Item No. 23.3 To brief on the activities of the University

- (a) The University has conducted three days *Virsat Mela* that was attended by over 10,000 visitors. In the maiden festival, 45 colleges participated. This activity shall henceforth be an annual activity.
- (b) A total numbers of 10 colleges (88 students) participated in NSS (boys) camp held at Harike Wetland from 05 July to 14 July 2006. the students undertook the task of removing the weed Hyacinth from the waters. This was done in an effort to preserve environment and wild life. The students exhibited a great zeal in participating for a noble cause. The villagers and neighborhood villages joined the students in clearing the wetland. The students have also planted 100 trees during the camp. The area where these have been planted has been named as PTU bagh by the co-cols. A similar camp has been planned for girls. Six Colleges are likely to participate in the camp.

Item No. 23.4 To Brief on the Construction work of PTU Campus at Kapurthala site

The construction work of the university at Kapurthala site, commenced on Feb-06 is progressing. Construction has reached plinth level in the front block. Raft foundation and 10% of retaining walls of rear block have been constructed. Visuals of the construction process and its progress will be presented during the meeting.

Estimates of the boundary wall have been received. DNIT have been prepared. However clearance from PUDA for exemption from schedule Road Act Jalandhar – Kapurthala highway is schedule road is awaited. Estimates of electrical work, public health work (external) have been received from the Architects have been received and are in process. A meeting of the BOG standing Committee on construction work is scheduled on 18.7.06. The minutes of the committee shall be tabled.

The Board may please take note of the minutes of the standing committee.

Item No. 23.5 To present the proceedings of the 25th meeting of the Academic Council and to approve key issues.

The 25th Academic Council Meeting was held on 30th June 2006 at 1130 hrs in the Conference Hall of GNA Institute of Management & Technology, Phagwara. The proceedings of same are placed at **Appendix B**.

The Board may please take note of the proceedings in general and approve the following:

(a) To approve examination of a subject in the latest syllabus.

PTU was established in the year 1997. At that time, there were 9 engineering colleges and few management colleges in the Punjab and were affiliated to the different universities like Punjab University, GNDU, Amritsar, Punjabi University etc. On establishment of Technical University in the State, all engineering and management colleges of Punjab were transferred to PTU. Initially PTU followed syllabi of the parent universities. Later PTU developed its own curriculum & syllabi and the same was implemented from 1998.

The maximum stipulated time for completion of degree was one and a half times the course duration. However, the University, vide notification no. PTU/REG/924 dated 22.2.06, implemented the decisions of the BOG and enhanced the duration of the course from one and a half time to twice the duration of the course. It has also extended the benefit of additional chances to the old batches students who were not able to complete their degree within stipulated time by giving another four chances in the form of special chances, from January 2006 to December 2007 to complete their degree.

Consequently the University has to conduct examinations in varied syllabi and schemes some of which cease to exist (even dates back

to syllabi of 1993 patch admissions). It is proposed that, in order to solve this practical difficulty, all examinations may be conducted in the syllabi inforce in the current scheme. In case of obsolete courses this would be by identifying and notifying the equivalent courses.

If approved the equivalence of the courses could be identified and notified accordingly before commencement of the examinations.

The issue was discussed in the Academic Council. The Council has made the following recommendations:

"The Council recommended an amendment to the academic regulations to incorporate examination in the latest syllabus applicable. The Council also recommended determination of an equivalent subject by the BOS in case a subject had been taken off the scheme or declared obsolete."

(b) To approve new colleges and increase in intake in the existing colleges.

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(e) Modifications of Academic Regulations 2004 Recommendations for Amendments

in Academic Regulations - 2004 (*FINAL RECOMMENDATIONS*)

The Board of Governors in it's 20th meeting held on August 19, 2005, constituted a committee to study the Academic Rules of various Universities and suggest modifications/amendments, if any, in the Academic Regulations 2004 of the Punjab Technical University, particularly with regard to the following two issues: -

- a) The promotional rules for students.
- b) The maximum duration for award of a degree by the University.

The committee constituted was as follows:

The committee submitted it's part recommendations, with regard to the maximum duration for award of a degree by the University, which was approved by the Board in it's 22nd Meeting held on April 10, 2006. The final recommendations of the committee with regard to the promotional rules are presented here, for consideration of the Board.

Background

In the past decade, there had been substantial expansion in the technical education system at all levels especially in professional disciplines such as Engineering, Technology, Computer Applications, Management, Pharmacy, Architecture, Hotel Management etc. Initially, the trend started in the southern states of Karnataka and Maharashtra. However, with the passage of time the situation became same in almost all the northern states as well. Previously, the demand and supply ratio was in favor of demand. Hence, in professional colleges only meritorious students could take admissions and the competition for each seat was fierce.



