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### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter called "MOU") is made on 12-Oct-2023 by and between Infosys Limited (including its subsidiaries and Affiliates), a corporation organized and existing under the laws of India and having its primary place of business at Plot No. 44 & 97A, Electronics City, Hosur Road, Bangalore 560 100, India (hereinafter "Infosys") and I. K. GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY (including its subsidiaries and Affiliates as listed under Annexure A) organized and existing under the laws of the state of Punjab and having its primary place of business at Jalandhar – Kapurthala Highway, VPO – Ibban, Dist. Kapurthala – 144603, Punjab (hereinafter "Partner"). Partner and Infosys being referred to individually as a "Party" or collectively as the "Parties."

#### Recitals

WHEREAS the Partner is I.K.Gujral Punjab Technical University (IKGPTU) was established by an Act of State Legislature on 16th January, 1997, to promote technical, management and pharmaceutical education in the state at degree level and above. It was established as Punjab Technical University and renamed as I.K.Gujral Punjab Technical University by State Government in the honor to Late Sh. Inder Kumar Gujral, Former Prime Minister of India, in 2015. The University has the mandate to set up centres of excellence in emerging technologies and for promoting training, research and development in these area and

WHEREAS Infosys is a global leader in consulting, technology, and outsourcing solutions and has agreed to provide their proprietary Springboard Platform for the Services. (hereinafter referred to as "Services")

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual agreements and covenants hereafter set forth, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

### 1. BROAD SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES

The objective of this MOU is to establish a written document forming a basis under which the Parties may enter into agreements to perform Services only in India as defined in Schedule A & B.

Both Parties understand that this is a Corporate Social Responsibility ("CSR") initiative hence scope of work can be augmented further as and when required.

Also, necessary augmentation, in consultation with both the Parties, can be made regarding the time period of the MOU.

The relationship between the Parties is non-exclusive and nothing herein will prohibit either Party from pursuing similar agreements with any company or person.

### 2. CONFIDENTIAL AND PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

Each Party acknowledges and agrees that any and all information emanating from the other Party's business, in any form, including but not limited to information relating to the disclosing party's past, present, or future research, development or business activities is "Confidential and Proprietary Information". Each Party agrees that it will not, during or after the term of this MOU, permit the duplication or disclosure of any such Confidential and Proprietary Information to any person (other than an employee, agent or representative of the other party who needs such information for the performance of the obligations hereunder), unless such duplication, use or disclosure is specifically authorized by the disclosing Party in writing. "Confidential and Proprietary Information" is not meant to include any information which (a) is publicly available prior to this MOU or is made publicly

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available by the disclosing party without restriction; (b) is rightfully received by the receiving party from third parties without accompanying secrecy obligations; (c) is already in the receiving party's possession and was lawfully received from sources other than the disclosing party; or (d) is independently developed by the receiving party. Partner may disclose Infosys' Confidential and Proprietary Information if Partner is required to do so under applicable law, rule or order or communicated in response to a valid order by a court or required by any governmental body or regulatory / legal authority, provided that, Partner, where reasonably practicable and to the extent legally permissible, provides Infosys with prior written notice of the required disclosure so that Infosys may seek a protective order or other appropriate remedy, and provided further that Partner discloses no more Confidential and Proprietary Information than is reasonably necessary in order to respond to the required disclosure. The secrecy of the Confidential and Proprietary Information disclosed pursuant to this MOU shall be maintained for a period of five (5) years following disclosure thereof.

### 3. DATA PRIVACY

- 3.1. The Parties hereby agree that each of it shall be acting in the capacity of an independent Data Controller and no PII (as defined under this MOU) of the other Party shall be used for any purposes other than for the fulfillment of the purpose of this MOU and provision of the Services as contemplated herein. Infosys while processing Personal Data for the purpose of Services contemplated herein; shall adhere to the stipulations agreed under Schedule C.
- 3.2 With respect to Personal Data provided by or on behalf of Partner or permitted by Partner to be provided to Infosys:(a) Each party will comply with all Laws, including all Laws relating to privacy or data security (b) Infosys and Partner will not be required to monitor or advise the other, in determining compliance with laws: (c) in the event of any change to (including changes in interpretation of a Law which requires a change to all or part of the Service, the Parties may make appropriate adjustments to the terms of the MOU and the Service, as determined by Infosys; and (d) Partner will encrypt all Partner Personal Data, prior to the provision to Infosys of such Partner's Personal Data by or on behalf of Partner or permitted by Partner to be provided to Infosys, or using such in connection with the Services. Partner is responsible for back up of all Partner Data.
- 3.3. Infosys has established and maintains a data security program. The existence of the data security program does not relieve either party of their obligations otherwise described in the MOU.

### 4. OWNERSHIP AND RESTRICTIONS

As used in this Section 4, the following terms have the respective meanings set forth below:

"Content" means any material hosted or to be hosted on Infosys Springboard including but is not limited to text, data, images, videos, graphics, code or other items.

"Free Software Foundation" means an entity defined at https://www.fsf.org/about/

"Partner Content" means all the Content that Partner uploads on or make available through Infosys Springboard.

"Infosys Content" means all the Content owned by Infosys or licensed to Infosys by any third party.

"Intellectual Property Rights" means all patents, copyrights and related rights, database rights, utility models, design rights, trademarks, service marks, rights in undisclosed or Confidential Information (such as knowhow, trade secrets and inventions) (whether patentable or not) and other rights of a like nature (whether registered or unregistered) and all applications for such rights as may exist anywhere in the world.

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"Open Source Software" means any software that is licensed under any license listed or described at <a href="http://www.opensource.org/docs/definition.php">http://www.opensource.org/docs/definition.php</a> or any license currently listed at <a href="http://www.opensource.org/licenses">http://www.opensource.org/licenses</a>. Free Code as defined by the Free Software Foundation.

- 4.1. Except as provided herein, this MOU will not be construed to grant any license under any trade secret, patent, patent application, industrial design, trademark, copyright, mask work, confidential process, formula, plan, computer program, data or other valuable confidential information or know-how to either Party. Each Party will own and retain all of its right, title, and interest in and relating to its intellectual property rights in its Products and Services and Confidential Information, both currently used and that which may be developed and used in the future. For avoidance of doubt, all intellectual property rights in infosys Springboard and Infosys Content will be retained by Infosys. Except otherwise provided in this MOU, Partner is not permitted to use the Infosys Springboard and Infosys Content.
- 4.2. Each party will have the non-transferable, non-exclusive, revocable license to use the other Party's logo(s), trade names(s) and trademarks and the names of its Products ("Marks") identified in Schedule D, all in unmodified form, solely for identification purposes in relation to the branding and marketing for the Services described in this MOU. All Marks must be reproduced on all copies of the Products and may not be altered or removed. The Party owning a Mark may modify, add or delete any such Marks upon sixty (60) days prior notice to the other Party. Each Party further agrees to ensure that all such use will comply with good trademark usage practices and the standards of display and trademark usage guidelines provided by the other Party and to take no action that would in any way infringe or interfere with the other Party's rights in its Marks. Each Party agrees to cooperate fully with the other Party in facilitating the other Party's monitoring and control of the nature and quality of the use of the other Party's Marks. Neither Party will have any right, title or interest in the Marks of the other Party, which will remain its sole and exclusive property, and each Party will retain all goodwill inured through the use of their respective Marks and, thus, agrees to assign to the other Party any rights that such Party may acquire in the applicable Marks by operation of law or otherwise. At no time during or after the term of this MOU will either Party challenge or assist others to challenge the other Party's Marks or the registration thereof or attempt to register, use or permit the use of any trademarks, marks or trade names confusingly similar to those of the other Party.
- 4.3 Infosys grants Partner a non-exclusive, limited, revocable, non-transferable, non-sublicensable license during the term to access and use Infosys Springboard and Infosys Content within the territory of India for educational and non-commercial purposes. Partner agrees not to distribute, transmit or publicly display any Infosys Content or any derivative work of Infosys Content to any third party unless otherwise agreed in this MOU. Partner agrees to retain all copyright or other notices fixed on any Infosys Content.
- 4.4. All Intellectual Property Rights in Partner Content will be retained by Partner. Partner represents and warrants that it has the necessary rights, licenses or consents to upload the Partner Content and to authorize end users of Infosys Springboard to access the Partner Content.
- 4.5. If Partner chooses to make the Partner Content available only to its authorized users. Partner grants infosys a non-exclusive, worldwide, royalty free license during the term of the MOU to host and display the Partner Content to authorized users of Partner through Infosys Springboard. In the event Partner chooses to make the Partner Content available at all the users of Infosys Springboard, Partner grants Infosys a non-exclusive, worldwide, royalty free, sub-license, perpetual license to host, copy, store, transmit or publicly display the Partner Content.
- 4.6. Partner agrees that Infosys has the right to remove the Partner Content from Infosys Springboard in the event Infosys receives any written notice or grievance from any third-party

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alleging infringement of its Intellectual Property Rights or violation of any privacy rights of that third party resulting from the Partner's Content.

4.7. Partner agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless infosys, its Affiliates, directors, officers, employees, representatives, and agents for any losses, damages, or expenses incurred by Infosys (including reasonable attorney fees) against: (i) any third party claim arising from the PARTNER's Content; (ii) breach of any warranties including implied warranties contained in this MOU by Partner; (iii) breach of confidentiality, data privacy and/or security obligations under this MOU, by Partner,

Infosys agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Partner, its Affiliates, directors, officers, employees, representatives, and agent for any losses, damages or expenses incurred by Partner (including reasonable attorney fees) against any third-party claims (i) arising from the Infosys breach of intellectual property rights; and (ii) breach of confidentiality, under this MOU. If any infringement claim is made or the same appears as a just claim concerning Infosys' Content, Infosys shall modify Infosys' Content so that is no longer infringing; or replace it with a non-infringing Infosys' Content.

THE INDEMNIFICATIONS STATED HEREIN ARE WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO THE INDEMNIFICATIONS THAT PARTNER HAS PROVIDED ELSEWHERE IN THIS MOU.

