- The terms of specific areas of cooperation shall be agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of any particular activity.
- Any specific programme shall be subject to mutual consent, availability of funds, and a budget approved by both parties.
- 8. The two universities agree to uphold this Memorandum for an initial period of five years from the date of joint signing; it will be effective when the representatives of both universities have signed and dated it.
- 9. The agreement may be renewed provided that neither party gives a written notice of termination of this agreement to the other before the end of the term at least six months in advance.







Recognizing the mutual benefits to be gained through a cooperative relationship promoting academic and scholarly activities, Thompson Rivers University (hereinafter referred to as "TRU") and the I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University of Punjab (hereinafter referred to as "IKGPTU") agree to the following:

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1. TRU is a degree granting public university with its main campus operating in Kamloops, British Columbia, Canada.
- 1.2. IKGPTU is a degree granting public university in the state of Punjab in India, with their main campus operating in Jalandhar, India.

2. DEFINITIONS

- 2.1. In this Memorandum of Understanding, unless otherwise stated or the context otherwise requires:
 - a) "Memorandum of Understanding" means this Memorandum of Understanding for Academic Cooperation. This is an agreement providing a framework for collaborative activities.

b) "Activity Agreement" means a specific agreement for each activity implemented in accordance with section 4 of this Memorandum of Understanding.

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3. AREAS OF COOPERATION

- 3.1. The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding includes, but is not limited to exploring cooperation with regard to the following activity areas:
 - Trades preparatory program offered in Punjab for students wishing to undertake trades training at TRU in Kamloops

4. IMPLEMENTATION

- 4.1. In order to carry out and fulfill the aims of this Memorandum of Understanding, TRU and IKGPTU will each appoint a representative who manages the development and conduct of joint activities.
- 4.2. Specific details of any activity will be set forth in an Activity Agreement, which will become an integral part of this Memorandum of Understanding upon signing by appropriate authorities of both parties. An Activity Agreement will include such items as:
 - a) Description of the responsibilities of each institution for the agreed activity;
 - b) Terms for the specific activity;
 - c) Budgets and sources of financing for the activity; and
 - d) Any other items necessary for the efficient achievement of the activity
- 4.3. Any Activity Agreement developed under this Memorandum of Understanding will be approved at each institution according to the normal procedures for the type of activities proposed.
- 4.4. Each institution will be responsible for the evaluation of activities under this Memorandum of Understanding according to their respective practices.

5. TERM OF THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

- 5.1. This Memorandum of Understanding will become effective on the date of signing and shall have an initial term of three (3) years. The term shall be extended on a year by year basis unless either party notifies the other in writing at least six (6) months before the end of the then-current term of its desire to terminate the Agreement. If either party breaches a material term herein, this Memorandum of Understanding may be terminated by the other party upon giving six (6) months' written notice of such breach.
- 5.2. This Memorandum of Understanding may be amended at any time by mutual written agreement of both parties.
- 5.3. Should no Activity Agreement be developed under this Memorandum of Understanding within three (3) years of its initial signing, this Memorandum of Understanding shall cease to have effect on the third anniversary of the coming into force of this Memorandum of Understanding.

Yorkville University, BC, Canada and I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar, Punjab, India wishing to promote co-operation between the two institutions and agree to explore the following collaborative initiatives:

- a. Articulation agreements and academic pathways for IKGPTU students;
- b. Joint marketing activities including Recruitment Fairs, Open Houses, Agent Nights;
- Joint academic events and activities, including faculty/administrators, professional development, student exchanges and class scheduling;
- d. Information exchanges including the results of teaching and research collaboration; and
- e. Any other activities viewed to be mutually beneficial;

The terms of co-operation for each specific activity implemented under this Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing by both parties prior to the initiation of that activity and may be the subject of separate agreements, as required.

This MoU becomes effective from the day the representatives of both institutions affix their signatures below and will continue for an initial period of three years, whereupon it shall be reviewed and may be extended by the mutual written agreement of both institutions. This MoU may be revised through the mutual agreement of both institutions and may be terminated by either party upon giving six month's written notice signed by the presiding officer of the notifying party.

Any use of the names 'Yorkville University' or 'I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University Jalandhar', including any of its constituent schools, departments, programs or logos, relating in any way to the activities described in this MoU, shall be subject to prior written approval.

The administration of this MoU will be the responsibility of the Vice President Academic, BC and/or the University President's Office, ON.

Agreement Details to be developed:

A. Co-operation on academic programs and pathways;

YU and IKGPTU agree to work towards an articulation agreement comprised of the following: An articulation from IKGPTU's Bachelor of Business Administration courses into YU's BBA Specializations. The goal is to create a seamless pathway for graduates and Alumni of IKGPTU into YU's BBA Specializations with credits that YU can grant for the courses completed at IKGPTU including what would be left to complete at YU (the residency requirement, which is a minimum of 60 credits). The articulation agreement may include special financial incentives such as (waiving of the application fee, a scholarship or bursary, or other incentives devised for such a pathway). An additional articulation of the BBA Degree courses of IKGPTU into YU's BBA General program (expected to be approved by DQAB in Fall of 2018.

B. Joint Marketing Activities

The development of joint marketing activities including Recruitment Fairs, Open Houses, Agent Nights, etc. YU and IKGPTU will work cooperatively so that YU's marketing team has access to IKGPTU campuses, Alumni and graduating students at specially created events and marketing initiatives so that students interested in transferring to YU are aware of the entrance requirements, courses, process, start dates, costs, etc. YU wants to be seen as a valued partner of IKGPTU and will focus on building this relationship through marketing, Open Houses and Agent Nights on a regular basis (such as every 6 to 8 weeks) are held so that students and agents are completely aware of all requirements.

C. Facilitate, University staff exchanges or mutual visits to both institutions;

Both YU and IKGPTU will work cooperatively to share staff expertise if required and conduct mutual visits to continue to build relationships with key staff and may look at offering courses at each other's facilities for the benefit of both schools and students.

International student training and development including student transfers;

Workshops, Open Houses, and Activities to develop student transfers to both YU and IKGPTU will be developed. Such activities may include joint ESL workshops for students needing extra help. It may include joint writing workshops by both staff and faculty of each school as an example or it might include the development of a bursary program for certain markets or for a certain period to help with joint recruitment and transfers.

E. Exchange of information, including the results of teaching and research collaboration;

From time-to-time, YU and IKGPTU agree to share information, teachers/administrators or research to help each other with issues or to illustrate to DQAB how institutions can partner for the benefit of students and staff. It could be as simple as sharing of marketing information in a particular country, offering a joint meeting to a foreign delegation, or be as comprehensive as jointly developing a conference for the benefit of teachers/faculty and involve scholarly activity beneficial to one or both parties.

F. Other activities viewed to be mutually beneficial. From time to time, YU and IKGPTU may collaborate on any activity designed to deepen the relationship to the benefit of both parties.

- Confirmation of an official TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score of at least 550 (written version) or 80 (Internet based version); or an IELTS (International English-Language Test System) overall bandwidth of at least 6.5; or a Canadian Academic English-Language Test 43 (CAEL) score of 60 or higher; or a score equivalent to these scores on another test of English language proficiency recognized by and acceptable to the University. Students with IELTS score of 6.0 or equivalent, applying to the BC BBA will be admitted to the EAP (Eng180) course to be completed in their first term of study along with specific other courses in the plan of study. Students below 6.0 applying for the BC BBA program will be referred to an ESL partner in BC or to the Ontario program.

c. Transfer Credit for Students

Students entering the Bachelor of Business Administration program may transfer blocks of credits from degree and diploma programs recognized by and acceptable to the admissions committee.

The block transfers are generally applied to the elective component of the program. Students may also transfer credits where it can be demonstrated that a course previously completed is equivalent to a course in the Bachelor of Business Administration program.

The general rules governing transfer of credits into the BBA are:

- The University may accept up to a maximum of 60 credits (50% of total credits required) in transfer toward the BBA degree for coursework.
- Credits being transferred to the Yorkville program must have been completed at a postsecondary institution recognized in that institution's home jugisdiction.

- Official transcripts must be submitted at the time of application to Yorkville University for transfer credits to be considered by the University. Transcripts will be evaluated and notification will be forwarded by the Registrar's Office concerning the student's status in the program, including the number of transfer credits awarded.
- Credits earned through transfer are not used to compute the student's GPA.

(3) Provisos

- i. In all cases, the University reserves the right to require proof of language proficiency before permission will be granted to register in academic courses. Applicants from countries where English is the language of instruction but is not the primary language of the general population, may be asked to demonstrate English-language proficiency.
- ii. For a student to graduate with a Yorkville University degree, at least 50% of degree credits must be completed at Yorkville University.
- iii. The transfer of credits obtained at other post-secondary institutions is permitted, but all requests must be well documented.

(4) Duration & Termination of LOA

- a. This LOA shall become effective on the date that it is signed by both parties and shall be valid for a period of five years, but will be reviewed annually, and may be extended by mutual consent expressed in writing.
- **b.** This LOA may be terminated by either Party at any time provided that the terminating Party gives written notice of its intention at least 90 days prior to termination. Such termination would not alter the programs for students who already have transfer credit with YU under this agreement as they would complete their studies in accordance with the terms of this LOA at the time of their entry into YU.
- c. Where there are two or more versions of this LOA in different languages, and where a dispute arises, the English version shall prevail for the purposes of interpretation of the LOA.

Agreement of Cooperation between Vancouver Island University

I.K. Gujral Punjab State Technical Universities

This Agreement is signed by the official representatives of the Government of Punjab of Punjab, India and Vancouver Island University, Nanaimo, British Columbia, Canada with the objective of promoting and expanding international understanding by stimulating and supporting educational, professional and intercultural activities and projects among students and staff of the two institutions and the respective communities that support them.

This Agreement will be effective from the date of signing by both parties for five years and will automatically extend for additional five-year periods unless terminated by either party. Either party may terminate this Agreement by giving ninety (90) days prior written notice to the other party by personal delivery or courier to the attention of the party's representative below.

This Agreement may be amended or modified by mutual agreement in writing signed by the parties.







4.1. Each Home Institution will send up to 1 Full Time Equivalent (FTE) to the Host Institution each Academic Year commencing with the 2018-2019 Academic Year. This number may be changed by the mutual consent of the two Parties.

4.2. For the purpose of accounting and managing the flow of Exchange Students each Exchange Student registered at the Host Institution shall be counted as one "Unit of Exchange" (0.5FTE) when attending part of or an entire normal academic term, or two "Units of Exchange" (1.0 FTE) when attending for a normal Academic Year. The

Liaison Officers of the two institutions shall review the program annually to determine any imbalance in the FTE student count, and adjust the numbers of students exchanged to maintain a reasonable balance in the Exchange. The balanced is reached by an average number of students of each side, or the payment of the differences in tuition and international fees to the Host Institution by the Home institution.

- 4.3. The Home Institution shall nominate students (a "Nominated Student") for Exchange at the Host Institution who meet the following criteria:

6.1. No Exchange Student shall have a term at the Host Institution which exceeds either two terms or the equivalent of one Academic Year.

6.2. Any extension of the Exchange beyond the number of Units of Exchange that were originally agreed on in regards to the specific Exchange Student shall be approved

in writing by the Liaison Officer from each of Concordia and the IKGPTU.

6.3. The Host Institution shall provide the Exchange Student with an official transcript of his or her academic record as soon as possible after the completion of that student's Exchange. Exchange Students at Concordia must formally request that the Registrar's Office forward copies of their transcript to their Home Institution; transcripts will not be sent without the consent of the Exchange Student.

6.4. Exchange Students shall be considered non-degree seeking Students by the Host

Institution, and:

 Concordia shall provide visiting Exchange Students participating in an undergraduate program with a designation of visiting student;



- B. In order to facilitate future institutional cooperation, the parties hereto wish to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding ("MoU").

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. Objective. The objective of this MOU is to outline the possible ways in which Medicine Hat College and I.K.Gujral Punjab Technical University Jalandhar, could develop and carry out collaborative activities.
- 2. Scope of Activities. The scope of collaboration under this MOU may include, but is not limited to:
 - a) exchange of faculty members and administrators
 - b) undergraduate and graduate student mobility
 - c) joint projects related to applied research, teaching and faculty development
 - d) development of joint initiatives with partner institutions, including joint or collaborative courses
 - e) opportunities for full-degree fee paying undergraduate/graduate study.
- 3. Not Legally Binding. This MOU is not intended to be and is not to be construed as a legally binding agreement. Signing of this MOU does not result in any material, financial or other obligation for either of the parties hereto. By signing this MOU, the parties are signifying their desire for future collaboration. Specific initiatives may be considered and agreed upon, on a case by case basis, including the contributions and obligations of each institution. Each such initiative shall be negotiated between and have the mutual agreement of the partners, and shall be formalized by a signed appendix to this general agreement.
- 4. Term. This MOU is effective for a period of 5 (five) years from the date the MOU is signed by both parties. It may be extended or amended with the written agreement of both parties and may be terminated by either party with 6 (six) months' written notice to the other party. MEMORAANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

NOTTINGHAM TRENT UNIVERSITY and I K GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, JALANDHAR

BETWEEN:

- Nottingham Trent University of 50 Shakespeare Street, Nottingham, NG1 4FQ, United Kingdom ("NTU");
- (2) I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University of Jalandhar- Kapurthala Highway, Kapurthala-144603, Punjab, India ("IKGPTU"); and

Also herein after referred to as the Parties.

- Aims
- 1.1 The Parties wish to explore further opportunities for collaboration in teaching and research. The aim of this Memorandum is to provide a framework within which the Parties will seek to develop a long-term collaborative relationship.
- 2. Status of this Memorandum
- Other than paragraphs 6, 7 and 8, this Memorandum is not intended to be and is not legally binding. If, as a result of further discussion, the Parties agree to collaborate in any of the activities anticipated in this Memorandum, the Parties shall enter into a formal and legally binding agreement, setting out the rights and obligations of each party in relation to that activity.
- Areas of potential collaboration
- 3.1 Subject to paragraph 3.2, the Parties will explore opportunities for potential collaboration in the following areas:
- (a) exchange of information on course development and teaching methods;
- (b) exchange of staff and students;
- (c) development of joint research projects;
- (d) development of progression routes from courses of IKGPTU to courses leading to awards of NTU;
- (e) any other areas which may promote the academic interests of the Parties in research and/or teaching.
- The development of a collaborative relationship between the Parties is subject to:

- (a) the approval of the relevant authorities of both NTU and IKGPTU. In particular, approval by NTU of IKGPTU as a collaborative partner and approval of any courses leading to awards of (or credit towards an award of) NTU is subject to the procedures set out in NTU's Academic Standards and Quality Handbook; and
- obtaining all necessary or advisable governmental, regulatory or other relevant approvals, consents or licences.

4. Financial implications

4.1 Each party shall be responsible for its own costs incurred in connection with this Memorandum. NTU and IKGPTU shall, where possible, explore opportunities for external funding of the collaborative activities anticipated in this Memorandum.

Exchange of information

5.1 Each party will exchange information with the other with a view to understanding whether it would be effective and practical for the institutions to work together.

6. Confidentiality

This Memorandum and any information provided in connection with it may not be disclosed to any third party other than (a) the parties' professional advisers; (b) as required by law or a relevant regulatory authority; (c) with the prior written consent of the other party; or (d) where the information has come into the public domain through no fault of the party wishing to disclose it.

7. Intellectual Property

7.1 Unless agreed otherwise in writing, any Intellectual Property rights belonging to the Parties, whether in existence at the date of this Memorandum or created during the course of it, shall belong to the respective Parties.

8. Publicity

- 8.1 The Parties will not include the name or logo of the other Party in any advertising or publicity material without the prior approval of the other Party on a case-by-case basis.
- 8.2 Neither Party will do anything which, in the reasonable opinion of the other, would damage the other's reputation and/or business.

