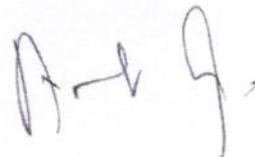
Item No. 55.9

To ratify opening and Maintenance of Separate Bank Account by Controller of Examination for Confidential Examination work of the University

To maintain proper secrecy in the examination related matters of the University, a separate Bank Account was required to open and maintained by the Controller of Examination for Confidential Examination work of the University. By opening a separate bank account there will be complete secrecy in the examination work of the University and the efficiency of Secrecy Branch will also be improved. In fact every University/Institutions of repute have a separate Bank Account for Secrecy Cell of Examination Branch to maintain complete secrecy in the examination work. The separate Bank Account for Confidential Examination work will be governed as per following guidelines :

1. It should be the responsibility of Controller Examination to maintain the account and submission of utilization certificate after completion of semester examination including supplementary or golden chance examination etc.
2. Initially to run the Account, seed money from the University Accounts has to be transferred.

Keeping in view the sensitivity of the matter, bank account to be operated by the Controller of examination was opened in Nov-14, the decision of Opening and Maintain Separate Bank Account by Controller of Examination for Confidential Examination work of the University is submitted for consideration and ratification by the Board of Governors.

Agenda for PITs :

(a) Starting of Academic Programme including B.Tech Program on the campus from 2016

This is to inform that the construction of following buildings is in progress and the works for these buildings will be completed in phases by the end of this year. The total built up area for these buildings is about 4.52 lacs sqft. :

- i) College Building-I
- ii) College Building-II
- iii) College Building-III
- iv) Library
- v) Seminar Hall
- vi) Hostels (Boys & Girls)

In addition to the above, following buildings have also been sanctioned for which work are to be started shortly :-

- i) Auditorium
- ii) Married student accommodation
- iii) Boys Hostels
- iv) Girls Hostels

Presently PG courses (M.Tech, MBA etc) are running at existing buildings and UG courses are to be started w.e.f academic year 2016-17. About 3600 students can be accommodated in 4.50 Lac Sqft area available. It is expected that about 1200 students will stay in the hostels and whereas the capacity of hostels being developed is only 600. It may also be noted that so far no provision has been kept for Warden house, Registrar house, Vice Chancellor and faculty residence. Stay of some faculty members and officials will be appropriate to maintain the discipline in the campus and to take care of any untoward incident in the campus after the working hours.

At present the university is under 2F of UGC but to bring it under 12B regulation it is mandatory to run the academic program on the campus. It is pertinent to mention that all the state universities of Punjab are under 12 B.

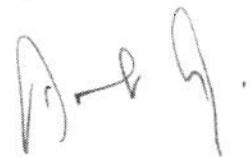

To take decision on requests made by University Officials for transfer/shifting from IKGPTU to MRRSSTU

Subsequent to the establishment of Maharaja Ranjit Singh State Technical University Bathinda (MRRSSTU), I.K.Gujral PTU invited consent of its employees willing to get transfer/shift to MRRSSTU. In response, a total 15 Officials requested for transfer to MRRSSTU, Bathinda retaining their lien for period as per norms of IKGPTU and 10 Officials requested for transfer from GZS PTU Campus to IKGPTU's constituent Colleges/Campus.

In this regard, it is also informed that in the past 2-3 years, 13 employees from GZSPTU Campus Bathinda had got transferred to IKGPTU and its constituent colleges/PITs with the approval of competent authorities. Out of which 02 of the employees have joined back GZSPTU Campus whereas rest of the 11 employees have requested for absorption in IKGPTU. It is worth to mention here that the Board of Governors, GZSPTU Campus vide its 17th meeting held on 22.8.2014 in its item no. 17.9 has decided to cancel the transfer/deputation of faculty/staff member from GZSPTU Campus and to direct the concerned employees to join back immediately in the interest of institute.

As per Govt. of Punjab Act no. 5 of 2015, GZSPTU campus is now under the MRRSSTU

To review the Status of Contractual appointments in the University.

University had made contractual appointments in the last five years using the discretionary powers of the Vice Chancellor approved by the Board of Governors vide its 44th meeting held on October 5, 2011 against some administrative and senior positions on short term basis from 03 months to 01 year. The tenure of these Officials was extended from time to time. Further to it, the Board vide its 49th meeting held on April 10, 2013 declined extensions to Officers appointed on temporary / contract basis. The Board decided that the vacant posts be filled through open advertisement as per Hon'ble Court orders. The Board of Governors vide its 52nd meeting held on March 20, 2014 had advised the University to fill all coveted posts through open advertisement. Punjab Govt. has constituted a new Technical University in Punjab, namely Maharaja Ranjit Singh State Technical University (MRRSSTU) Bathinda for which notification has been issued. As per the notification, jurisdiction of 11 districts has been shifted from IK Gujral PTU to the new University. With this, the enrollment of about 40% of the total enrolled students with IKG PTU under

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different affiliated institutes will be shifted with MRRSSTU. Besides loss in revenue, quantum of work in some departments has reduced substantially.

Keeping in view the above, case of all such appointments is placed before the Board for deliberations.

Item No. 55.13

To approve the promotions of faculty under CAS

University has adopted criteria from UGC promotion of faculty staff under CAS. Minor modification/relaxation in criteria of UGC has been made as presently teaching departments are not in existence in University. This has necessitated to grant promotions to faculty in time and to safeguard the interest of faculty. This relaxation will be applicable till teaching departments are fully established in University. The proposed criteria is placed at **Annexure XIX**.

As per this criterion, Screening-cum-Evaluation Committee has been constituted and interviews & evaluations have been completed. The proceedings of different meetings of Committees are placed at **Annexure XX**. The matter is put up to Board for deliberation.

To re-consider the policy of appointments on compassionate grounds

The Board of Governors, in its 52nd meeting held on 20.3.2014 has approved the policy regarding offering regular job to one of the family member of deceased in the case of death of a Class III & IV employee according to his/her eligibility.

Board may consider the matter for approval to extend the benefit of jobs on compassionate grounds to Group A & B employees in view of Punjab Govt. notification No. 11/105/98/4PPII/ 14420, dated 21.11.2002(Copy placed at **Annexure-XXI**) alongwith amendments.

To implementation the policy of Punjab Govt. Notification No. 17/20/2010-2पी पी2/132 dated 17.11.2014 for the persons with disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 (Central Act No. 1 of 1996) clause No. 33

As per Dept. of Personnel, Punjab Govt. Chandigarh notification no. 7/20/2010-2 PP2/132 dated 19.11.2014 (Copy placed at **Annexure-XXII**), the retirement age of Persons with disabilities have been changed from 58 to 60 years in following categories:

- (i) Blindness or Low Vision
- (ii) Hearing Impairment
- (iii) Loco motor disability or cerebral palsy.

It is brought to the notice that the Board of Governors at its 45th meeting held on December 21, 2011 had approved the implementation of notifications of Punjab Government issued from time to time.

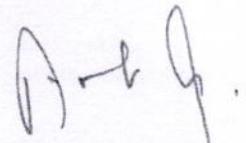
To consider the enhancement of Retirement Age from 58 years to 60 years for Group B & C Non-teaching employees

University was established in 1997. Initially majority of officers/staff were appointed on deputation/contractual basis. Onwards regular recruitments of all categories were made from time to time.