- 4.8. Partner agrees not to do, and not to allow or authorize any of its instructors or third party to do. any of the following:
  - a. Use infosys Springboard in any manner that could interfere with, disrupt, negatively affect or inhibit other users from fully enjoying the services provided by Infosys Springboard, or that could damage, disable, overburden or impair the functioning of the Infosys Springboard:
  - b. Harvest or collect information about other users, including their email addresses or any other personal details, without their consent;
  - c. Use any robot, spider, crawler, scraper or other automated means or interface not provided by us to access Infosys Springboard or to extract data from Infosys Springboard;
  - d. Reverse engineer any aspect of Infosys Springboard or do anything that might discover source code or bypass or circumvent measures employed to prevent or limit access to any area, content or code of Infosys Springboard (except as otherwise expressly permitted by
  - e. Use or attempt to use any account for which the Party does not have authorization;
  - f. Impersonate or post on behalf of any person or entity or otherwise misrepresent the Party's affiliation with a person or entity;
  - g. Attempt to circumvent any content filtering techniques Infosys employs, or attempt to access any service or area of Infosys Springboard not authorized to access by the Partner:
  - h. Engage in any harassing, intimidating, predatory or stalking conduct;
  - Develop any third-party applications that interact with infosys Springboard without our prior written consent:
  - Use Infosys Springboard for any illegal or unauthorized purpose or engage in, encourage or promote any activity that violates these Terms; and
  - k. Upload any Content which is defamatory, obscene, pornographic, pedophilic, invasive of another's privacy, including bodily privacy, insulting or harassing on the basis of gender. libelous, racially or ethnically objectionable, relating or encouraging money laundaring or gambling, or otherwise inconsistent with or contrary to the laws in force

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### 5. TERM

This MOU shall become effective on the last date of signing of this MOU ("Effective Date") and shall continue for a period of 5 (Five) years.

The Parties shall be entitled to terminate this MOU at any time by giving 30 days written notice of such termination to the other Party. Nothing in this MOU shall prevent the Parties from terminating this MOU immediately if there occurs a material breach of the terms and conditions mentioned herein.

Upon completion, termination or expiration of this MOU, Partner will, in addition to any other obligations of Partner on completion, termination or expiration:

- Cease all performance of the completed or terminated Services and furnish and return to Infosys all access of Infosys Springboard;
- (ii) Return to Infosys all copies of any Confidential or Proprietary Information of Infosys related to the completed or terminated Services and cease all use of these materials. Partner shall also certify to Infosys that it has complied with such obligations.

### 6. EXPENSES

Each Party will bear the costs and expenses of its performance under this MOU, unless agreed otherwise by the Parties in writing.

### 7. REPRESENTATION AND WARRANTIES

Partner represents and warrants that:

- in the execution of this MOU, Partner shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations and ordinances;
- (ii) Partner shall not subcontract any part of the Services without prior written approval of Infosys.
- (lii) that the Partner Content will not contain any viruses or worms, bugs, disabling devices or any devices that will disrupt, disable, harm, impede or otherwise interfere with the Services of Infosys or allow unauthorized access into Infosys systems or hardware.

Infosys represents and warrants that:

- the Services will be performed consistent with generally accepted industry standards in a professional and workmanlike manner;
- in the execution of this MOU, Infosys shall comply with all applicable laws, regulations, and ordinances, related to Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988; UK Bribery Act, 2010 and US Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, 1977.

Except as otherwise expressly set forth in this MOU, neither Party makes any warranties, guarantees or representations of any kind, express or implied, including without limitation any implied warranty of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose.

### 8. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Except for claims/ loss/ damages arising due to breach of Section 2 (Confidential and Proprietary Information), Section 4 (Ownership and Restrictions) and 10(g) (Non-Hire), for claims arising from any willful misconduct, fraud, misrepresentation, and or violation by Partner of any laws, rules, ordinances, or regulations; and any other liability which cannot be excluded under law, Partner

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shall not be liable to the other Party for damages, whether in contract, tort or otherwise, arising out of or in connection with this MOU. Further, Infosys shall not be liable to the other Party for damages, whether in contract, tort or otherwise, arising out of or in connection with this MOU. In no event shall either Party be liable for any indirect, special, incidental, consequential, punitive, tort or other damages, however caused, including, without limitation, any damages resulting from loss of use, loss of data, loss of profits or loss of business arising out of or in connection with this MOU, or of any other obligations relating to this MOU, whether or not the Party has been advised of the possibility of such damages.

#### 9. NOTICES

All notices to be given in connection with this MOU shall be effective upon receipt, shall be made in writing and shall be sufficiently given if personally delivered or if sent by courier or other express mail service, postage prepaid, addressed to the party entitled or required to receive such notice at the address for such party as follows:

### 10, GENERAL PROVISIONS

- a Independent Contractors. It is expressly understood that Infosys and Partner are contractors independent of one another, and that neither has the authority to bind the other to any third person or otherwise to act in any way as the representative of the other, unless otherwise expressly agreed to in writing signed by both parties hereto.
- b. Force Majeure. Each Party shall be excused from any failure to perform or any delay in performing its obligations under this MOU by reasons which arises from causes beyond a Party's reasonable control and not occasioned by its fault or negligence including but not limited to natural disasters, terrorist activities, government sanctions, economic sanctions, trade sanctions, embargo, actions or decrees of governmental bodies, communication line failures not the fault of the affected Party (hereafter referred to as a "Force Majeure Event"). A Party affected by the Force Majeure Event shall notify as soon as practicable the other Party of the occurrence of such event.

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- c. Compliance with Laws: Each Party will comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations in its performance of this MOU.
- d. Assignment: Neither Party will have the right to assign or otherwise transfer its rights or obligations under this MoU without receiving the express prior written consent of the other Party, such content not be unreasonably withheld. Notwithstanding the above or any contrary provision contained in this MoU, the Parties shall have the right to assign this MOU, in whole or in part, to any of their affiliates, parents or subsidiaries, or to any successor by way of merger, consolidation or acquisition of a substantial amount of the assets of said corporation or its parent company.
- e. Dispute Resolution and Arbitration: In the event of any dispute arising out of or in connection with this MOU, the Parties will attempt in good faith to resolve such dispute through negotiations between them. Where the parties are unable to resolve a dispute by means of negotiation, the dispute shall be finally settled by arbitration conducted in accordance with the rules of the Arbitration & Conciliation Act, 1996 as in effect on the Effective Date of this MOU. Such disputes will be resolved by a single arbitrator appointed by the parties after mutual agreement. The seat of arbitration will be Bangalore India. The language of the arbitration will be English. Each party will bear its own expenses in the arbitrators may, in their discretion, award costs and fees to the prevailing party. Judgment upon the award may be entered in any court having jurisdiction over the award or over the applicable party or its assets.
- f. Governing Law: This MOU, and any dispute arising from the relationship between the parties to this MOU, shall be governed by laws of India, excluding any laws that direct the application of another jurisdiction's laws.
- g. Non-Hire: Except as otherwise expressly agreed to by the other Party in writing, Partner agrees not to directly or indirectly or through third parties solicit or hire for employment any of other Party's employees involved in the provision of Services under this MOU during the term of this MOU and for a period of one (1) year following its completion or termination except where such hiring is pursuant to a bonafide advertisement to general public.

### 1. Definitions:

- iii. 'Data Controller' or 'Controller' means the entity that determines the purposes and means of Processing of Personal Data, either alone or jointly with another entity.
- iv. 'Data Subject' means any individual whose Personal Information is collected, used and/or processed under this DPA (Data Processing Agreement) for the purpose(s) as mentioned in MoU of the Parties. Explanation: list includes employees, clients, client customers, agents, contractors.
- v. 'Technical and Organizational Security Measures' means those measures aimed at protecting personal data against accidental or unlawful destruction or accidental loss, alteration, unauthorized disclosure or access, in particular where the processing involves the transmission of data over a network, and against all other unlawful forms of processing.
- vi. 'Personal Data Breach' means a breach of security leading to the accidental or unlawful destruction, loss, alteration, unauthorized disclosure of, or access to, Personal Data transmitted, stored or otherwise processed.
- vii. 'Processing' or any other derivative thereof, means any operation or set of operations performed upon PI, whether or not by automatic means, such as collection, recording, organization, structuring, storage, adaptation or alteration, consultation, use, disclosure by transmission, dissemination or otherwise making available, alignment or combination, restriction, blocking, erasure or destruction.

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# Processing of Personal Data

- The parties agree that in connection with this MOU. Partner and Infosys shall each act as a independent data controller with regard to use and processing of personal information for the purposes contemplated by this MOU. 

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This **Memorandum of Understanding** (hereinafter referred to as the 'MOU') is entered into the 7<sup>th</sup> October,2020 by and between

GOLDEN CITY ENTREPRENEURS SOCIETY, AMRITSAR represented herein by its Chairman, Raghav Khanna (hereinafter referred to as 'First Party,' the organization which expression, unless excluded by or repugnant to the subject or context, shall include its successors - in-office, administrators and assigns).

AND

I K Gujral Punjab Technical University, Amritsar Campus (Punjab) India, and represented herein by its Vice Chancellor, Dr. Ajay Kumar Sharma, (hereinafter referred to as 'Second Party,' the institution which expression, unless excluded by or repugnant to the subject or context shall include its successors - in-office, administrators and assigns).

First Party and Second Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party.'

### 1. Background of Parties

1.1. Golden City Entrepreneur Society (Amritsar Founders) is a community of entrepreneurs, leading business owners from Amritsar that connects and empowers professionals working in the corporate or startup ecosystem. It was founded to promote high standards of business behavior based on ethical values and international work culture. It is a body that wants to empower young entrepreneurs to grow their ideas, generate employment, and organize market clutter for the holistic progress of stand-alone enterprises. The key activities of

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investment interest are Recruitment Drives, Training Camps, Market Research, Resource Sharing, Articulation of Trade Concerns, Influencing Government

- 1.2. Policies & putting Amritsar on the World Business Map. The community members belong to a varied spectrum of industries like Marketing, Advertising, Sales, Education, Mechanical Engineering, Events Services, Computer Hardware, IT, International Trade, Construction, and Architecture.
- 1.3. I. K. ### 2. Objectives

2.5. To provide support in setting up the incubation center.

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### 3. Cooperation

The Parties agree to the following cooperation:

### 3.1. Curriculum Design

First Party will give valuable inputs to the Second Party in teaching and training methodology and suitably customize the curriculum to fit into the industrial scenario meaningfully.

### 3.2. Incubation Center Support

First Party will provide expertise and extend the necessary support to the Second Party in defining the roadmap and processes to initiate and manage the Incubation Center.

### 3.3. Industrial Training and Visits

Industry and Institution interaction will give an insight into the latest developments and requirements of the industries. The First Party will permit the Students of the Second Party to visit its group companies and also involve in Industrial Training Programs for the Second Party. The Second Party may provide stipend to Second Party Students after discussing with the First Party for the Industry Training or Internships. The Second Party will ensure its students' commitment and discipline as advised by the First Party. On completion of the Training or Internship, the Industry shall provide certificates.