Disputes

- 9.1 The Parties shall attempt to resolve in good faith any dispute arising between them out of the operation of this Memorandum. If the dispute cannot be resolved informally, it shall be referred to the Pro Vice-Chancellor International, of NTU and the Vice-Chancellor of IKGPTU.
- 9.2 In the event of any dispute regarding the performance of NTU's obligations under this Agreement the governing law shall be England. In the event of any dispute regarding the performance of PTU's obligations under this Agreement the governing law shall be India.
- 9.3 Any dispute arising out of the operation of this Memorandum shall be finally settled by arbitration under the Rules of Arbitration, and Conciliation of the

International Chamber of Commerce by two or more arbitrators appointed under those rules. The place of arbitration shall be London and the language of the proceedings shall be English.

- 10. Duration, termination and review
- This Memorandum shall commence on the date set out on the first page and shall continue for a period of 3 years. It may be extended by the written agreement of both Parties.
- 10.2 Either Party may terminate this Memorandum at any time by giving to the other not less than 6 months' notice in writing, or with immediate effect by written notice if the other Party fails to comply with its obligations under this Memorandum. Termination of this Memorandum shall be without prejudice to any other collaborative arrangement between the Parties.
- 10.3 The Parties shall review the operation of this Memorandum on an annual basis.

- I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University Jalandhar of Ibban, Kapurthala-144603, Kapurthala, Punjab, INDIA ("IKGPTU"

Individually a "Party" and together "the Parties"

1. Background

- 1.1 NTU is a higher education corporation incorporated in the United Kingdom under the Education Reform Act 1988.
- 1.2 IKGPTU is a State Technical University Est. under Punjab Technical University Act, 1996 (Punjab Act No. 1 of 1997).
- 1.3 NTU and IKGPTU have agreed to enter into an arrangement on the terms set out in this Agreement whereby students of IKGPTU who successfully complete certain courses at IKGPTU are eligible for entry to the start of a specified NTU course.

2. Interpretation

2.1 In this Agreement the following words and expressions have the following meanings, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Academic Year"	a year beginning on 1 September of any calendar year and ending on 31 August of the following calendar year;
"Confidential Information"	all secret or confidential commercial, financial and technical information, know-how, trade secrets, inventions, computer software and any other information in any form or medium, whether disclosed orally or in writing, together with all reproductions in any form or medium, and any part(s) of it;
"Force Majeure"	any event outside the reasonable control of either Party affecting its ability to perform any of its obligations (other than payment) under this Agreement;
"IKGPTU Course"	the IKGPTU course or courses as set out in Schedule 1, as amended and restated from time to time.
"Intellectual Property"	all inventions, patents, trade marks, registered designs and any pending applications for any of the foregoing, unregistered design rights arising at common law, design rights, copyrights (including future copyrights), database

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rights, know-how, trade secrets, Confidential Information and any other intellectual property rights;

"NTU Course"

the NTU course or courses set out in Schedule 1, as amended and restated from time to time;

"Progress"

progression by a Student from a IKGPTU Course to the start of a NTU Course, and "Progression" shall be construed accordingly;

"Student"

a student or students registered on the IKGPTU Course;

- 2.2 The headings in this Agreement are for convenience only and do not affect its interpretation.
- 2.3 References to clauses or schedules are references to clauses or schedules of this Agreement.
- 2.4 References to any statutory or other legislative provision shall be interpreted as a reference to that provision from time to time amended, extended or reenacted.
- 2.5 References to any governmental, regulatory or other similar body shall be interpreted as including a reference to any successor organisation.

Approval

- 3.1 This Agreement is conditional upon and shall not commence unless and until:
 - (a) NTU has approved IKGPTU and the IKGPTU Course as a progression route to the NTU Course; and
 - (b) IKGPTU has provided written confirmation, which is satisfactory to NTU, that it has obtained all necessary or advisable governmental, regulatory or other approvals or consents relevant to this Agreement.

4. Progression

- 4.1 NTU has reviewed the content and standards of the IKGPTU Course and agrees that Students who have successfully completed the IKGPTU Course shall, from the date of this Agreement, be eligible to apply to Progress onto the start of the relevant NTU Course as set out in Schedule 1.
- The entry criteria, including English language requirements, for the NTU Course are set out in Schedule 1. NTU shall retain responsibility for the determination of entry criteria and the acceptability of the entry qualifications of all Students who seek to Progress to a NTU Course.
- 4.3 NTU shall consider all applications from Students to Progress on their individual merits, against NTU's admissions criteria and in accordance with any application rules or UK legislation. NTU's decision as to a Student's suitability for Progression is final.

5. Quality assurance

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- 5.1 This Agreement is based on the NTU Course as currently offered by NTU. NTU will inform IKGPTU about any changes to the NTU Course which may affect the Progression of Students.
- This Agreement is based on the current curriculum for the IKGPTU Course, as approved by NTU. IKGPTU shall ensure that academic equivalency and comparable learning outcomes are maintained throughout the term of this Agreement
- Any changes made by IKGPTU to the IKGPTU Course must be notified to NTU prior to the Progression of Students to the NTU Course. Any breach of this clause is a material breach for the purposes of clause 18.2(a).
- 5.4 IKGPTU shall provide NTU with a copy of the annual report for the IKGPTU Course as prepared under its quality assurance procedures, together with any other relevant information about the operation of the IKGPTU Course.

Monitoring and review

- 6.1 IKGPTU will keep such records relating to the IKGPTU Course and this Agreement as required from time to time by any relevant regulatory body and will allow access by NTU or those auditing NTU processes to such records for academic or quality audit purposes.
- 6.2 NTU will carry out an annual monitoring review of this Agreement. IKGPTU will at its own expense co-operate fully with NTU in any review process and will comply with any requirements imposed by NTU as part of that review.

Promotion of the NTU Course and other services

- 7.1 IKGPTU shall be responsible for promoting and marketing the opportunity for Students to Progress to the NTU Course and for providing information requested by Students wishing to Progress, but NTU may also, at its discretion, promote and market the opportunity for Progression.
- 7.2 IKGPTU will provide advice and guidance to Students wishing to undertake the NTU Course using only such official NTU promotional recruitment and admission criteria and information as provided by NTU to IKGPTU from time to time.
- 7.3 IKGPTU shall not present misleading or false information about NTU to Students or represent itself as acting as an agent of NTU.
- 7.4 IKGPTU will make Students aware that they are responsible for their own financial support including the payment of tuition fees to NTU.
- 7.5 IKGPTU will make Students aware that it is their responsibility to ensure that they meet the formal entry and extension (where appropriate) requirements set out in immigration legislation for entry into the UK prior to application and for the duration of their studies at NTU. With regard to entry into the UK, Students must provide the Visas and Immigration Control with appropriate documentary evidence to confirm their status.
- 7.6 NTU will provide information about accommodation in Nottingham for Students who are offered a place on the NTU Course, either in NTU halls of residence or in NTU approved private accommodation.
- 7.7 During the continuation of this Agreement each Party may use the other's name and logo in connection with Progression but in doing so must comply with any

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requirements as to the use of that name or logo notified to it by the other Party and shall forthwith on demand by the other Party cease any use of that name or logo which the other Party believes is damaging to its reputation.

7.8 Neither Party will do anything which, in the reasonable opinion of the other, would damage the other's reputation and/or business.

8. Arrangements for the admission of Students to NTU

- 8.1 On receipt of a formal application from Students who meet the entry criteria for the NTU Course, NTU shall inform IKGPTU of Students holding offers for entry to NTU.
- 8.2 IKGPTU shall provide accurate academic transcripts and inform NTU of Students' final grades, as they become available. NTU shall, after due consideration of those Students who do not meet the terms of entry or a conditional offer, provide IKGPTU with a definitive list of Students accepted for entry to NTU, subject to clause 8.3below.
- 8.3 NTU shall inform directly those Students who meet the required standards but whose International English Language Testing System (IELTS) examination score is below that required for entry to the NTU Course that they will be required to attend a pre-sessional English language course at NTU for an agreed period of time.
- 8.4 IKGPTU shall inform all successful Students that they will be required to attend the general NTU orientation course prior to the start of the academic year.

Exchange of information

- 9.1 The Parties agree to share statistical information on the number of Students who have Progressed to NTU from IKGPTU with a list of NTU Courses being studied which IKGPTU may use as part of its recruitment and marketing activities.
- 9.2 NTU will host agreed visits for staff and Students of IKGPTU (as agreed in advance of such visits between the Parties) to promote NTU's facilities to Students.
- 9.3 Each Party shall appoint a member of staff to act as the main contact with the other Party for the purposes of this Agreement.

Financial arrangements

10.1 Unless otherwise agreed between the Parties, each Party shall be responsible for its own costs and expenses incurred in connection with this Agreement.

11. Ownership of Intellectual Property

- Unless otherwise agreed in writing all materials relating to the NTU Course and the IKGPTU Course (and any Intellectual Property rights in them), whether in existence at the date of this Agreement or created during the course of it, shall belong respectively to NTU and IKGPTU.
- Any other materials relating to this Agreement (and any Intellectual Property rights in such materials), whether in existence at the date of this Agreement or created during the course of it, shall belong to the Party creating them. If any such materials are created jointly by NTU and IKGPTU those materials (and any

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Intellectual Property in such materials) shall be owned jointly by NTU and IKGPTU.

If either Party becomes aware of any potential infringement of the other Party's name, logo or Intellectual Property rights, or becomes aware of any allegation that any of the Party's materials infringe the rights of a third party, it shall immediately inform the other Party. Each Party will provide the other with such reasonable assistance as the other may request in connection with any action it may take in respect of such potential infringement.

12. Confidentiality

- 12.1 The Parties shall keep and procure to be kept strictly confidential all Confidential Information received or obtained as a result of entering into or performing this Agreement and shall use such Confidential Information only for the purposes of this Agreement.
- 12.2 Either Party may disclose information which would otherwise be Confidential Information if and to the extent:
 - (a) required by law or by any relevant regulatory body;
 - (b) disclosed on a strictly confidential basis to the professional advisers, auditors and bankers of that Party;
 - (c) the information has come into the public domain through no fault of that Party; or
 - (d) the other Party has given prior written approval of the disclosure.

13. Data protection

- 13.1 Each Party acknowledges and agrees that the Parties will share Personal Data under this Agreement and as such each Party shall ensure that, prior to providing any Personal Data to the other Party, it has all appropriate legal bases (whether consent or otherwise) necessary to enable lawful transfer of Personal Data to the other Party. Once such Personal Data has been provided to the other Party, the Parties acknowledge and agree that each Party shall act as separate Data Controllers when Processing such Personal Data and:
 - 13.1.1 IKGPTU shall be a Data Controller where it is Processing Personal Data for the purpose of its relationship with each Student;
 - 13.1.2 NTU shall be a Data Controller where it is Processing Personal Data for the purpose of the NTU Course;
 - 13.1.3 the Parties do not anticipate that either will act as a Data Processor on behalf of the other Party and neither Party is authorised or instructed to act as a Data Processor on behalf of each other; and
 - 13.1.4 the Parties will not act as joint Data Controllers in common.
- Each Party shall ensure that it complies with its respective obligations under the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679 and the Data Protection Act 2018 and any applicable local legislation.

14. Freedom of Information

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- 14.1 IKGPTU acknowledges that NTU is subject to the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOIA") and of the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 ("the EIR") and IKGPTU shall assist and co-operate with NTU (at IKGPTU's own expense) to enable NTU to comply with these information disclosure requirements.
- 14.2 Where a request for information under the FOIA and/or the EIR is submitted to NTU concerns information held by IKGPTU, IKGPTU shall provide NTU with a copy of all the information requested in its possession or power in the form requested within five working days of the request for the information (or such other period as may be specified).
- 14.3 IKGPTU further acknowledges that NTU may be required to disclose information concerning IKGPTU and/or this Agreement in discharging its obligations under the FOIA and/or the EIR. NTU, having used reasonable endeavours to consult with IKGPTU and having considered its views, shall be responsible for determining at its absolute discretion, whether the information should be disclosed under the FOIA and/or the EIR or whether an exemption from disclosure applies.
- 15. Anti-Bribery
- 15.1 IKGPTU shall:
- (a) comply with all Relevant Requirements;
- not engage in any activity, practice or conduct which would constitute an offence under sections 1, 2 or 6 of the Bribery Act 2010 if such activity, practice or conduct had been carried out in the UK;
- (c) have and shall maintain in place throughout the term of this Agreement its own policies and procedures, including Adequate Procedures to ensure compliance with the Relevant Requirements and this clause 15, and will enforce them where appropriate;
- (d) procure and ensure that all of its Associated Persons and/or other persons who are performing services and/or providing goods in connection with this Agreement comply with this clause 15.
- 15.2 Breach of this clause 15 shall be deemed to be a material breach which is not capable of remedy.
- 15.3 For the purpose of this clause 15, the following terms have the meaning set out next to them:
 - "Adequate Procedures" shall be determined in accordance with section 7(2) of the Bribery Act 2010 (and any guidance issued under section 9 of that Act).
 - "Associated Person" shall have the meaning ascribed to it in section 8 of the Bribery Act and shall include but is not limited to any employees, agents and/or subcontractors of the relevant Party.
 - "Bribery Act" shall mean the Bribery Act 2010 (and any amendment thereto).
 - "Foreign Official" shall be determined in accordance with section 6(5) of the

"Relevant Requirements" shall mean all applicable laws, statutes, regulations, and codes relating to anti-bribery and anti-corruption including but not limited to the Bribery Act.

16. Prevent

- 16.1 IKGPTU acknowledges that NTU is subject to the Counter Terrorism and Security Act 2015 (the "**Prevent Duty**") which requires it to act to deal with the present and growing threat of terrorism within the UK, treat security with the utmost importance and recognise the need to tackle terrorism and, where possible, to prevent individuals including students from being drawn into terrorism.
- Where NTU has any concerns about a Student or becomes aware of any other matters which may require it to take action in accordance with the Prevent Duty it shall notify IKGPTU, and IKGPTU shall at the request of NTU provide NTU with a copy of all relevant information which is available to it in the form NTU requires and shall provide all necessary assistance requested by NTU to report and/or take such action.
- 16.3 NTU shall be responsible for determining in its absolute discretion what action it needs to take and IKGPTU acknowledges that NTU may be obliged under the Prevent Duty to disclose such information following consultation with IKGPTU and having taken its views into account.

17. Regulatory

- 17.1 IKGPTU shall ensure that it complies with all local legislation and/or other regulatory requirements relevant to this Agreement, and in particular that all necessary or advisable governmental, regulatory or other approvals or consents (whether required at the time this Agreement was entered into or from a later date) are secured and maintained for the duration of this Agreement.
- 17.2 The Parties will comply with any requirements or guidance relevant to this Agreement issued by the Higher Education Funding Council for England, the Quality Assurance Agency or any other regulatory body.

18. Duration and termination of this Agreement

- 18.1 This Agreement shall commence on 1 September 2019 and shall continue for a period of 3 Academic Years until 31 August 2022, unless terminated before that time in accordance with this clause. After this period the Agreement may be renewed for the same or similar period subject to the joint agreement of both Parties.
- 18.2 Either Party may terminate this Agreement:
 - (a) by giving to the other not less than 6months' notice in writing;
 - (a) with immediate effect by notice in writing if the other Party commits a material breach (which may consist of a series of minor breaches) of the terms of this Agreement which (if capable of remedy) it fails to remedy within 30 days of receipt of a notice requiring such breach to be remedied;
 - (b) with immediate effect by notice in writing if the other Party is subject to a change of control, becomes insolvent, is unable to pay its debts as and when due or otherwise ceases to exist.

Consequences of termination

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- 19.1 If the term of this Agreement as set out in clause 18.1 has come to an end without it being renewed, or if notice of termination has been given under clause 18.2:
 - (a) IKGPTU shall cease to promote or market the IKGPTU Course as providing a Progression opportunity to the NTU Course;
 - (b) each Party shall cease using the name and/or logo of the other;
 - (c) unless agreed otherwise in writing, the Parties shall return at their own expense any documents and other materials relating to the Course to the relevant Party.
- The termination of this Agreement, however it arises, is without prejudice to the rights, duties and liabilities of the Parties accrued prior to termination. The clauses of this Agreement which expressly or implicitly have effect after termination will continue to be enforceable notwithstanding termination.

