Item No 34.3 To approve the recruitment proposal for the 'A' & 'B' Grade posts.

In pursuance of the decision taken in the 33rd meeting of the Board of Governors, PTU the Human Resource Committee was constituted to deal with all the issues relating to Human Resources of the University:

The Committee deliberated upon the issue and has submitted its report. The proposal of the Committee for the Posts to be filled up on urgent basis for A and B Grade Posts, is placed at Annexure II.

Item 34.4 Brief about CET-2009- Online Counselling

Online counselling was conducted by the University for Admissions to $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ year of B.Tech / B.Pharmacy courses.

Two round of online counselling were held and seats were allotted on the basis of CET-09 /AIEEE-9 respectively.

Accordingly 13746 seats were allotted for B.Tech Courses and 243 B. Pharmacy courses. The counsellings were conducted as per the notifications issued by the State Government. After the end of 2nd round of counselling as the process of further allotment of seats on the basis of qualifying examination had been initiated, the process was stayed followed by the orders of Punjab & Haryana High Court in civil writ petitions filed in the Court.

The case was defended by the University in the Hon'ble Court. The Court has quashed the counselling and also the allotments made on the basis of qualifying examination i.e 10+2 etc.

Accordingly new schedule of the counselling in the 3rd round based on the CET/AIEEE-09 rankings in accordance with the guidelines of the Hon'ble Court being issued.

The last date for admissions to these courses has also been extended to $30^{\rm th}$ September 2009.

The minutes of 33^{nd} meeting of the Academic Council held on 29.8.2009 are placed at Annexure III for approval of the Board.

Item 34.6 All India Entrance Examination based Admissions for B.Tech, B.Pharma, B. Architecture, MBA & MCA.

Since the establishment of the Punjab Technical University Jalandhar the admission in its affiliated colleges are done on the basis of entrance test conducted by one of the State Universities. Combined Entrance Test (CET) for admission to B.Tech, B.Pharmacy and B.Architecture had been conducted by PTU Jalandhar since 1998 in compliance with the notifications issued by Govt. of Pb. from time to time. Similarly Management Entrance Test (MET)/(PAM/CAT) for admissions to MBA and MCA was conducted by one of the state universities out of PTU, Jalandhar, Pbi University, Patiala and GNDU, Amritsar in compliance to notifications issued by Govt. Of Punjab from time to time.

At present majority of the states in India has abandoned the conduct of State level Entrance Tests and admission of B.Tech & B. Architecture is being done on the basis of AIEEE (All India Engineering Entrance Examination). This has resulted in to a uniform pattern in most parts of the Country. Stress, repetitive testing and financial burden on students has been observed to have been reduced by following this pattern. In state of Punjab Thapar University, Patiala, PEC, Chandigarh and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar NIT, Jalandhar are pursuing admissions to B.Tech and B.Arch on the basis of AIEEE.

It is submitted that admissions to B.Tech, B. Architecture, MBA & MCA and B.Pharmacy for the Academic session 2010-11 in the State of Punjab in all the Universities established by Act of Govt. Of Punjab i.e. PTU Jalandhar, Punjabi University, Patiala and GNDU Amritsar be conducted on the basis of prevalent All India Entrance Examination. In future no Combined Entrance Test may be conducted separately by any of the above Universities. The criteria for 85% and 15% for Punjab State and All India quota may be followed per the previous practice.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council in its 33rd meeting held on 29.8.2009 and the Council recommended as under:

- Multiplicity of tests leads to lot of harrassment to the students, which could be avoided by resorting to making admissions on AIEEE merit basis as has been adopted by a large number of universities.
- Rural area students generally do not have the exposure of competitive examinations. It was therefore decided that awareness be created amongst the students about the conduct of admission through AIEEE for which if required 10+2 students may be given some kind of orientation/training programme at the beginning of the academic session.
- Likewise, admissions to MBA & MCA may be carried out on the basis of All India level Entrance Test such CAT/MAT.

Item No. 34.8 Scholarship for Rural Students

To attract rural students in Technical education and to motivate every college to admit rural students in their college, a scheme of scholarship has been initiated by the University for the candidates of rural areas.

The key highlights of the scheme are as under:

- All the students belonging to rural areas and studying in the affiliated colleges of PTU shall be eligible for the scholarships.
- Student can be from any stream, e.g. Management, Pharmacy, Engineering, Architecture or others.
- Student should have passed his/her matriculation and 10+2 examination from a rural school.
- 4. The students should have a good academic record in studies and shall have no reappear in his /her exams. Those who are in their 1st year of studies, the marks scored in 10+2 examination shall be the criteria.
- The students should apply for the scholarship on a prescribed Performa through their respective institutions.
- In case of tie in merit between the two students, the candidate with lower income shall be eligible for the scholarship.
- 7. Scholarship amount shall be Rs. 5000/- per annum per candidate.

The matter was placed before the Academic Council in its 33rd meeting held on 29.8.2009 and the Council appreciated the University efforts to motivate the rural students for technical education. It was also informed that Rs. 25 lakh have been allocated for this scheme. This scheme is applicable to the students of Punjab State only.

Item 34.9 Brand Building of the University through Electronics Media.

It is pertinent to mention that the Board of Governors in its 25th meeting held on 27th March 2007 vide item no. 27.7 annexure 3 point no. 6 had approved in principle a budget of Rs. 25 to 30 Lac for overall branding exercise. The same is reproduced below:

"6. The University must provide an annual budget to the tune of 25-30 Lakhs for September session every year for branding exercise alone and also for promoting courses which has direct bearing on the service sector such as Hotel Management, Paramedical, Mass Communication & Journalism, Multi Media and Fashion Technology etc."

A proposal was received from All India PTU DEP Associates for organizing a national level branding campaign of the Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar in famous electronic channels like Zee News, India TV, ND-TV, Aaj Tak etc. with 10 second slot, 20 times a day for 28 days with an overall proposed budget of Rs. 90 Lacs which to be shared by PTUDEP Associates, PUTIA and PTU.

The entire project was to be coordinated by the All India PTU DEP Associates.

University has allocated a grant of $1/3^{\circ t}$ of the project cost but not exceeding Rs. 30 Lacs for the entire project. An advance of Rs.18 lacs has been released to PTUDEP Associates to enable it to start with of its brand building exercise.

Item No. 34.12 Grant of Special chance to students

BOG after considering request of the old students of PTU who were having backlog in clearing their degrees were ordered vide notification no. PTU/REG/924 dated 22.2.06 to clear all their papers by December 2007. University had implemented the above order in letter and spirit. But few students of old batches who were admitted to 2001 onward batches are yet to clear some papers. Some students whose duration of course has already completed are making representations for the grant of a special chance.

The matter was discussed in the 33rd meeting of the Academic Council that approved the grant of a special chance to such students as one time measure only.