### 3.4. Skill Development Programs

First Party will support developing programs to train the Second Party students on the emerging technologies to bridge the skill gap and make them industry-ready.

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### 3.5. Guest Lectures

First Party will extend the necessary support to deliver guest lectures to the Second Party students on the technology trends in-house requirements.

### 3.6. Counseling and Mentorship

# 3.7. Shared Use of Research Equipment and Facilities

With prior permission, the parties can use their infrastructure and facilities like meeting rooms, auditoriums, labs, projectors, sound systems, machinery, and other related equipment. Any expenses involved shall be discussed in advance and handled accordingly.

### 3.8. Publicity and Use of Logos

First Party will leverage its logo with the Second Party for events, workshops, boot camps, hackathons, industrial training and visits, pitching competitions, and other activities organized by the First Party. The First Party will display the Second Party's name, logo, icons, and details of the programs on the First Party's website, social media, and documents with mentions to the program.

### 4. Validity

- 4.1. This MOU shall be effective from the date of signing by both parties.
- 4.2. This MOU shall be valid for a period of three (3) years from the date of signing, with the understanding that it may be modified by written mutual agreement of both Parties.

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- This MOU is subject to yearly review by both parties.
- This MOU will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which the Golden City Entrepreneurs Society, the First Party, as the case may be, will take practical steps for implementation of this MOU. Any act on the part of Golden City Entrepreneurs Society, the First Party, after the termination of this Agreement by way of communication, correspondence, etc., shall not be construed as an extension of this MOU.
- 4.5. This MOU may be terminated by either Party upon 30 calendar days' prior written notice. In the event of termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations.
- Either Party shall be entitled forthwith to terminate this MOU upon written notice if the other Party has ceased or threatened to cease business or is or has been wound up.

### 5. Financial Arrangements

- This MOU places no financial obligations or additional funding commitments on either party. These activities will be defined through separate program agreements that detail the commitment of resources (financial or otherwise) required by either Party.
- Subsequent program agreements must be approved in writing by the authorized representatives of both Parties.
- 5.3. Each party will be responsible for its costs connected with all matters relating to collaboration under this MOU.
- 5.4. The Parties may also seek funding for collaborations from government or other related agencies.

### 6. Confidential Information

- 6.1. Each party acknowledges that it is in a confidential relationship with the other party. Each Party also acknowledges that during the term of this MOU, it may have access to privileged information deemed to be secret and confidential and which constitutes the exclusive property, trade secrets, and confidential information of the other Party or one of such other Party's affiliates (collectively "Confidential Information").
- 6.2. Confidential information shall be used by the recipient only in connection with the provision of this MOU and shall not be used for other purposes.
- 6.3. Each party shall maintain the confidentiality of the Confidential Information and use the same degree of care as it uses concerning its own Confidential Information to prevent the disclosure, publications, or unauthorized use of Confidential Information. Neither party may duplicate or copy Confidential Information of the other party other than to the extent reasonably necessary for legitimate business uses in connection with the MOU.

### 7. Notices

7.1. # **Letter of Agreement: Transfer Statement**

I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University (PTU)

Bachelor of Business Administration

And

Yorkville University (YU)

Bachelor of Business Administration (with specializations)

This Letter of Agreement (LOA) for Transfer into YU's Bachelor of Business Administration, (BBA) directly by completion of the PTU BBA or through the Qualifying Studies Pathway (indicated courses if the BBA has not been completed), is subject to the terms of the MOU in place between YU and PTU.

(1) Preamble

YU has reviewed courses from PTU's Bachelor of Business Administration presented to YU and have determined the articulation results identified.

Subject of to the availability of space and enrollment allocations, the Transfer Credit & Program Plan in Y's BBA for students from PTU's Bachelor of Business Administration program is as follows:

Appendix I

Transfer Credit from PTU: 23 courses (60 credits)

Program Plan courses to be taken at YU: 20 courses (63 credits)

NOTE: The Program Plan shows just one pathway based on students entering YU after PTU's second year. Other program plans could be worked out with a YU Academic Advisor for PTU students who choose to transfer at different points in their studies.

(2) Admissions and Transfer Credit

In general, a minimum of 50% of the courses required for an undergraduate degree must be completed through Yorkville University. In addition, project-based and capstone courses must be completed at Yorkville University.

Students who meet the following BBA entry and language requirements as outlined below, and have a minimum transfer GPA of 2.0 on a scale of 4.0 (YU) or an average score of 44 (C) on a scale of 100 (PTU), will be unconditionally admitted to the YU BBA and will follow the Program Plans as indicated in Appendix.

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a. Program Admission Requirement

Students who complete Grade 12 program leading to a British Columbia Certificate of Graduation, or the equivalent, with at least a 65% average in the following:

- Foundations Math 12 or Pre-Calculus Math 12 or Principles Math 12, or equivalent
- English 12/English 12 First Peoples or equivalent

b. English Admission Requirements

English is the primary language of instruction at Yorkville University. Applicants whose native language is not English must establish proficiency in English sufficient for post-secondary study. Such proficiency may be established in one of the following ways:

Completion of secondary education where English is the language of instruction.

 Successful completion of at least 12 credit hours of previous postsecondary education where English is the language of instruction.

Successful completion with the equivalent of "B" standing of a post-secondary level English

for Academic Purposes program accredited by Languages Canada.

 Confirmation of an official TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score of at least 550 (written version) or 80 (Internet based version); or an IELTS (International English-Language Test System) overall bandwidth of at least 6.5; or a Canadian Academic English-Language Test 43 (CAEL) score of 60 or higher; or a score equivalent to these scores on another test of English language proficiency recognized by and acceptable to the University. Students with IELTS score of 6.0 or equivalent, applying to the BC BBA will be admitted to the EAP (Eng180) course to be completed in their first term of study along with specific other courses in the plan of study. Students below 6.0 applying for the BC BBA program will be referred to an ESL partner in BC or to the Ontario program.

For Language Canada, see footnote 1.

c. Transfer Credit for Students

Students entering the Bachelor of Business Administration program may transfer blocks of credits from degree and diploma programs recognized by and acceptable to the admissions committee.

The block transfers are generally applied to the elective component of the program. Students may also transfer credits where it can be demonstrated that a course previously completed is equivalent to a course in the Bachelor of Business Administration program.

The general rules governing transfer of credits into the BBA are:

• The University may accept up to a maximum of 60 credits (50% of total credits required) in transfer toward the BBA degree for coursework.

• Credits being transferred to the Yorkville program must have been completed at a postsecondary institution recognized in that institution's home jurisdiction.

- Normally, only credits earned within ten years of a student's admission to Yorkville will be accepted, but the admissions committee may establish different rules for particular cases.
- Students must have achieved a satisfactory grade, as defined by the registrar or admissions committee, in the courses being considered for a transfer credit.
- Transfer credit will not be granted for the following courses:
  - BUSI 2123 Business Strategy
  - o BUSI 4003 Business Case Analysis
  - BUSI 4013 Business Organization Analysis Project
  - BUSI 4033 Business Improvement Project
  - o BUSI 4046 Final Business Plan
- Official transcripts must be submitted at the time of application to Yorkville University for transfer credits to be considered by the University. Transcripts will be evaluated and notification will be forwarded by the Registrar's Office concerning the student's status in the program, including the number of transfer credits awarded.
- Credits earned through transfer are not used to compute the student's GPA.

### (3) Provisos

- i. In all cases, the University reserves the right to require proof of language proficiency before permission will be granted to register in academic courses. Applicants from countries where English is the language of instruction but is not the primary language of the general population, may be asked to demonstrate English-language proficiency.
- ii. For a student to graduate with a Yorkville University degree, at least 50% of degree credits must be completed at Yorkville University.
- iii. The transfer of credits obtained at other post-secondary institutions is permitted, but all requests must be well documented.

### (4) Duration & Termination of LOA

- a. This LOA shall become effective on the date that it is signed by both parties and shall be valid for a period of five years, but will be reviewed annually, and may be extended by mutual consent expressed in writing.
- **b.** This LOA may be terminated by either Party at any time provided that the terminating Party gives written notice of its intention at least 90 days prior to termination. Such termination would not alter the programs for students who already have transfer credit with YU under this agreement as they would complete their studies in accordance with the terms of this LOA at the time of their entry into YU.
- c. Where there are two or more versions of this LOA in different languages, and where a dispute arises, the English version shall prevail for the purposes of interpretation of the LOA.

Ajay Kumar Sharma and the Tribhuvan University (TU) represented by its Vice Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Tirth Raj Kaniya agree to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding, which is a statement of our desire to promote academic and cultural learning, research, and global leadership in today's high-tech and multicultural society. This Memorandum is based on the foundation of mutual trust for the benefit and development of the two universities and the promotion of international understanding and goodwill.

- Exchange of Faculty and Administrators: Based on their respective academic and educational priorities, as well as their operational needs and constraints, the two universities will promote exchange of visiting scholars in the joint mechanism of teaching/educational/ administration/cooperative research.
- 2. Exchange of Students: Based on their respective academic and educational priorities, as well as their operational needs and constraints, the two universities will promote student exchange programmes on a reciprocal basis, which will support the promotion of all-round development of students, particularly in the areas of global outlook and cultural appreciation.
- Conduct of Joint Research: The two universities will promote joint research studies in areas

- The terms of specific areas of cooperation shall be agreed upon in writing by both parties prior
  to the initiation of any particular activity.
- Any specific programme shall be subject to mutual consent, availability of funds, and a budget approved by both parties.
- The two universities agree to uphold this Memorandum for an initial period of five years from the date of joint signing; it will be effective when the representatives of both universities have signed and dated it.

9. The agreement may be renewed provided that neither party gives a written notice of termination of this agreement to the other before the end of the term at least six months in advance.

# MEMORANDUUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (hereafter referred to as "MOU") is entered into effect on 9<sup>th</sup> February, 2019.

#### BY AND BETWEEN THE FOLLOWING PARTIES:

I. K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar, established by an Act of State Legislature on 16<sup>th</sup> January, 1997, to promote technical, management and pharmaceutical education in the state at degree level and above, having its address at Jalandhar - Kapurthala Highway, VPO-Ibban, Kapurthala-144603, Distt. Kapurthala, represented for the purposes of the MOU by its Dean, Planning and External Programs, Dr. N. P. Singh (hereinafter referred to as "IKGPTU")

and

- Leaders Institute Pty Ltd, ABN 605 807 305, a higher education provider in Australia, registered under the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency Act 2011, and whose academic programs are accredited by the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency, having its address at 76 Park Road, Woolloongabba, Qld, 4102, Australia; P.O. Box 73, Stones Corner, Qld, 4120, Australia, represented for the purposes of this MOU by its Chief Executive Officer Dr. Rodney (Rod) St Hill (hereinafter referred to as "Leaders")

IKGPTU and Leaders may individually be referred to as "Party" and collectively as "Parties".

