the candidate (s) shall be submitted along with recommendations to IKGPTU as per IKGPTU norms.
- All other rules and regulations of IKGPTU for its Ph.D. programs, as stated in Rules & Regulations for the Ph.D. program, shall be applicable to the Ph. Students.

4. EXCHANGE OF IKGPTU STUDENTS/ TECHNICAL STAFF/ FACULTY MEMBERS

SPHAERA PHARMA agrees to provide training to students, and occasionally to staff and/or technical personnel of IKGPTU within the areas of mutual co-operation based on prior discussions and mutual agreement.

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- At any given time not more than 3 selected students of IKGPTU will be taken up for summer/industrial training at SPHAERA PHARMA.
- The duration of training period for IKGPTU students at SPHAERA PHARMA will preferably be for 3-6 months.
- The technical staff/faculty members deputed by IKGPTU for training shall be governed by SPHAERA PHARMA's rules of conduct.
- Students/staff/faculty undergoing training at SPHAERA PHARMA will execute an individual Confidentiality Agreement with SPHAERA PHARMA and IKGPTU will take reasonable measures in order to ensure that the terms of Confidentiality Agreement are duly implemented and adhered to.

5. JOINT CONFERENCES/WORKSHOPS/COURSES

Both the parties agree to consider the possibility of holding/conducting joint workshops, conferences, training courses etc. within the areas of mutual co-operation, whenever feasible.

The host institution shall provide accommodation to the participating members.

6. SPONSORED PROJECT(S)

- SPHAERA PHARMA will consider carrying out Sponsored Research Project(s) with IKGPTU in areas of mutual interest, as and when deemed feasible.
- In the event, parties agree to work on any sponsored project(s); the terms of the same will be negotiated and laid forth in a separate agreement; on a "project by project" basis.

7. SHARING OF FACILITIES

Host institute/industry will allow members of the visiting institute/industry to use their resources, such as library, R&D facilities and reagents/chemicals; provided there is no legal or third party restriction of such use.

8. AREAS OF CO-OPERATION

- The specifics regarding the areas of co-operation will be defined and modified from time to time by the Joint Steering Committee (JSC) set up for the purpose.
- Vice President-R&D, SPHAERA PHARMA or his nominee shall be the coordinator from SPHAERA PHARMA for each identified area of co-operation. The Vice President-R&D, SPHAERA PHARMA may nominate more than one coordinator.

The coordinator from IKGPTU for each identified area of co-operation shall be the Head of the concerned department at IKGPTU.

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SPHAERA PHARMA may provide inputs from industry perspective for upgradation or updating of Master and Bachelor course (s) in Pharmaceutical Sciences/Chemistry at IKGPTU.

9. JOINT STEERING COMMITTEE(JSC)

The following will constitute the Joint Steering Committee, to monitor and review the collaborative program(s) between the two institutions:

- a) Vice-Chancellor, IKGPTU or his nominee.
- b) Vice President-R&D, SPHAERA PHARMA or his nominee.
- c) Coordinators from IKGPTU and SPHAERA PHARMA

The JSC shall:

- a) Review the progress of the identified program (s) (at least once in ayear)
- b) Consider the new R&D proposals for joint collaboration.
- c) Consider the addition/deletion of areas of co-operation between the two institutions.

10. CONFIDENTIALITY

- The parties agree that with respect to any business information of the Disclosing Party which is (a) marked as "confidential," "proprietary" or some similar indication; (b) is advised by the Disclosing Party to be confidential; or (c) which the parties would reasonably construe to be confidential information under the circumstances (collectively referred to as "Confidential Information").
- Confidential Information" includes, without limitation, information in tangible or intangible form relating to and/or including released or unreleased Disclosing Party's all patent rights, copyrights and all other intellectual property rights and proprietary rights thereto such as, scientific, technical, clinical, experimental and analytical data, properties, characteristics, functionalities, mechanisms and/or advantages of the Disclosing Party's products or proposed products, test samples, trade names, research and development activities, know-how, specifications, drawings, inventions, data and result of studies that will be performed on the test substances owned by the Disclosing Party, that Recipient is obligated to treat as confidential.
- The party receiving the Confidential Information shall be referred to as the "Receiving Party "and the party disclosing the Confidential Information shall be referred to as the "Disclosing Party ".
- The Receiving Party hereby agrees to keep confidential, any Confidential Information provided by the Disclosing Party to the Receiving Party pursuant to this Agreement. Such Confidential Information shall be treated in the strictest confidence and shall not be disclosed by the Receiving Party to any Third Party and shall only be used for the proper performance of this Agreement and shall be treated as confidential for the duration of this Agreement and for a period of 5 years after its termination.

