Revision of mileage rate for use of own car/taxi to Expert / Officials

As per notification No. PTU/Reg/Notification /27/9774, dated 31-08-09 (Annexure 'D'), Rs. 7/- per K.M. are being given to the expert / officials invited for use of their own car / taxi and on actual basis in special cases. The toll tax charges are being paid on actual basis on production of receipt. These rates have not been revised since Aug 2009, however, the rates of hiring taxis and rates of diesel / petrol have increased a lot since then. In this regard, it is proposed that the rates of Rs. 7/- km. may be increased to Rs. 9/- plus toll tax as per actual & Rs. 300 per night for driver in case of overnight stay. In a special circumstances, such claims/charges be paid actual basis with the approval of Vice-Chancellor.

Authorization of signatory powers to be given to the officers of PTU for signing of cheque.

As per regulations, Payments shall be made cheques signed by the controller of finance. The Board may however authorize any other officer or officers to sign cheques and specify the monetary limits thereof. In view of the functional requirement, the cheque signing authority under dual signatures has been approved by the Vice Chancellor from time to time. The present cheque signing authority under dual signatures along with monetary limits is placed at Annexure 'E'.

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In this regard, draft standard authorization signatory powers along with financial limits to be given to officer not below the rank of Assistant Registrar mentioned below:-

i) to Upto Rs 10,00,000/- AR and DR / Director

ii) Above Rs.10,00,000/- Director-Finance / DR (in the absence of Director-Finance and Registrar/Dean

It is proposed in view of the functional requirements that the Vice Chancellor be authorized to approve the Cheque signing authority and financial limits under dual signatures as per requirements from time to time.

### 25.08 Engagement of auditor.

As per the regulation 20 the Board shall appoint the Auditor for the purpose of Internal Audit for two years (Two audit in a year) in accordance with the regulations framed by it. The auditor so appointed will be eligible for reappointment for a period not exceeding two years at a time. The remuneration of such auditor shall be fixed by the board.

As per regulation 21 it shall be the duty of the Auditor to prepare and submit through the Finance committee an annual audit report on the accounts of the University to the Board, certified by him to be correct. He shall see

That the accounts of the University are properly kept,

That the state of balance shown therein agrees with the Bank's account.

That all payment are supported by proper vouchers and that they are under proper sanction and

That all receipts and payments are properly classified.

In view of the increase in the volume of work and to keep the compliance of statutory norms & to check the routine process, the internal audit in the form of concurrent audit was initiated from the year 2009-10 and two type of Audit is being carried out i.e. Internal Audit & Statutory Audit.

# 25.09 Engagement of Software provider for on line fee collection and MIS of DEP for the year 2013(Semester M13 & S13).

This is regarding collection of online fee and MIS of Distance Education Programme & other online collection for the academic year 2013-14. Under Distance Education Programme, more than 1,25,000 students are enrolled in different Learning Center in India. Presently fees from the students are being collected by the concerned LC at their respective center in the form of DD's and after compilation, it is handed over to the respective RC's along with students details and it is being submitted bythe RC's to the University. During the above process money is lying in transit in the form of DD's for which no benefit is being passed to any one i.e. students, LC, RC or University. University may take the benefit of interest by collection of fees at the RC's location through direct deposit

in our Bank Account in at the RC/LC Location. By doing this we may able to get interest benefit for at lease one month and we may able to reduce the manpower cost, smooth functioning, smooth fee collection system, easily MIS for students and management.

In this regard, proposal has been received from Revolution Next, Ludhiana. The proposal of the firm is placed at Annexure 'F' The firm will provide the following services:

- i) Domain Registration and Maintenance.
- Web Development & Maintenance. ii)
- Server Hiring & Mainteannce iii)
- Registration of RC/M&F/C&F/LC iv)
- Integrated with bank for online pyament V)

Software street The firm will charge Rs. 20 per student transaction with minimum of 1 lac transaction. In case University desired to include other services like exam module, call centre moudle, accounting module, salaary module, the company will charge Rs. 10 per transaction for each module.

> The services of M/s Revolution Next may be taken into consideration for collection of online fee module for Distance Education Programme and other online fee collection for the session 2013-14 by waive off the regular procedure of hiring of service for the above period on trial basis and the outcome will be worked out after the observations and analysis of this trial project. Accordingly, regular process may be initiated.