#### PREAMBLE

Whereas, in accordance with a mutual desire between the Parties to promote further cooperation in education, training and research between IKGPTU and Leaders .

#### Therefore, it is hereby agreed as follows:

- 1. The preamble is an integral part of the present MOU.
- 2. 2.1 Both Parties agree on the following general forms of cooperation:
  - a) Joint educational, training and/or research activities.
  - Exchange of invitations to faculty, research personnel, graduate and undergraduate students (hereinafter referred to as "Scholars") for lectures, visits and sharing of experiences.
  - c) Exchange of invitations to Scholars for participation in conferences, symposia and seminars.

- d) Exchange of Scholars for study, training and research.
- 2.2 The details of cooperation for any of the above-identified fields may also be specified in the form of addenda or subsequent agreements to this MOU upon signature by appropriate representatives.
- 3. 3.1 It is agreed between the Parties that exchange of Scholars will be subject to the rules and regulations of the host Party and country. Scholars must fulfil existing visa requirements and submit evidence of adequate medical and travel insurances stating a waiver of subrogation against the host Party for any reason whatsoever. The above-mentioned documents are subject to a prior written approval from the host Party.
  - 3.2 Each Party undertake on behalf of their Scholars (i) to comply with the other Party's policies and procedures regarding the use of their premises and facilities in a reasonable manner and (ii) to avoid any unethical behaviors.
  - 3.3 Both Parties agree in their respective Bylaws or Policies on the principles of equal opportunity and non-discrimination. Neither Party shall impose criteria for exchanges of Scholars, which would violate the principles of nondiscrimination
- 4. Both Parties agree that this MOU does not commit either Party to financial liability and all financial arrangements that are necessary to implement this MOU will depend upon the availability of funds and will be subject to negotiations and separate written agreements.
- 5. The MOU is valid for a term of five (5) years from the Effective Date. All provisions will automatically expire if no specific agreement related to the above four areas of cooperation (cf. article 2) is not signed within 18 (eighteen) months following the Effective Date.

  Unless automatically expired, this MOU may be renewed before the termination date on 9th February, 2024; by virtue of an addendum to be signed in due course. Either Party may terminate this MOU by giving written notice of ninety (90) days to the other Party. In the event of early termination, the Parties will make good faith efforts to complete or terminate existing projects or engagements without substantial prejudice to the other Party. Subject to any applicable legal or regulatory requirements or restrictions, any existing project or engagement that is in effect at the time of termination shall not be affected by the termination of this MOU and will proceed as originally agreed upon until successful completion.

- 8. Each Party shall not use the name and/or logo of the other Party in any publication, advertising, promotional material, press release, or other marketing material, without the express prior written consent of the other Party to each particular use of its name and/or logo.
- 9. If and whenever either Party is in breach of any obligation under this MOU and/or any subsequent addenda or agreement, the other Party shall send a written notice to the breaching Party in order to remedy such a situation within 15 (fifteen) working days. If the breaching situation is not remedied accordingly, the present MOU and/or any subsequent addenda or agreement shall be terminated on the full liability of the breaching Party who shall incur the damages against all losses, costs and/or expenses arising from or in connection with their breach.
- 10. Each Party shall not assign or transfer any of their rights and/or obligations under this MOU to any third party without the prior written consent of the other Party.
- 11. The present MOU is the entire understanding between the Parties and supersedes all prior understandings, correspondence and agreements, whether verbal or written between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. The terms of the MOU may be amended only by mutual written consent.



This is the 1st generation of this agreement. This agreement applies to the University of Nottingham campuses in the UK, Malaysia and China and is subject to revision, renewal or cancellation by mutual consent and becomes effective for a period of five (5) years upon completion of signature.



Cambridge English works with partners in India to promote the use of standardised international assessments as a benchmark to improve the learning and teaching of English and is keen to work with institutions to give their teachers and students access to international English qualifications.


In consideration of discussions between the parties and mutual promises and conditions in this MoU, the parties agree as follows:

a. Promote the following Cambridge English examinations:

for the students: Cambridge English Placement Test, Linguaskill, B1 Business Preliminary, B2 Business Vantage, C1 Business Higher and other general English qualifications.

for the teachers: TKT and English as a Medium of Instructions (EMI)


b. Encourage Cambridge English examinations are taken by students at the IKGPTU.

AVU and IKGPTU are referred to collectively as "Parties" or individually as "Party".

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) establishes the following:

#### 1st Article

#### Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to establish a mutually beneficial relationship built on academic, scientific and cultural cooperation as well as to define the areas for fundamental, academic research in which the Parties desire to work together in the future for their mutual benefit to foster a collaborative framework with a view to benefiting from each other's initiatives and working procedures.

Areas of cooperation between AVU and IKGPTU include the exchange of faculty professors, administrative Officersresearchers, students, publications, academic programs and research projects.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Article

#### Scope

The Parties agree to provide opportunity, as appropriate, for the following activities towards the completion of the objective hereof.

- Exchange of faculty members, administrative officers and/or researchers with the
  objective of offering courses, training programme and realizing research projects in
  areas mutually agreed upon by both universities in accordance with the procedures
  and expectations established by each university and specific departments.
- 2. Support reciprocity in university extension activities of common interest.
- Exchange of books, scientific publications, study programs, academic projects, course information, seminars, conferences and any other data and information of common interest.
- 4. Develop joint research projects and joint publications.
- 5. All joint activities are realized through the mutual agreement and clearly established conditions and mutual obligations of the appropriate university entity.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup>Article

# Implementation of the MOU

- 1 The implementation of this MOU is defined according to every particular case, either by the signing of Specific Cooperation Agreements or by the simple correspondence between the representativesof the Parties.
- 2 The Rector of AVU and the Vice-Chancellor of IKGPTU can, whenever they wish, nominate representatives and give them powers to sign and execute the Agreements concluded under this MOU.
- 3 These agreements take into account the specificities of each action to be taken, in particular regarding the objectives to be defined, the methodologies to be applied, the means to be provided and the financial resources involved.

#### 4th Article

# Obligations of the Parties

In order to establish the intended cooperation correctly, the Party undertakes, after prior consultation, to make available to the other Party the necessary means to implement the agreed measures in compliance with the rules between the Parties and without any prejudice to the normal implementation hereof.

# 5<sup>th</sup>Article

## **Publications**

All publications resulting from actions taken under this MOU are properly referenced with regard to its authorship and participating institutions.

# 6<sup>th</sup>Article

Duration

- 1 This MOU comes into force upon its signature, is valid for an indeterminate period of time and may be reviewed at any time.
- 2 This MOU may be cancelled at any time, by agreement of the Parties, or terminated by either Party, by registered letter sent to the other Party with at least 30 days in advance.
- 3 In case of cancellation or termination hereof, the Parties are bound to fulfill the obligations under the related agreements.

# 7th Article

Litigation

The Parties undertake to solve any doubts, omissions or difficulties in the interpretation hereof.

Wilfrid Laurier University (WLU), and I. K. Gujral Punjab Technical University (IKGPTU), wish to enter into this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") to promote international and intercultural understanding and academic cooperation and collaboration.

#### Purpose

The purpose of this MOU is to provide a framework for the future development of academic and educational cooperation between the parties as set out below.

- 1. The parties will explore academic and educational activities of mutual interest on the basis of equality and reciprocity and will encourage the following:
  - a) Exchange visits of faculty members, researchers, and administrative staff,
  - Exchange of students, student visitation, and the development of study abroad and short-term programs;
  - c) Assessing the potential for transfer and degree completion programs;
  - d) Organization of conferences, seminars, sports event/competitions, symposia or lectures;
  - e) Exploration of common research interests and other forms of academic collaboration.
- 2. Initial areas of collaboration and cooperation may include, but not be limited to the following:
  - a) Development of an Articulation Agreement for transfer students from PTU's B. Tech (CSE) to WLU Bachelor of Computer Science degree program under credit transfer program.
  - Development of short-term, customized training workshops for PTU's students, staff, and administrators.
  - c) Collaboration on joint initiatives within the Punjab.
  - d) Assessment of the potential for a Student Exchange Agreement to enable short-term study/internships.

#### Tasks for each Party

- 3. Each party agrees to:
  - a) Maintain regular and reasonable contact with the other party, informing the other party of any relevant changes or developments in relation to this MOU:
  - b) Review this MOU on an annual basis, providing the other party with relevant information and statistics in relation to the purpose; and
  - c) Nominate a senior member of staff to be responsible for overseeing the implementation of this MOU.
- 4. The details of any specific activities based on this MOU will be separately negotiated and agreed to in writing between the parties in a separate agreement.



5. The parties understand that the implementation of any activities stated in Clauses 1, 2 or 3 above shall depend upon the availability of resources and the financial support of each party.

#### Costs

6. The parties agree that each shall bear its own costs in connection with, or for any work under this MOU, save and except as agreed in writing between the parties. For the avoidance of doubt, each party shall (unless otherwise agreed) meet the travel, accommodation and subsistence costs of their own staff involved in visits to the other party associated with this MOU.

# Confidentiality

- 7. Each party shall keep confidential and shall not, without the prior written permission of the other party, disclose to any other institution or organization or other third party any confidential information it acquires from the other party in connection with this MOU, unless such information:
  - a) Is already in, or subsequently enters, the public domain (other than as a result of its disclosure by the receiving party in breach of this clause 5), or
  - b) Is required to be disclosed by law or any legal or regulatory authority, or
  - is already known to the receiving party before the acquisition from the other party (without being subject to any obligations of confidentiality to the other party), or
  - d) Is obtained from a third party in circumstances where no obligation of confidentiality is owed to the other Party in respect of such information.

Each party recognizes and agrees that the other party may have independent obligations under privacy protection legislation, such as *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* and that nothing in this MOU prohibits either party from complying with such obligations. The obligations of the parties under this clause 6, 7 and 8 shall continue following the expiry or termination of this MOU.