At present the retirement age for Group-A & D employees is 60 years in the University. However, for Group B & C employees, the retirement age is 58 years. The employees working in Group B & C of the University are requesting time and again to consider the enhancement of retirement age from 58 to 60 years at par with other Universities in Punjab.

Accordingly the University has collected information from Punjabi University, Patiala, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, PAU Ludhiana regarding retirement age of Group-B & C employees working over there. The information received from this University is placed at **Annexure XXIV.** As per the information received from this University, the retirement age for Group-B & C employees is 60 years.

The proposal for enhancement of retirement age of Group-B & C employees of the University from 58 to 60 years at par with other Universities of the State is submitted for consideration and approval by the Board of Governors.

Though the above employees have not rendered 5 years of qualifying service in the University but rendered their services soon after inception of the University on adhoc basis for more than 10 years in the best interest of the University. 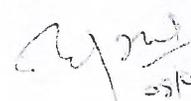

For the above purpose autonomous Institution status is required for the Campus.

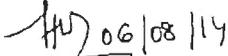

Item No. 43.1 : To confirm the Minutes of 42nd meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee held on 16.07.2014.

As no comments had been received, the minutes of 42nd meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee held on 16.07.2014 were confirmed.

Item No. 43.2 : Action taken on various items discussed during previous meetings of Standing Building Construction Committee.

It was informed by the Executive Engineer/PTU that following actions have been taken on various items discussed during previous meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee:

- The provisions/specifications for video presentation system, sound reinforcement system, stage lighting, fire fighting, wall paneling and acoustic treatment for proposed auditorium at main campus, Kapurthala are to be presented in the present meeting.
- The patterns for exterior finishes of hostels and auditorium proposed to be constructed at main campus, Kapurthala are to be discussed in the present meeting.
- The flooring patterns for circulation area and VIP Banquet hall of auditorium proposed to be constructed at main campus, Kapurthala are to be presented by the Architect in the present meeting.
- The estimate for raising, repairing and painting of existing boundary wall of main campus, Kapurthala has been forwarded to PWD for further action at their end.
- The detailed designing and estimation for Bank & Post office buildings and roads for main campus, Kapurthala has been started by the Architect.



Item No. 43.3: To discuss, analyze and approve the provisions/specifications for video presentation system, sound reinforcement system, stage lighting, fire fighting, wall paneling and acoustic treatment for proposed auditorium at main campus, Kapurthala.

After detailed discussions and deliberations on the presentations made by the Consultants engaged by the Architect and by Sh. Rajiv Aggarwal, Architect, following decisions have been taken by the committee:

a) Acoustic Treatment :-

- i. All the materials proposed to be used for this work should preferably be manufactured in India. The technical specifications of such materials, their comparative cost to be put up in the next meeting. The costing of this work will also be revised accordingly.
- ii. Committee agreed for provision of push back chairs with wooden arm rest and without cup holder.
- iii. All the wood to be used should be pre-treated against termite.
- iv. Provision for three motorized curtains shall be made on the stage. The front curtain will be uplifting and rear curtains will be side moving.
- v. Fixed cyclorama will be provided and the same will also act as a rear wall of the stage.
- vi. Carpet will be provided in the aisles only and remaining area will be covered with PVC or linoleum sheets.
- vii. The design/scheme of the treatment proposed for the walls of the auditorium shall be presented to the committee for approval.

b) Stage Lighting System :-

- i. Provision of three lighting bars over the stage and one in front of the stage is approved.
- ii. All lights will be LED lights and a combination of normal and intelligent light fittings to be provided.
- iii. Provision of suitable cat-ladders for maintenance of lights is to be provided.
- iv. Lighting control is to be provided in the projector room.



c) **Sound Reinforcement System :-**

- i. Provision of stereo sound system with hanging/flying line-array FOH speakers and subwoofer is approved. However, no provision is to be made for 5.1 sound system.
- ii. Front fill speakers on vertical wall of stage and stage fill speakers along with stage monitor are to be provided.
- iii. Sufficient microphone connection socket would be provided in the stage for easy access.
- iv. The SPL, STI and other performance related specifications for audio systems to be submitted along with design so that the same can be verified after implementation.

d) **Audio Video System :-**

- i. Provision of two side screens in the auditorium hall is not to be kept. However, provision for TVs is to be kept in VIP suite, VIP banquet and student's verandah.
1. Video projector of 20000 ANSI lumens at control room is to be provided.
2. Minimum 2 presentation point at stage for connecting booth of analogue- VGA and digital inputs – HDMI from laptop/computer to be provided.
3. All the controls should be provided in the control room to be set up on one side of the stage.
4. No provision for inter-active touch screen at podium and video conferencing system is to be kept.
5. Stage Monitor Screen of 55" or suitable higher size to be provided for people at Dias /Podium.

Item No. 43.4 : To discuss and approve the patterns for exterior finishes of hostels and auditorium proposed to be constructed at main campus, Kapurthala.

The patterns presented by the Architect for exterior finishes of hostels and auditorium were approved by the committee.

Item No. 43.5 : To discuss and approve the flooring patterns for circulation area and VIP Banquet area of auditorium proposed to be constructed at main campus, Kapurthala.

It was decided that some more patterns may be presented by the Architect so that appropriate decision is taken in this regard.

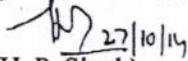

As no comments had been received, the minutes of 43rd meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee held on 01.08.2014 were confirmed.

Item No. 44.2 : Action taken on various items discussed during previous meetings of Standing Building Construction Committee.

It was informed by the Executive Engineer/PTU that following actions have been taken on various items discussed during previous meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee:

- The manufacturers/specifications for acoustic treatment for proposed auditorium at main campus, Kapurthala are to be presented in the present meeting for discussions and approval.
- The flooring patterns for circulation area and VIP Banquet hall of auditorium proposed to be constructed at main campus, Kapurthala are to be presented by the Architect in the present meeting for discussions and approval.
- The comments offered by the committee for Stage lighting system, Sound reinforcement system and audio video system have been incorporated in the design/scheme and the detailed estimate is being presented in this meeting.

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Item No. 44.3: To discuss and approve the manufacturers/specifications for acoustic treatment and audio video system for the proposed auditorium at main campus, Kapurthala.

The Architect presented the various options available in respect of the materials, specifications, their finishes, costs etc. for acoustic treatment and audio video system. After detailed discussions and deliberation, the committee was of the opinion that before taking any decision in this regard, University must finalize its requirements for acoustic treatment finishes and audio video system. Accordingly, the committee decided to appoint following sub-committee to finalize the University's requirements in respect of acoustic treatment finishes and Audio-Video System:-

- 1. Dr. Buta Singh, Dean/Academics, PTU
- 2. Sh. P.S. Saini, Superintending Engineer, PGI, Chandigarh
- 3. Executive Engineer, PTU
- 4. Executive Engineer, PWD, Construction Division 2, Kapurthala
- 5. Sh. Rajiv Aggarawal, Architect.

Item No. 44.4: To discuss and approve rough cost estimate for proposed auditorium at main campus, Kapurthala.

After detailed discussions and deliberations, the committee approved the rough cost estimate based upon plinth area rates of CPWD for Civil, Electrical, Public Health, Fire fighting and air-conditioning works amounting to Rs. 1720.59 lacs. As regards, the estimates for other specialized items such as Acoustic treatment, Stage lighting, Sound reinforcement system, Audio video presentation etc. the same shall be finalized after receipt of requirements from University (Agenda item No. 44.3 above).