20. Force Majeure

- 20.1 If either Party is affected by Force Majeure it shall immediately provide the other Party with details in writing and shall keep the other party fully informed of the continuance of the Force Majeure and of any change in circumstances.
- 20.2 If the Force Majeure continues for longer than three months either Party may at any time, whilst such Force Majeure continues, terminate this Agreement by notice in writing.
- Save as provided for in this clause Force Majeure shall not entitle either Party to terminate this Agreement and neither Party shall be in breach of this Agreement, nor otherwise liable to the other, by reason of any delay in performance, or non-performance of any of its obligations due to Force Majeure.

21. Disputes

- The Parties shall attempt to resolve in good faith any dispute arising between them out of the operation of this Agreement. If the dispute cannot be resolved informally, it shall be referred to the Head of College (Business Law and Social Sciences) of NTU and the Registrar at IKGPTU.
- 21.2 If the matter is not resolved through negotiation either Party may refer the matter to mediation, and the parties will attempt in good faith to resolve the dispute through mediation in accordance with the model procedure of the Centre for Effective Dispute Resolution.
- 21.3 The Parties agree to co-operate in dealing with or defending any claim by a third party arising out of the operation of this Agreement.

22. Law and jurisdiction

- This Agreement and any dispute or claim (including non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of it or its subject matter or formation shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of England.
- Subject to clause 22.3 any dispute or claim (including non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of the operation of this Agreement shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

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22.3 If IKGPTU has no assets within the jurisdiction of the English courts and is established in a jurisdiction which will not enforce the judgment of the English courts then any dispute or claim (including non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of the operation of this Agreement shall be finally settled by arbitration under the Rules of Arbitration and Conciliation of the International Chamber of Commerce by two or more arbitrators appointed under those rules. The place of arbitration shall be London and the language of the proceedings shall be English.

23. Indemnity and insurance

- 23.1 IKGPTU agrees to indemnify NTU against all actions, claims, proceedings, costs, expenses, loss or damage of whatsoever kind (including legal fees) sustained by NTU in respect of or arising out of any breach of IKGPTU's obligations under this Agreement.
- 23.2 NTU agrees to indemnify IKGPTU against all actions, claims, proceedings, costs, expenses, loss or damage of whatsoever kind (including legal fees) sustained by IKGPTU in respect of or arising out of any breach of NTU's obligations under this Agreement.
- 23.3 IKGPTU agrees to maintain appropriate insurance to cover its liabilities under this Agreement.

24. Limitation of liability

- NTU shall not be liable to IKGPTU in contract, tort (including negligence) and/or breach of statutory duty for any loss or damage which IKGPTU may suffer by reason of any act, omission, neglect or default (including negligence) in the performance of this Agreement by NTU, its servants or agents, in a sum which is greater than the total amount of the fees paid by IKGPTU.
- 24.2 Nothing in this clause shall operate so as to exclude:
 - (a) NTU's non-excludable liability in respect of death or personal injury caused by its negligence or the negligence of its servants or agents; or
 - (b) liability for fraudulent misrepresentation.

25. General provisions

- 25.1 This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties in relation to its subject matter and supersedes all prior agreements, understandings or discussions between the Parties in relation thereto.
- 25.2 A variation to this Agreement will not be valid unless made in writing and signed by both Parties.
- Any notice given in connection with this Agreement must be in writing and delivered by or by first class pre-paid recorded delivery (or international equivalent) to the address given in this Agreement, or to another address notified by either Party for the purposes of serving notices. A notice will be deemed to have been served two days after posting if sent by first class pre-paid recorded delivery (or seven days if by international equivalent). If notice is deemed to have been given on a day that is not a normal business day of the recipient, it shall be deemed to have been given on the next normal business day.

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- 25.4 The rights and remedies of each Party under this Agreement shall not be diminished, waived or extinguished by any failure or delay by that party to exercise such a right or remedy.
- The provisions of this Agreement are severable and distinct from one another, and if at any time any provision is or becomes invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the validity, legality or enforceability of the other provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired.
- 25.6 This Agreement may be executed by each party on separate counterparts.
- For the avoidance of doubt, nothing in this Agreement shall confer on any third party any benefit or the right to enforce any provision of this Agreement.
- Nothing in this Agreement shall create or be deemed to create a partnership, joint venture or relationship of principal and agent between the Parties.
- 25.9 The Parties shall not assign, transfer or sub-contract any of their rights and responsibilities under this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- 25.10 [The English language version of this Agreement shall be regarded as the authoritative version notwithstanding that it may be translated into another language.]

MEMORANDUUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (hereafter referred to as "MOU") is entered into effect on 9th February, 2019.

BY AND BETWEEN THE FOLLOWING PARTIES:

I. K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar, established by an Act of State Legislature on 16th January, 1997, to promote technical, management and pharmaceutical education in the state at degree level and above, having its address at Jalandhar - Kapurthala Highway, VPO-Ibban, Kapurthala-144603, Distt. Kapurthala, represented for the purposes of the MOU by its Dean, Planning and External Programs, Dr. N. P. Singh (hereinafter referred to as "IKGPTU")

and

- Leaders Institute Pty Ltd, ABN 605 807 305, a higher education provider in Australia, registered under the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency Act 2011, and whose academic programs are accredited by the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency, having its address at 76 Park Road, Woolloongabba, Qld, 4102, Australia; P.O. Box 73, Stones Corner, Qld, 4120, Australia, represented for the purposes of this MOU by its Chief Executive Officer Dr. Rodney (Rod) St Hill (hereinafter referred to as "Leaders")

IKGPTU and Leaders may individually be referred to as "Party" and collectively as "Parties".

PREAMBLE

Whereas, in accordance with a mutual desire between the Parties to promote further cooperation in education, training and research between IKGPTU and Leaders.

Therefore, it is hereby agreed as follows:

- 1. The preamble is an integral part of the present MOU.
- 2. 2.1 Both Parties agree on the following general forms of cooperation:
 - a) Joint educational, training and/or research activities.
 - b) Exchange of invitations to faculty, research personnel, graduate and undergraduate students (hereinafter referred to as "Scholars") for lectures, visits and sharing of experiences.
 - c) Exchange of invitations to Scholars for participation in conferences, symposia and seminars.

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- d) Exchange of Scholars for study, training and research.
- 2.2 The details of cooperation for any of the above-identified fields may also be specified in the form of addenda or subsequent agreements to this MOU upon signature by appropriate representatives.
- 3. 3.1 It is agreed between the Parties that exchange of Scholars will be subject to the rules and regulations of the host Party and country. Scholars must fulfil existing visa requirements and submit evidence of adequate medical and travel insurances stating a waiver of subrogation against the host Party for any reason whatsoever. The above-mentioned documents are subject to a prior written approval from the host Party.
 - 3.2 Each Party undertake on behalf of their Scholars (i) to comply with the other Party's policies and procedures regarding the use of their premises and facilities in a reasonable manner and (ii) to avoid any unethical behaviors.
 - 3.3 Both Parties agree in their respective Bylaws or Policies on the principles of equal opportunity and non-discrimination. Neither Party shall impose criteria for exchanges of Scholars, which would violate the principles of nondiscrimination
- 4. Both Parties agree that this MOU does not commit either Party to financial liability and all financial arrangements that are necessary to implement this MOU will depend upon the availability of funds and will be subject to negotiations and separate written agreements.
- 5. The MOU is valid for a term of five (5) years from the Effective Date. All provisions will automatically expire if no specific agreement related to the above four areas of cooperation (cf. article 2) is not signed within 18 (eighteen) months following the Effective Date.

 Unless automatically expired, this MOU may be renewed before the termination date on 9th February, 2024; by virtue of an addendum to be signed in due course. Either Party may terminate this MOU by giving written notice of ninety (90) days to the other Party. In the event of early termination, the Parties will make good faith efforts to complete or terminate existing projects or engagements without substantial prejudice to the other Party. Subject to any applicable legal or regulatory requirements or restrictions, any existing project or engagement that is in effect at the time of termination shall not be affected by the termination of this MOU and will proceed as originally agreed upon until successful completion.
- 6. For purposes of implementing this MOU, the contact persons will be as follows unless the concerned Party notifies the other in writing of a new contact person:

Each Party shall protect and keep confidential any documents and information exchanged between the Parties pursuant to this MOU and/or to subsequent correspondence, addenda and/or written agreements. Each Party shall in all respects treat such documents and information as carefully as that accorded to their own confidential information. At the termination of the MOU or within fifteen (15) working days of receipt of a written request, each Party will return to the other Party all documents and information disclosed to them under this MOU, including but not limited to all printed or reproduced material and information stored in electronic form or other form. This obligation of confidentiality shall survive the expiration or termination of the present MOU for any reason whatsoever.
- Each Party shall not use the name and/or logo of the other Party in any publication, advertising, promotional material, press release, or other marketing material, without the express prior written consent of the other Party to each particular use of its name and/or logo.
- 9. If and whenever either Party is in breach of any obligation under this MOU and/or any subsequent addenda or agreement, the other Party shall send a written notice to the breaching Party in order to remedy such a situation within 15 (fifteen) working days. If the breaching situation is not remedied accordingly, the present MOU and/or any subsequent addenda or agreement shall be terminated on the full liability of the breaching Party who shall incur the damages against all losses, costs and/or expenses arising from or in connection with their breach.
- Each Party shall not assign or transfer any of their rights and/or obligations under this MOU to any third party without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- 11. The present MOU is the entire understanding between the Parties and supersedes all prior understandings, correspondence and agreements, whether verbal or written between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. The terms of the MOU may be amended only by mutual written consent.

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the Board of Trustees of Northern Illinois University, located in DeKalb, Illinois, 60115 USA ("NIU"), functioning through its Division of International Affairs, and I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar-Kapurthala Highway, Kapurthala, Punjab, India (IKGPTU). NIU and IKGPTU are collectively referred to herein as "institutions" and individually as "institution".

NIU and IKGPTU wish to expand scholarly ties and promote closer academic collaboration and therefore agree as follows:

- Both institutions are united by common interests and objectives in educational exchange, and they wish to maintain and promote channels of communication that permit those mutual exchanges.
- This Agreement will govern the general framework for academic exchanges between NIU
 and University. Individual working agreements, should they arise, will be executed for
 specific projects under this Agreement.
- The individual working agreement(s) referred to in paragraph 2 may be developed for, but need not be limited to, the exchange of faculty and students.
- 4. Each institution will be responsible for the travel costs of its own faculty or officials involved in mutual exchange activities under this Agreement.
- 5. Each institution will take action to make the substance of this Agreement known to its appropriate personnel, and will provide normal and reasonable assistance to such personnel in regard to the administrative details of exchanges and work agreements.
- 6. Each institution will appoint a liaison. The liaisons will, together, be responsible for tracking cooperative efforts, facilitating mutual assistance, and making an annual report to both institutions of the previous year's joint activities and the initiatives in progress for the next year.

- 7. This Agreement shall commence on May 15, 2019 ("Effective Date") and terminate three years from the Effective Date, unless earlier terminated or renewed as provided for herein. This Agreement shall not take effect until it is signed by both parties. It may be renewed for an additional term of three years by an exchange of letters between the NIU Executive Vice President and Provost or Associate Vice President for International Affairs and the appropriate official of University (the "Authorized Representatives") or other document evidencing intent to renew signed by the Authorized Representatives. Either party may terminate this Agreement upon prior written notice to the other party.
- Any modifications to this Agreement shall be in writing and signed by the Authorized Representatives.
- This Agreement does not oblige either IKGPTU or NIU to undertake any financial expenditures or other contractual obligations.
- The assignment of this Agreement to any other party or parties is expressly prohibited except with the written concurrence by the appropriate authorities of both NIU and IKGPTU.
- 11. The English version of this Agreement shall be the authoritative version of the Agreement for all purposes. In the event of a conflict between the English version and any translation of this Agreement, the English version shall control.
- 12. The parties are independent contractors with respect to each other, and a party shall not be deemed, nor hold itself out as being, a partner, joint venturer, employee or agent of the other party.
- 13. Neither party shall issue any press release or other public announcement relating to this

Agreement or the activities contemplated by this Agreement or use the other party's name, logos, marks or any other trade designations (including, but not limited to, on its website, in printed materials or in any other manner) or any other intellectual property of the other party (collectively, "Institutional IP") without the prior written approval of such party, which approval may be withheld for any reason. Any approved use of Institutional IP shall be subject to compliance with all of the approving party's requirements, specifications and brand guidelines pertaining to the use of such Institutional IP. Each party shall comply with all reasonable requests from the other in the event any use of Institutional IP does not meet the reasonable expectations of the approving party. Neither party shall acquire or claim any right, title, interest or ownership rights of any nature whatsoever in any Institutional IP of the other party by virtue of this Agreement and shall cease use of any Institutional IP of the other party upon such party's request or upon termination of this Agreement. Any use of the other party's Institutional IP in a manner not authorized herein

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- is a violation of this Agreement. Any and all goodwill that may result from use of the Institutional IP shall inure to the benefit of the owner of the Institutional IP.

The parties further agree that any xerographically or electronically reproduced copy of this fully executed Agreement shall have the same legal force and effect as any copy bearing original signatures of the parties.
- 15. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties; and any future agreement, understanding, or waiver, to be binding upon the parties must be reduced to writing and signed by the Authorized Representatives.

- The activities to be initiated in order to realize these objectives shall be determined in each case through particular agreements, in accordance with the rules and regulations of each institution, and subject to available funding by each party.
- Representatives of the parties to the agreement shall consult, at regular intervals, to consider the progress of mutual programs and to evaluate future projects.







5. This agreement shall be valid for five years from the date of signing and may be automatically renewed for successive five-year periods. Should one of the parties wish to terminate the agreement, such notice should be given in writing at least six months prior to the termination period.

The details concerning the various programs discussed per department will be confirmed through the Memorandum of Agreement.

This agreement shall take effect after both parties have signed the agreement and have exchanged signed copies.






b. Encourage Cambridge English examinations are taken by students at the IKGPTU.

This MoU may be executed in one or more counterparts each of which when executed and delivered electronically or in hardcopy shall be deemed an original, but all of which taken together shall constitute one and the same document.

- 1. Aims
- 1.1 The Parties wish to explore further opportunities for collaboration in teaching and research. The aim of this Memorandum is to provide a framework within which the Parties will seek to develop a long-term collaborative relationship.
- 2. Status of this Memorandum
- Other than paragraphs 6, 7 and 8, this Memorandum is not intended to be and is not legally binding. - Areas of potential collaboration

- The Parties will not include the name or logo of the other Party in any 8.1 advertising or publicity material without the prior approval of the other Party on a case-by-case basis.
- Neither Party will do anything which, in the reasonable opinion of the other, 8.2 would damage the other's reputation and/or business.

9. Disputes

GENERAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN IKG PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, JALANDHAR AND SPHAERA PHARMA PRIVATE LIMITED

This General Agreement (hereinafter referred to as the 'Agreement') is made on this 2021 (hereinafter to as the 'effective date') by and between:

Legislature, on the 16th of January 1997 for the promotion of the Technical education (herein after referred to as "IKGPTU", which expression shall include its successor(s), administrator(s) or permitted assignees) of the first part. The University has a mandate to set up centers of Excellence in Emerging Technology (ies) and for promoting Training, Research & Development in the field of the applied sciences and technology. The University is well competently working for providing professional & skill oriented knowledge to the masses. IKGPTU is also promoting a number of courses in different streams in both, regular as well as distance education programs.

AND

SPHAERA PHARMA PRIVATE LIMITED, a company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956, having its registered office situated at A 5/109, Indira Enclave, Neb Sarai, New Delhi-110030 and its corporate office situated at Plot No. 32, Sector-5, IMT Manesar, Gurugram-122051, Haryana; (herein after referred to as "SPHAERA PHARMA" which expression shall include its successors-in-interest, permitted assignees and associate companies) of the **second part**.

Both IKGPTU and SPHAERA PHARMA shall individually be referred to as "Party" and collectively be referred to as "Parties.

