MINUTES OF THE 16TH MEETING OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL HELD ON 3RD JUNE, 2004 AT LOVELY INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY, HARDASPUR, PHAGWARA.

The 16th meeting of the academic council was held on 3rd June, 2004 at Lovely Institute of Technology, Hardaspur, Phagwara, Dr S K Salwan, Vice-Chancellor, PTU chaired in the meeting

The chairman welcomed the members and in his opening address he mentioned that the past two months had seen hectic activities as far as PTU was concerned. These have put PTU in the fast track towards development and implementation of quality standards. He informed the august body that PTU was a team consisting of the principals and staff of various colleges students, their parents employees and the staff of PTU. The conduct of CET-2004 went so smooth that it had earned the university a name. PTU had received congratulatory letters from far and wide by the issue and the credit goes to the members of the Academic Council and the staff of the university, including those at affiliated colleges, for their dedicated efforts to make CET-04 a success. He mentioned to the members that in the immediate time to come there are equally important mile stones to be covered. He said that he had full confidence in his team.

The Chairman briefed the Council on the 2nd Convocation planned for 9th of June, 2004. He informed the Council that Dr R Chidambaram, Scientific Advisor, Govt of India has kindly consented to be the chief guest at the function which will be presided over by H.E. Justice (Retd.) O P. Verma, Governor of Punjab. The convocation was planned to be held in the auditorium of NIPER, at Mohali. Since the university did not have Deans appointed, it was necessary to select Deans from amongst the council members viz. principals of two affiliated colleges. The Council deliberated and selected Dr D.S. Hira as Dean Engineering and Dr.D.R. Singh as Dean Management.



Chapter XIII

Regulations regarding re-totaling and Re-evaluation of answer books

A candidate who wishes to apply for re-totaling or re-evaluation of answer books may apply to the University on the prescribed application form accompanied by a fee of Rs. 500 or Rs. 2500 per answer book respectively along with the detailed marks card/degree, in original, if issued till the date of applying for re-totaling or re-evaluation. The above rule shall be applicable subject to the following provisions:

- Re-totaling shall be allowed in all theory papers.
- An application for re-totaling shall be allowed only within 21 days of the declaration of the result by the university. Under no circumstances, the retotaling application shall be accepted after the expiry of 21 days of declaration of results.
- The results consequent upon re-totaling shall be final and no representation shall be entertained.
- 4. The student shall be allowed to see the answer books subsequent to 'declaration of the results of re-totaling on payment of Rs. 100 per answer book.
 - A request for re-evaluation of answer books may be accepted by permission of the Vice-chancellor, subsequent to re-totaling and inspection of the answer book by the student.
 - The re-evaluation in such cases shall be done by an examiner appointed by the Vice-chancellor.
 - In any particular case, the results of re-evaluation shall be final and binding on all concerned and shall supercede all results declared earlier.
 - 8. No further re-evaluation shall be allowed, under any circumstances.
 - 9. A candidate whose answer book is not available for re-totaling or re-



evaluation, for any reason whatsoever, may be allowed by the Vicechancellor either:

- For award of average marks of all theory papers taken in that semester;
- b. To appear in that paper when the university examination is held next, without any examination fee, provided, the student does not exceed the maximum permissible time for award of the degree. In that event, his result will be decided by the marks the student secures during re-appear.
- 10. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations, in case of any discrepancy regarding interpretation of rules, the Vice-chancellor alone shall issue clarifications, wherever required.

The matter is placed before the Academic Council for the consideration, suggestions and recommendations and is to be placed before the meeting of BOG scheduled to be held on 09 August 2004

The points those are required to be considered by the Academic Council:

- The existing regulations for BBA/BCA courses having two conditions i.e the student must pass all the subjects of a semester in maximum of three chances including the regular chance and complete the whole course in 4 studies.
- 2. At present there are number of cases where the students have availed one or two mercy chances and are still not able to clear their subjects clearing one subject in the maximum of three chances and he/she has to forego 2 ½ to 3 years of his/her academic career.
- 3. In the present case of existing students who have failed to clear the semester within three chances including the regular chance and are agitating in University campus out of fear of cancellation of their degree and the Hon'ble High Court has ruled in favour of regulations. The legal retrospectively. After that the University has filed an affidavit that it will technical education.
- 4. What action need to be taken in order to create congenial almosphere and to prevent that no such agitation should take place in the University campus or within the Institutes in future.
- The Academic Council may also consider that if some body has to discontinue from his/her studies within prescribed period / chance, it must be done within initial one year of his /her study so the student can have alternative means.
- These regulations need to be amended for the future to fulfil the aspirations
 of the University and the students. If it needs amendment what should be the

- Chairman of the Academic Council requests to the members to seriously consider the case of BBA/BCA students and come up with an acceptable solution keeping in mind the input quality, aspirations and standards of the technical education.