However, for the time being, payment to the Architect may be released by considering 70% of this cost (Rs. 1720.59 lacs) as detailed estimates being prepared on the basis of Punjab PWD CSR are always lower than the estimates prepared on the basis of plinth area rates of CPWD.

Item No. 44.5 : To discuss and approve the flooring patterns for circulation area and VIP Banquet area of auditorium proposed to be constructed at main campus, Kapurthala.

The Architect presented various flooring patterns by using kota stone, marble, granite and their combinations alongwith their cost implications. The committee is of the view that some hard stone should be used for these areas. However, there is a huge difference in the cost of kota/marble stone and granite stone. After detailed discussions and deliberation, the committee is of the opinion that before taking any decisions in this regard, it will be appropriate that University finalizes its requirements for the type of the stone to be used for these areas. Accordingly, the committee decided to appoint following sub-committee to finalize the University's requirements for the type of the stone to be used for these areas:-

- 1. Dr. A. P. Singh, Dean/P&D, PTU
- 2. Dr. Rajneesh Sachdev, Registrar, PTU
- 3. Executive Engineer, PTU
- 4. Executive Engineer, PWD, Construction Division 2, Kapurthala
- 5. Sh. Rajiv Aggarawal, Architect.

Item No. 44.6 : To discuss and approve the revised estimate for construction of boundary wall of Punjab Institute of Technology, Mansa.

The Architect informed committee that there has been increase in the cost of work of boundary wall of PIT, Mansa on account of the followings:

1. The estimate approved in 30th meeting (Agenda item No. 30.7) of the Standing Building Construction Committee for this work for an amount of Rs. 300.0 lacs was based upon a tentative design prepared by the Architect and there has been a substantial change in the design as per actual site conditions/geo-technical investigations. There has been substantial increase in size of the foundations from that considered at the time of preparation of original estimate.
2. The length of boundary wall has increased from 4224 metre to 4870 metre on account of a mistake by the Architect at the time of preparation of original estimate as length of boundary wall for one site was not included in the estimate. Moreover, there has been increase in length of boundary wall as per site conditions. Additional boundary wall is being constructed all-around one acre of land, which has not been acquired by Punjab Govt. and this land is falling in between PTU's land.

After reviewing the earlier decisions taken by the committee in this regard and considering the reasons for increase in the cost, committee approved the revised estimated cost for the boundary wall works of PIT Mansa for an amount of Rs. 409.27 lacs. plus price variations payable to the contractor as decided earlier. It was also agreed by the committee that works may be got executed from the existing contractor at already accepted rates to avoid trespasses, encroachments and misuse of the area as without completing the boundary wall works, the whole area will remain open.

Item No. 44.7 : To discuss and approve the design basis reports submitted by the Architect for Structure, Electrical and Public Health works in respect of Punjab Institute of Technology, Arniwala, Fazilka.

After detailed discussions and deliberations, committee decided as under:

1. Structure:

The report presented by the Architect has been approved.

2. Electrical Works:

- i. As the maximum demand load is only 40 KW for the proposed construction, LT connection will be taken.
- ii. Provision of DG set of 25KVA capacity.

3. Public Health Works:

a) Water supply system:

- i. Provision of Underground reservoir (UGR)
- ii. Treatment of raw water near UGR.
- iii. Pumping of water after treatment directly to overhead PVC tanks to be installed at terrace of the building.

b) Sewerage system:

- i. Provision of 15 KLD overhead STP with FAB technology.

In addition to the above, committee reviewed its earlier decisions taken for PIT Arniwala and decided as under:

- i. Plinth level of the buildings should be kept minimum 300mm above the main highway running in front of the institute.
- ii. The buildings proposed to be constructed now should be constructed in front area of the campus.
- iii. No filling of earth is to be done for open areas around the buildings.

Following table item was discussed with the permission of Chair:

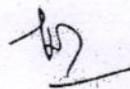
Item No. 44.8 To discuss and approve the Electric load of Hostels and auditorium proposed to be constructed at main campus, Kapurthala.

In 42nd meeting of the committee, it was decided that calculation of electric loads for proposed hostels and auditorium may be re-examined. Accordingly, the same has reviewed and presented by the Architect in the meeting. After detailed discussions and deliberations, committee approved the following:-

- i. Total demand load of 1123 KVA.
- ii. Provision of 3 transformers of capacity 400 KVA each.

As the total demand load of the University has increased to more than 4 MVA, the committee directed that planning for 66 KVA sub-station is done on priority. Location proposed by the Architect for housing 66 KVA sub-station in about 1000 Sqm. area near the existing metering house was also approved by the committee.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.

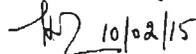

Item No. 45.5 :

To discuss and finalize the Energy audit report of PTU's main administrative building, main campus, Kapurthla submitted by Punjab State Council for Science and Technology.

The observations/recommendations submitted by Punjab State Council for Science and Technology (PSCST) in their energy audit report were presented by the Architect. After detailed discussions and deliberations, committee has taken the following decisions:-

S. No.	Observations/ Recommendations by PSCST	Decisions taken by the committee
1	Optimize operation of transformers.	Committee felt that the scheme suggested is not commensurate with the savings as additional skilled manpower will be required for switching on/off the transformers. However, it was agreed that switching on of AC system is delayed by 1-2 hours in the morning and switching off advanced by 1-2 hours before the closing time of the office.
2	Optimize the contract demand power supply from PSPCL.	The committee agreed to the proposal. However, it was suggested that extra contract demand power supply available may be used for new buildings (under construction). The Architect was advised to put up the scheme for use of extra contract demand power supply available in the new buildings.
3	Improve overall power factor of complex to unity.	The recommendations have been accepted and PTU was advised to add capacitor banks in existing APFC panels.
4	Replace existing air cooled screw chillers with water cooled screw chiller.	It was informed by the Architect that decision to provide air cooled screw chillers was a calculated and deliberated decision. This decision was taken to save water as there is a shortage of water in the area. The existing system will be continued.
5	Replace 36 watts and 18 watts fluorescent tube lights with 18 watts and 9 watts LED tube lights.	It was agreed that LED lights shall be purchased for all future maintenance requirements and with passage of the time, all lights will automatically be replaced with LED lights.
6	Replace 150W HPSV street lights with 60 watts LED and 70W HPSV with 30 W LED street lights.	It was agreed that LED lights shall be purchased for all future maintenance requirements and with passage of the time, all lights will automatically be replaced with LED lights.
7	Optimize power consumption of lighting by automation.	Before considering the proposal, Committee suggested that implication of sensors proposed must be studied for which PSCST was advised to provide literature/ specifications of the proposed sensors.

Committee suggested for provision of solar power system by PTU in their main campus, Kapurthala with a provision of supplying electricity to main grid system.

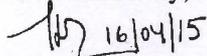

Item No. 46.2 : Action taken on various items discussed during previous meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee.

It was informed by the Executive Engineer/PTU that following actions have been taken on various items discussed during previous meeting of Standing Building Construction Committee:

- Based upon the concept plans approved by the Building Committee in respect of the proposed auditorium and hostels at main campus, Kapurthala, the municipal drawings have been approved by Chief Town Planner, Punjab.

- The Architect will be making a presentation in the present meeting on cost comparison of projector and LED screen to be provided for the proposed auditorium at main campus, Kapurthala.
- The detailed estimate for provision of speakers, amplifiers and microphones to be provided for the proposed auditorium at main campus, Kapurthala will be presented by the Architect in the present meeting for discussions and approval.
- The issue pertaining to payment to the Architect against preparation of building plans for the proposed auditorium and hostels at main campus, Kapurthala is to be discussed in the present meeting.