Transport Allowance to Class 'A' officials of Punjab Technical University. 25.10

In this regard, a committee was constituted by the Vice Chancellor. The Committee recommends to implement the UGC norms for grant of Transport Allowance to Class 'A' officials w.e.f. March 01, 2013 onwards as Rs. 1600/- + DA thereon for other cities. PTU officers drawing grade pay of Rs. 10000/- & Rs. 12000/- who are entitled to use of official car shall be given option to avail themselves of existing facilities or to draw the Transport Allowances at the rate of Rs. 7000/- plus DA thereon. ### 25.11 HRA to the staff of Punjab Technical University Jalandhar

Punjab Technical University was established under the Punjab Technical University Act 1996(Act 1 of 1997) vide notification dt. 16th January, 1997 by Department of Legal and Legislative Affairs, Punjab.

As per Section 2 (f) of the Act the University means the Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar as incorporated under this Act.

During the Initial years the University had been operating through its Camp Offices at NIT Jalandhar and Govt. BEd College campus Lade vali Road due to non-availability of larger space and non construction of its building at the land allocation by Govt. initially in Jalandhar and later on at Ibban village near science city on Jalandhar Kapurthala road. The present location of the University is such that it is around 15-16 km from Jalandhar Bus stand (within 6 km from the Municipal limits of Jaladhar) and around 6 km from the Kapurthala Bus Stand.

The other facts are that:

Most of the staff employed resides at Jalandhar being the main Urban City. For all the facilities such as Medical, Transportation, Hospitality, Bus Service, Pailway Services. School and college education of Children and for residence purposes, the staff of the University depends on and reside at Jalandhar. Further in order to attract quality staff and faculty, the University employees have to be facilitated to stay at Jalandhar.

As per the Punjab Govt Notifications the University employees were getting HRA @ 15 % in pre revised scales and 20 % in revised scales as per the Govt. orders for Jalalndhar city. When new appointments were made the University Management also faced this type of Queries regarding HRA.

So keeping in view of the Interest of the employees and to attract quality staff and faculty, the University employees have been continued to remain entitled for HRA @ 20%.(Annexure 'H').

#### 25.12 Revision of DEP Examination Centre payment for March-13 Session.

This matter is regarding revision of DEP Examination Centre payment for March-13. In this regard a Committee was constituted by the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor to look into the matter. The Committee recommended the proposal as under for March-13 examination on trial basis and on the basis of satisfactory report of March-13, exam payment model shall be further continued.

### 25.14. Status of Service Tax Liabilities

A show cause notice no C.No. IV(ST) Sp. Cell/LDH/PTU/10/11/6657, dated 19-4-2012 for Rs. 108.68 Cr. and No. V(ST)Commr.Adj/48/2012/20356, dated 30.10.12 for Rs. 35.47 Cr. was served by the office of the Commissioner of Central Excise, Ludhiana regarding taxable services of 'Franchise Services' to the Regional Centres (RCs) and Learning Centre (LCs) appointed by them and appear to have contravened the provisions of Section 66,68,69 and 70 of the Finance Act in as much as during the period from 01-10-06 to 31-03-11 the Notices received the payments for the above mentioned services provided by them but they did not get themselves registered with the department, did not pay the appropriate service tax and also did not file the prescribed returns with the Department, thus, they appear to have evaded the serviced tax amounting to Rs. 108.68 Cr. which appear recoverable under Section 73(1).

In this regard, service of M/s Kawitansh Khanna & Associates, M/s A.K.Batra & Associates and Sudhir Malhotra, Advocate has been engaged to represent PTU at Commissioner, Central Excise. Accordingly reply has been filed. The matter is submitted for kind perusal and information.

### 25.15 Restructuring of Distance Education.

As approved in BOG agenda dated 27-07-2012 regarding restructuring of Distance Education Programme, University has initiated different activities and entered into an agreement with NetIIT as a consultant for strategy and implementation related to restructuring of Distance Education Programme.

Activities undertaken by NetIIT include development of strategy, vigilance and monitoring system, designing communication strategy, administrative and legal support, process design and innovation.