WHEREAS:

- A. IKGPTU is a Premier University engaged in education and research in science, pharmaceuticals chemistry, molecular biology, biotechnology, engineering technology, industrial technology, management, information technology, environment, planning, architecture and paramedical sciences.
- B. SPHAERA PHARMA is engaged in the business of drug discovery and development and have research labs at Plot No. 32, Sector-5, IMT Manesar, Haryana-122051

PREAMBLE

IKGPTU and SPHAERA PHARMA are mutually interested to collaborate in academic and research related activities especially in the areas of Pharmaceutical Sciences.

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1. DEFINITIONS:

"Intellectual property (IP)" means any know how, inventions, developments, discoveries, improvements, processes, compositions of matter, formulations, or methods of use, conceived or reduced to practice.

"Public Disclosure" means disclosure of IP, as defined above, to anyone who is not part of the IKGPTU or SPHAERA PHARMA teams associated with work being done under the scope of the Agreement.

"Commercialization" means and includes manufacturing, marketing, promoting, selling and distributing the know-how by utilization of IPR, including making arrangements of any and all kinds with any entity or entities anywhere in the world including sub-licensing in respect to the IP.

2. SCOPE OF THE AGREEMENT AND OBJECTIVES

The scope of collaboration on academic and research activities included in this General Agreement encompasses the following objectives:

Enrollment of SPHAERA PHARMA's scientist(s)/ employee(s) in a Ph.D program at IKGPTU, as part-time students as per the IKGPTU rules.

Exchange of graduate and postgraduate students of IKGPTU in the disciplines of Pharmaceutical/Synthetic Organic chemistry for project work/training at SPHAERA PHARMA.

Sponsorship and pooling of resources for co-operative seminars, workshops and other scientific meetings on topics of mutual interest, as and when deemed feasible.

Exploring the possibilities of carrying out SPHAERA PHARMA sponsored research project(s) at IKGPTU.

Assisting in the development of curriculum of pharma sciences/chemistry courses according to industrial/research lab requirements in order to make student more employable.

3. EXCHANGE OF SPHAERA PHARMA'S SCIENTISTS FOR Ph. D PROGRAM(S)

Both the parties will consider working together in areas of mutual interest.

In the event both parties agree to work together; the concerned scientists of SPHAERA PHARMA and the corresponding faculty members of IKGPTU will formulate joint Research Plan(s) for the joint work on a "case by case" basis, with due approval of the **Joint Steering Committee**.

At any given time, no more than 5 scientists of SPHAERA PHARMA will be registered for the Ph.D. program at IKGPTU.

Requirement for enrolment/registration for Ph.D. Program for SPHAERA PHARMA's scientists at IKGPTU will be as per the ordinance for the 'Doctor of Philosophy' program of IKGPTU.

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The supervisor for SPHAERA PHARMA's scientists enrolling/registering for the Ph.D. will be from IKGPTU. However, there can be a co-supervisor from SPHAERA PHARMA, subject to fulfillment of the requirements of the ordinance for the Doctor of Philosophy at IKGPTU

IKGPTU shall provide experienced faculty for conducting the Ph. D. program, conduct and monitor the research programs, carry out performance evaluation as per its Ph. D. program. All/any examination(s) to be conducted by IKGPTU shall be in the same manner as that carried out for other Ph.D. students admitted by IKGPTU. The Ph. D. Degree shall be awarded by IKGPTU.

IKGPTU shall provide accommodation and other facilities for visiting Ph. D. students of SPHAERA PHARMA, who shall be treated similar to the other Ph.D. students of IKGPTU. Students shall be required to pay actual boarding, lodging, electricity and other applicable charges, as per IKGPTU's rules.

IKGPTU will provide boarding and lodging facilities for the visiting official/s of SPHAERA PHARMA at its campus.

Selection of candidates for Ph. D. Program would be as follows:

Candidates nominated by SPHAERA PHARMA will be registered for Ph. D. as per the Ph.D. admission norms of IKGPTU.

The eligible applicants will submit their application/s as per the Ph.D. rules &

regulations of IKGPTU.

The admission of the candidate would be through the recommendation by the C) admission committee at IKGPTU along with an external guide from SPHAERA PHARMA, if appointed.

The recommendations of the admission committee shall be forwarded for the d) approval and further necessary action as required by the rules at IKGPTU rules. From time to time the Supervisor from SPHAERA PHARMA will interact with the Supervisor from IKGPTU, in order to review the progress of the candidate(s).

The approved candidates then would be required to pay admission fees (prevailing fees payable at IKGPTU) as given in the rules and regulation for Ph.D.: (Annexure: A, attached) to IKGPTU to formally register for the Ph. D. programs of IKGPTU.

IKGPTU will review the background of the candidate for pursuing Ph.D. work in the proposed area and recommend the qualifying papers and any other course. The course work will be conducted at IKGPTU as per applicable norms of IKGPTU. It is hereby clarified and agreed between the Parties that the candidate will be solely liable and responsible for any administrative expenses to be incurred during the term of the Ph. D.program.

The report on the progress of the candidate (s) shall be submitted along with recommendations to IKGPTU as per IKGPTU norms.

All other rules and regulations of IKGPTU for its Ph.D. programs, as stated in Rules & Regulations for the Ph.D. program, shall be applicable to the Ph. Students.

EXCHANGE OF IKGPTU STUDENTS/ TECHNICAL STAFF/ FACULTY MEMBERS

SPHAERA PHARMA agrees to provide training to students, and occasionally to staff and/or technical personnel of IKGPTU within the areas of mutual co-operation based on prior discussions and mutual agreement.

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- At any given time not more than 3 selected students of IKGPTU will be taken up for summer/industrial training at SPHAERA PHARMA.
- The duration of training period for IKGPTU students at SPHAERA PHARMA will preferably be for 3-6 months.
- The technical staff/faculty members deputed by IKGPTU for training shall be governed by SPHAERA PHARMA's rules of conduct.
- Students/staff/faculty undergoing training at SPHAERA PHARMA will execute an individual Confidentiality Agreement with SPHAERA PHARMA and IKGPTU will take reasonable measures in order to ensure that the terms of Confidentiality Agreement are duly implemented and adhered to.

JOINT CONFERENCES/WORKSHOPS/COURSES 5.

Both the parties agree to consider the possibility of holding/conducting joint workshops, conferences, training courses etc. within the areas of mutual co-operation, whenever feasible.

The host institution shall provide accommodation to the participating members.

SPONSORED PROJECT(S) 6.

- SPHAERA PHARMA will consider carrying out Sponsored Research Project(s) with IKGPTU in areas of mutual interest, as and when deemed feasible.

1. Aims

1.1 The Parties wish to explore further opportunities for collaboration in teaching, research and any other area of academic and social relevance. The aim of this Memorandum is to provide a framework within which the Parties will seek to develop a long-term collaborative relationship.

2. Status of this Memorandum

2.1 Other than paragraphs 6 and 7, this Memorandum is not intended to be and is not legally binding. If, as a result of further discussion, the Parties agree to collaborate in any of the activities anticipated in this Memorandum, the Parties shall enter into a formal and legally binding agreement, setting out the rights and obligations of each party in relation to that activity.

3. Areas of potential collaboration

- 3.1 Subject to paragraph 3.2, the Parties will explore opportunities for potential collaboration in the following areas:
- (a) Exchange of information in any area of mutual interest;
- (b) Exchange of faculty/officers/research scholars/students;
- (c) Health awareness, clinics, clinical trials, camps, seminar etc under the ambit of Ayurved.
- (d) Design & delivery of new courses in the field of AYUSH to be jointly disseminated locally & globally.
- Joint academic events and activities, including faculty/administrators professional development, student exchanges and class scheduling;
- (f) development of joint research projects;
- (g) Cultural exchange programmes

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- (h) any other areas which may promote the academic interests of the Parties in research and/or teaching.
- 3.2 The development of a collaborative relationship between the Parties is subject to:
- (a) the approval of the relevant authorities of both IKGPTU and Guru Ravidas Ayurved University, Hoshiarpur; and
- obtaining all necessary or advisable governmental, regulatory or other relevant approvals, consents or licenses.

4. Financial implications

4.1 Each party shall be responsible for its own costs incurred in connection with this Memorandum. Both the parties may where possible, explore opportunities for external funding of the collaborative activities anticipated in this Memorandum.

5. Exchange of information

5.1 Each party will exchange information with the other with a view to understanding whether it would be effective and practical for the institutions to work together.

6. Confidentiality

This Memorandum and any information provided in connection with it may not be disclosed to any third party other than (a) the parties' professional advisers; (b) as required by law or a relevant regulatory authority; (c) with the prior written consent of the other party; or (d) where the information has come into the public domain through no fault of the party wishing to disclose it.

7. Intellectual Property

- 7.1 Unless agreed otherwise in writing, any Intellectual Property rights belonging to the Parties, whether in existence at the date of this Memorandum or created during the course of it, shall belong to the respective Parties.
- 8. Each institution will take action to make the substance of this Agreement known to its appropriate personnel, and will provide normal and reasonable assistance to such personnel in regard to the administrative details of exchanges and work agreements.
- 9. Each institution will appoint a liaison officer. The liaison officer will, together, be responsible for tracking cooperative efforts, facilitating mutual assistance, and making an annual report to both institutions of the previous year's joint activities and the initiatives in progress for the next year.

Disputes

- The Parties shall attempt to resolve in good faith any dispute arising between them out of the operation of this Memorandum. If the dispute cannot be resolved informally, it shall be referred to the Vice-Chancellor of IKGPTU and Vice Chancellor of GRAU for final decision.
- 10.2 Jurisdiction with regard to this MOU shall be Kapurthala Courts.

11. Duration, termination and review

GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, JALANDHAR, hereinafter referred to as IKGPTU, with a registered address atKapurthala- Jalandhar Highway, in Jalandhar(city), India(country), having the identification number A State University established by Govt. of Punjab vide Punjab Act No. 1 of 1997, represented by its Vice-Chancellor, Prof (Dr.) Ajay Kumar Sharma, Vice Chancellor, agree to this Memorandum of Understanding.

AVU and IKGPTU are referred to collectively as "Parties" or individually as "Party".

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) establishes the following:

1st Article

Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to establish a mutually beneficial relationship built on academic, scientific and cultural cooperation as well as to define the areas for fundamental, academic research in which the Parties desire to work together in the future for their mutual benefit to foster a collaborative framework with a view to benefiting from each other's initiatives and working procedures.

Areas of cooperation between AVU and IKGPTU include the exchange of faculty professors, administrative Officersresearchers, students, publications, academic programs and research projects.

2nd Article

Scope

3rdArticle

Implementation of the MOU

- 1 The implementation of this MOU is defined according to every particular case, either by the signing of Specific Cooperation Agreements or by the simple correspondence between the representativesof the Parties.
- 2 The Rector of AVU and the Vice-Chancellor of IKGPTU can, whenever they wish, nominate representatives and give them powers to sign and execute the Agreements concluded under this MOU.
- 3 These agreements take into account the specificities of each action to be taken, in particular regarding the objectives to be defined, the methodologies to be applied, the means to be provided and the financial resources involved.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING



Wilfrid Laurier University (WLU), and I. K. Gujral Punjab Technical University (IKGPTU), wish to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") to promote international and intercultural understanding and academic cooperation and collaboration.

Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to provide a framework for the future development of academic and educational cooperation between the parties as set out below.

- The parties will explore academic and educational activities of mutual interest on the basis of equality and reciprocity and will encourage the following:
 - a) Exchange visits of faculty members, researchers, and administrative staff,
 - Exchange of students, student visitation, and the development of study abroad and short-term programs;
 - c) Assessing the potential for transfer and degree completion programs;
 - d) Organization of conferences, seminars, sports event/competitions, symposia or lectures;
 - e) Exploration of common research interests and other forms of academic collaboration.
- 2. Initial areas of collaboration and cooperation may include, but not be limited to the following:
 - Development of an Articulation Agreement for transfer students from PTU's B. Tech (CSE) to WLU Bachelor of Computer Science degree program under credit transfer program.
 - Development of short-term, customized training workshops for PTU's students, staff, and administrators.
 - c) Collaboration on joint initiatives within the Punjab.
 - Assessment of the potential for a Student Exchange Agreement to enable short-term study/internships.

Tasks for each Party

- 3. Each party agrees to:
 - Maintain regular and reasonable contact with the other party, informing the other party of any relevant changes or developments in relation to this MOU;
 - b) Review this MOU on an annual basis, providing the other party with relevant information and statistics in relation to the purpose; and
 - c) Nominate a senior member of staff to be responsible for overseeing the implementation of this MOU.
- 4. The details of any specific activities based on this MOU will be separately negotiated and agreed to in writing between the parties in a separate agreement.



5. The parties understand that the implementation of any activities stated in Clauses 1, 2 or 3 above shall depend upon the availability of resources and the financial support of each party.

Costs

6. The parties agree that each shall bear its own costs in connection with, or for any work under this MOU, save and except as agreed in writing between the parties. For the avoidance of doubt, each party shall (unless otherwise agreed) meet the travel, accommodation and subsistence costs of their own staff involved in visits to the other party associated with this MOU.

Confidentiality

- 7. Each party shall keep confidential and shall not, without the prior written permission of the other party, disclose to any other institution or organization or other third party any confidential information it acquires from the other party in connection with this MOU, unless such information:
 - a) Is already in, or subsequently enters, the public domain (other than as a result of its disclosure by the receiving party in breach of this clause 5), or
 - b) Is required to be disclosed by law or any legal or regulatory authority, or
 - is already known to the receiving party before the acquisition from the other party (without being subject to any obligations of confidentiality to the other party), or
 - d) Is obtained from a third party in circumstances where no obligation of confidentiality is owed to the other Party in respect of such information.

Each party recognizes and agrees that the other party may have independent obligations under privacy protection legislation, such as *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* and that nothing in this MOU prohibits either party from complying with such obligations. The obligations of the parties under this clause 6, 7 and 8 shall continue following the expiry or termination of this MOU.

Intellectual Property

- 8. Any intellectual property rights owned by a party before the Commencement Date (as defined in clause 12) and during the term of this MOU will remain the property of that party. Nothing contained in this MOU will affect the absolute ownership rights of either party in such party's intellectual property rights. For the avoidance of doubt, no licences are granted under this MOU.
- 9. In the event that either party wishes to use the name and/or logo of the other party for any purposes, including without limitation for the purposes of marketing or recruitment, such party shall obtain the written consent of the other party in advance of such use and (if such consent is given, at the discretion of the other party) shall comply strictly with all of the other party's directions from time to time as to the manner of such use.
- 10. Neither of the Parties shall publish any marketing material relating to this MOU without the prior written consent of the other party, and the parties agree that the wording for any such marketing materials shall be agreed jointly between the parties prior to its use.

Term and Termination

11. This MOU will be effective from the date of the last signature below and shall remain in effect for a period of five (5) years from the date of signing (the

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- "Commencement Date"), unless earlier terminated as outlined below. This MOU may be renewed, in writing, upon the mutual agreement of the parties.
- 12. Either party reserves the right to terminate this MOU upon six months' written notice to the other party.

General

- This MOU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by both parties hereto.
- 14. This MOU shall be executed in English. In the event a translated copy of this MOU exists, the parties agree that the English version shall prevail for the purposes of interpretation.
- 15. This MOU may be signed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. Nothing in this MOU should be construed to obligate the parties to any current or future expenditure or resources, or to enter into contract with one another. - CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION shall mean any proprietary information, data or facts belonging to PARTIES collectively or severally, disclosed by the disclosing party under this agreement or any subsequent agreement, whether in writing, verbal or electronically, irrespective of the medium in which such information is stored, which is marked confidential or with any other words having similar meaning by the disclosing party, or specifically agreed to be kept confidential by the parties, or declared or identified so by the disclosing party before such disclosure or during the discussions.

Further, students of the PTU programs can be admitted to one of the MBA programs at IAU if they satisfy program entry requirements. Successful graduates of the latter program will earn their MBA degree from IAU. IAU offers MBA in various concentrations: General, Agriculture, Hospitality, Management Information Systems, Business Analytics, Human Resource Management, Finance, Healthcare Administration, Marketing, Luxury Brand Management and Logistics Management.

Students must meet all IAU program requirements.