#### Intellectual Property

- 8. Any intellectual property rights owned by a party before the Commencement Date (as defined in clause 12) and during the term of this MOU will remain the property of that party. Nothing contained in this MOU will affect the absolute ownership rights of either party in such party's intellectual property rights. For the avoidance of doubt, no licences are granted under this MOU.
- 9. In the event that either party wishes to use the name and/or logo of the other party for any purposes, including without limitation for the purposes of marketing or recruitment, such party shall obtain the written consent of the other party in advance of such use and (if such consent is given, at the discretion of the other party) shall comply strictly with all of the other party's directions from time to time as to the manner of such use.
- 10. Neither of the Parties shall publish any marketing material relating to this MOU without the prior written consent of the other party, and the parties agree that the wording for any such marketing materials shall be agreed jointly between the parties prior to its use.

#### **Term and Termination**

11. This MOU will be effective from the date of the last signature below and shall remain in effect for a period of five (5) years from the date of signing (the



- "Commencement Date"), unless earlier terminated as outlined below. This MOU may be renewed, in writing, upon the mutual agreement of the parties.
- Either party reserves the right to terminate this MOU upon six months' written notice to the other party.

#### General

- This MOU may be amended or modified by a written agreement signed by both parties hereto.
- 14. This MOU shall be executed in English. In the event a translated copy of this MOU exists, the parties agree that the English version shall prevail for the purposes of interpretation.
- 15. This MOU may be signed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original. Nothing in this MOU should be construed to obligate the parties to any current or future expenditure or resources, or to enter into contract with one another. An electronic scanned copy of this MOU shall have the same force and effect.

and

**Train Turf Academic Solutions Limited**, the academic and advisor of IAU and PTU, based in Vancouver, BC, Canada, represented by its CEO, Parneet Dhillon, herein referred to as "TT".

There will be three parties to the Understanding, and they are listed as follows:

PARTY A **INTERNATIONAL AMERICAN UNIVERSITY** (IAU) ADDRESS Los Angeles, California, USA

PARTY B IK GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY (PTU) ADDRESS Kapurthala, Punjab, India

PARTY C TRAINTURF ACADEMIC SOLUTIONS LIMITED (TT) ADDRESS Vancouver, BC, Canada.

#### WITNESS THAT:

WHEREAS, IAU is an accredited and private post-secondary educator that has been operating in California since 2005, Approved by the State of California Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (BPPE), Certified by the Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP), and accredited by the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS), that offers management and Business Graduate and Post-Graduate programs. WHEREAS, PTU is a State Government University, that offers UG and PG programs at its campuses and affiliated colleges in Punjab.

and

WHEREAS, Train Turf is a training & education advisory organization based in Vancouver, British Columbia. Train Turf is the exclusive recruitment, marketing, counseling and operations partner of articulation, credit exchange programs.

WHEREAS, the parties wish to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding to promote international cooperation in the delivery of management and credit transfer programs.

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NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the parties hereby agree as follows:

#### ARTICLE I

# DESCRIPTION OF COOPERATION

Parties agree to promote the collaboration in following areas like:

- a) Credit Transfer program
- b) Progression and exchange of students
- c) Exchange of teaching, research and administrative staff
- d) Organization of joint academic and research activities such as seminars, lectures, conferences.

IAU shall accept course credit for students coming from the following PTU program(s):

IAU's Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and PTU's Bachelor of Business Administration. Following concentration options are available at IAU's BBA: Accounting, Economics, Finance, Hospital Travel Tourism and Marketing.

Further, students of the PTU programs can be admitted to one of the MBA programs at IAU if they satisfy program entry requirements. Successful graduates of the latter program will earn their MBA degree from IAU. IAU offers MBA in various concentrations: General, Agriculture, Hospitality, Management Information Systems, Business Analytics, Human Resource Management, Finance, Healthcare Administration, Marketing, Luxury Brand Management and Logistics Management.

Students must meet all IAU program requirements.

#### For BBA:

**Education:** IAU requires either evidence of an earned high school diploma, General Educational Development (GED) tests, ability-to-benefit exam (ATB), or the successful completion of a degree program. The degree must be earned at an appropriately accredited institution or foreign equivalent. Exceptions may be made on a case-by-case basis.

**Professional Experience:** IAU recommends 1 year of full-time professional experience, in any organization, including, but not limited to, private, public, for-profit, non-profit, start-ups, or established corporate organizations.

**Information Technology:** IAU requires students to possess computer and internet skills sufficient to effectively participate in IAU's pedagogical model and conduct research at the undergraduate level.

**Evidence of English Proficiency:** IAU requires writing skills at the appropriate level. Proficiency in reading, writing, speaking, and understanding English is essential to your success at IAU. If English is not the applicant's native language, or if an applicant has not had their secondary education taught in English, they will be required to provide proof of **English Proficiency.** Since classes are taught in English, an applicant must demonstrate their ability to read, write and speak English.

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#### For MBA:

**Education**: IAU requires evidence of an earned bachelor degree in business, management, or administration. All degrees must be earned at an appropriately accredited institution or foreign equivalent. IAU understands the differing rigor of schools and grading scales around the world, and IAU evaluates prior academic credentials within their own context. Exceptions may be made on a case-by-case basis.

**Professional Experience:** IAU recommends 3 years of full-time professional experience, including, but not limited to, private, public, for-profit, non-profit, start-ups, or established corporate organizations.

**Information Technology:** IAU requires students to possess computer and internet skills sufficient to effectively participate in IAU's pedagogical model and conduct research at the undergraduate level.

**Evidence of English Proficiency:** IAU requires writing skills at the appropriate level. Proficiency in reading, writing, speaking, and understanding English is essential to your success at IAU. If English is not the applicant's native language, or if an applicant has not had their secondary education taught in English, they will be required to provide proof of English Proficiency. Since classes are taught in English, an applicant must demonstrate their ability to read, write and speak English.

PTU agrees to forward the interested student(s) application documents for entrance into the program at IAU.

IAU will provide marketing information for the partnership and course transfer as requested by PTU. PTU will publish the MoU through media and affiliated colleges.

# ARTICLE II

# **MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

- Each party agrees and covenants to the other that it shall enter negotiations in good faith.
- 2. All parties warrant that they have the capacity and resources to assume their respective responsibilities outlined in this Understanding.
- All parties undertake to inform each other of all new information and developments, which would have an impact on the negotiations.
- 4. All notices required or permitted under this Understanding shall be in writing and transmitted to the addressee by registered e-mail at the address indicated in the party clause hereof. A party hereto may cause a change in its address by serving a written notice of such fact to the other. A notice of a change of address shall be binding on the other party immediately upon receipt of such notice.
- This Understanding may be amended, modified, or otherwise altered only by means of a written instrument duly signed by all the parties.

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- 6. IAU will make final acceptance of students based on its admissions criteria per program.
- PTU will be listed on IAU website as a licensed school under Understanding to transfer credit.
- 8. IAU will be listed similarly to 7 on the PTU website.
- 9. All signage, promotional or marketing materials must be approved by IAU prior to usage, public broadcast or used for display purposes.
- 10. Interested students admission is to be handled by PTU and TT.

# ARTICLE III

#### TERMINATION AND EXTENSION

It is hereby agreed that any party may terminate this Understanding for whatever cause after due written notice to the other parties is given at least one academic year prior to the intended date of termination.

During this termination period all parties agree to return all propriety and property belonging to the respective parties and will cease to use the name, will not refer to and will not use the curriculum or any provide any messaging to the public that may be misleading. Any signage and logos will immediately be removed upon termination by either party.

This MoU is for a period of 3 years and valid till  $\frac{4/26/2025}{}$ , after which a further 3-year extension will be exercised if all parties agree.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

In accordance with a mutual desire to promote cooperation and understanding between Canada and India as well as to enhance the intellectual and experiential resources of four great and reputed institutions, Vancouver Premier College of Arts and Science (Canada), Vancouver Premier College of Business and Management (Canada), Vancouver Premier College of Hotel Management (Canada) and I.K. GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY (India), and TrainTurf Academic Solutions Limited (Canada) voluntarily agree to join in this agreement on cultural and educational cooperation by establishing a cooperative relationship.

Recognizing the separate and mutual benefits to be gained through a cooperative program that proactively promotes scholarly activities and international understanding, I.K. GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY (India) (hereinafter referred to as "PTU" or "the University") and Vancouver Premier College of Arts and Science, Vancouver, Premier College of Business and Management, Vancouver, Premier College of Hotel Management (hereinafter referred to in the collective as "VPC" or "Vancouver Premier College") and TrainTurf Academic Solutions Limited (hereinafter referred to as "TrainTurf") enter into this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") and agree as follows:

# 1.0 THE PURPOSE OF ACADEMIC AND EDUCATIONAL CO-OPERATION

Both PTU and VPC agree to enter into this academic partnership. Within the context of global higher education cooperation and development, the institutions will collaborate to meet the growing need for cultivating skilled and knowledgeable international professionals. This MOU is intended to take full advantage of the education resources available at both PTU and VPC and therefore, contributes to the development and expansion of the global higher education market.

# 2.0 SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES OF THIS MOU

Co-operation between PTU and VPC will focus primarily on areas of common interest.

- 2.1 The objectives of this MOU may include, but are not be limited to, the following:
  - The development of articulation or credit transferagreements.
  - The organization of cooperative academic activities such as conferences, seminars, symposia or lectures.

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- Faculty, Officers and student visits, transfers and related collaboration.
- d) Semester, inter session and disciplinary exchange programs.
- e) The exchange of research publications and promotional materials.
- f) The exploration of other common areas of interest.
- 2.2 Cooperative projects defined within this MOU may include any academic initiative, program and/or discipline of PTU and VPC.

#### 3.0 IMPLEMENTATION & REPRESENTATION

- 3.1 Future supplemental letters of agreement or other attachments shall include such items as:
  - a) The elaboration of the responsibilities of each party for the agreed upon activity;
  - b) Schedules and/or timelines for the completion of the specific activities;
  - A list of first year courses and course outlines for articulating programs.
- 3.2 The respectively appointed PTU and VPC faculty and/or staff coordinator(s) shall be responsible for the evaluation of all activities under this MOU according to the variously existing policies, procedures and practices of their respective institutions.
- 3.3 TrainTurf will be academic advisor between VPC and PTU. Train Turf is the exclusive recruitment, marketing, counseling and operations partner of articulation programs between VPC and PTU.

#### 4.0 DURATION & TERMINATION

- 4.1 This MOU shall become effective on the date that it is signed by both PTU and VPC and shall be valid for a period of five (5) years after which it may be renewed or extended by mutual consent expressed in writing.
- 4.2 Any change to this MOU shall be subject to the written consent of both PTU and VPC.
- 4.3 This MOU may be terminated by either PTU or VPC at any time during the first 90 days after which each party will provide three months of written notice of its intention to terminate this MOU which will enable each party to amply prepare for its termination.