As per advice of the consultant, University has appointed C&F for the vacant zones due to termination of RC's. The details of payments made to the consultants and the C&F will be placed on table.

Copy of the Annual Report of the Department for the year 2011-12 is placed at Annexure 'B'.

24.05 Transport Allowance to Class 'A' officials of PTU.

The Committee discussed the matter and after due deliberation keeping in location disadvantage & transport facility available to other employees, the Committee approved the proposal in principle and recommended that the UGC norms should be adopted to attract best faculty and staff. 24.08 Soft loan given by GZS Campus, Bhatinda to Baba Hira Singh Bhattal College of Engineering & Technology.

The Committee discussed the matter and after deliberation, the committee decides that the loan cannot be waived-off. The GZS campus should take up the matter with BHSBCET for pay back the loan.

24.09 Revision of Rates for Sports, cultural activities and payment on Utilization Certificate.

Item No. 37.1: To confirm the Minutes of 36<sup>th</sup> meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee held on 23.10.2012.

The minutes of 36<sup>th</sup> meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee held on 23.10.2012 were confirmed by all the members.

Item No. 37.2: Action taken on various items discussed during previous meetings of Standing Building Construction Committee.

It was informed by Executive Engineer that following actions have been taken on various items discussed during previous meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee:

Based upon the discussions held in 36<sup>th</sup> meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee, the Architect has revised the plans for Punjab Institute of Technical Teachers Training and Research (PITTTR) proposed to be established at Ladowali Road, Jalandhar and the same are being presented in this meeting.

- Based upon the discussions held in previous meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee, the Architect has prepared estimate based upon plinth area rates of CPWD for proposed buildings for Punjab Institute of Technology at Nandgarh, Bathinda and the same is to be discussed in the present meeting.
- The conceptual plans for proposed Administrative Block, Student Centre, Auditorium and Hostel buildings at GZS PTU CET, Bathinda Campus have been prepared by the faculty of this campus and the same are being presented as an agenda item.

Item No. 37.3: To discuss and finalize the plans of Punjab Institute of Technical Teachers Training and Research (PITTTR) proposed to be established at Ladowali Road, Jalandhar.

Based upon the amendments suggested by the committee in 36th meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee, the revised plans prepared for Punjab Institute of Technical Teachers Training and Research (PITTTR) proposed to be established at Ladowali Road, Jalandhar were presented by the Architect in the meeting. After discussions and deliberations, committee approved the plans with following amendments:-

- Out of the various options presented for the layout of hostel rooms with attached toilets, option-II is approved.
- Only 4'-0" area around badminton courts to be paved and balance area should be kept as grocu.

Architect was advised to go ahead with detailed designing and estimation for this institute:

Item No. 37.4: To discuss and approve the rough cost estimate of proposed buildings for Puniab Institute of Technology at Nandgarh, Bathinda

The rough cost estimate based upon plinth area rates of CPWD prepared by the Architect and vetted by Thapar University, Patiala for an amount of Rs. 3043.14 lacs for the proposed buildings for Punjab Institute of Technology at Nandgarh, Bathinda was approved by the committee.

Item No. 37.5: To discuss and finalize the plans of proposed Administrative Block, Student Centre, Auditorium and Hostel buildings at GZS PTU CET, Bathinda Campus.

The matter plans and plans of various proposed buildings at Goo P. J Cell, Bannada campus were presented by the faculty members of this campus. After lot of discussions and deliberations, the committee has taken the following decisions:

#### 1. Master Plan:

The master plan presented was approved.

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#### 2. Student Centre:

The plans presented for the Student Centre were approved with following amendments:

- The sizes of the toilets provided are not sufficient by considering the size of the student centre. There number may be appropriately enhanced. It was also suggested that toilets may also be provided on the ground floor and first floor of the building.
- The ventilation and natural lighting for the kitchen is not sufficient. The kitchen area may be redesigned.

## 3. Boys Hostel:

The plans presented for the Boys Hostel were approved with following amendments:

- 1. One additional entrance to the hostel should be provided.
- 2. Toilets and Bathing areas to be separated.
- No. of toilets and bath rooms provided are not sufficient by considering the size of the hostel. The same should be increased as per norms.
- 4. Staircase area near main entrance should be increased.
- 5. Kitchen and dinning area should be revised based upon the codal provisions.
- At least one staircase should be enclosed as per fire safety norms.
- 7. All the lills should be provided at one location only.
- 8. Core area should be redesigned.