For BBA:

Education: IAU requires either evidence of an earned high school diploma, General Educational Development (GED) tests, ability-to-benefit exam (ATB), or the successful completion of a degree program. The degree must be earned at an appropriately accredited institution or foreign equivalent. Exceptions may be made on a case-by-case basis.

Professional Experience: IAU recommends 1 year of full-time professional experience, in any organization, including, but not limited to, private, public, for-profit, non-profit, start-ups, or established corporate organizations.

Information Technology: IAU requires students to possess computer and internet skills sufficient to effectively participate in IAU's pedagogical model and conduct research at the undergraduate level.

Evidence of English Proficiency: IAU requires writing skills at the appropriate level. Proficiency in reading, writing, speaking, and understanding English is essential to your success at IAU. If English is not the applicant's native language, or if an applicant has not had their secondary education taught in English, they will be required to provide proof of **English Proficiency.** Since classes are taught in English, an applicant must demonstrate their ability to read, write and speak English.

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For MBA:

Education: IAU requires evidence of an earned bachelor degree in business, management, or administration. All degrees must be earned at an appropriately accredited institution or foreign equivalent. IAU understands the differing rigor of schools and grading scales around the world, and IAU evaluates prior academic credentials within their own context. Exceptions may be made on a case-by-case basis.

Professional Experience: IAU recommends 3 years of full-time professional experience, including, but not limited to, private, public, for-profit, non-profit, start-ups, or established corporate organizations.

Information Technology: IAU requires students to possess computer and internet skills sufficient to effectively participate in IAU's pedagogical model and conduct research at the undergraduate level.

Evidence of English Proficiency: IAU requires writing skills at the appropriate level. Proficiency in reading, writing, speaking, and understanding English is essential to your success at IAU. If English is not the applicant's native language, or if an applicant has not had their secondary education taught in English, they will be required to provide proof of English Proficiency. Since classes are taught in English, an applicant must demonstrate their ability to read, write and speak English.

PTU agrees to forward the interested student(s) application documents for entrance into the program at IAU.

IAU will provide marketing information for the partnership and course transfer as requested by PTU. PTU will publish the MoU through media and affiliated colleges.

ARTICLE II

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 1. Each party agrees and covenants to the other that it shall enter negotiations in good faith.
- 2. All parties warrant that they have the capacity and resources to assume their respective responsibilities outlined in this Understanding.
- 3. All parties undertake to inform each other of all new information and developments, which would have an impact on the negotiations.
- 4. All notices required or permitted under this Understanding shall be in writing and transmitted to the addressee by registered e-mail at the address indicated in the party clause hereof. A party hereto may cause a change in its address by serving a written notice of such fact to the other. A notice of a change of address shall be binding on the other party immediately upon receipt of such notice.
- 5. This Understanding may be amended, modified, or otherwise altered only by means of a written instrument duly signed by all the parties.

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- 6. IAU will make final acceptance of students based on its admissions criteria per program.
- PTU will be listed on IAU website as a licensed school under Understanding to transfer credit.
- 8. IAU will be listed similarly to 7 on the PTU website.
- All signage, promotional or marketing materials must be approved by IAU prior to usage, public broadcast or used for display purposes.
- 10. Interested students admission is to be handled by PTU and TT.

ARTICLE III

TERMINATION AND EXTENSION

It is hereby agreed that any party may terminate this Understanding for whatever cause after due written notice to the other parties is given at least one academic year prior to the intended date of termination.

During this termination period all parties agree to return all propriety and property belonging to the respective parties and will cease to use the name, will not refer to and will not use the curriculum or any provide any messaging to the public that may be misleading. Any signage and logos will immediately be removed upon termination by either party.

This MoU is for a period of 3 years and valid till 4/26/2025 ___, after which a further 3-year extension will be exercised if all parties agree.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

In accordance with a mutual desire to promote cooperation and understanding between Canada and India as well as to enhance the intellectual and experiential resources of four great and reputed institutions, Vancouver Premier College of Arts and Science (Canada), Vancouver Premier College of Business and Management (Canada), Vancouver Premier College of Hotel Management (Canada) and I.K. GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY (India), and TrainTurf Academic Solutions Limited (Canada) voluntarily agree to join in this agreement on cultural and educational cooperation by establishing a cooperative relationship.

Recognizing the separate and mutual benefits to be gained through a cooperative program that proactively promotes scholarly activities and international understanding, I.K. GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY (India) (hereinafter referred to as "PTU" or "the University") and Vancouver Premier College of Arts and Science, Vancouver, Premier College of Business and Management, Vancouver, Premier College of Hotel Management (hereinafter referred to in the collective as "VPC" or "Vancouver Premier College") and TrainTurf Academic Solutions Limited (hereinafter referred to as "TrainTurf") enter into this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") and agree as follows:

1.0 THE PURPOSE OF ACADEMIC AND EDUCATIONAL CO-OPERATION

Both PTU and VPC agree to enter into this academic partnership. Within the context of global higher education cooperation and development, the institutions will collaborate to meet the growing need for cultivating skilled and knowledgeable international professionals.  - The organization of cooperative academic activities such as conferences, seminars, symposia or lectures.

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- Faculty, Officers and student visits, transfers and related collaboration.
- d) Semester, inter session and disciplinary exchange programs.
- e) The exchange of research publications and promotional materials.
- f) The exploration of other common areas of interest.
- 2.2 Cooperative projects defined within this MOU may include any academic initiative, program and/or discipline of PTU and VPC.

3.0 IMPLEMENTATION & REPRESENTATION

- 3.1 Future supplemental letters of agreement or other attachments shall include such items as:
 - a) The elaboration of the responsibilities of each party for the agreed upon activity;
 - b) Schedules and/or timelines for the completion of the specific activities;
 - A list of first year courses and course outlines for articulating programs.
- 3.2 The respectively appointed PTU and VPC faculty and/or staff coordinator(s) shall be responsible for the evaluation of all activities under this MOU according to the variously existing policies, procedures and practices of their respective institutions.
- 3.3 TrainTurf will be academic advisor between VPC and PTU. Train Turf is the exclusive recruitment, marketing, counseling and operations partner of articulation programs between VPC and PTU.

4.0 DURATION & TERMINATION

- 4.1 This MOU shall become effective on the date that it is signed by both PTU and VPC and shall be valid for a period of five (5) years after which it may be renewed or extended by mutual consent expressed in writing.
- 4.2 Any change to this MOU shall be subject to the written consent of both PTU and VPC.
- 4.3 This MOU may be terminated by either PTU or VPC at any time during the first 90 days after which each party will provide three months of written notice of its intention to terminate this MOU which will enable each party to amply prepare for its termination.

5.0 TERMS & CONDITIONS

It is understood by PTU and VPC that this MOU involves providing students who have completed certain designated programs at PTU with preferred entry and block transfer into VPC diploma



programs in General Studies (Arts and Science), Business Management and Hospitality Management as well as preferred entry into VPC's postgraduate programs in Hospitality Management, Digital Marketing, Cybersecurity, DataAnalytics and Information Technology.

It is further understood that VPC will not receive any tuition or other fees from PTU or PTU's students who enter into the designated programs for block transfer as long as their courses are being staffed and taught at PTU. Concurrently, VPC will not incur costs associated with PTU students completing their designated programs at PTU. Upon successful completion of the designated courses, PTU students will then apply to VPC and be processed in accordance with VPC's entrance and transfer requirements. Accepted students will then pay for their tuition prior to beginning their VPC program and in accordance with VPC's tuition payment deadline dates.

6.0 TUITION & PROGRAMS

- 6.1 All PTU students will pay tuition in accordance with currently posted tuition costs on VPC's website.
- 6.2 The four VPC programs available for credit transfer include the Hospitality Management Diploma; Hospitality Management Diploma with Co-op; Business Management Diploma; General Studies Diploma.
 - PTU bachelor degree holders can apply to VPC Post Graduate Diploma programs in Hospitality Management; Post Graduate Diploma in Digital Marketing; Post Graduate Diploma in Cybersecurity; Post Graduate Diploma in Data Analytics; and, Post Graduate Diploma in Information Technology on the condition that they meet relative admission requirements.
- 6.3 In a manner consistent with VPC's policies, procedures and designated program requirements, VPC agrees to accept into its diploma and postgraduate programs, qualified PTU students who have completed the designated 10 course VPC curriculum for each of its designated diploma programs at PTU with an AGPA of 2.00 (63%-66% in percentage grading scale) or higher.
- 6.4 All PTU students must meet VPC's English Language proficiency requirements. Those PTU students who are unable to meet this requirement can enroll in VPC's ESL program.

Between

Yorkville University (YU), a private university designated under Ontario Post-Secondary Education Choice and Excellence Act, (2000) to offer university degrees

And

I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University (PTU), a university in India that is offering various programs at undergraduate and graduate levels in a variety of disciplines.

HEREINAFTER referred to as the Parties.

WHEREAS both Parties, as part of a larger Collaboration Agreement, agree that an academic partnership that creates seamless pathways from PTU BBA to YU BBA is beneficial to their past, current and future students;

WHEREAS both Parties are committed to providing high quality academic programs that serve to advance the academic and professional goals of their students; and

WHEREAS both Parties offer post-secondary education programs that meet with all respective jurisdictional legislation where required and applicable;

THEREFORE the Parties agree to establish a formal articulated pathway for students of PTU's BBA program to complete their Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) at Yorkville University. PTU BBA students will be admitted to and given credits toward the Yorkville BBA program in accordance with the details outlined below.

1. Project Background

2. Project Summary

Memorandum of Understanding

Introduction

Believing in the significance of academic and cultural understanding and cooperation I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar (IKGPTU)- Kapurthala Highway, VPO - Ibban, Kapurthala-144603, Punjab, INDIA (https://ptu.ac.in/#) and the University of South Carolina Beaufort. Bluffton, South Carolina, USA (https://www.uscb.edu) have agreed to initiate the process to enhance relations, exchange expertise, and boost academic development for both institutions which will also be in the general interest of students and staff. This memorandum of understanding (MOU) is a step in the said direction and delineates the main features of cooperation between the two organizations, particularly in academic development. Research, exchange of students, faculty and staff; and development of educational opportunities to enrich campus internationalization at each institution. While this memorandum is not to be considered a contract, the following articles shall be explored and discussed by both parties in good will and in good faith.

Article 1

I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar (IKGPTU) and the University of South Carolina Beaufort (USCB) "have agreed to explore the possibility of establishing a relationship in order to advance global understanding, research teaching relationships and faculty and student exchanges".

Article 2

The two parties shall endeavor to encourage faculty and staff from both institutions to explore possible areas where instruction can be enriched through an electronic forum between classes. The purpose of the electronic forum would be to connect undergraduate or graduate students in India to students in the United States around a specific course topic, problem, or research project for the purpose of providing students with greater global perspectives on the course content or discipline. Both the Institutions will discuss the mechanism, technicalities of delivering video conferencing. an electronic forum, and/or web-based chat rooms and if the terms, conditions and financial implications are mutually agreed by and between the two Institutions, an agreement shall be executed between the parties incorporating all the agreed terms and conditions, which will be signed by the designated authorized persons from both the parties.

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Article 3

Both the Institutions shall explore the feasibility of developing a select number of academic curriculum partnerships. These may ultimately be in the form of dual-degree (2+2, 3+3, 1+1 or similar configuration), or other creative curriculum partnerships to enrich undergraduate and/or graduate study opportunities.

Article 4

Both parties will explore the possibility of creating awareness of the undergraduate and graduate programs available at the partner institution, advising students as to the criteria and deadlines for admission, and accordingly assist students with the submission of applications to the graduate programs.

Article 5

The Second Party will negotiate a discounted non-resident tuition rate for students from the Partner institution. The scholarship will be extended for a total of (to be negotiated) semesters provided the student is making adequate progress in the program.

Article 6

The two parties shall encourage the exchange of faculty and, staff from both institutions or teaching, professional development, and/or research endeavors; and/or encourage staff to carry out non-residential partnerships to develop academic and scientific research in areas and fields of interest to both parties.

Article 7

The two parties agree to encourage the offering of short, specialized courses and training sessions in areas needed by both institutions (for example, through short term summer "Discovery" Programs hosted on the campus).

Article 8

The two parties shall encourage student visits from both institutions. However before implementing, all procedures, mechanisms to study, the cost and share of both the parties to implement these visits, terms and conditions including financial implications for the Institutions if mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto shall be incorporated in an agreement to be executed between the parties.

Article 9

The two parties will encourage exchanges of ideas, processes and procedures in student life and campus leadership.

Article 10

One liaison officer from each institution will be appointed to follow up the implementation of the MOU and to brief the officials in both institutions about progress achieved.

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Article 11

Not with standing anything to the contrary stated herein, the parties herein agree that before implementing any program/activities under this MOU/arrangement, the parties will negotiate all the terms and conditions including financial and other implications on both the institutions; if the patties mutually agree, the agreed terms and conditions shall be so documented in an agreement to be executed by and between the parties and shall be signed by the authorized representative of the parties herein

Article 12

This Memorandum of Understanding is typically valid for One (01) year from the date signed by both parties and is automatically renewed on a year to year, basis unless otherwise revoked by either party in writing by giving 180 days prior notice to the other party for termination of the agreement.

This tripartite Memorandum of Understanding ("MoU") is executed on the 31.05.2022 at PTT, Mohali-I Campus of IKAPTU.

This tripartite **Memorandum of Understanding** ("MoU") is executed on the 31.05.2022 at PIT Mohali-I Campus of IKG-PTU.

Among

Punjab Skill Development Mission Society (PSDM), a nodal agency of the Government of Punjab for its Skill Development Mission, represented by Mission Director having its office at S.C.O 149-152, Level 2, Sec 17 C, Chandigarh (hereinafter referred to as "**FIRST PARTY**" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, mean and include its successors and assigns);

AND

I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University (PTU), a nodal agency of the Government of Punjab established by an Act of State Legislature, represented by Dean (Planning & External Programmes) having its office at Jalandhar-Kapurthala Highway, Kapurthala, Near Pushpa Gujral Science City, Jalandhar (hereinafter referred to as "SECOND PARTY" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, mean and include its successors and assigns);

AND

ICICI Foundation for inclusive growth (ICICI Foundation), a charitable trust registered at Chennai, Tamil Nadu vide a Trust Deed dated January 04, 2008 and having its office at ICICI Bank Towers, Bandra Kurla Complex, Bandra East, Mumbai 400051(hereafter referred as "THIRD PARTY" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, mean and include its successors and assigns), of the other Part.

BACKGROUND

- A. First Party recognizes the value of skill development initiatives for the community and are willing to support and collaborate with individuals, institutions, trusts, corporate bodies and any other such entities that administer and run skill development initiatives for the lesser privileged youth in the state of Punjab ("State") and thereby enabling them to participate in the growth and economic development of the State.
- B. Second Party has the mandate to set up centres of excellence in emerging technologies and for promoting training, research and development in these areas. The University has undertaken the task of training students to help in the development of skilled manpower in this sector in the country in general and in the state, in particular.
- C. Third Party is a public charitable trust, set up with the objectives as set out inthe Trust Deed dated January 04, 2008, which inter alia, includes catalyzing and accelerating inclusive social and economic development through empowerment of poor by integrated action in the diverse fields connected to the society to augment India's inclusive growth process. As a part of achieving such objectives and to further its initiatives towards education and livelihoods, Second Partyhas institutionalized the ICICI Academy for Skills that provides skill training and vocational training to young unemployed school and college dropouts which may lead towards their self-employment or wage employment.

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- D. The Parties had earlier collaborated with each other vide a Memorandum of Understanding dated February 17, 2016 for setting up a centre of ICICI Academy for Skills at Mohali, Punjab, hereinafter referred to as the 'Academy'. This non-financial Agreement is entered between the First Party, Second party and third party for a term of five years.
- E. The Parties are desirous of continuing the said collaboration and continue providing technical and skill development training through the Academy in accordance with the terms and conditions as agreed upon in this MoU. The MoU shall be effective from the expiry of the earlier MoU between the parties.