#### 5.0 TERMS & CONDITIONS

It is understood by PTU and VPC that this MOU involves providing students who have completed certain designated programs at PTU with preferred entry and block transfer into VPC diploma



programs in General Studies (Arts and Science), Business Management and Hospitality Management as well as preferred entry into VPC's postgraduate programs in Hospitality Management, Digital Marketing, Cybersecurity, DataAnalytics and Information Technology.

It is further understood that VPC will not receive any tuition or other fees from PTU or PTU's students who enter into the designated programs for block transfer as long as their courses are being staffed and taught at PTU. Concurrently, VPC will not incur costs associated with PTU students completing their designated programs at PTU. Upon successful completion of the designated courses, PTU students will then apply to VPC and be processed in accordance with VPC's entrance and transfer requirements. Accepted students will then pay for their tuition prior to beginning their VPC program and in accordance with VPC's tuition payment deadline dates.

#### 6.0 TUITION & PROGRAMS

- 6.1 All PTU students will pay tuition in accordance with currently posted tuition costs on VPC's website.
- 6.2 The four VPC programs available for credit transfer include the Hospitality Management Diploma; Hospitality Management Diploma with Co-op; Business Management Diploma; General Studies Diploma.

PTU bachelor degree holders can apply to VPC Post Graduate Diploma programs in Hospitality Management; Post Graduate Diploma in Digital Marketing; Post Graduate Diploma in Cybersecurity; Post Graduate Diploma in Data Analytics; and, Post Graduate Diploma in Information Technology on the condition that they meet relative admission requirements.

- 6.3 In a manner consistent with VPC's policies, procedures and designated program requirements, VPC agrees to accept into its diploma and postgraduate programs, qualified PTU students who have completed the designated 10 course VPC curriculum for each of its designated diploma programs at PTU with an AGPA of 2.00 (63%-66% in percentage grading scale) or higher.
- 6.4 All PTU students must meet VPC's English Language proficiency requirements. Those PTU students who are unable to meet this requirement can enroll in VPC's ESL program.

**HEREINAFTER** referred to as the Parties.

WHEREAS both Parties, as part of a larger Collaboration Agreement, agree that an academic partnership that creates seamless pathways from PTU BBA to YU BBA is beneficial to their past, current and future students;

WHEREAS both Parties are committed to providing high quality academic programs that serve to advance the academic and professional goals of their students; and

**WHEREAS** both Parties offer post-secondary education programs that meet with all respective jurisdictional legislation where required and applicable;

**THEREFORE** the Parties agree to establish a formal articulated pathway for students of PTU's BBA program to complete their Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) at Yorkville University. PTU BBA students will be admitted to and given credits toward the Yorkville BBA program in accordance with the details outlined below.

#### 1. Project Background

The BBA program at Yorkville University was granted consent by the Postsecondary Education Quality Assessment Board and the Minister of Advanced Education and Skills Development in Ontario in September 2016.

PTU is a registered university in India that offers undergraduate and graduate programs. Their BBA program is accredited by all the relevant education authorities in India.







#### 2. Project Summary

This Agreement formalizes the articulation arrangements for the PTU's BBA students to the BBA program at YU. Students from PTU's BBA program who achieve the required academic standing will be able to easily transition into the BBA program at YU and will receive credit toward their BBA for work completed at PTU.

#### 3. Under this Articulation Agreement, Yorkville University agrees to:

3.1. Admit students from PTU's BBA program, who meet all eligibility criteria listed in this agreement and award those students transfer credits toward completion of the BBA detailed in Section 5 of this agreement.

To be eligible for admission and the award of transfer credits, the PTU students must have successfully completed the courses outlined in Section 5 of this agreement. There will be no time limit applied to the ability to transfer their credits.

- 3.2. Collaborate with PTU in the development and implementation of a marketing plan to promote the academic pathway options for PTU students.
- 3.3. Review PTU curricula changes in a timely manner as required to ensure the integrity of this articulation.

#### 4. Under this Articulation Agreement, PTU agrees to:

- 4.1. Advise YU immediately of any changes to curricula within the BBA program.
- 4.2. Collaborate with YU in the development and implementation of a marketing plan to promote the academic pathway options for PTU students.
- 4.3. Promote the YU BBA pathway to PTU students, both current and alumni.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, SAN BERNARDINO AND I.K GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, INDIA

To promote academic cooperation, to strengthen educational and cultural ties, to support internationalization efforts on their respective campuses, and to achieve a successful and sustainable collaboration, California State University, San Bernardino, hereafter referred to as "CSUSB," and I.K Gujral Punjab Technical University, India, hereafter referred to as "IKGPTU," endorse this Memorandum of Understanding.

Subject to applicable laws, regulations and university policies, both institutions will endeavor to encourage direct contact, educational and research cooperation among their constituents, including students, faculty members and staff, departments and research institutes, and will endeavor to cooperate in the fields of interest to both institutions. The parties contemplate the following forms of cooperation:

- Study abroad programs for IKGPTU students to study at CSUSB for a full academic year, one or two academic semesters, or short term;
- 2. Partnerships in academic programs;
- 3. Special short-term academic and language programs;
- Joint research and professional activities, such as participation in seminars and academic meetings.

Terms, conditions, and arrangements (e.g., academic, logistics, financial) of joint activities will be identified and negotiated for each specific case and must be memorialized in writing and executed by an authorized representative of each institution prior to the commencement of the associated activities.

It is understood that the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding will commence upon its mutual signing and remain in effect for a period of five years unless one university provides a six-month written notice to the other university to terminate it. Subject to a review this Memorandum may be renewed for an additional period of five years. Academic and administrative representatives from both institutions will discuss the terms of a renewal at least six months prior to the termination of the current Memorandum of Understanding.

This agreement can be modified upon mutual agreement between academic and administrative representatives of both institutions, provided that any such modification must be memorialized in writing and executed by an authorized representative of each institution.

#### ARTICLE-I: SCOPE OF THE MOU

- Support entrepreneurship amongst students.
- Develop local IP and provide support for it being exploited by developing IP sharing agreements between related parties.

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Participate and steer in incubation talks, conferences, seminars and competence building activities.

#### ARTICLE-II: SCOPE AND TERMS OF INTERACTIONS SABUDH FOUNDATION:

- Provide Industry ready training in advanced technologies such as Machine Learning, AI, Cyber Security, IoE.
- · Bring social problems for researchers to engage with.
- Address problems faced by startups, incubated at I. K. Gujral Punjab Technical University (IKGPTU), Jalandhar.
- Bring our extensive network of world-wide academics and industry leaders to interact with I. K.
   Gujral Punjab Technical University (IKGPTU) academicians and students.
- Train students in advances in Machine Learning, AI and other future technologies.
- Organise dissemination workshops.
- Provide access to top companies in this space for student employment.
- Attract industry to engage and invest with research in the university.
- Run faculty development programmes.
- Co-teach modules on advanced technology areas.
- Create data repositories associated with local Punjab context.

#### I. K. GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY, JALANDHAR:

- Facilitate internship in association with the Sabudh Foundation.
- Engage in research activities/projects with the Sabudh Foundation on topics of interest.
- Provide data storage space and security of the data.
- Provide a single point of contact that will actively participate in regular Steering Committee
  meetings. Steering committee would include Dr Sarabjot Singh Anand (Director) and Dr Sukhjit
  Singh Sehra (Director) from Sabudh Foundation and two members from the Department of
  Planning & External Programmes and/or other Departments of IKGPTU, Jalandhar.

#### ARTICLE-III: EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION OF MOU

- This MOU shall be effective from the date of its approval by competent authorities at both ends.
- The duration of the MOU shall be for a period of 5 years from the effective date.
- During its tenancy, the MOU may be extended or terminated by a prior notice of not less than 3

- Further both I. K. Gujral Punjab Technical University (IKGPTU), Jalandhar and Sabudh Foundation shall put in place adequate and reasonable measures to keep and store confidential information secure to prevent any unauthorized use.
- CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION shall mean any proprietary information, data or facts belonging to PARTIES collectively or severally, disclosed by the disclosing party under this agreement or any subsequent agreement, whether in writing, verbal or electronically, irrespective of the medium in which such information is stored, which is marked confidential or with any other words having similar meaning by the disclosing party, or specifically agreed to be kept confidential by the parties, or declared or identified so by the disclosing party before such disclosure or during the discussions.

However, confidential information shall not include any data or information which:

- o Is or become publicly available through no fault of the receiving party
- Is already in the rightful possession of the receiving party prior to its receipt of such data or information.

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- Is independently developed by the receiving party without reference to the confidential information of the disclosing party
- Is rightfully obtained by the receiving party from a third party or is in the public domain.
- Is disclosed with the written consent of the party whose information it is, or
- Is disclosed pursuant to court order or other legal compulsion, after providing prior notice to the disclosing party

#### ARTICLE-VI: AMENDMENTS

Any amendment or addenda to the AGREEMENT shall be in writing and signed by the PARTIES

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

Gujral Punjab Technical University (PTU), a nodal agency of the Government of Punjab established by an Act of State Legislature, represented by Dean (Planning & External Programmes) having its office at Jalandhar-Kapurthala Highway, Kapurthala, Near Pushpa Gujral Science City, Jalandhar (hereinafter referred to as "SECOND PARTY" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, mean and include its successors and assigns);

#### AND

ICICI Foundation for inclusive growth (ICICI Foundation), a charitable trust registered at Chennai, Tamil Nadu vide a Trust Deed dated January 04, 2008 and having its office at ICICI Bank Towers, Bandra Kurla Complex, Bandra East, Mumbai 400051(hereafter referred as "THIRD PARTY" which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof, mean and include its successors and assigns), of the other Part.

#### BACKGROUND

- A. First Party recognizes the value of skill development initiatives for the community and are willing to support and collaborate with individuals, institutions, trusts, corporate bodies and any other such entities that administer and run skill development initiatives for the lesser privileged youth in the state of Punjab ("State") and thereby enabling them to participate in the growth and economic development of the State.
- B. Second Party has the mandate to set up centres of excellence in emerging technologies and for promoting training, research and development in these areas. The University has undertaken the task of training students to help in the development of skilled manpower in this sector in the country in general and in the state, in particular.
- C. Third Party is a public charitable trust, set up with the objectives as set out inthe Trust Deed dated January 04, 2008, which inter alia, includes catalyzing and accelerating inclusive social and economic development through empowerment of poor by integrated action in the diverse fields connected to the society to augment India's inclusive growth process. As a part of achieving such objectives and to further its initiatives towards education and livelihoods, Second Partyhas institutionalized the ICICI Academy for Skills that provides skill training and vocational training to young unemployed school and college dropouts which may lead towards their self-employment or wage employment.