Rules cannot be amended to be applied retrospectively until and unless they were to the advantages to the students in general and could be applied uniformly to all without injustice to any individual and in the interest of natural justice.
- (b) The academic rules as applicable are well structured and clear. It was evident that the rules on promotion of B. Tech. students though applicable, were intimated to the students / colleges after start of the admissions. As brought out by the students, the rules applicable to them had not been conveyed to them by the students, the rules applicable to them had not been conveyed to them clearly some of the colleges printed the 24 Credit rule in their prospectus for admission 2001 B. Tech. Batch.
- The one time relaxation given to 2001 batch B. Tech. Students, on the basis of earning 24 credits out of the total credits of the 1st year carried the impression to the students that they would be able to go to 6th semester without passing the 2nd semester on the basis of this one time chance. Hence, some of them had not taken exam in a few subjects in December, 2003.

Online Virtual Campus Punjab Technical University

Chronological Order of Events

- PTU advertised and floated tender for companies to apply for setting up an Online Virtual Campus.
- Lovely International Trust (LIT) along with three other parties applied for the tender along with detailed project report on the process of setting up the Online Virtual Campus.
- Lovely International Trust was selected by PTU for setting up the Virtual Campus after evaluation of all the bids by the designated committee.
- Board of Governors (BOG) in their meeting approved the online programme.
- Thereafter, an agreement was signed between PTU and LIT and LIT was made Worldwide Service Provider (WWSP) of PTU for offering programmes through Online Virtual Campus.
- PTU approved the programmes to run through Virtual Campus, syllabus for courses, prospectus along with regulations and fee structure.
- 7. After consent and approval of the university, LIT did the following-
 - Registered a domain name "ptuonline.com" for setting up the university portal website.
 - b) Designed and developed website for PTUOnline Virtual Campus.
 - c) Got course content developed by eminent academicians.
 - d) Content Digitization and Multimedia CD creation.
 - e) Content conversion for Web and Book publishing format.
 - f) Got CDs and books published and dispatched to students.
 - g) Setup an entire Learning Management System for imparting Online Education to students enrolled in online programmes.
 - h) Setup host of student faculty collaboration tools like chat, discussion forum, email, whiteboard, etc to enable strong student faculty relationship.
 - i) Setup a Learning Network comprising of 22 Learning Centres across the country to create awareness amongst the students about online education and subsequently carrying out student admissions. In addition to providing suitable career guidance to the students, the Learning Centres also provided a multimedia PC along with facility for internet surfing at a very affordable cost to the students enrolled in online programmes.
 - Conducted contact classes and doubt clearing sessions in December, 2002 and January 2003 to provide practical hands on experience to the students.
 - k) Designed and developed a Management Information System (MIS) for providing administrative backend support by digitally storing and analyzing the entire student and administrative data.
 - Designed and developed a application software for online university information and redressal of student complaints.
 - m) Developed "Examination System" software for allotment of marks/grades by PTU.

n) Incurred huge costs towards advertisement in national dailies, newspapers, websites, etc and promotional materials like hoardings, glow signs, prospectus, leaflets, brochures, etc.

Under directions from PTU, LIT made substantial investment in developing 8. the PTU Online Section on the university premises at Ladowali Road. Subsequently the premises was got vacated.

9. LIT had engaged a permanent team of professionals for software development, content development, website design and development. academic counseling, administration and accounts which is still being maintained at a very substantial cost. 10.

Experienced faculty has been engaged for content development, conduct of

chat sessions and holding of content classes for the students enrolled.

11. In the very first session (2002-03), the university got 1063 enrollments in the Online Virtual Campus across India. 12.

The university website had top ranking among all major search engines with whopping 8-10 lac/month website traffic hits.

13. The synopsis of the Virtual Campus was presented in the 10th Academic Council meeting held on 13th December, 2002. Though, the online programmes had already commenced, it was referred to the Standing Committee to look into the scheme and syllabus of online programmes. 14.

In the Standing Committee meeting held on 13th Feb,2003, it was referred to Board of Studies for framing of structure and syllabus.