1. OBJECTIVE / PURPOSE OF MOU

The parties hereto mutually agreed upon to continue their collaboration for operating the Academy to train the lesser privileged youth in the State ("Trainees") and to assist them to seek employment (either by wage employment or self-employment) in the relevant field. The Parties have further agreed that the Academy will strive to train 1600 candidates of Punjab annually and that the Academy will be on a non-residential basis, i.e. it shall not provide lodging (hostel) facility to the candidates. To further the aforesaid objective, this MoU sets out the terms and scope of collaboration between the parties.

2. SCOPE AND INTENT:

The scope of this document is valid for three years from the date of signing. The duration of this MOU can be extended by mutual consent of all the three parties.

3. PROGRAM DETAILS:

The selection criteria of the Trainees (age, education and social economic background) and the operational parameters, including the course(s) to be offered at the Academy, shall continue to be mutually decided in writing by the Parties keeping in view the market demand and the local factors and the changes therein. The training shall be held physically but in case of any restriction imposed/set in by Government (for ex. COVID, Pandemic) the theoretical partcan be executed in online mode.

The specific responsibilities and obligations of each Party and other relevant details are as set out in the **Annexure I** attached herewith. The list of courses being offered at the Academy is listed in **Annexure II**.

4. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

Each Party hereby represents and warrants that it has all requisite power and authority to execute this MOU and to perform its obligations hereunder. The execution and delivery of this MOU and the performance of this MOU will not constitute a breach or constitute a default or a breach of any agreement entered with any third party and it will perform its obligations and fulfill its responsibilities under this MOU in a manner that complies with all applicable laws.

5. CONFIDENTIALITY

Neither the first party nor the second party and the third party shall disclose during the term of this agreement or thereafter to any third party any information, course materials or make public the documents, materials, equipment's, diagrams etc. of joint course provided by first, second and third party.

6. TERMINATION

Any Party desirous of terminating this MOU shall forthwith provide written notice of 120 days to the other Parties. However, the Parties shall ensure that termination of this MoU is

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not effected in the middle of ongoing training batches at the Academy except that either Party can forthwith terminate this MoU in case of breach of any of term of this MoU by the other Party.

7. MISCELLANEOUS

- A) Unless otherwise agreed in writing by all, each party shall bear its own cost in connection with effecting the terms and conditions to this MoU.
- B) Each party may request changes to this MoU. Any changes, modifications, revisions, amendments to this MoU which are mutually agreed upon and between all the parties shall be incorporated by the written instrument, and effective when executed and signed by each party.
- C) Relationship of each party under this MoU is that of independent entities and nothing in this MoU shall, or shall be deemed to constitute or place them in fiduciary relationship, any other relationship of trust or confidence, partnership, employer-employee, agency or joint venture relationship and no party shall have the right to agree to obligations on behalf of any other Party in any manner.
- D) For effective implementation and monitoring of MoU, each party shall designate a nodal officer. The nodal officer from each party shall be proactive, have good English written and oral skills, shall have email access and shall be able to get things executed.
- E) Any dispute, differences, claim or question of interpretation of any nature arising between the Parties with respect to this MoU as to the respective rights, claims, liabilities and obligations under this MoU, including any question regarding its existence, validity or termination which is not resolved by amicable settlement shall be referred to and finally resolved by arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 or any statutory amendment thereto. The Parties shall mutually appoint a sole arbitrator to conduct the arbitration proceedings. The venue of such proceedings shall be at Chandigarh and the language of arbitration shall be English. The award of the arbitration shall be final and binding on the Parties. The costs of Arbitration shall be borne in such manner as the arbitrator may direct.

F) Force Majeure Clause.

- a. For the purposes of this MoU, "Force Majeure" means an event which is beyond the reasonable control of a Party, is not foreseeable, is unavoidable and not brought about by or at the instance of the Party claiming to be affected by such events and which has caused the non-performance or delay in performance, and which makes a Party's performance of its obligations hereunder impossible or so impractical as reasonably to be considered impossible in the circumstances, and includes, but is not limited to, war, riots, civil disorder, earthquake, fire, explosion, storm, flood or other extreme adverse weather conditions, strikes, lockouts, pandemic and pandemic induced lockdown or other industrial action (except where such strikes, lockouts or other industrial action are within the power of the Party invoking Force Majeure to prevent), confiscation or any other action by Government agencies.
- b. Force Majeure shall not include (i) any event which is caused by the negligence or intentional action of a Party or by or of such Party's Sub-Consultants or agents or employees, nor (ii) any event which a diligent Party could reasonably have been expected to take into account at the time of the conclusion of this MOU, and avoid or overcome in the carrying out of its obligations.

8. NON-BINDING

This MOU is non-binding in nature herein and the parties agree that the execution of this MOU shall not constitute any undertaking by each party to mandatorily perform the transactions hereunder. This MOU does not impose legal or financial obligations on each

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Party. The parties recognize that the Execution of this MOU does not constitute any legal obligation or commitmentby each party to enter a definitive agreement.

9. NOTICE

All notices required or permitted by, or made pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding shall be in writing and shall be sent by certified mail or by courieror by post or by facsimile within the stipulated time of 15 days to the following addresses: -

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Annexure I

Responsibilities of First Party:

- Ensuring on an ongoing basis that the Premises is functional with supply of power, water, sewerage connection, access, safety etc.
- ii. Sourcing: Mobilizing prospective youth from underprivileged backgrounds in the 18 to 30 years' age-group and enrolling them for training at the Academy. The qualification of these underprivileged youths will be class 8 passed up to graduates. Candidates who have or are undergoing diploma, ITIs or other vocational / professional courses will not be eligible.
- Placement assistance: Facilitate ICICI Foundation's efforts for placement of students upon successful completion of training.

Responsibilities of second party

(i) The second Party has provided premises including space for work shed and open area for practical training at Punjab Institute of Technology, Government Polytechnic, Khuni Majra, Kharar-Landran Road, Sector 115, Mohali – 140307, Punjab. ICICI foundation shall be allowed to continue to operate from the said premises and use all the area currently provided to ICICI Foundation, for the duration of this MoU. The academy is located in Administrative block of PTU in campus of Government Polytechnic College, Khunimajra . It will occupy the following area:

First Floor (whole) :13890 Sq. ft. area Second floor (Half): 6912 Sq. ft. area

Shed (Workshop on ground floor, near parking): 4242 Sq. ft. area

(ii) The Premises will be for exclusive use by ICICI Foundation during the Term of this MOU and shall neither be completely or partially let out for lease or rent to any other party nor any other party shall be given possession and/or right to use the Premises, without the consent from ICICI Foundation.

Responsibilities of Third Party

- i. Operations: Running the Academy, including providing for moveable assets.
- Placement assistance: Providing placement opportunities to students upon completion of training, on a best-effort basis, with assistance from State Government.
- iii. Expenses: Undertaking the operating expenditure for the Academy for the tenure of the MoU, including expenditure on:
 - a) Provision of trainers and training materials
 - b) Caretakers for the Academy
 - c) Salary and related costs for the Academy personnel
 - d) Electricity, water and telecommunications
- The liability of hiring, salary and issues of manpower resources will be borne by ICICI foundation.
- v. The expense of any additional infrastructure if any, will be borne by third partywith prior knowledge of the first and second party.

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Joint Responsibilities:

Certification: Upon completion of the training, the students shall be jointly certified by the First Party, ICICI Foundation, industry leaders who are knowledge partners of ICICI Foundation and PSDM.

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This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter called MOU) is made on 18 - 06 - 2022 between I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University having office at Jalandhar-Kapurthala Highway, Kapurthala-144603, Punjab, (herein after called IKGPTU "The First Party") and Quality Council of India (QCI), an Autonomous body under Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, having its principle office at 2nd Floor, Institution of Engineers Building, Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg, New Delhi (hereinafter called QCI "The Second Party").

Each of the parties mentioned above are collectively referred to as the 'Parties' and individually as a 'Party'.

Whereas IKGPTU was established by an Act of State Legislature on 16th January, 1997, to promote technical, management and pharmaceutical education in the state at degree level and above. It was established as Punjab Technical University and renamed as I.K.Gujral Punjab Technical University by State Government in the honour to Late Sh. Inder Kumar Gujral, Former Prime Minister of India, in 2015. The University has the mandate to set up centres of excellence in emerging technologies and for promoting training, research and development in these areas. The University has undertaken the task of training students to help in the development of skilled manpower in this sector in the country in general and in the state in particular. With this goal in mind, the university is promoting a number of courses in different streams in regular as well as distance education programmes. At present University have 121 AICTE and 65 UGC recognized/ approved institutes affiliated with it. IKGPTU is undertaking and supervising the instructions and award of 30+ bachelor's degrees in Engineering & Technology & 20+ in non-AICTE & UGC courses. The university has more than 10 campuses throughout Punjab.

And Whereas QCI, as the national accreditation and apex quality facilitation body, establishes and operates national accreditation structure and promotes quality through National Quality Campaign. The promotion of quality encompasses all segments including laboratory accreditation, manufacturing, health, education and public services. QCI started eQuest which offers eLearning courses around themes that form the core areas of QCI.

Both parties agree and undertake that specific project under the MoU proposed, formulated and agreed upon by them for the implementation of this MoU and for the said projects; IKGPTU and/or QCI shall consider the same as part of this MoU.

The two institutions will endeavour to cooperate as follows -

ARTICLE 1

AREAS OF COOPERATION

This MoU aims to build a long-term relationship and to develop healthy & stable arrangements between both the Parties. Any collaborative programs, projects or activities proposed under the purview of this MoU shall be subject to negotiation, agreement and approval between both the Parties. Both parties recognize that there is a need to identify new Physical Training Programmes and e-learning courses, and institutionalize capacity building by Physical Training Programmes and e- learning.

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ARTICLE 2 SCOPE

- 2.1 IKGPTU and QCI shall jointly work under the scope of this MoU. The scope, projects, roles and responsibility of the engagement shall be drawn up with mutual consent.
- 2.2 Both parties recognize the need for conducting educational and training programmes with blending of physical training and e-Learning mode. Therefore, the following activities, roles and responsibilities for the said purpose are outlined under this MoU.
 - i. To identify new courses keeping requirements of industry and academia. Sharing feedback and inputs for design and development of e- learning courses/ new courses. Identification of emerging areas to conduct training programmes through blended learning. Facilitation content development through empanelled Subject Matter Expert (SME). Awarding joint Certificates to eligible participants.
 - Sharing of Human Resources Subject Matter Expert (SME), Trainers, Assessors and Speakers in the identified areas.
 - iii. Dovetailing Credit Courses and Non -Credit courses of e-Quest in the curriculum (e-Quest- E-Quality Platform for Employability through Skill and Training; e-Quest is an Online learning portal by QCI. e-Quest is designed to help Indian professionals to strengthen their skills sets and knowledge thereby enhancing their career prospects).
 - iv. Developing e-Learning course on skill based modular courses.
 - v. Manufacturing Competitiveness programme will be inculcated as the credit-based programme in the curriculum. Program will be developed as per requirements of Industry. Identification of tailor-made programmes for industry may also be undertaken.
 - vi. Providing facilities for the conduct of various courses/ contact programmes in partnership with QCI in premises of PTU in collaboration of institutions/ industries.
 - vii. Professional competency-based certification as per ISO 17024.
 - viii. Consideration of NABL Accreditation for IKGPTU Laboratory(s). Award of Accreditation to Laboratories post compliance of requirements.
 - ix. Awarding Accreditation as EIA Consultant Organization post complying the requirements of scheme.
 - Identification of new areas for collaboration in the area of Quality.
 - xi. Training of QCI Professionals (PPID- Project Planning and Implementation Division) by IKGPTU on agreed skill set with culmination in Certificate/ Diploma/ Degree.
 - xii. Internship of Students.

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- xiii. To run a training centre at IKGPTU under NICPP project.
- xiv. Accreditation of non -AICTE Vocational Courses as per NABET Accreditation Scheme of Learning Service Providers.
- xv. Evaluation of Study Centres as per ISO 21001 and/or ISO 29993.

ARTICLE 3

WORKING ARRANGEMENT

- 3.1 The Parties shall constitute a Joint Coordination Committee ("JCC") by taking member(s) from both the parties to facilitate cooperation, foster partnership and review progress.
- 3.2 The head of each party shall nominate the respective coordinator. The participants and coordinators may change from time to time as decided by appropriate authority of the IKGPTU and QCI.
- 3.3 The JCC will be co-chaired by designated representative of the parties and both the parties shall determine the composition of the JCC. The member of representatives from each party may be between 2 to 3.
- 3.4 The JCC may meet on a bi-yearly/ annual basis as may be required and deemed fit, virtually or in person, as the case may be.
- 3.5 The Parties agree to arrange regular meeting and communication with one another and with other relevant stakeholder, to review and finalize the detailed plan for each stage of the programme.

ARTICLE 4

FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

The financial arrangement for the joint activities undertaken within the framework of this MoU shall be mutually agreed upon by both the Parties on a case -to -case basis, subject to the availability of funds and resources. The two institutions will consider allocating seed money to initiate the partnership. In addition, they will also approach international/ national funding agencies, industries and academic institutions. Special attention will be given to obtain funded projects from industry as well as from alumni to support such collaborations.

ARTICLE 5

REPRESENTATION AND WARRANTY

Each Party to this MoU represent that the execution and performance of this MOU is not contrary to any rule, law, statue, internal policy, or any other such order or rule by which such Party is bound.

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ARTICLE 6

PROTECTION OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS/OWNERSHIP

- 6.1 Each party will protect, within its territory, intellectual property rights of the other party in force in their respective jurisdiction. All copyrights of the document produced in support of any activity under this MoU shall rest with QCI and IKGPTU.
- 6.2 Both the parties will ensure appropriate protection of intellectual property rights obtained on the basis of this MoU, in accordance with providing laws and regulations in force in the country.

ARTICLE 7

CONFIDENTIALITY

Each Party undertakes to observe the confidentiality and secrecy of documents, information and other data received from or supplied to the other Party during the period of the implementation of the MoU or any other agreement made pursuant to this MoU. However, in case of any such circumstances such as R.T.I or any other legal requirement, each party may do so with intimation to other party.

ARTICLE 8

SUSPENSION

Each party reserves the right for reason of national security, national interest, public order or public health to suspend temporarily either in whole or in part the implementation of this MoU. The suspension shall take effect immediately after written notification of one month has been given to the other party by the competent authority.

ARTICLE 9

REVISION, MODIFICATION AND AMENDMENT

Either party may request in writing a revision, modification or amendment of all or any part of this MoU. Any revision, modification or amendment agreed to by the parties shall be reflected in writing and shall form part of this MoU. Such revision, modification or amendment shall come on such data as may be determined by the parties.

ARTICLE 10

SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

- 10.1 The obligation of QCI and IKGPTU have been outlined in the MoU. However, during the operation of MoU, circumstances may arise which may call for alterations or modifications of this MoU. These amendments shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing.
- 10.2 Any differences or dispute between the parties concerning the interpretation and/or implementation and /or applicable to any of the provisions of this MoU shall be settled amicably through mutual consultation and / or negotiation between the Parties, without reference to any third party or tribunal.
- 10.3 All the issues involving financial matters e.g., sharing of course fees etc. shall be decided jointly by both the parties.

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10.4 The MoU shall be governed and constructed in accordance with the Laws of India. In case any difference does not get resolved by mutual consultation and any of the parties is not satisfied and intends to resort to legal proceedings, it shall give a notice period of 30 days to the other party. The parties agree to submit to exclusive of jurisdiction of Courts in New Delhi, or any other place (India), mutually agreed to in connection with any dispute between the Parties under the MoU.

ARTICLE 11

EFFECTIVE DATE, DURATION AND TERMINATION

- 11.1 The MoU shall commence from effective date and shall continue for a period of 3 years from the Effective Date (hereafter referred to as "Term"). Thereafter, both parties shall review the status of this cooperation and may extend the Term on yearly basis on such terms as mutually agreed upon.
- 11.2 Notwithstanding Article 10 para 1 above, either party may terminate this MoU by notifying the other party in writing at least thirty (30) days in advance of such termination subject to settling of any dues/ overdue
- 11.3 Unless otherwise agreed upon by the Parties, the termination of this MoU shall not affect the implementation of on-going activities and /or programmes, which have been agreed upon to by the Parties on or before the date of the termination of the MoU.