Over the past few years, with the reversal of this ratio whereby the supply has surpassed the demand, any 10 + 2 pass out seeking admission to professional course gets a seat. The entrance examination, at best, is a process through which selection of course and an institution is decided on merit. Faced with such challenges of selection, the AICTE Regulations on eligibility has, over the years, been made more inclusive. Initially, the eligibility condition of 10+2 with 60% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics was the minimum criterion for admission to engineering courses. Yet, some state governments relaxed the condition to 50% aggregate in 10+2 for admission, where a large number of colleges were not able to fill all their seats through such conditions. Faced with such a condition slowly emerging in almost all states, the AICTE relaxed the eligibility to pass at 10+2 level with the condition that admissions shall be made only on the basis of merit ranking at the common entrance test either conducted by the state government or through the All Indian Entrance Examination conducted by the CBSE. It was felt that this relaxation was essential not only for the economic viability of the Engineering colleges but also to address the problems of competitions with various below par foreign institutions and universities operating in India.

The immediate fallout of this relaxation was large-scale failures in university examinations. The non-uniformity in the core syllabi of 10+2 level system in State Boards vis-a-vis the Central Boards have only accentuated the problems of failures in the university examinations conducted by the technical universities. Even the best of technical universities have a pass percentage of almost 40-45% at the first semester level and marginally better at the IInd semester level.

As per existing rules, the process of filtering takes place after one year, when the student has substantially spent a large sum of money for acquiring professional qualification. The present PTU Regulations allow a student to repeat the Ist year, if he does not clear more than 50% of all theory papers in the Ist year taken together. The student thus has the option to spend 2 years in the system for making the eligibility to be promoted in the IIIrd semester. Number of students, who still do not qualify to be promoted, in essence have spent 2 years and the real threat of leaving the course in the

Item No 23.6 To recommend amendment to Chapter XVI of the regulations relating to use of unfair means in or in relation to examination.

There has been an increase in use of mobile phones and other means of electronics communication devices in unfair means during conduct of examinations. Even though instructions on the issue of carriage of such items to the examination hall by the examinees is laid down, this requires to be included in the regulations of Use of Unfair Means. A copy of the regulations is placed at **Appendix-C.** It is proposed that this be included in the regulation 10 of Chapter XVI "Prevention, Punishment and Procedure concerning cases of Misconduct and use of Unfair Means in or in relation to Examination" of the University.

The following addition is recommended under regulation 10 of the Regulations supera.

10(z) "Carriage of mobile and other means of electronics communication inside the examination hall (even in off condition). Communicating or trying to communicate, by any means whatsoever, through electronic media or otherwise with any other person in a manner that is indicative of help being sought/given in an examination."

Consequently clause 11.1 (VII) of the Regulations under chapter XVI shall be modified to read (y & z) instead of (y).

The board may consider academic council agenda items 25.6 ,25.7, 25.17 and 25.18 and approve please.

Item No 23.7 To report on the present status of the staff of the university and to highlights various issue involved.

The issue of staff of the university was presented to the Board under agenda Item No 22.5. The decisions arrived at in the meeting have been circulated and included in Page 6 at **Appendix-D**. It was decided that no change in the present status of the staff may be effect in until and unless a final decision on the issue is taken by the BOG. The university has received representations from the staff members. Representations are enclosed.

As brought out in report submitted under agenda Item No 22.5 placing staff in scale was carried out arbitrarily in that some of the staff members who had joined earlier have continuous to be in contractual appointments while the staff joined subsequently have been placed in scale. This has discrimination has caused discontentment amongst the staff members.

The representation in general is on the following issues.

- (a) Discrimination in implementing scale to select personnel.
- (b) Non-regularization of employment.
- (c) Lack of motivation.
- (d) Lack of career growth.

This is considered to be against interest of the university. It is hence recommended that an early decision on the following may be taken at the earliest.

- (a) Removal of discrimination in implementing scale to select personnel.
- (b) Increment from the date of placing in scale.
- (c) Some incentives who have been not placed in scale but on daily wages/ fixed pay and have rendered long service.

Item No 23.8 To review the University staff cadre.

Item No 23.10 To deliberate setting up of regional center at Khadoor Sahib in Tarn Tarn.

The Hon'ble Chief Minister, Punjab, on the occasion of 400-martyrdom day of "Sh Guru Arjun Dev Ji", on 16-06-2006, declared Tarn Tarn to be an independent District. The Hon, ble Chief Minister also announced opening of a college of Engineering & Architecture at Khadoor Shaib in the district. The Deputy Commissioner of the district had convened a meeting on 10 July 2006 to discuss the issue. It was proposed that this could be either as an autonomous college approved by AICTE or in the form of a Regional Centre of the University. The required land would be made available by the district administration. This would involve an expenditure of about Rs. 6 Crores on part of the university. The Board is also informed that in addition to the above the following Regional Centres / Educational Institutions are also proposed to be set up in the district.