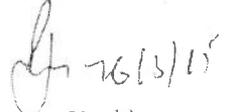
4. He emphasized the need to provide affordable technical education to various sections of society and University shall strictly monitor the quality of distance education program.

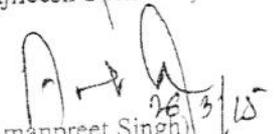

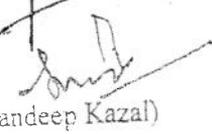

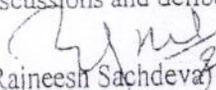
2. Director (EDvantage) explained the current system being following under the EDvantage and Director (DDE) gave the current position of students admitted under the old model. The number of students under the old system have drastically declined as no admissions are being made in the old system as University was not able to get the permission from the last two years. After the permission was granted to PTU to start distance education within the territorial jurisdiction of the state of Punjab, the new program of EDvantage was launched, which has ^{not} received ~~very poor~~ ^{expected} response.

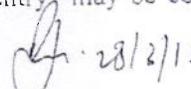
3. Higher fee structure and lack of interest by the Learning Centers, which have now been converted as Registration Centres, could be possible reasons for poor response. It was also noted that most of the activities are being coordinated by Delhi camp Office with little control of the University. It was felt that University should have direct control on the important processes such as admissions, examinations, learning material, award of degrees etc. In fact, it was brought out that the learning material for first semester was prepared by the University and which was sent to Delhi Camp Office and the same material was presented back to the University without any significant changes.

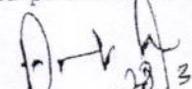

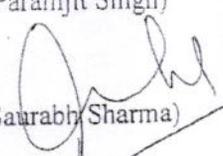

The matter regarding setting up its own study centers for conduct of Personal Contact Programs (as per guidelines of UGC) was discussed and it was decided that the same can be set up by the University in the PITs/Constituent/Affiliated colleges as it has sufficient number of them in the State of Punjab. These study centers would further be supported as an additional measure by the learning support centers in close proximity to the location of the learner.

4. It was also unanimously felt that the University now has sufficient in house capacity, infrastructure and resources to ensure stringent quality in all the key aspects of distance education such as Admission, preparing Self Learning Material, Examination and Award of certificates etc. The distance education program should accordingly be restructured with the University having direct control on all the key processes like admission, examination, study material, certification etc.

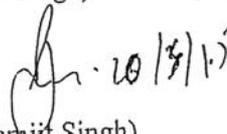

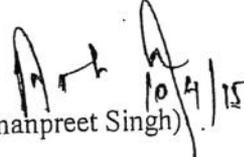

At the outset the committee took comprehensive review of new DEP Policy Document prepared in series of earlier meetings on the noted subject. Also the proceedings of meeting held under chairmanship of Honourable Technical Education Minister dated 14-05-2015 were considered for detailing out the further roadmap on starting the Distance Education Programme.

The committee took stock of present scenario of PTU DEP Learning Centres network and observed that Learning Centres of Punjab might not be operationally ready as per new vision and direction of our new draft DEP Policy. They need to be immediately communicated about policy shift for successfully activating them as Learning Support Centres.

On the other hand the process of establishing our Study Centres at PITs/Constituent colleges/affiliated colleges as envisaged in Policy Document needs immediate kick start. This process also needs geographic mapping of Learning Support Centres with nearest Study Centres. This is even more imperative for minimizing the average distance, a student has to travel to attend PCP at allotted Study Centre.

In addition there are functional requirements to be met for activating the broad decisions taken in earlier meetings, meeting chaired by Honourable Technical Education Minister dated 14-05-2015 and operationalising the new PTU DEP Policy Document.

Accordingly the committee recommends as under:

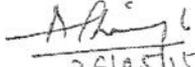
1. As per approval in 44th Academic Council meeting dated 09-06-2014 and subsequent approval of BOG in its 53rd meeting dated 06-08-2014, it was decided that PTU DEP will run 23 courses as per list attached (Flag-A). The content for first semester of most of these courses has already been prepared by Directorate of Distance Education. While work is already on for the content development of next semesters. Hence it is proposed that new admission be launched in these 23 courses.
2. All officially active Learning Centers of DEP including such Registration Centers of Edvantage which were earlier Learning Centres of DEP are hereby proposed to be renamed as Learning Support Centers (LSC).
3. These LSCs may be allowed to serve only such admissions which are as per their previously approved streams/courses (but to be selected from above 23 courses only), since offering of new course will need inspections at LSCs which may take time.
4. Every PTU LSC will have a common standardized sign board displayed at its front. The proposed standard design is attached herewith (Flag-B). The minimum size

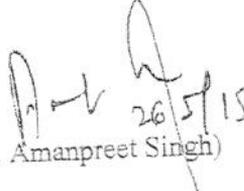
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should be 10'X 4'. The signboard must be a glow sign board box type with backlight sheet and having internal illumination.

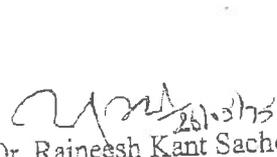
5. As per decision in the meeting, fee structure has to be affordable to the average tune of Rs.10,000/-. It may be revised from time to time. Accordingly it is submitted that we may go ahead with already existing fee structure of PTU DEP where average fee of first semester comes to be around Rs.9500/-
6. DDE department is in process of drafting agreements to be signed with LSCs as per the new paradigm. By the time all currently active LSCs may be given provisional continuation approval till signing of the new agreement.
7. LSCs are required to maintain infrastructure and faculty as per existing norms which may be revised from time to time. Their roles and responsibilities will be as per existing norms of DEP with modifications if any to be notified later by the university.
8. The LSCs may be given share of 45% of Tuition Fee + upto 5% incentive as per the guidelines issued by university from time to time.
9. There are some apprehensions about likelihood of litigation over our new admissions by some mischievous elements. To avert any such possibility, it is proposed to file caveats in courts of different jurisdictions as done while launching the Edvantage programme.
10. It is proposed that PTU may issue central advertisement in print/electronic media showcasing the DEP with its new vigour. A draft advertisement is attached herewith to begin with (Flag-C). On the other hand, the LSCs are also required to launch media campaigning/advertisement/promotion of PTU DEP in their local area using their own resources.
11. It is proposed that any PTU LSC must not be allowed to indulge in anti-PTU activity including becoming distance education Learning Centrer of any other university.

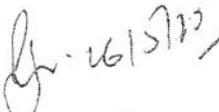

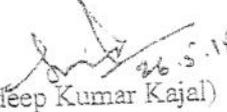

Distance Education Policy 2015 Punjab Technical University

1. Introduction

- 1.1. Open and Distance Education has been accepted and recognized as one of the important mode for achievement of enhanced access, life-long education and continuing education. It provides avenues to those students who are not able to leave their jobs or are not able to attend regular classes due to some reasons. It provides for social inclusion and affordable education.
- 1.2. PTU was established in 1996 and one of its obligations as defined in the Punjab Technical University Act 1996 was to offer continuing education. PTU being a State Technical University has to play an important role in the expansion of technical education and therefore would spearhead the Distance Education Program in the State.