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- At any given time not more than 3 selected students of IKGPTU will be taken up for summer/industrial training at SPHAERA PHARMA.
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The coordinator from IKGPTU for each identified area of co-operation shall be the Head of the concerned department at IKGPTU.

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Confidential Information does not include information that: (a) is or comes into the public domain otherwise than by breach of this Agreement by either party; (b) is made known to the Receiving Party by a Third Party having the legal right to make such disclosure, (c) is independently developed by the Receiving Party without any aid of the Confidential Information of the Disclosing party.

11. PUBLICATIONS AND PATENTS

All publications in the programs of co-operation shall be co-authored by the concerned scientist

(s) of SPHAERA PHARMA and the Research Fellow/Faculty of IKGPTU.

SPHAERA PHARMA and IKGPTU will be joint holders of the Intellectual Property Right (IPR)/ Patents arising out of any joint work. The IPR expenses are to be borne by both the parties in equal proportion.

SPHAERA PHARMA will have the first right of refusal for commercialization if any, of such joint IPRs.

In the event the JSC decides that the joint IP may have some commercialization potential; SPHAERA PHARMA will have no obligation to commercialize; in case it is deemed that such joint IP could be detrimental to its internal product(s)/project(s) portfolio of program(s).

12. PUBLIC DISCLOSURE

In case of any joint research and/or sponsored project (s) taken up by SPHAERA PHARMA and IKGPTU. no party shall disclose any part of the investigation in media in any form without any prior mutual, written consent.

13. DURATION OF AGREEMENT AND TERMINATION .51

This General Agreement is effective from the date it is signed by the appropriate officer of each signatory.

This General Agreement may be amended at anytime by mutual consent and shall continue in force and effect for five years and can be extended by mutual consent of both parties.

Participants from each of the parties, while in attendance at the other party's facilities, shall abide by the rules and regulations of that host institution/industry regarding the use of facilities and conduct, and shall be subject to the laws of the host industry/institute.

In the event of material breach or default of any provisions of this Agreement, the nonbreaching party will be entitled to call upon the defaulting party to rectify such breach or default within a period of 30 days from the date of such notice. In the event of failure on the part of the defaulting party to remove or rectify such breach or default,

the Agreement shall stand terminated at the end of such notice period.

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14. NOTICES

Except, as may be otherwise provided hereunder, all notices and consents under this Agreement directed to any party shall be in writing and shall be considered to be duly served if delivered by registered post/email to the parties at the address mentioned below.

15. APPLICABLE LAWS

This Agreement shall in all respects be construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of India and will be subject to the courts at New Delhi/Jalandhar.

- Non-assign ability— The rights and obligations of the parties under this Agreement shall not be assignable without written permission of the other party.
- Severability -- If any provision hereof is held unenforceable or void, the remaining provisions shall be enforced in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.
- Entire Agreement -- This Agreement and the agreements contemplated hereunder constitute the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes or cancels all previous negotiations, agreements, commitments oral or written between the parties

on the subject of this Agreement. This Agreement may not be amended in any manner except by an instrument in writing signed by the authorized representatives of each of the parties hereto.

- Any waiver of any breach of, or any default under, any of the terms of this Agreement will not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach or default and will in no way affect the other terms of this Agreement.
- Nothing in this Agreement shall create or be deemed to create a partnership, agency or joint venture between the parties.