- D. The Parties had earlier collaborated with each other vide a Memorandum of Understanding dated February 17, 2016 for setting up a centre of ICICI Academy for Skills at Mohali, Punjab, hereinafter referred to as the 'Academy'. This non-financial Agreement is entered between the First Party, Second party and third party for a term of five years.
- E. The Parties are desirous of continuing the said collaboration and continue providing technical and skill development training through the Academy in accordance with the terms and conditions as agreed upon in this MoU. The MoU shall be effective from the expiry of the earlier MoU between the parties.

#### 1. OBJECTIVE / PURPOSE OF MOU

The parties hereto mutually agreed upon to continue their collaboration for operating the Academy to train the lesser privileged youth in the State ("Trainees") and to assist them to seek employment (either by wage employment or self-employment) in the relevant field. The Parties have further agreed that the Academy will strive to train 1600 candidates of Punjab annually and that the Academy will be on a non-residential basis, i.e. it shall not provide lodging (hostel) facility to the candidates. To further the aforesaid objective, this MoU sets out the terms and scope of collaboration between the parties.

#### 2. SCOPE AND INTENT:

The scope of this document is valid for three years from the date of signing. The duration of this MOU can be extended by mutual consent of all the three parties.

#### 3. PROGRAM DETAILS:

The selection criteria of the Trainees (age, education and social economic background) and the operational parameters, including the course(s) to be offered at the Academy, shall continue to be mutually decided in writing by the Parties keeping in view the market demand and the local factors and the changes therein. The training shall be held physically but in case of any restriction imposed/set in by Government (for ex. COVID, Pandemic) the theoretical partcan be executed in online mode.

The specific responsibilities and obligations of each Party and other relevant details are as set out in the **Annexure I** attached herewith. The list of courses being offered at the Academy is listed in **Annexure II**.

#### 4. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

Each Party hereby represents and warrants that it has all requisite power and authority to execute this MOU and to perform its obligations hereunder. The execution and delivery of this MOU and the performance of this MOU will not constitute a breach or constitute a default or a breach of any agreement entered with any third party and it will perform its obligations and fulfill its responsibilities under this MOU in a manner that complies with all applicable laws.

#### 5. CONFIDENTIALITY

Neither the first party nor the second party and the third party shall disclose during the term of this agreement or thereafter to any third party any information, course materials or make public the documents, materials, equipment's, diagrams etc. of joint course provided by first, second and third party.

#### 6. TERMINATION

Any Party desirous of terminating this MOU shall forthwith provide written notice of 120 days to the other Parties. However, the Parties shall ensure that termination of this MoU is

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not effected in the middle of ongoing training batches at the Academy except that either Party can forthwith terminate this MoU in case of breach of any of term of this MoU by the other Party.

#### 7. MISCELLANEOUS

- A) Unless otherwise agreed in writing by all, each party shall bear its own cost in connection with effecting the terms and conditions to this MoU.
- B) Each party may request changes to this MoU. Any changes, modifications, revisions, amendments to this MoU which are mutually agreed upon and between all the parties shall be incorporated by the written instrument, and effective when executed and signed by each party.
- C) Relationship of each party under this MoU is that of independent entities and nothing in this MoU shall, or shall be deemed to constitute or place them in fiduciary relationship, any other relationship of trust or confidence, partnership, employer-employee, agency or joint venture relationship and no party shall have the right to agree to obligations on behalf of any other Party in any manner.
- D) For effective implementation and monitoring of MoU, each party shall designate a nodal officer. The nodal officer from each party shall be proactive, have good English written and oral skills, shall have email access and shall be able to get things executed.
- E) Any dispute, differences, claim or question of interpretation of any nature arising between the Parties with respect to this MoU as to the respective rights, claims, liabilities and obligations under this MoU, including any question regarding its existence, validity or termination which is not resolved by amicable settlement shall be referred to and finally resolved by arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 or any statutory amendment thereto. The Parties shall mutually appoint a sole arbitrator to conduct the arbitration proceedings. The venue of such proceedings shall be at Chandigarh and the language of arbitration shall be English. The award of the arbitration shall be final and binding on the Parties. The costs of Arbitration shall be borne in such manner as the arbitrator may direct.

#### F) Force Majeure Clause.

- a. For the purposes of this MoU, "Force Majeure" means an event which is beyond the reasonable control of a Party, is not foreseeable, is unavoidable and not brought about by or at the instance of the Party claiming to be affected by such events and which has caused the non-performance or delay in performance, and which makes a Party's performance of its obligations hereunder impossible or so impractical as reasonably to be considered impossible in the circumstances, and includes, but is not limited to, war, riots, civil disorder, earthquake, fire, explosion, storm, flood or other extreme adverse weather conditions, strikes, lockouts, pandemic and pandemic induced lockdown or other industrial action (except where such strikes, lockouts or other industrial action are within the power of the Party invoking Force Majeure to prevent), confiscation or any other action by Government agencies.
- b. Force Majeure shall not include (i) any event which is caused by the negligence or intentional action of a Party or by or of such Party's Sub-Consultants or agents or employees, nor (ii) any event which a diligent Party could reasonably have been expected to take into account at the time of the conclusion of this MOU, and avoid or overcome in the carrying out of its obligations.

#### 8. NON-BINDING

This MOU is non-binding in nature herein and the parties agree that the execution of this MOU shall not constitute any undertaking by each party to mandatorily perform the transactions hereunder. This MOU does not impose legal or financial obligations on each

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Party. The parties recognize that the Execution of this MOU does not constitute any legal obligation or commitmentby each party to enter a definitive agreement.

#### 9. NOTICE

All notices required or permitted by, or made pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding shall be in writing and shall be sent by certified mail or by courieror by post or by facsimile within the stipulated time of 15 days to the following addresses: -

#### Responsibilities of First Party:

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MoU") entered into on this May of December 2020 by and between:

National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assigns), of the First party;

AND

The Technical Institute (I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar) hereinafter called as (TI) which the expression shall unless repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assigns) of the Second Party.

WHEREAS,

Both the I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University (IKGPTU) and NHAI are desirous of working together with mutual cooperation for dissemination of respective expertise in civil/highway engineering field through the road infrastructure development.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

#### 1. INTENT:

National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) intends to associate the TI who shall voluntarily contribute its share of experience for betterment of the highway infrastructure.

#### 2. SCOPE OF THE MoU

The primary scope of MOU inter alia includes the following:

(i) NHAI shall facilitate the faculty, researchers and students of the Institute to familiarize with the latest trends in the highway/transportation sector with a common objective of sharing the knowledge in their

respective domain. This will, in one hand, facilitate to bridge the industry-institution gap and familiarize students with the latest trends in industry and on the other hand the research output could be suitably adopted in practice by NHAI.

- (ii) The Institute shall adopt nearby stretches of NHs as specified in the **Appendix-1** as a voluntary initiative under ambit of Institutional Social Responsibility (ISR). The list of stretches may be modified by deletion/addition by mutual consent of NHAI and the Technical Institute.
- (iii) The adopted stretch may be used as a field of study for faculty, researchers and students.
- (iv) NHAI shall offer internship to 20 numbers each of Undergraduate and Postgraduate students of TI periodically and also extend stipend for period of Two (2) months.
- (v) NHAI shall pay stipend @ Rs. 8000/- (Rupees Eight Thousand only) per month for undergraduate students and @ Rs. 15000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand only) per month to Postgraduate students. All other arrangements including stay shall be responsibility of the Institute. However, depending upon availability, NHAI may extend transportation facility to the interns within the project jurisdiction.

#### 3. Roles and Responsibilities:

The scope of this MOU shall be carried out in a collaborative mode between NHAI and the Technical Institute. The Roles & Responsibilities of NHAI and he Technical Institute in performing the defined objective shall be as follows:

#### NHAI

- a. NHAI shall provide the list of potential candidate National Highway stretches for adopting by the Technical Institute;
- b. NHAI shall facilitate availability of relevant data required with specific reference to the above stretches through its field office/consultant/concessionaire/contractor engaged in the project;
- c. NHAI will nominate an officer as a point of contact for all correspondence in carrying out the defined objective;
- **d.** NHAI shall facilitate the faculty, researchers and students of the Institute to give access to the site of the identified stretch being adopted by the Technical Institute, relevant documents for the purpose of activities to be carried by these intellectuals of the Institute;
- e. NHAI through its field office/Consultant/Concessionaire/Contractor engaged in the project, as per reasonable requirement, will disseminate and familiarize the latest trends and know how in highway/transportation sector in general and the identified project in specific to the authorized faculty, researchers and students of the Institute;
- f. NHAI may suitably adopt the research output and feedback received from the Technical Institute in practice for qualitative improvement as deemed fit at appropriate stage of implementation.
- **g.** NHAI may support creation of Lab infrastructure in the Institute and can sponsor relevant research project that helps in using alternative resource material and improving quality of roads.
- h. The NH stretch adopted can be co-branded with the associated technical institute by NHAI

- d. The Technical Institute will nominate a coordinator as a point of contact for all correspondence in carrying out the defined objective as well as inform, from time to time.

#### 4. EFFECTIVE DATE AND PERIOD OF MOU

This MoU shall come into effect for all its intents and purposes from the immediate effect and shall remain valid for a period of 5 years from the date of signing unless terminated earlier by mutual consent by either party by giving 60 days' notice in writing to the other party.

# MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN

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This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter called MOU) is made on 1.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University having office at Jalandhar-Kapurthala Highway, Kapurthala-144603, Punjab, (herein after called IKGPTU "The First Party") and Quality Council of India (QCI), an Autonomous body under Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, having its principle office at 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Institution of Engineers Building, Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg, New Delhi (hereinafter called QCI "The Second Party").

Each of the parties mentioned above are collectively referred to as the 'Parties' and individually as a 'Party'.

Whereas IKGPTU was established by an Act of State Legislature on 16th January, 1997, to promote technical, management and pharmaceutical education in the state at degree level and above. It was established as Punjab Technical University and renamed as I.K.Gujral Punjab Technical University by State Government in the honour to Late Sh. Inder Kumar Gujral, Former Prime Minister of India, in 2015. The University has the mandate to set up centres of excellence in emerging technologies and for promoting training, research and development in these areas. The University has undertaken the task of training students to help in the development of skilled manpower in this sector in the country in general and in the state in particular. With this goal in mind, the university is promoting a number of courses in different streams in regular as well as distance education programmes. At present University have 121 AICTE and 65 UGC recognized/ approved institutes affiliated with it. IKGPTU is undertaking and supervising the instructions and award of 30+ bachelor's degrees in Engineering & Technology & 20+ in non-AICTE & UGC courses. The university has more than 10 campuses throughout Punjab.