## 4. Administrative Building:

Committee suggested that

- Multi-purpose hall proposed in this building should be shifted to Auditorium complex.
- 2. No academic/student related activities should be planned in this building.
- 3. This building should be planned as a pure administrative building.

Based upon the above suggestions, committee advised to revise the plans and present the same in the next meeting.

#### 5. Auditorium:

The capacity of the auditorium in the plans presented was of 1350 persons. Committee suggested that a detailed study should be conducted by the campus based upon its internal utility, frequency of usage and its potential for hiring by outside parties, etc. and work out the optimum capacity required for the auditorium. Committee also suggested that before proceeding further, approval of capacity and tentative cost of the auditorium may be got approved from the BOG through Building Committee.

Committee agreed that rough cost estimates for Student Centre and Boys Hostel may be got proposed from Punjab PWD and the same is put up in the new meeting of the Findace committee of PTU for financial sanction.

Agenda Item (Table item) discussed with the permission of the Chair:-

Item No. 37.6: To discuss and approve the revised cost of Girls Hostel being constructed by Punjab PWD at GZS PTU CET, Bathinda Campus.

 Dr. Hundal, Campus Director informed that construction of Girls hostel is being executed by PWD on deposit basis. All activities related to the construction such as preparation of estimates, invitation of tenders, execution, supervision, payments etc. are being done by PWD.

Estimate amounting to Rs. 241,77 lacs submitted by PWD for construction of two storey (Ground and First floor) of Girls Hostel was approved in 9<sup>th</sup> meeting of Building Works Committee of Giani Zail Singh College of Engg. & Technology, Bathinda held on 26.05.2011 under agenda item no. 9.4 and the same was approved in the 32<sup>nd</sup> meeting of Finance Committee vide item no. 32.11.

Further, the estimate submitted by PWD for construction of 2nd floor of this hostel for Rs. 120.0 lacs was approved in 36<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Standing Building Construction Committee of PTU held on 23.10.2012 under agenda item no. 36.8.1 and the same was approved by the Finance Committee on dated 15.11.2012. Thus, in total, the estimates sunctioned for this work is of Rs. 361.77 lacs.

It was further informed that Executive Engineer PWD (B&R) has submitted a detailed estimate for this work for an amount of Rs. 503.91 lacs (increase of Rs. 142.14 lacs i.e. 39.29%) alongwith some explanations for the increased amount. The cost per square feet with the revised cost works out to be Rs. 1441/-.

Based upon the discussions held with Executive Engineer/PWD Bathinda, following facts were brought to the notice of the committee by Executive Engineer/PTU

- The estimate sanctioned for an amount of Rs. 241.77 lacs in year 2011 is based on Punjab PWD plinth area rates as prevailing in year 2006. No detailed estimate was prepared by PWD for this work at that time as detailed design/drawings were not finalized at that time.
- At the time of invitation of the tenders by PWD for engagement of contractor for this work in year 2011, prevailing rates (year 2011) of CSR were taken in the tender document which are about 40% higher than the rates prevailing in 2006 i.e. the rates included in the tender were about 40% higher than the rates included in the sanctioned estimate. Since, no detailed estimate/quantities were prepared by PWD till the time of



PWD that total amount of estimated cost included in the tender were so adjusted/reduced by sanctioned estimate. Thus, by following the above procedure wherein the sanctioned estimate is based upon the rates of year 2006, rates included in the tender are the prevailing rates (year 2011) and to keep the total estimated and with the angle of quantities included in the tender were substantially reduced by PWD than actually required to be executed. Thus, the accepted rates of the contractor are higher than the sanctioned rates.

Now, PWD has prepared a detailed estimate wherein actual quantities to be executed have been included and accepted rates of the contractor have been taken. The quantities included in the detailed estimate are much higher than the quantities included in the tender on account of the facts that deliberately lesser quantities were taken while invitation and finalization of tenders.