2. Regulatory Framework

- 2.1. University Grants Commission (UGC) is currently entrusted with the responsibility of regulating the Distance Education in the country. UGC has laid down the following broad guidelines for distance education:
 - (i). a Central or State Government University can conduct courses through its own departments, its constituent colleges and/or through its affiliated Colleges;
 - (ii). a University established or incorporated by or under a State act shall operate only within the territorial jurisdiction allotted to it under its Act and in no case beyond the territory of the state of its location;

(iii). no University, whether central, state, private or deemed, can offer its programmes through franchising arrangement with private coaching institutions even for the purpose of conducting courses through distance mode.

2.2. UGC vide its letter no. F.No UGC/DEB/PTU/PUN/2012 dated 6th August, 2014 has granted approval to PTU to offer distance education within the territorial jurisdiction of the State.

3. Directorate of Distance Education

3.1. PTU has set up a Directorate of Distance Education with adequate capacity in all the aspects of distance education. The Directorate would be responsible for coordination, superintendence and implementation of Distance Education Programs. The Directorate would in particular focus on the following key processes.

3.1.1. Study Centres

The University will set up its own Study Centres for conducting personal contact program in its constituent campuses namely Punjab Institute of Technologies and would also utilize the various Government Engineering Colleges and Technical Institutions. The University will also utilize the network of its affiliated colleges for the purposes of Study Centres. A careful demographic mapping would be carried out to ensure adequacy of such Centres.

3.1.2. Admissions

The admission process would be fully transparent and automated. The admissions would be held twice in the year in January and July. The admission portal would be strengthened with greater ease of use, secure online transaction, and robust architecture for scaling up. All fees will be paid online. The portal would provide necessary MIS and integration with various support agencies and partners.

3.1.3. Study Material

Self-Learning Material (SLM) is crucial to the success of distance education program. The Directorate of Distance Education has already been staffed with requisite professionals for preparing SLM and the arrangement would further be strengthened. The University would also work towards providing digital content for all its programs including video streaming.

3.1.4. Examination & Evaluation

Exams will be conducted by the University twice a year in April and November. The exams will be conducted on the similar pattern as prevalent in the regular mode of the University. The Examination Centres would be set up in the places, which are duly assessed, evaluated and meet stringent criteria to be set by the University so that there is no scope for any malpractices.

Complete examination process will be under the direct control and supervision of the University and the evaluation will be done by the evaluators appointed by the University. Students with more than 40% marks aggregate in external and internal assessment will be declared pass and detailed marks card will be made available online to the students.

3.1.5. Certification

After the successful completion of the course, the University will issue a transcript and finally award a degree. All the documents will be delivered directly at the address of the learner and he would have facility to track the same on the portal.

3.1.6. Placement

The University will facilitate its distance education learners with placement. A placement portal and dedicated placement team would work towards providing these services.

3.1.7. Support Processes

The University will work with its support agencies to provide the following support:

- (i). The University will establish a brand in the market place as a quality provider of an alternate mode of learning.
- (ii). The programs will be advertised through newspapers, FM Radio, local television, Internet, Mobile, Outdoor marketing, Road shows, exhibitions etc
- (iii). Counseling to the prospective candidates for distance education will be organized. Other than the trained counselors, the University will utilize technology to provide detailed and professional counseling. All information about the University, its courses, career prospects, program components, academics, examination system, FAQ etc will be made available in audio visual formats that can be accessed anytime from anywhere.
- (iv). Registration of students will be carried out after checking the eligibility documents and finally allotting a unique registration number.
- (v). Library with relevant books will be made available at the support centres. Students will also be provided access to digital library at the support centers where the labs of specific courses will also be made available where students can practice what they have learnt.
- (vi). Additional learning support at the door steps of the students through a network of Learning Support Centres and Regional Centres.

4. Affordability

Affordability of the distance education programs would be a key consideration to ensure that the benefits of education reach the poor and weaker sections of the society.

5. Quality Assurance in Distance Education

5.1. Maintaining quality standards in Distance Education is the key challenge. In fact, poor quality has led to erosion of credibility and recognition crisis of Distance Education degrees.

5.2. The thrust areas where quality benchmarks are required to be set and complied with are:

- (i). Planning of programs & curriculum design
- (ii). Development of courseware including multimedia content
- (iii). Infrastructural requirements (both general & program specific)
- (iv). Human resource requirements vis a vis faculty, administrative staff at HQ & Study centers
- (v). Student Support Services
- (vi). Pedagogy
- (vii). Incorporation of R&D for better educational products & services

5.3. **Quality Assurance Mechanism**

5.3.1. There will be a Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA) for ensuring the quality of programs offered through internal quality monitoring mechanism. CIQA will lay down quality benchmarks for both the PTU DEP HQ as well as its Study Centres/Support Centres and other partners to be followed in the respective domains.

5.3.2. The actual performance of different processes shall be systematically monitored against established quality benchmarks and gaps will be identified and reported in the form of continuous feedback.

- 5.3.3. CIQA will also be the surveillance unit of Directorate of Distance Education of the University to gauge and report gaps between quality norms for distance education and actual performance of all the stakeholders.
- 5.3.4. This will help keep check on all critical process parameters and will help aversion of gradual and silent regression of quality.
- 5.3.5. The University will post its QA mechanism on its website as part of self disclosure. Also the Annual Report of Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA) shall be put on the website which will instill greater public confidence.

About Carrier Advancement Scheme

Carrier Advancement Scheme is a scheme for carrier advancement of faculty in universities as notified by UGC's notification of 2000 and 2010. Under this scheme time bound promotion is ensured for faculty subject to fulfilment of certain academic parameters. The Promotion under the CAS is defined through clause 6.0.1 to 6.0.91. 6.1.0 to 6.4.11 of UGC notification no. F.3-1/2009.

Unit-II

CAS Guidelines

1. Assistant Professor (Stage-II)

An Assistant Professor (Stage 1/entry level) will be eligible for placement in Stage- 2 through a procedure of screening cum verification process if he/she has:

- a. Completed 4 years of continuous service after regular appointment and possesses a Ph.D degree in the concerned or an allied/relevant discipline or has completed 5 years and possesses an M.Phil./LLM/M.Tech/MD or equivalent relevant degree, or six years of service and does not possess an M.Phil or Ph.D degree.
- b. Participated in one Orientation Course and one Refresher/Research Methodology Course of 2/3 weeks duration, or engaged in other appropriate continuing education programmes of comparable quality as may be specified or approved by the UGC.
- c. Attained minimum API scores using PBAS scoring proforma developed by the University (see Chapter-IV).
- d. Has completed one year's service as a member of the PTU faculty and has been confirmed in her/his post. Promotion shall be due from the date of eligibility and financial benefits will be given from the date of appointment in the university.

2. Assistant Professor (Stage-III)

An Assistant Professor will be eligible for placement in Stage-3 through a procedure of screening cum verification process if he/she has

- a. Completed five years in Stage-2/senior scale.
- b. Participated in one course/programme of 2/3 weeks duration from amongst the categories of Refresher Courses, Methodology Workshops, Training Programmes, Teaching-Learning-Evaluation Technology Programmes, Soft Skills Development Programmes, and Faculty Development Programmes.
- c. Attained minimum API scores using PBAS scoring proforma developed by the University (see Chapter-IV).

- d. Has completed one year's service as a member of the PTU faculty and has been confirmed in her/his post. Promotion shall be due from the date of eligibility and financial benefits will be given from the date of appointment in the university.