And Whereas QCI, as the national accreditation and apex quality facilitation body, establishes and operates national accreditation structure and promotes quality through National Quality Campaign. The promotion of quality encompasses all segments including laboratory accreditation, manufacturing, health, education and public services. QCI started eQuest which offers eLearning courses around themes that form the core areas of QCI.

Both parties agree and undertake that specific project under the MoU proposed, formulated and agreed upon by them for the implementation of this MoU and for the said projects; IKGPTU and/or QCI shall consider the same as part of this MoU.

The two institutions will endeavour to cooperate as follows -

#### ARTICLE 1

#### AREAS OF COOPERATION

This MoU aims to build a long-term relationship and to develop healthy & stable arrangements between both the Parties. Any collaborative programs, projects or activities proposed under the purview of this MoU shall be subject to negotiation, agreement and approval between both the Parties. Both parties recognize that there is a need to identify new Physical Training Programmes and e-learning courses, and institutionalize capacity building by Physical Training Programmes and e-learning.

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# ARTICLE 2 SCOPE

- 2.1 IKGPTU and QCI shall jointly work under the scope of this MoU. The scope, projects, roles and responsibility of the engagement shall be drawn up with mutual consent.
- 2.2 Both parties recognize the need for conducting educational and training programmes with blending of physical training and e-Learning mode. Therefore, the following activities, roles and responsibilities for the said purpose are outlined under this MoU.
  - To identify new courses keeping requirements of industry and academia. Sharing feedback and inputs for design and development of e- learning courses/ new courses. Identification of emerging areas to conduct training programmes through blended learning. Facilitation content development through empanelled Subject Matter Expert (SME). Awarding joint Certificates to eligible participants.
  - Sharing of Human Resources Subject Matter Expert (SME), Trainers, Assessors and Speakers in the identified areas.
  - iii. Dovetailing Credit Courses and Non -Credit courses of e-Quest in the curriculum (e-Quest- E-Quality Platform for Employability through Skill and Training; e-Quest is an Online learning portal by QCI. e-Quest is designed to help Indian professionals to strengthen their skills sets and knowledge thereby enhancing their career prospects).
  - Developing e-Learning course on skill based modular courses.
  - v. Manufacturing Competitiveness programme will be inculcated as the credit-based programme in the curriculum. Program will be developed as per requirements of Industry. Identification of tailor-made programmes for industry may also be undertaken.
  - vi. Providing facilities for the conduct of various courses/ contact programmes in partnership with QCI in premises of PTU in collaboration of institutions/ industries.
  - Professional competency-based certification as per ISO 17024.
  - viii. Consideration of NABL Accreditation for IKGPTU Laboratory(s). Award of Accreditation to Laboratories post compliance of requirements.
  - Awarding Accreditation as EIA Consultant Organization post complying the requirements of scheme.
  - x. Identification of new areas for collaboration in the area of Quality.
  - xi. Training of QCI Professionals (PPID- Project Planning and Implementation Division) by IKGPTU on agreed skill set with culmination in Certificate/ Diploma/ Degree.
  - xii. Internship of Students.

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- xiii. To run a training centre at IKGPTU under NICPP project.
- xiv. Accreditation of non -AICTE Vocational Courses as per NABET Accreditation Scheme of Learning Service Providers.
- xv. Evaluation of Study Centres as per ISO 21001 and/or ISO 29993.

#### **ARTICLE 3**

#### WORKING ARRANGEMENT

- 3.1 The Parties shall constitute a Joint Coordination Committee ("JCC") by taking member(s) from both the parties to facilitate cooperation, foster partnership and review progress.
- 3.2 The head of each party shall nominate the respective coordinator. The participants and coordinators may change from time to time as decided by appropriate authority of the IKGPTU and QCI.
- 3.3 The JCC will be co-chaired by designated representative of the parties and both the parties shall determine the composition of the JCC. The member of representatives from each party may be between 2 to 3.
- 3.4 The JCC may meet on a bi-yearly/ annual basis as may be required and deemed fit, virtually or in person, as the case may be.
- 3.5 The Parties agree to arrange regular meeting and communication with one another and with other relevant stakeholder, to review and finalize the detailed plan for each stage of the programme.

#### **ARTICLE 4**

#### FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

The financial arrangement for the joint activities undertaken within the framework of this MoU shall be mutually agreed upon by both the Parties on a case -to -case basis, subject to the availability of funds and resources. The two institutions will consider allocating seed money to initiate the partnership. In addition, they will also approach international/ national funding agencies, industries and academic institutions. Special attention will be given to obtain funded projects from industry as well as from alumni to support such collaborations.

#### **ARTICLE 5**

#### REPRESENTATION AND WARRANTY

Each Party to this MoU represent that the execution and performance of this MOU is not contrary to any rule, law, statue, internal policy, or any other such order or rule by which such Party is bound.

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#### **ARTICLE 6**

#### PROTECTION OF INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS/OWNERSHIP

- 6.1 Each party will protect, within its territory, intellectual property rights of the other party in force in their respective jurisdiction. All copyrights of the document produced in support of any activity under this MoU shall rest with QCI and IKGPTU.
- 6.2 Both the parties will ensure appropriate protection of intellectual property rights obtained on the basis of this MoU, in accordance with providing laws and regulations in force in the country.

#### ARTICLE 7

#### CONFIDENTIALITY

Each Party undertakes to observe the confidentiality and secrecy of documents, information and other data received from or supplied to the other Party during the period of the implementation of the MoU or any other agreement made pursuant to this MoU. However, in case of any such circumstances such as R.T.I or any other legal requirement, each party may do so with intimation to other party.

#### **ARTICLE 8**

#### SUSPENSION

Each party reserves the right for reason of national security, national interest, public order or public health to suspend temporarily either in whole or in part the implementation of this MoU. The suspension shall take effect immediately after written notification of one month has been given to the other party by the competent authority.

#### **ARTICLE 9**

#### REVISION, MODIFICATION AND AMENDMENT

Either party may request in writing a revision, modification or amendment of all or any part of this MoU. Any revision, modification or amendment agreed to by the parties shall be reflected in writing and shall form part of this MoU. Such revision, modification or amendment shall come on such data as may be determined by the parties.

#### **ARTICLE 10**

#### SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

- 10.1 The obligation of QCI and IKGPTU have been outlined in the MoU. However, during the operation of MoU, circumstances may arise which may call for alterations or modifications of this MoU. These amendments shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in writing.
- 10.2 Any differences or dispute between the parties concerning the interpretation and/or implementation and /or applicable to any of the provisions of this MoU shall be settled amicably through mutual consultation and / or negotiation between the Parties, without reference to any third party or tribunal.
- 10.3 All the issues involving financial matters e.g., sharing of course fees etc. shall be decided jointly by both the parties.

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10.4 The MoU shall be governed and constructed in accordance with the Laws of India. In case any difference does not get resolved by mutual consultation and any of the parties is not satisfied and intends to resort to legal proceedings, it shall give a notice period of 30 days to the other party. The parties agree to submit to exclusive of jurisdiction of Courts in New Delhi, or any other place (India), mutually agreed to in connection with any dispute between the Parties under the MoU.

#### **ARTICLE 11**

#### EFFECTIVE DATE, DURATION AND TERMINATION

- 11.1 The MoU shall commence from effective date and shall continue for a period of 3 years from the Effective Date (hereafter referred to as "Term"). Thereafter, both parties shall review the status of this cooperation and may extend the Term on yearly basis on such terms as mutually agreed upon.
- 11.2 Notwithstanding Article 10 para 1 above, either party may terminate this MoU by notifying the other party in writing at least thirty (30) days in advance of such termination subject to settling of any dues/ overdue
- Unless otherwise agreed upon by the Parties, the termination of this MoU shall not affect the implementation of on-going activities and /or programmes, which have been agreed upon to by the Parties on or before the date of the termination of the MoU.

#### **ARTICLE 12**

#### INDEMNIFICATION

Both the parties shall indemnify and keep the other party indemnified and harmless against any and all claims, actions, proceedings by third party (including all costs, expenses, damages/ losses) arising out of or in connection with this MoU due to breach of any provisions of this MoU by such party as a result of any act of negligence/ omission or commission on part of such party and / or its employees, agents etc.

#### **ARTICLE 13**

#### **FORCE MAJEURE**

#### a. Force Majeure Event

Any of the following events resulting in Material Adverse Effect shall constitute Force Majeure Event:

- Unprecedent situation resulting due to COVID -19
- Earthquake, inundation, landslide;
- III. Storm, tempest, hurricane, cyclone, lighting, thunder or other extreme atmospheric disturbances;
- IV. Act of terrorism, hacking, cyber -attack and the like; and
- War, hostilities (whether war be declared or not), invasion, act of foreign enemy, rebellion, riots, weapon conflict or military action or civil war;
- Strikes or boycotts, other than those involving the SECOND PARTY, its contractors or their employees, agents etc.

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#### b. Notice of Force Majeure Event

As soon as practicable and in any case within 3 days of the date of occurrence of a Force Majeure Event or the date of knowledge thereof, the Party which is rendered wholly or partially unable to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement because of a Force Majeure Event ("the Affected Party") shall notify the other party of the same, setting out, inter alia, the following in reasonable detail:

- i. The nature and extent of the Force Majeure Event;
- ii. The estimated Force Majeure Period;
- The nature of and the extent to which, performance of any of its obligations under this Agreement is affected by the Force Majeure Event;
- iv. The measures which the Affected Party has taken or proposes to take to alleviate/ mitigate the impact of the Force Majeure Event and to resume performance of such of its obligations affected thereby, and
- v. Any other relevant information concerning the Force Majeure Event, and/ or the rights and obligations of the Parties under this MoU

#### **ARTICLE 14**

#### MISCELLANEOUS

- 14.1 Neither party shall use or publicize this MoU in such a manner as to cause any disrepute to the other party, nor shall to make any statement relevant to this MoU which may reasonably be considered to be misleading.
- 14.2 If any doubt arises as to the interpretation of the provision of his Agreement or as to matters not provided therein, the parties to this Agreement shall consult with each other for each instance and resolve such doubts in good faith.