It was brought to the notice of the committee by Registrar/Bathinda campus that while detailed designing of the building, there has been increase in the depth of foundations than that considered in the estimate. Some minor additions/alternations such as addition of balconies, specifications for floorings have been done at college level, approval for which has been granted by Campus Director.

By considering all the above factors, there has been increase in the cost of the works by about Rs. 142 lacs.

Campus Director and Registrar of GZS PTU CET Bathinda confirmed that the revised estimate and explanation submitted by Punjab PWD is in order and the revised estimate may be considered for approval.

procedure followed by GZS PTU Bathinda campus and PWD is not appropriate and advised that, in future, tenders should not be invited without preparation and approval of detailed estimate. However, by looking at the urgency and present status of the work, committee ratifies and approves the revised estimate for an amount of Rs. 503.91 lacs, as a special case.

The meeting ended with thanks to the chair.





In this section we propose the Current Student's Accounting & Registration Module (Distance Learning) that will cover all types of functionalities by Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar.




Fig 2.Data Flow Diagram for Accounting Details For Current Students

Fig. 2 shows the data flow process of Online Fees Collection System for Current Students. It shows that PTU System would ask ZNFs/CNFs to enter the data for current students. 




Fig. 4 Data Flow Diagram of Online Admissions and fee payment

- The grant of transport allowance shall be subject to the following conditions.
  - The blind or orthopaedically handicapped employee in terms of this Ministry's orders vide OM No 21(1) 97-E-II(B) dated 3.10.1997 shall continue to draw this allowance at double the normal rates which shall, in no case, be less than Rs.1000 per month plus the applicable rate of dearness allowance. The other conditions of O.M.No.19029/1/78-E-IV (B) dated 31.8.78 related to grant of conveyance allowance to blind and orthopaedically handicapped central Government employees shall remain unchanged.
  - ii) The allowance shall not be admissible to those employees who have been provided with the facility of Government transport.

- the condition contained in para 3(ii) of O.M. No.21(1) 97E-II dated 3.10.97 by which the grant of Transport Allowance to employees provided with official accommodation within one kilometer to office or within a campus housing the place of work and residence was disallowed, has been withdrawn.
- iv) In respect of those employees who opt to retain their pre-revised scales of pay, the corresponding Grade pay of the pay scale / corresponding pay scale of the post occupied on 1.1.2006 as indicated in CCS (Revised Pay) Rules 2008 would determine the allowance under these orders.
- (v) These orders will apply to all civilian employees of the Central
  Government. The orders will also apply to the civilian employees paid from t
  he defence service estimates. In regard to Armed Forces Personnel
  and Railway employees, separate orders will be issued by the ministry of
  Defence and Ministry of Railways, respectively.
- 3. Officers drawing grade pay of Rs.10,000 & RS.12000 and those in the HAR+Scale who are entitled entitled to the use of official car in terms of O.M.No.20(5)—E-II(A) / 93 dated 28.1,94 shall be given the option to avail themselves of the existing facility or to draw the Transport Allowance at the rate of Rs.7000 plus dearness allowance thereon.

On this issue two meetings were held earlier by the University officers and consultants on 11.01.2013 and 18.01.2013. The matter was deliberated and the previous payment model was discussed and it was found that the payment distribution was not uniform due to rate admissibility depending upon student strength. The model in practice is as under:

Accordingly it was decided in the meeting held on 11.01.2013 and 18.01.2013 to keep the rates uniformly applicable on all the exam centres in Punjab and rest of India. Keeping in view the uniformity in rates at different ECs, it is decided to give two components of payment one of which is fixed i.e. Rs. 40,000/- and the other is variable i.e. Rs. 40/- per used answer sheets.

These figures were applied on Sept.-12 EC details and it was found to be the most fit model with the proposal of Rs. 40,000/- fixed per EC for the maximum student strength of 300+10% as a peak load on any specific day/session. In case the peak load increases beyond 330 on any particular day/session the fixed component i.e. Rs. 40,000/- shall be multiplied by two and the exam centre shall be considered as two EC. Hence committee recommends the proposal as under from March-2013 onwards examinations.

1. EC payment fixed as Rs. 40,000/- (For student strength up to 330 on any day/session)

2. EC payment Rs. 40/- per used answer-sheet.