- 1. Establishment of a Regional Centre of Shri Guru Angand Dev University of Veterinary Science at Patti.
- 2. Regional Centre of Guru Nanak Dev University at Valtoha.
- 3. College of Physical Education at Patti.

The issue is being deliberated by the finance committee on its meeting on 19 July 2006. Minutes of the meeting shall be tabled during the meeting of the BOG.

The matter is placed before the Board for its consideration and decision.

Item No 23.11 To approve continuation of Sh Ekonkar Singh.

Services of Sh Ekonkar Singh was hired on contract initially for a period of two year. The BOG in its 20th meeting had approved extension of the above contract for a period of one more year. The same expires on 12.12.2006. The individual is a diligent and responsible officer. He is currently employed on construction project. He has a thorough knowledge of the project. As a B.Tech (Civil) & M.Tech (Environment Science Engg) Sh. Ekonkar Singh appreciates technicalities of the project.

In the interest of the project it is considered necessary that the contract of Sh Ekonkar Singh is extended for a period of two years or the completion of the civil works which ever is earlier.

The agenda is placed before the Board for decision.

Item No 23.12 Recruitment of University staff on deputation.

Selection committee constituted for the purpose of selection, on deputation, had conducted selection. The details of the panel selection received will be tabled during the meeting.

The Board may approve the following.

- (a) Deputation of two candidates for a period not exceeding three years.
- (b) Panel as prepared by the selection committee in order of merit.

Because of urgency of the matter, the Chairman of the Board of Governors has approved the above as an interim measure. This requires to be ratified by the Board.

The same is placed before the Board for ratification.

Item No. 23.13: To approve the criteria of performance appraisal of RLFCs working under Distance Education Program of the university.

In the last meeting of the Board, it was desired that the Board may first approve the criteria of assessment of RLFCs for consideration of their extension of agreement with the university, before the DEP Council assesses their performance for extension. The University has now prepared a detailed performance appraisal system, in consultations with reputed institutions, for evaluating the performance of the RLFCs during their five-year tenure of association with the Distance Education program of the University. Item No.23.14 To consider incentive share to Learning Centers.

Learning Centers in the distance education program have an important role to play. With the revision of Norms of infrastructure and cost escalation, the Learning centers are facing severe resource crunch, which affects their performance. Presently, the sharing pattern is 45% to LCs out of the fees, which comes to about 42.5% after deduction of TDS out of which they have to meet the expenditure of infrastructure, faculty, labs, training cost etc.

Earlier, when the University started distance education program and launched the non IT streams, the Learning center share for non-IT streams used to be 50% and that of IT centers it was 45%. However, later it was reduced to 45% to keep parity with the IT stream. The sharing pattern has not been revised during past 5 years and the fee has also remained almost constant.

Various state universities running distance education program, give 50% share to their LCs and therefore PTU learning centers are at a distinct disadvantage. Further, there is no incentive share on a graded pattern, due to which there is no competitive spirit between big and small centers. The sharing pattern of various universities to their Study Centers/Learning Centers are given below:

Earlier on recommendations of Goel Committee approved by the Board, an incentive based sharing pattern has been adopted for the RLFC. In lieu with

For information about operation of Master RLFC i.e. Symantec Infoways under distance education programme of PTU.

Symantec Infoways the master RLFC appointed by the University in 2001 was given the responsibility for coordinating the distance education activities throughout the country except the state of Punjab, HP & J&K. The agreement stipulated that the RLFC shall appoint ARLFC for coordinating the activities. The said agreement is valid till 2006. After monitoring the activities of the RLFC concerned and on mutual discussions with the RLFC the University and the RLFC had agreed to limit their operations in those states in which their ARLFC was performing to the satisfaction of the University. In doing so, the RLFC concerned had agreed to limit their operation only in the following states:

- 1. Andhra Pradesh
- 2. Gujrat
- 3. UP & Uttranchal
- 4. Kerala
- 5. Rajasthan

They have signed agreements with various ARLFC till December 2006 as indicated above. It has already been informed to the Board in the last meeting that all RLFC shall continue only till December 2006 and their performance shall be independently evaluated by Distance Education Council as per criteria to be approved by the Board (Presented as separate agenda item).

The matter has already been reported to DEP Council about the zones of operation of Symantec Infoways in the above states. The decision was taken amicably between RLFC and the University. In compliance of the decision of the University, a long pending case of the RLFC i.e. Symantec Infoways against the University has also been withdrawn.

The matter is reported to BOG for information.

Item No 23.16 To inform on financial health of the University.

Details have been referred to the finance committee. A meeting of the committee is scheduled to be held on 20 July 2006 at 1030 hrs. The details together with recommendations of the committee shall be tabled during the meeting for information and necessary action of the BOG.