3. Associate Professor (Stage 4)

An Assistant Professor will be eligible for promotion to the post of Associate Professor through selection by a duly constituted Selection Committee if he/she has:

- a. Completed three years of service in the Stage-3 of Assistant Professor;
or
- b. Completed 12 years of past service as Assistant Professor irrespective of length of service in each stage.
- c. Attained minimum API scores using PBAS scoring proforma developed by the University (see Chapter-IV)
- d. Participated in one course/programme of minimum one week duration from amongst the categories of Refresher Courses, Methodology Workshops, Training Programmes, Teaching-Learning-Evaluation Technology Programmes, Soft Skills Development Programmes, and Faculty Development Programmes.
- e. At least three publications of quality in the entire period of as Assistant Professor. (e) Completed one year's service as a member of the JNU faculty and has been confirmed; promotion will be due from the date of eligibility or date of appointment in the university whichever is later.

4. Professor (Stage 5)

An Associate Professor may be considered for promotion to the post of a Professor by a duly constituted Selection Committee if he/she has:

- (a) A minimum of five publications of quality since the teacher was placed in Stage-3.
 - (b) Completed at least one year's service in the university and has been confirmed to the post; promotion will be due from the date of eligibility or appointment in the university whichever is later.
-
- i. Completed three years as Associate Professor (Stage 4).
 - ii. A Ph. D degree in the concerned or an allied/relevant discipline.
 - iii. Attained minimum API scores using PBAS scoring proforma developed by the University (See Chapter-IV)

Note:

1. The composition of the Screening committee for promotion under the CAS shall be
 - a) Vice Chancellor to be chairperson of the Selection Committee
 - b) Dean, of the concerned Faculty
 - c) Head of Department
 - d) One Subject Expert nominated by the Vice Chancellor
2. The composition of the Selection Committees for promotion under the CAS shall be the same as that of direct recruitment i.e.
 - a) Vice Chancellor to be the Chairperson of the Selection Committee.
 - b) An academician who is the nominee of the Visitor/Chancellor, wherever applicable.
 - c) Three experts in the concerned subject/field nominated by the Vice Chancellor out of the panel of names approved by the relevant statutory body of the university concerned.
 - d) Dean of the faculty, wherever applicable.
 - e) Head/Chairperson of the Department/School.
 - f) An academician representing SC/ST/OBC/ Minority / Women / Differently-abled categories, if any of candidates representing these categories is the applicant, to be nominated by the Vice Chancellor, if any of the above members of the selection committee do not belong to that category.

At least four members, including two outside subject experts, shall constitute the quorum
3. The repeat process of promotion/interview for the faculty members not found fit for promotion under CAS in their first attempt may be considered again after a minimum period of one year from the date of interview in which the faculty member was not found fit. The date of eligibility for their promotion shall be one year after their earlier date of eligibility.
5. **Counting of Past Services for Direct Recruitment and Promotion under Career Advancement Scheme:**

Previous service, whether national or international, as Assistant Professor, Associate Professor or Professor, or equivalent, in a University, college, national laboratory, or any other scientific/professional organization, e.g. CSIR, ICAR, DRDO, UGC, ICSSR, ICHR, ICMR, DBT etc., should be counted for direct recruitment or promotion under CAS of a teacher in the various stages of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor or Professor, as the case may be provided that:

- (a) The essential qualifications for the post held were not lower than the qualifications prescribed by the UGC for the Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, or Professor as the case may be;
- (b) The post is/was in an equivalent grade/scale of pay or pre-revised scale of pay as the post of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor or Professor;
- (c) A candidate already in service has applied through proper channel;
- (d) The candidate possesses the minimum qualifications prescribed by the UGC/AICTE for appointment as Assistant Professor/Associate Professor or Professor, as the case may be;
- (e) The post was filled in accordance with the prescribed selection procedure as laid down by the UGC/ State Government/Central Government/Concerned Institutions, for such appointments.
- (f) The previous appointment was not as guest lecturer for any duration, or ad hoc or in a leave vacancy of less than one year's duration. Ad hoc or temporary service of more than one year's duration can be counted provided that:
- (i) The period of service was of more than one year duration;
 - (ii) The incumbent was appointed on the recommendation of a duly constituted Selection Committee.
- (g) No distinction should be made with reference to the nature of management of the institution where previous service was rendered (private/local body/ government) for counting past services under this clause.
- (h) Assistant Professors (Stage-1/entry level), who had worked as Junior Research Fellows/Research Assistants and had participated in teaching in the recognized Universities/academic and research institutions may be given the benefit of one-third of the period during which they were actually involved in teaching of courses assigned to them during their service as Junior Research Fellows/Research Assistant. The period of teaching supported by a certificate from the Centre Chairperson/Dean of the School, and Head of Department, etc., in case of persons from other universities/institutions, may be included for consideration of their cases for placement/ promotion under Career Advancement Scheme.
- i) In the case of Adhoc/contractual teachers appointed as per UGC/AICTE norms whose pay scales have been revised as per UGC revised guidelines, the teaching period after excluding the notional breaks shall be counted as qualifying service for placement in the Stage-2.

(j) Assistant Professors, who had been working as Research Associates, and were appointed as Research Associates through a duly constituted Selection Committee and performed academic duties corresponding to lecturers, may be given the benefit of past service for the purpose of promotion as Assistant Professor (Stage-2)

(k) Service as Research Associate/ Post Doctoral Fellow/ Research Fellow/Research Scientist in Universities/Research Organizations India/abroad may be counted for the purpose provided the teaching/research experience gained abroad prior to joining the University is equivalent in content and substance of the work expected in their present position in the University.

(l) While counting past regular service under CAS, the eligibility may be considered from actual date of eligibility notionally and the financial benefits under CAS promotion will be given only from the date of joining at University.

6. Relaxation for Implementing CAS in Punjab Technical University

Since decision to implement promotions under CAS as per UGC norms was taken on 14-10-2014 to be made effective prospectively. However, keeping in view the work profile of PTU faculty, following relaxation were approved:

- a) API-PABS Part-I and II which includes points based on teaching load of the faculty relaxed as per work assigned to faculty in PTU and still the establishment of teaching departments in university.
- b) Due to prospective implementation of the CAS promotion procedure relaxation may be given to faculty complete the mandatory conditions of attending orientation /refresher courses without affecting the date of eligibility for promotions.
- c) If faculty fails to obtain minimum API score in category -III due to lack of research facilities in the Campus lenient view of same may be taken by the Screening Committee / Selection committee.

Sub.: Scheme for compassionate appointments-2002, Grant of employment in the State Services on compassionate grounds-Policy regarding.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to address you on the subject noted above and to say that at present, the policy regarding grant of employment in the State Services, Class-III and IV on compassionate grounds (' is mainly contained in circular letter No. 11/27/94- - 2PPI/2364, dated 5.2.1996. This policy was framed on the basis of the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India delivered in the case of 'Umesh Kumar Nagpal State of Haryana and others (1994)4 S.C. cases (138). The Apex Court held that the object of compassionate apr pointments is to enable the penurious family of the deceased employee to tide over the sudden financial crisis and not to provide employment. It was further held that mere death of an employee does not entitle his family to compassionate appointment. The authority concerned must consider as to whether the family of the deceased employee is unable to meet the financial crisis resulting from the employee's death. The offering compassionate appointments as a matter of course irrespective of the financial condition of the family of the deceased and making compassionate appointments in posts above Class-III and IV, is legally impermissible. The compassionate appointments can not be granted after a lapse of reasonable period which must be specified in the rules. The consideration for such employment is not a vested right which can be exercised at any time in future. The object being to enable the family to get over the financial crisis which it faces, at the time of death of the sole bread-winner, the compassionate employment can not be claimed and offered, whatever the lapse of time and after the crisis is over.