ARTICLE 12

INDEMNIFICATION

Both the parties shall indemnify and keep the other party indemnified and harmless against any and all claims, actions, proceedings by third party (including all costs, expenses, damages/ losses) arising out of or in connection with this MoU due to breach of any provisions of this MoU by such party as a result of any act of negligence/ omission or commission on part of such party and / or its employees, agents etc.

ARTICLE 13

FORCE MAJEURE

a. Force Majeure Event

Any of the following events resulting in Material Adverse Effect shall constitute Force Majeure Event:

- Unprecedent situation resulting due to COVID -19
- II. Earthquake, inundation, landslide;
- III. Storm, tempest, hurricane, cyclone, lighting, thunder or other extreme atmospheric disturbances;
- IV. Act of terrorism, hacking, cyber -attack and the like; and
- War, hostilities (whether war be declared or not), invasion, act of foreign enemy, rebellion, riots, weapon conflict or military action or civil war;
- VI. Strikes or boycotts, other than those involving the SECOND PARTY, its contractors or their employees, agents etc.

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b. Notice of Force Majeure Event

As soon as practicable and in any case within 3 days of the date of occurrence of a Force Majeure Event or the date of knowledge thereof, the Party which is rendered wholly or partially unable to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement because of a Force Majeure Event ("the Affected Party") shall notify the other party of the same, setting out, inter alia, the following in reasonable detail:

- i. The nature and extent of the Force Majeure Event;
- ii. The estimated Force Majeure Period;
- iii. The nature of and the extent to which, performance of any of its obligations under this Agreement is affected by the Force Majeure Event;
- iv. The measures which the Affected Party has taken or proposes to take to alleviate/ mitigate the impact of the Force Majeure Event and to resume performance of such of its obligations affected thereby; and
- v. Any other relevant information concerning the Force Majeure Event, and/ or the rights and obligations of the Parties under this MoU

ARTICLE 14

MISCELLANEOUS

- 14.1 Neither party shall use or publicize this MoU in such a manner as to cause any disrepute to the other party, nor shall to make any statement relevant to this MoU which may reasonably be considered to be misleading.
- 14.2 If any doubt arises as to the interpretation of the provision of his Agreement or as to matters not provided therein, the parties to this Agreement shall consult with each other for each instance and resolve such doubts in good faith.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, SAN BERNARDINO AND I.K GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, INDIA

To promote academic cooperation, to strengthen educational and cultural ties, to support internationalization efforts on their respective campuses, and to achieve a successful and sustainable collaboration, California State University, San Bernardino, hereafter referred to as "CSUSB," and I.K Gujral Punjab Technical University, India, hereafter referred to as "IKGPTU," endorse this Memorandum of Understanding.

Subject to applicable laws, regulations and university policies, both institutions will endeavor to encourage direct contact, educational and research cooperation among their constituents, including students, faculty members and staff, departments and research institutes, and will endeavor to cooperate in the fields of interest to both institutions. The parties contemplate the following forms of cooperation:

- Study abroad programs for IKGPTU students to study at CSUSB for a full academic year, one or two academic semesters, or short term;
- 2. Partnerships in academic programs;
- 3. Special short-term academic and language programs;
- Joint research and professional activities, such as participation in seminars and academic meetings.

Terms, conditions, and arrangements (e.g., academic, logistics, financial) of joint activities will be identified and negotiated for each specific case and must be memorialized in writing and executed by an authorized representative of each institution prior to the commencement of the associated activities.

It is understood that the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding will commence upon its mutual signing and remain in effect for a period of five years unless one university provides a six-month written notice to the other university to terminate it. Subject to a review this Memorandum may be renewed for an additional period of five years. Academic and administrative representatives from both institutions will discuss the terms of a renewal at least six months prior to the termination of the current Memorandum of Understanding.

This agreement can be modified upon mutual agreement between academic and administrative representatives of both institutions, provided that any such modification must be memorialized in writing and executed by an authorized representative of each institution.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BY AND BETWEEN

National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology, an Autonomous Scientific Society under Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India, hereinafter called NIELIT, which expression shall, where the context so admits, be deemed to include its successors, executors and administrators of the ONE PART.

And

I.K.Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar-Kapurthala Highway, Kapurthala-144601, Punjab, herein after called IKG-PTU, which expression shall, where the context so admits, be deemed to include its successors, executors and administrators, of the SECOND PART,

WHEREAS, NIELIT, offers, inter alia, various Training Programmes in the field of IECT to equip the students with necessary knowledge of the key industry practices and skills to be fruitfully employed besides providing exposure to live projects and hands-on practical training,

WHEREAS, in the spirit of the MoU signed by NIELIT with All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) under AICTE's Employability Enhancement Training Program (EETP) to provide competency based employability enhancement skills to the students of AICTE funded institutions through NIELIT's own 40+ centres across the country, NIELIT had proposed vide letter no. NIELIT/RPR/2 /2017/101 dated 27th April 2018 to develop and offer a bouquet of courses to students of IKG-PTU affiliated colleges for undergraduates to give them practical exposure and access to high standards of industry oriented training expertise of NIELIT,

WHEREAS both parties haveheld discussions and agreed that NIELIT will impart the requisite training and award credits for the training conducted on its own, to the registered students of IKG PTU campus & affiliated colleges,

Therefore, both parties wish to conclude this Memorandum of Understanding (hereafter called "MoU") to co-operate on the activities set forth in this MoU on May 30, 2018 for the period of three years which may be extended with the mutual consent of both parties.

A) The Objective

The objective of this MoU is Employability Enhancement of the students covered under the programme and to set forth the modus operandi to provide Training in the field of IECT and all related areas by NIELIT to students of IKG-PTUaffiliated colleges / institutes under following categories:

- a) Semester /Industrial Training Programmes of 5-6 months duration
- b) Summer Training Programmes of 6-8 weeks duration

The aim of the programme is to equip the students with necessary knowledge of the key industry practices and skills to be fruitfully employed besides providing exposure to live projects and hands-on practical training.





B) TERMS

NIELIT agrees to take students of IKG-PTU's campuses and affiliated colleges for admissions through its campuses at Ropar, Mohali and Chandigarh to its scheduledSemester/ Industrial and Summer Training Programmes or any other Training Programme, as deemed fit, in the best interest of the students, mutually decided with IKG-PTU, specially customized for IKG-PTU incorporating NIELIT's trademark strengths structured as follows:

A. Semester Training Programmes

- i. Semester Training IT (Computer Science) Programme (5-6 Months):
 - a) Core Concepts: Turing Machine and Von Neumann Architecture, Memory, data structures, process, Layers beneath the program, Concepts of Software Engineering, Project Management, Norms, protocols, Cyber Security.
 - b) Soft Skills and Business Communication, Government Procurement Practices, Legal aspects -IPR, IT Act, International Norms.
 - c) Specialization in one area of technology such as Web Designing (HTML5, Javascript), PHP with MySQL,CMS, Cloud Computing, Big Data, Mobile Application Development using Android, ASP.Net with VB/C#, etc.
 - d) Aptitude Preparation Module to prepare the student for competitive exams.

ii. Semester Training Electronics Programme (5-6 Months)

- a) Core Concepts: Semiconductor Electronics, Analog & Digital Electronic Concepts, Electronic Circuits and Devices, Printed Circuit Boards.
- Soft Skills and Business Communication, Government Procurement Practices, , Legal aspects -IPR, IT Act, International Norms
- c) Specialization in one area of technology such as Internet of Things, Embedded Systems Design -AVR/ 8051/PIC/ARM, Programming with Ardiuno, Raspberry Pi with Python, etc.
- d) Aptitude Preparation Module to prepare the student for competitive exams.

B. Summer Training Programmes (6/8 Weeks):

Short duration programmes in student's chosen field / language / technology with exposure to live projects being undertaken by NIELIT Centres.

- IKG-PTUshallissue instructions to all its affiliated colleges / institutes to inform the students to undergo relevant(Electronics and Computer Science) Semester / Summer Training at NIELIT.
- Fee Structure: The fee will be as applicable at respective campuses of NIELIT Chandigarh
 and Ropar. However, NIELIT agrees to offer a special discount of 10% on the applicable fee to
 the students under the ambit of this MoU.

4. Delivery Mode:

- Concerned NIELIT Centre will announce the schedule of skill training modules for calendar year.
- The various programs on different topics under this MoU will consist of theory and hands-on training sessions supplemented with structured academic content.
- Practical sessions shall be held in **flexi-mode** that shall expose the students to various IECT equipment in term soft heir operations.





 Locations: The training would be imparted at the following locations initially in nonresidential mode. However, at NIELIT Ropar, training will also be available in residential mode post 2019.

- IKG-PTU will nominate one coordinator for all programmes being offered by NIELIT for its affiliated colleges who shall be the single point of contact for the same.
- Each of the concerned NIELIT Centre at Ropar, Mohali and Chandigarh will nominate one coordinator for all programmes being offered by respective NIELITlocations.
- 8. NIELIT shall be responsible for:
 - Enrolment of students
 - Conduct of Training
 - iii) Assessment and Certification
 - iv) Infrastructure / modalities related to the conduct of courses.
- 9. IKG-PTU will display the information related to the programmes on its website.
- 10. Attendance: Assessment and certification of only those candidates will be done, who have attended a minimum of 75% lectures in the programme.
- 11. Assessment and Certification: The assessment will be done based on written and practical examination / Project of the candidates completing the programme with minimum attendance as required.
- Commencement and duration of the programmes under the MoU will be strictly as per schedule mutually agreed upon.
- 13. NIELIT reserves the right to cancel registration of students not adhering to NIELIT's code of attendance and discipline.
- 14. The present agreement can be terminated by either party by giving a notice of three months without assigning any reason. In this regard neither party shall have any claim against the other party and its officials on account of termination of this agreement. However, the responsibilities and duties of both parties in respect of thestudents already registered for any of the Programs under this MoU shall not end with thetermination of the agreement, and these will remain valid in totality untilcompletion of evaluation of the alreadyregistered students andreporting of their results by both parties.
- 15. Both the parties shallindemnify and keep the other party indemnified and harmless against any and all claims, actions, proceedings by third party (including all costs,

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expenses, damages / losses) arising out of or in connection with this MOU due to breach of any provisions of this MoU by such party or as a result of any act of negligence / omission or commission on part of such party and / or its employees, agents etc.

- 16. Arbitration: In the event of any difference or dispute arising between the parties in connection with or concerning the observance of the terms and conditions or interpretation thereof, the same shall be jointly resolved by Director-in-charge NIELITChandigarh and Director IKG-PTUin a spirit of independence, mutual respect and shared responsibilities, failing which both parties shall appoint a mutually agreed arbitrator. The decision of the arbitrator shall be final and binding on parities hereto. The Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 as amended from time to time and rules framed there under shall be applicable to the parties hereto.
- 17. In all matters and disputes arising hereunder the appropriate courts under the jurisdiction of Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana at Chandigarh shall have the jurisdiction to entertain and try them.

NOW THEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AS UNDER:

- That IKG-PTU will give an annual fee of Rs. 8.00 Lakhs (Rupees Ten Lakhs only) to TiE, hereinafter referred to as the "Collaboration Fee". GST and other statutory levies as may be applicable from time to time will be extra and to IKG-PTU's account.
- TiE and IKG-PTU will create a calendar of activities (Annexure 2) jointly, to be executed by TIE along with assistance from IKG-PTU, for the entire year.
- Continue activities like Placement drive, Internship opportunities and B-Plan competition for duration of 3 years with effect from June, 2019 i.e. during the period of agreement.
- Entrepreneur development activities will be coordinated with Sh Navdeepak Sandhu
 Deputy Director (CR&A) IKG PTU or the officer appointed by IKG PTU on his
 behalf.
- Entrepreneurship development activities to be done at all locations as identified By IKG PTU.
- Entrepreneurship workshops or lectures by serial entrepreneurs on IKG-PTU affiliated college campuses. (Ref Annex "1 a").
- Annual Business Plan contest will be conducted amongst the IKG PTU affiliated colleges with prize money of approximately Rs. ONE lakh from TiE. (Ref Annex "I b").
- Top 3 winners will be given an opportunity to participate in the TiE International Business Plan competition. The teams will be mentored for the global TiE competition by senior TiE members.

 Additional Mentorship requests or review of business ideas of IKG PTU students will be done by TIE. This will be routed through Central Entrepreneurship cell.

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- 10. Joint campus recruitment drives for IKG-PTU students conducted by TiE member companies for potential placements. (Ref Annex "1c").
- 11. Joint internship drives for IKG-PTU students conducted by TiE member companies for potential industrial training opportunities. (Ref Annex "ld").
- 12. Assist IKG-PTU in skill development program, academic contributions etc. on advisory basis as per mutually recognized requirement. (Ref Annex "1e").
- 13. IKG-PTU to recognize one entrepreneur from TiE Fraternity with the "The Entrepreneur of the year Award" from the region with a token monetary award.
- 14. TIE and IKG-PTU teams to meet every 6 months to discuss the Status Report of the Mutual Association.
- 15. The Collaboration fee will be paid to TiE annually in advance, after the signing date in one single payment immediately. Collaboration fee can be increased annually as per mutual agreement.
- 16. The term of this agreement will be 3 years and can be renewed mutually after that for next 3 years, as per terms decided and reviewed at that point of time.
- 17. An amendment or modification of this Agreement shall be effective or binding on the Parties only if it is in writing and signed by all the Parties.
- 18. Any waiver, express or implied, by the Parties of any right under this Agreement shall not constitute or be deemed as a waiver of any other right or any other breach, whether of a similar or dissimilar nature to the right or breach being waived. No single waiver shall constitute a continuing waiver. Waiver of a Party's rights under this Agreement shall be effective only if that Party agrees in writing.
- 19. This Agreement is solely for the benefit of the Parties and their respective successors and permitted assigns, and this Agreement shall not otherwise be deemed to confer upon or give to any other third party, including any lender, any remedy, claim-liability, reimbursement, cause of action, or other right.

