#### 25.3 To approve Revised Budget for the year 2006-2007 and Budget for the year 2007-2008 as recommended by the Finance Committee in its 12<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> March 2007.

A meeting of the finance committee, PTU, Jalandhar was held under the Chairmanship of Dr. S.K. Salwan, Vice Chancellor, Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar on 23 March 2007. The committee approved the revised budget for the year 2006-2007 and budget for the year 2007-2008 and recommended the same to the Board of Governors for its approval. #### 25.4 Brief on the Adhoc Staff.

#### Brief on the present status of staff.

Ever since the inception of the University, the university has employed staff at various stages during 1997-2004 in the B, C and D category. The recruitments were made as adhoc and no procedure of appointment was followed, although the university had framed Regulations for appointment of staff soon after the inception of the university.

The staff initially recruited, were kept for a period of 89 days, without advertisement, without a proper selection committee and without issuing a

# 25.5 Brief on Construction of PTU Campus.

1. A Plot of Land measuring 78.16 acres approximately on Jalandhar-Kapurthala Highway in Kapurthala District stands transferred to Punjab Technical University from Department of Civil Aviation, Govt. of Punjab for the construction of its new campus. M/s Archigroup Architects, New Delhi stand selected as consultants for the design of campus and the buildings after inviting Expression of Interest through press and making selection by a committee constituted by the Board. On the basis of scope supplied by the University, following components have been planned:

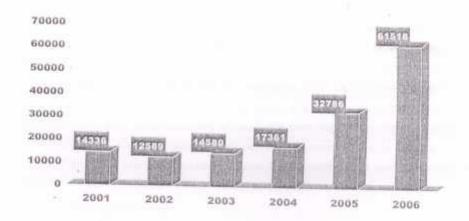
#### 25.7 Distance Education Brief.

To brief about the activities of Distance Education Program and to ratify the recommendations of the DEP Council and the sub-committee of Board approved for implementation by the then Chairman, BOG.

World over Distance Education is fast growing mode of education because of the unique benefit that it provides. The Universities are now able to reach the community that is deprived of higher education due to various reasons including social, economic and geographical constraints. This provides them a second chance to upgrade their technical skills and qualifications.

Keeping the above facts in mind Punjab Technical University initiated its distance education program and started offering various job oriented technical courses such as Information Technology, Hotel Management, Paramedical & Applied Technologies and Fashion Technologies since July 2001. The program was initiated with the aim of fulfilling the mandate of the Act for providing continuing education.

The program was started after approval of the Board in it's 7th Meeting held in December 2001, and a Public Private partnership model was evolved to provide student support services in all parts of the country. Over the past 5 years the program has developed from strength to strength and various innovations have been brought into the system. The enrolment of students under distance education has continuously risen during the past 5 years, which is shown below:



The University has over the years initiated various quality improvement initiatives in establishing and running its distance education program to deliver quality education at par with that of regular mode of education. This also takes care of the overall personality development of the students. Presently, PTU has more than 60000 students enrolled in more than 50 courses under distance education stream in over 675 learning centers across the country.

After the first 5 years, the BOG had decided that the support service providers working under the PTU system may be assessed and evaluated by the DEP Council of the University through a comprehensive benchmarking mechanism approved by the Board. The matter was considered by the DEP Council and a Review Report was submitted by the DEP Council after thorough deliberations on various issues of relevance under the Distance Education Program of PTU. The Brief of the report shall be presented by the Dean. The recommendations of the sub-committee of the BOG which was approved by the then Chairman, BOG for implementation is enclosed herewith at Annexure- C

# 25.8 Briefing on the affairs of the University.

Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar was established, by an act of state Legislature, Government of Punjab w.e.f 16<sup>th</sup> January 1997, when the

- By providing support for mechanical equipment and stocking critical spares.
- (x) . By setting up demonstration centres for appropriate technology.
- (xi) Setting up of services for sophisticated testing and calibration facilities for local industrial units.
- (xii) Dissemination of information, interaction with local agencies.
- (xiii) Exploring new potential for large-scale employment through efforts in the post harvest and associated areas of rural industrialization.

# 25.9 To ratify the appointment of Dean/ Registrar

#### 25.10 To brief about the admission in Caparo School of Manufacturing and Material Technology

PTU Caparo School of Excellence for Manufacturing and Material Technology is being established at PTU site Kapurthala-Jalandhar Road. Foundation stone laying ceremony of the school was carried out on 11.10.06

The affairs of the School were entrusted to a Governing Council comprising of member nominated equally by PTU & Caparo. The Governing Council was made responsible for day- to-day operation/ functioning of the School in accordance with the directions given to them and perform their functions under the overall supervision of the Governing Body of the said society. The composition of the Society is annexed.

BOG in its 24th meeting held on 20th November,06 approved the running of following three courses

- B. Tech. (Electronic) with specialization in Manufacturing Electronic B. Tech (Mechanical) with specialization in Manufacturing Technology
- B. Tech. (IT) with specialization in Process Planning Control.

It may be informed that these courses were approved by the Academic Council in its 27th meeting held on November 10,2006 vide item no. 27.3

The admissions to the school for the academic session 2007-08 are proposed to be made as under:

- 50% admissions reserved for Punjab residents based on AIEEE i) merit of Punjab
- 50% admissions on all India basis based on AIEEE- All India Merit

The occasion commemorated the birth centenary year of 'Shaheed-e-Azam Sardar Bhagat Singh', who sacrificed his life for the sake of the motherland. The Congress was inaugurated by His Excellency Dr. A.R. Kidwal, Governor, Haryana. Distinguished Scientists and Technical experts viz. Prof. Y.S. Rajan, Principal Advisor CII, Dr. R.S. Khnadpur, Dr. S.K. Kapoor, Dr. S.S. Chahal, Dr. Jai Rup Singh and Dr. R.C. Sobti were invited to deliver expert talks. #### 25.13 MOU between Chitkara Education Trust and GBC.

Academic Council in its 24<sup>th</sup> meeting under Item No 24.12 considered the proposal for award of dual degree and appointed a committee under the chairmanship of Dr. V.P. Sandlas. The committee recommended award of dual degree. The minutes were approved by the 25<sup>th</sup> Academic Council under item No 25.2 (d).

Consequent upon the decision taken by the committee an MOU was signed by Chitkara Educational Trust with George College (GBC) Toronto, Canada. The same has been forwarded to the PTU for award of dual degree by TPU (BCA degree) and GBC (Three years Advanced Diploma in Computer Systems Technology) a copy of the bilateral agreement is placed at Annexure—.