It has been considered appropriate that there is need to review the whole policy on compassionate appointments by taking a cue from the policy of Government of India and to impose strict conditions so that compassionate appointments are available only to very deserving cases. Most of the vacancies that are available or accrue in direct quota posts in various departments are consumed by these compassionate appointments considerably reducing vacancies for carrying out recruitments from the open market. This has a direct reflection on the efficiency and working of the departments as it restricts the Government for making selections from a wider choice of candidates. Imposition of a cap on compassionate appointments will also protect the legitimate right of young qualified persons who are waiting for their turn for being

recruited in various departments of the Government for years.

2. The State Government has decided to review the policy, on compassionate grounds strictly, on the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of 'Umesh Kumar Nagpal' Versus State of Haryana', referred as above. The Government has reconsidered all the earlier instructions issued from time to time on compassionate appointments and has decided to review the policy to provide the benefit only to deserving candidates as per directions of the Apex Court referred in Para-1 above.

3. Henceforth, the objective of the Scheme is limited to grant of appointment on compassionate grounds to persons who fall in the categories mentioned below:-

(1) A dependent member of the family of a person (bread-winner) killed or 100% physically disabled in terrorist action or by security forces acting in-aid of civil power, in the State;

(2) A dependent member of the family of the deceased Govt. employee, who dies in harness.

(3) Disabled Ex-Servicemen (fit for Civil Service).

(4) A dependent member of the family of the Defence Services' Personnel;

(i) Killed in service, while performing duties, or

(ii) Who are severely disabled and totally unfit for re-employment.

NOTE-I 'Dependent Family Member' means:

(a) Spouse; or

(b) Son (including adopted son); or

(c) Un-married Daughter (including adopted Daughter); or

(d) Un-married Brother or Un-married Sister in the case of unmarried Govt. Servant. —

who was wholly dependent on the Govt. Servant/member of the Armed Forces at the time of death in harness.

NOTE-II 'Government Servant for the purpose of these instructions means a Govt. Servant - appointed on regular basis and not one working on daily wage or casual

apprentice or adhoc or contract or re-employment or 89 days basis.

NOTE-III 'Confirmed Work-Charged Staff' will also be covered by the terms 'Government Servant' mentioned in Note II above.

NOTE-IV 'Service' means a period prior to the date of superannuation. It does not include extension in 'service or re-employment after attaining the normal age of retirement in a civil post.

NOTE-V 'Re-employment' does not include employment of ex-servicemen before the normal age of retirement in a civil post.

4. AUTHORITY COMPETENT TO MAKE COMPASSIONATE APPOINTMENT

(a) Competent Authority for recruitment as per Standing Order of each Department, and Departmental Service Rules;

- (b) Head of the Department, in relation to the posts under his control and in the case of attached offices;
 and subordinate
 (c) Secretary of the Department concerned in special types of cases.

5. POSTS TO WHICH SUCH APPOINTMENTS CAN BE MADE
 Group 'C' or Group 'D' posts against direct recruitment quota available at the time of appointment in the Department of the deceased employee. If no such post is available, the case may be referred to the Redeployment Cell in Department of Personnel for sponsoring the name of the candidate for appointment in other Departments against the available direct quota posts.

6. ELIGIBILITY

(a) The family is indigent and deserves immediate assistance for relief from financial destitution. The authority concerned must consider as to whether the family of deceased employees is unable to meet the financial crisis resulting from employee's death.

(b) Applicant for compassionate appointment should be eligible and suitable for the post in all respects under the provisions of the relevant Recruitment Rules.

7. EXEMPTIONS

Compassionate appointments are exempted from observance of the following requirements:-

- (a) Recruitment procedure, i.e. without the agency of the Punjab State Subordinate Services Selection Board or the Employment Exchange.
 (b) Clearance from the Surplus Cell of the Department of Administrative Reforms.
 (c) The ban orders of filling up of posts issued by the State Government from time to time.

8. RELAXATIONS

(a) Upper age limit could be relaxed wherever found to be necessary; In case of reserved categories of SC/BC, Widows the age relaxation may be allowed as per policy instructions issued from time to time. The lower age limit should however, in no case be relaxed below 18 years of age in case of Group 'C' and below 16 years in case of Group 'D'. However, the Administrative Department may relax upper age limit by 5 years in deserving cases. NOTE Age eligibility shall be determined with reference to the date of application and not the date of appointment;

(b) No relaxation in educational qualification is permissible. However, for Group 'D' minimum 5th standard is necessary. For Group 'C' the appointing authority may temporarily relax the conditions for the passing of Punjabi Language for a period of six months. The person so appointed shall have to pass an examination of Punjabi Language equivalent to Matriculation standard or he/she has to qualify a test conducted by Language Wing of the Department of Education, Punjab within prescribed period. If he/she fails to qualify the test, he/she may be dealt with like other employees as per rules.

NOTE In the case of an attached/ subordinate office, the Secretary in the concerned

Administrative Department shall be the competent authority for this purpose.
(c) Where a widow is appointed on compassionate Group 'D' post, she will be exempted from the requirement of possessing the educational qualifications prescribed in the relevant rules provided the duties of the post can be satisfactorily performed by her without possessing such educational qualification.

9. DETERMINATION/AVAILABILITY OF VACANCIES

(a) Appointment on compassionate grounds should be made only on regular basis and that too only if regular vacancies meant for that purpose are available.

(b) Compassionate appointments can be made upto a maximum of 5% of vacancies falling under direct recruitment quota in any Group 'C' or 'D' post. The appointing authority may hold back upto 5% of vacancies in the aforesaid categories to be filled by direct recruitment through Subordinate Services Selection Board or otherwise so as to fill such vacancies by appointment on compassionate grounds. A person selected for appointment on compassionate grounds should be adjusted in the recruitment roster against the appropriate category viz. SC/ST/ OBC/General depending upon the category to which he belongs. For example, if he belongs to SC category he will be adjusted against the SC reservation point, if he is ST/ OBC He will be adjusted against ST/OBC/ point and if he belong to General Category , he will be adjusted against the vacancy point meant for General Category.

(c) The ceiling of 5% of direct recruitment vacancies for making compassionate appointment should not be exceeded by utilising any other vacancy e.g. sports quota vacancy.

(d) Employment under the scheme is not confined to the Department/office in which deceased Government servant had been working. Such an appointment can be given anywhere under the Government of Punjab depending upon the availability of a suitable vacancy meant for the purpose of compassionate appointment.

(e) If sufficient vacancies are not available in any particular office to accommodate the person in the waiting list for compassionate appointment, it is open to the Administrative Department/office (through Administrative Department) to take up the matter with the Re-deployment Cell in the Department of Personnel to adjust the candidate in other Department/offices of the Government of Punjab.

10. WIDOW APPOINTED ON COMPASSIONATE GROUNDS GETTING REMARRIED

A widow appointed on compassionate grounds will be allowed to continue in service even after re-marriage.

11. WHERE THERE IS AN EARNING MEMBER

(a) In deserving cases even where there is already an earning member may be considered for compassionate appointment with prior approval of the Secretary of the Department concerned, who before approving such appointment will consult the Department of Personnel and satisfy himself that grant of compassionate appointment is justified having regard to number of dependents, assets and liabilities left by the Government servant income of the earning member as also his liabilities including the fact that the earning member is residing with the family of the Government servant and whether he should not be a source of support to other members of the family.