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- 20. If any provision of this Agreement shall be determined to be invalid or unenforceable under applicable Laws, all other provisions of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect unless such invalidity or unenforceability adversely affects the underlying intent of this Agreement or unless the invalid or unenforceable provision comprises an integral part of, or is inseparable from, the remainder of this Agreement. Provided, however, that if such severability materially changes the economic benefits of this Agreement to any Shareholder, the Shareholders shall negotiate an equitable adjustment in the provisions of this Agreement in good faith.
- 21. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create an association, trust, partnership, quasi-partnership, joint venture or other fiduciary relationship between the Parties or to impose a trust, partnership or quasi-partnership duty, obligation, or liability between the Parties.
- 22. Each Party hereto undertakes with the others to act in the utmost good faith in interpreting and implementing this Agreement and agrees to do all things reasonably within its power, which are necessary or desirable to give effect to the spirit and intent of this Agreement.
- 23. Each of the Parties undertakes that it and any affiliate and each director or employee of the Party shall not, without limit of time, divulge or communicate to any third party or use for its own purposes any information about the affairs of the Party or the other Party except as may be necessary for such party to perform its obligations under this Agreement or as may be required by Law, any regulatory authority within or outside India and except such information as may have come into the public domain otherwise than by a breach of this undertaking or with the prior written approval of the other Party.
- 24. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India and Jurisdiction as Jalandhar.
- 25. Any and all disputes or claims arising under this Agreement or out of or in connection with the execution, interpretation, performance, or non-performance of this Agreement or any or all of the fore going shall be solely and finally settled by arbitration under the Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, as may be

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arbitration proceedings shall be conducted in the English language and the venue of arbitration shall be Jalandhar. The award of arbitrators shall be final and binding on the Parties.

a) Entrepreneurship Workshops

TiE will conduct interactive workshops in IKG PTU campuses & affiliated colleges to train the next generation of successful entrepreneurs. These workshops will be conducted by successful TiE entrepreneurs with proven track record. The objective of these transformational workshops will be to inspire the young graduates to become pioneering change makers. The students will learn about idea generation, idea validation techniques and different aspects of business i.e. finance, marketing, operations etc. This will help build confidence and develop necessary skills to set up scalable startups. TiE will conduct a maximum of 15 such workshops throughout the year.

b) Business Plan Contest

India is going through an incredible phase of young entrepreneurs starting new and innovative businesses which solve the real problems. TiE wants to be at the forefront of this encouraging phenomenon and hence will organize a Business Plan contest for students of IKG-PTU affiliated colleges. The students will get hands on training in doing an in-depth analysis of their proposed plans. TiE will mentor students in conceptualizing the ideas with strategic guidance on execution, scalability and underlying challenges. The proposed competition will be good motivation for students to channelize their creativity and enhance their future prospects. TiE will bring successful entrepreneurs to judge and mentor students for the contest.

c) Placement Drive

TiE will conduct placement drive jointly with IKG-PTU twice a year as suggested in the proposed calendar. A minimum of 10 TiE companies will participate in the placement drive. There will no cap on salaries offered to students. Timings of the placement drive will be mutually agreed upon.

d) Internship Drive

TiE will conduct internship drive jointly with IKG-PTU twice a year as suggested in the proposed calendar. A minimum of 10 TiE companies will participate in the internship drive. There will no cap on internship amount offered to students. Timings of the internship drive will be mutually agreed upon.

e) Industry Academia Collaboration

In addition to activities as suggested above, TiE will strive to give multiple opportunities to students of IKG-PTU affiliated colleges in form of participation in various events conducted by TiE throughout the year. However there will be a cap on number of students who can attend the event. This may vary from event to event. The events include prestigious TiECON, the annual affair of TiE Chandigarh, which brings about valuable opportunities for students to connect and learn at one mega gathering of accomplished entrepreneurs, thought leaders and industry captains. TiE will also actively pursue opportunities to collaborate with colleges on academic front to improve relevancy of syllabus, set up incubation centers or encourage industry interface to further the prospects of students. 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INDUSTRY ACADEMIA COLLABORATION AGREEMENT

This Industry Academia Collaboration Agreement is entered into at Kapurthala on the 23rd of July, 2019.

BETWEEN

The Indus Entrepreneurs - Chandigarh, a Society registered incorporated under the Societies Act, having its registered office at TIE CHANDIGARH C/O Net Solutions 15, Rajiv Gandhi Chandigarh Technology Park, 160101, Chandigarh, (hereinafter referred to as "TIE" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, be deemed to include its successors, legal representatives and permitted assigns)

AND

- C. AND WHEREAS Partner with assistance from Infosys has goals for enhancing the quality of the technical education for students thereby enabling them to meet the industry needs and to be recognized globally.

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NOW THEREFORE THE PARTIES HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGE AND AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- This MOU is for collaboration between both parties, for mutual benefit, to enhance the quality of the educational experience of students of the Partner and for the specific purposes detailed in Annexure I of this MOU.
- Infosys shall be responsible for providing the requisite course material, publicity material such as handouts, information brochures and posters and conducting faculty enablement programmes as agreed between the parties.
- The Partner shall be responsible for providing the requisite infrastructure, network and internet access and any other facility required for the education and training.
- 4. It is agreed that the terms and conditions of any agreed cooperative project(s) as outlined in Annexure 1 of this MoU shall be the subject matter of separate definitive agreements to be negotiated and agreed upon by the Parties and/or any third parties, wherever applicable, provided always the decision whether to initiate and/or implement any resources on the part of each Party.
- The parties, their representatives, and/or assignees, following the execution of this MoU, desire to maintain close contacts with each other to achieve the goals and objectives of, and to develop the ideas acknowledged in this MoU.
- 6. Both parties hereby agree to designate a representative from its side who will be the primary point of contact on behalf of that party.
- Any expenses incurred by the parties for the purpose of this MoU shall be agreed upon and shall be borne as per the mutual agreement.
- 8. Not with standing any other provision of this MoU, neither party shall have any right to use any trademarks or trade name of the other party, nor to refer to this MoU or the obligations performed hereunder directly or indirectly, in connection with any product, promotion, or publication without the prior written approval of the other party
- 9. All information which has been disclosed to or obtained by either party at any time during the implementation of this MoU, is confidential information. For this purpose, the parties agree to sign the binding non-disclosure agreement in Annexure II.

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- 10. The terms and conditions mentioned herein shall commence on the execution of this MoU and shall continue for a period of two (2) years from the date thereof or for such period as may be determined or extended by the parties from time to time by written notice, unless terminated by either party in accordance with this MoU. Either party may terminate this MoU at any time by providing three (3) months written notice to the other party.
- 11. Any notice required to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be sufficiently served on the party if sent by hand or by registered post to the addresses of the party as stated in this MoU. Notices shall be deemed received:
- (i) If sent by registered mail, three (3) days after posting;
- (ii) If by hand, on the day of delivery; and
- (iii) If sent-by telex or facsimile to the correct number or designated address within seventy-two (72) working hours.
- 12. Both parties agree to take all reasonable steps to ensure the successful completion of the collaboration, and co-operate with each other in duly carrying out the obligation agreed upon.
- 13. The expiration and termination of this MoU will not affect the terms of those activities, which are in progress at the time of notification of expiry or termination of the MoU.
- 14. On the termination or expiry of this MoU or when requested by Infosys, the Partner undertakes to return all materials to Infosys without any delay.
- 15. Each party shall ensure that they do not actively solicit the faculty of the other party who is involved in the implementation of this MoU during the period of such faculty's involvement with the program and for six (6) months thereafter.
- 16. Both the parties agree that Infosys is not obliged on account of this MoU to recruit any fixed number of students from the Partner.
- 17. This MoU is an indication of good faith and intent on the part of both parties and does not create any legal obligations between them. The parties possesses competitively valuable Confidential Information (as hereinafter defined) regarding their past, current and future services and products, research and development, customers, business plans, software, listings, holdings, alliances, investments, transactions, intellectual property and rights associated thereto and general business operations. The parties wish to enter into a mutually beneficial relationship, and as such, wish to share their Confidential Information with the other party, including its authorized employees and agents. For the purposes of this Agreement, the party that discloses Confidential Information to the other party shall be referred to as the "Disclosing Party", and the party that receives such Confidential Information from the other party shall be referred to as the "Recipient".

The Recipient may be given access to the Disclosing Party's Confidential Information or to create new Confidential Information for the Disclosing Party.

In view of the above, the parties agree as follows:

1. Confidential Information

"Confidential Information" includes any information:

- specifically indicated by the Disclosing Party, either verbally or in writing, as confidential;
- under the circumstances of the disclosure, that are to be treated as confidential; or
- the Recipient creates or produces while performing its obligations under this Agreement,
 regardless of the media that contains the information.

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Confidential Information does not include information, which:

- is generally available to the public at the time of its disclosure to the Recipient;
- becomes known to the public through no fault/action of the Recipient in violation of the terms herein;
- is legally known to the Recipient at the time of disclosure by the Disclosing Party;
- is furnished by the Disclosing Party to third parties without restriction; or
- is furnished to the Recipient by a third party who to the Recipient's knowledge legally obtained said information and the right to its disclosure.
- is developed independently by Recipient without use of or reference to the Disclosing Party's information.

2. Restrictions on Use

- (a) The Recipient will not disclose any Confidential Information to third parties for any purpose without the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party. However, where the Recipient is required to disclose Confidential Information in accordance with judicial or other governmental action, the Recipient will give the Disclosing Party reasonable prior notice unless such notice is prohibited by applicable law.
- (b) The Recipient will not use any Confidential Information for any purposes except those expressly contemplated or authorized by the Disclosing Party.
- (c) The Recipient will take the same reasonable security precautions as it takes to safeguard its own confidential information, but in no case less than reasonable care.
- (d) The Recipient undertakes to impose the confidentially obligations on all directors, officers and employees or other persons who work for the Recipient or under its direction and control, and who will have access to the Confidential Information.
- (e) The Recipient will return all originals, copies, reproductions and summaries of Confidential Information in its control, or confirm its destruction as requested by the Disclosing Party.

3. Action on Breach

(a) The Recipient will notify the Disclosing Party immediately upon discovery of any breach of this Agreement by the Recipient, and will cooperate in every reasonable way to help the Disclosing Party regain possession of the Confidential Information and prevent further breach.

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(b) The Disclosing Party will be entitled, without waiving any other rights or remedies, to seek such injunctive or equitable relief as may be deemed proper by a court of competent jurisdiction.

4. Ownership and Warranties

- (a) All Confidential Information, including the inherent intellectual properties, remains the sole and exclusive property of the Disclosing Party and the Recipient shall no right, title or interest in the same. Similarly, the Disclosing Party does not own any of the intellectual property of the Recipient, including any proprietary methodologies, tools or practices, unless otherwise agreed.
- (b) The Disclosing Party, unless expressly confirmed, makes no warranty regarding the accuracy or reliability of Confidential Information.

5. Applicability of Provisions

- (a) The provisions of this Agreement are jointly and severally applicable and will not be considered waived by any act or acquiescence, except by a specific prior written confirmation. Accordingly, both parties will expressly agree in writing to any changes in the Agreement.
- (b) If any provision of this Agreement is held illegal, invalid or unenforceable by law, the remaining provisions will remain in effect. Moreover, should any of the obligations of this Agreement be found illegal or unenforceable for any reasons, such obligations will be deemed to be reduced to the maximum duration, scope or subject matter allowed by law.
- (c) If any action at law or in equity is necessary to enforce or interpret the rights arising out of or relating to this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees, costs and necessary disbursements in addition to any other relief to which it may be entitled.

6. Jurisdiction

This Agreement will be governed by the laws of India on all substantive aspects, and both parties consent to the jurisdiction of the courts in Bangalore.

7. Tenure and Survival

All obligations created by this Agreement shall survive change or termination of the parties' business relationship for a period of two years from the date of the disclosure of the Confidential Information or the change in/termination of the business relationship of the parties whichever is later.

First Party and Second Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party.'

1. Background of Parties

1.1. 3. Cooperation

The Parties agree to the following cooperation:

3.1. Curriculum Design

First Party will give valuable inputs to the Second Party in teaching and training methodology and suitably customize the curriculum to fit into the industrial scenario meaningfully.

3.2. Incubation Center Support

First Party will provide expertise and extend the necessary support to the Second Party in defining the roadmap and processes to initiate and manage the Incubation Center.

3.3. Industrial Training and Visits

Industry and Institution interaction will give an insight into the latest developments and requirements of the industries. The First Party will permit the Students of the Second Party to visit its group companies and also involve in Industrial Training Programs for the Second Party. The Second Party may provide stipend to Second Party Students after discussing with the First Party for the Industry Training or Internships. The Second Party will ensure its students' commitment and discipline as advised by the First Party. On completion of the Training or Internship, the Industry shall provide certificates.

3.4. Skill Development Programs

With prior permission, the parties can use their infrastructure and facilities like meeting rooms, auditoriums, labs, projectors, sound systems, machinery, and other related equipment. Any expenses involved shall be discussed in advance and handled accordingly.

3.8. Publicity and Use of Logos

First Party will leverage its logo with the Second Party for events, workshops, boot camps, hackathons, industrial training and visits, pitching competitions, and other activities organized by the First Party. The First Party will display the Second Party's name, logo, icons, and details of the programs on the First Party's website, social media, and documents with mentions to the program.

4. Validity

- 4.1. This MOU shall be effective from the date of signing by both parties.
- 4.2. This MOU shall be valid for a period of three (3) years from the date of signing, with the understanding that it may be modified by written mutual agreement of both Parties.

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- 4.3. This MOU is subject to yearly review by both parties.
- 4.4. This MOU will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which the Golden City Entrepreneurs Society, the First Party, as the case may be, will take practical steps for implementation of this MOU. Any act on the part of Golden City Entrepreneurs Society, the First Party, after the termination of this Agreement by way of communication, correspondence, etc., shall not be construed as an extension of this MOU.
- 4.5. This MOU may be terminated by either Party upon 30 calendar days' prior written notice. In the event of termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations.
- 4.6. Either Party shall be entitled forthwith to terminate this MOU upon written notice if the other Party has ceased or threatened to cease business or is or has been wound up.

5. Financial Arrangements

- 5.1. This MOU places no financial obligations or additional funding commitments on either party. These activities will be defined through separate program agreements that detail the commitment of resources (financial or otherwise) required by either Party.
- 5.2. Subsequent program agreements must be approved in writing by the authorized representatives of both Parties.
- 5.3. Each party will be responsible for its costs connected with all matters relating to collaboration under this MOU.
- 5.4. The Parties may also seek funding for collaborations from government or other related agencies.

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6. Confidential Information

- 6.1. Each party acknowledges that it is in a confidential relationship with the other party. Each Party also acknowledges that during the term of this MOU, it may have access to privileged information deemed to be secret and confidential and which constitutes the exclusive property, trade secrets, and confidential information of the other Party or one of such other Party's affiliates (collectively "Confidential Information").
- 6.2. Confidential information shall be used by the recipient only in connection with the provision of this MOU and shall not be used for other purposes.
- 6.3. Each party shall maintain the confidentiality of the Confidential Information and use the same degree of care as it uses concerning its own Confidential Information to prevent the disclosure, publications, or unauthorized use of Confidential Information. Neither party may duplicate or copy Confidential Information of the other party other than to the extent reasonably necessary for legitimate business uses in connection with the MOU.

7. Notices

7.1. All notices and other communications under or in connection with this MOU shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given: when delivered, if delivered by messenger during normal business hours of the recipient (and a signature from an authorized recipient is obtained); when sent, if transmitted by facsimile transmission (electronic transmission report confirmed) during normal business hours of the recipient; or on the third business day following mailing, if





1. INTENT:

National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) intends to associate the TI who shall voluntarily contribute its share of experience for betterment of the highway infrastructure.

2. SCOPE OF THE MoU

The primary scope of MOU inter alia includes the following:

(i) NHAI shall facilitate the faculty, researchers and students of the Institute to familiarize with the latest trends in the highway/transportation sector with a common objective of sharing the knowledge in their

respective domain. This will, in one hand, facilitate to bridge the industry-institution gap and familiarize students with the latest trends in industry and on the other hand the research output could be suitably adopted in practice by NHAI.

- (ii) The Institute shall adopt nearby stretches of NHs as specified in the **Appendix-1** as a voluntary initiative under ambit of Institutional Social Responsibility (**ISR**). The list of stretches may be modified by deletion/addition by mutual consent of NHAI and the Technical Institute.
- (iii) The adopted stretch may be used as a field of study for faculty, researchers and students.
- (iv) NHAI shall offer internship to 20 numbers each of Undergraduate and Postgraduate students of TI periodically and also extend stipend for period of Two (2) months.
- (v) NHAI shall pay stipend @ Rs. 8000/- (Rupees Eight Thousand only) per month for undergraduate students and @ Rs. 15000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only) per month to Postgraduate students. All other arrangements including stay shall be responsibility of the Institute. However, depending upon availability, NHAI may extend transportation facility to the interns within the project jurisdiction.

3. Roles and Responsibilities:

The scope of this MOU shall be carried out in a collaborative mode between NHAI and the Technical Institute. The Roles & Responsibilities of NHAI and he Technical Institute in performing the defined objective shall be as follows:

 - (iv) Improvements in the riding comfort through cost effective measures based on innovative technologies on practices applicable in the area;
 - (v) Viability of new way side amenities for road user based on the existing traffic pattern and user expectations;,
 - (vi) Potential solutions to old recurring problems based on local experience etc.
- The Institute may also associate with the Consultants/NHAI during conceptualization, design and project preparation of new projects and suggest the relevant parameters and innovations based on experience specific to the site climate, topography and resource potential for better socio economic outcome
- The Technical Institute will nominate a coordinator as a point of contact for all correspondence in d. carrying out the defined objective as well as inform, from time to time.

4. EFFECTIVE DATE AND PERIOD OF MOU

This MoU shall come into effect for all its intents and purposes from the immediate effect and shall remain valid for a period of 5 years from the date of signing unless terminated earlier by mutual consent by either party by giving 60 days' notice in writing to the other party.