Board of Studies meeting took place on 12th March, 2003 where the syllabus 15. for 1st and 2nd semester of the online programmes was approved by the 16.

On 22nd April 2003 in the 11th Academic council meeting, the council approved the programmes along with syllabi for few select courses. 17.

On 19th May 2003, the university decided to conduct exams for all PTUOnline courses from 2nd July, 2003 onwards.

- Out of appox 1063 students registered, only 672 students filled up the 18. examination forms due to delay in examination which were intended to be conducted in Feb, 2003.
- Thereafter, things took a dramatic turn and the university decided not to make 19. any admissions for the session 2003-04.

On 21st May, 2003, LIT was given approval for starting admissions for session 20. 2003-04 and LIT started admissions subsequently.

The prospectus, eligibility criteria, fee structuse, admission form and 21. advertisements were again submitted and were approved by the university on 29th May, 2003.

On 8th August, 2003 the university instructed LIT to refund fee to students 22. enrolled in session 2003-04. LIT started refunding fee to the students as per directions of the university and thereby incurred heavy losses incurred on advertisement, promotion, overheads and also got bad name from students.

The matter was once again taken to the '2th Academic Council Meeting held 23. on 10th October, 2003 and it was decided to conduct exams for all courses except BA(Professional). Exams for MTech(IT) were to be held after checking eligibility criteria with that of other universities.

24. Consequent to increasing delay in conducting of exams, many students filed court cases against LIT and PTU and LIT employees received number of threatening calls form agitated students and their parents.

LIT refunded fee to students enrolled in BA(Professional) and those found 25. ineligible by PTU in "second eligibility check".

26 As per instructions of the university officials, LIT was also constrained to refund fee of some students who had withdrawn from online programmes due to inordinate delay and were threatening court cases.

27. University finally decided to conduct exams for students enrolled in session 2002-03 from 15th January 2004 and date sheet was issued in first week of January. As the exams took place at such a short notice, the students also faced great difficulty in preparing for the exams.

28. Out of the 672 forms submitted, less than half of the students appeared in the

exams due to frustration and depression.

On 25th March, 2004 the university approved readmission to next semester for 29. students enrolled in session 2002-03. However as on 27th April, 2003 only 19 students have enrolled for 2nd semester due to uncertainty about the future of online programmes.

Sub: Admission under vacant seat at GZSCET, Bhathinda-reg

Placed below is a request from Ms. Deepika Gupta for admission at GZSCET, in B.Arch Degree programme. The details of the case is as follows:

 It appears, on 25/9/03, Ms Deepika Gupta, who had passed dip. in Architecture from Thapar Polytechnic (Patiala) with 59% marks submitted a request for admission to GZSCET against vacant seat, which was denied since the last date as stipulated by PTU (15/9/03) was over.

The student approached the state Govt. and vide letter no.4236 dt Oct1,
 2003, the Govt extended the deadline for admission in B.Arch against vacant seats till Oct6, 2003

3. Vide Memo no.14539 dt-6/10/03, the college sought clarification from Registrar PTU, if they can take admission in pursuance of govt. notification extending the deadline for direct admission till Oct6,2003. It was also mentioned that the college was already informed by Director (colleges) that no admission after Oct3,2003 should be allowed as per PTU calendar. The college clarified that Oct3,2003 was a holiday.

4. The college again wrote on 7/10/03 vide memo no. 14543 that the Punjab Govt. order was received only on 6/10/03 since Oct3,2003 was a holiday followed by sat/sun on 4/5 Oct,2003. The next working day after the deadline of Oct3,03 imposed by PTU was Oct6,2003. The college forwarded 4 cases for approval of the Univ. who had sought admission against vacant seats in GZSCET.on Oct6,2003.

5. Director (colleges) vide letter no.dc/8841 dt.28.10.2003 asked certain clarification from the college. The letter did not mention about the last the date of direct admission nor this issue was mentioned in the said letter.

The college replied on 31/10/03, indicating therein that on 6/10/03 the admission were made only when vacant seats were available and no other claimant for those seats was available.

In view of the above, and in partricular, against the following facts:

- 1. The Govt. of Punjab had already extended the deadline till Oct6,2003.
- Since GZSCET was closed on 3/10/03. The students could not have taken admission on the date as prescribed by the Univ.
- There is an apparent conflict between last date prescribed by Govt & the University for admission against vacant seats.
- 4. Four affected candidates are awaiting decision of the University.