(b) In case where any member of the family of the deceased servant is already in employment and is not supporting the other members of the family of the Government servant, extreme caution has to be observed in "ascertaining the economic distress of the members of the family of the Government servant so that the facility of appointment on compassionate ground is not circumvented and misused by putting forward, the ground that the member of the family already employed is not supporting the family.

12. MISSING GOVERNMENT SERVANT

Cases of missing Government servants are also covered under the scheme for compassionate appointment subject to the following conditions:-

(a) A request to grant the benefit of compassionate appointment can be considered only after a lapse of at least 7-years from the date from which the Government servant has been, missing provided that;

(i) an FIR to this effect has been lodged with the Police;
(ii) the missing person is not traceable; and (iii) the competent authority feels that the case is genuine.

(b) This benefit will not be applicable to the case of a Government servant:-

(i) who had less than 7 years to retire the date from which he has been missing; or
(ii) who is suspected to have committed fraud or suspected to have joined any terrorist organisation or suspected to have gone abroad.

Compassionate appointment in the case of a missing Government servant also would not be a matter of right as in the case of others and it will be subject to fulfillment of all the conditions, including the availability of vacancy laid down for such appointment under the scheme;

While considering such a request, the results of the Police investigation should also be taken into account; and A decision on any such request for compassionate appointment should be taken only at the level of the Secretary of the Department concerned in consultation with Department of Personnel.

13. PROCEDURE

The performa as in Annexure-I may be used by Departments/offices for ascertaining , necessary information and processing the cases of compassionate appointment, alongwith the documents given in Annexure-II, and submitted to the Appointing Authority within a period of 6 months from the date of death or disability of a person/employee as the case may be. Appointment must be made within period of one year within the Department and 2 years in other departments through Redeployment Cell. Genuine belated requests with cogent reasons for compassionate appointment can be entertained only within a period of 5 year from the date of death or disability of the employee/person with the special approval of the Personnel Department and Finance Department. Department/office should depute any senior official to meet the members pf the family of the Government servant in question immediately after his death to advise and assist them in getting appointment on compassionate grounds. The applicant should be called in person at the very first stage and advised in person about the requirements and formalities to be completed by him, within a period of 6 months. All applications for appointment on comopassionate grounds should be considered in

the light of these instructions And appointment be made by the Appointing Authority in all Departments. To solve the complicated cases a Committee of 3 officers - one Chairman and 2 Members in the rank of Deputy Secretary/ Director be constituted in each Department. The Committee may meet during the 2nd week of every month to consider cases received during the previous month. The applicant may also be granted personal hearing by the Committee, if necessary, for better appreciation of the facts of the case. Recommendations of the Committee should be placed before the competent authority for a decision. If the competent authority disagrees with the Committee's recommendations, the case may be referred to the next higher authority for a decision. In case of non-availability of posts in the Department, the matter may be taken up with the Re-deployment Cell in Personnel Department which will adjudge the eligibility and suitability of the candidates in the meeting of the Committee already constituted for the purpose and recommend the names of the candidates to different departments for appointment.

14. UNDERTAKING

A person appointed on compassionate grounds under the Scheme should give an undertaking in writing (as in Annexures) that he/she will maintain properly the other family members who were dependent on the Government servant/members of the Armed Forces in question and in case it is proved subsequently (at any time) that the family members are being neglected or are not being maintained properly by him/her, appointment may be terminated forthwith.

15. REQUEST FOR CHANGE IN POST/ PERSON

When a person has been appointed on compassionate grounds to a particular post, the set of circumstances, which led to such appointment, should be deemed to have ceased to exist. Therefore:- (a) he/she should strive in his/her career like his/her colleagues for future advancement and any request for appointment to any higher post on considerations of compassion should invariably be rejected. (b) an appointment made on compassionate grounds can not be transferred to any other person and any request for the same on consideration of compassion should invariably be rejected.

16. SENIORITY

(a) The interse seniority of persons appointed on compassionate grounds may be fixed with reference to their date of appointment. Their interpolation with the direct recruits/promotees may also be made with reference to their dates of appointment without disturbing the interse seniority of direct recruits/promotees. (b) Date of joining by a person appointed on compassionate grounds shall be treated, as the date of his/her regular appointment.

17. GENERAL

(a) Appointments made on grounds of compassion should be done in such a way that persons appointed to the post do have, the essential educational and technical qualifications and experience required for the post consistent with the requirement of maintenance of efficiency of administration.

(b) It is not the intention to restrict employment of a family member of the deceased Group 'D' Government servant to a Group 'D' post only. As such, a family member of such Group 'D' Government servant can be appointed to a Group 'C' post for which he/she is educationally qualified, provided a vacancy in Group 'C' post exists for this purpose.

(c) Compassionate appointment should not be denied or delayed merely on the ground that there is reorganisation in the Department/office. It should be made available to the person concerned if there is a vacancy meant for compassionate appointment and he or she is found eligible under the Scheme.

(d) Requests for compassionate appointment consequent on death of Group 'D' staff may be considered with greater sympathy by applying relaxed standards depending on the facts and circumstances of the case. (c) Compassionate appointment will have precedence over absorption of surplus employees and regularisation of daily wage/casual workers with/without temporary Status.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Punjab in the Sixty-fifth Year of the Republic of India, as follows:-

- (1) This Act may be called the Punjab Technical University (Amendment) Act, 2014. Short title and commencement.
- (2) It shall come into force at once.

2. In the Punjab Technical University Act, 1996 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), in the long title, for the words "THE PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY", the words "THE I.K. GUJRAL PUNJAB TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY" shall be substituted.
 3. In the principal Act, in section 1, in sub-section (1), for the words "the Punjab Technical University", the words "the I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University" shall be substituted.
 4. In the principal Act, in section 2, in clause (f), for the words "the Punjab Technical University", the words "the I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University" shall be substituted.
 5. In the principal Act, in section 3, in sub-section (1), for the words "the Punjab Technical University", the words "the I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University" shall be substituted.
 6. In the principal Act, in section 14, in sub-section (5) in clause (1), for the words "the Punjab Technical University", the words "the I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University" shall be substituted.

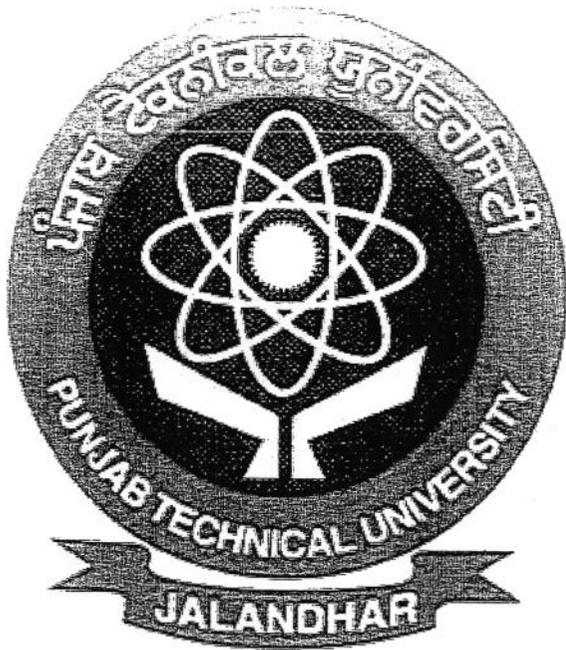

- (a) Rename the Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar as I.K. Gujral Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar.

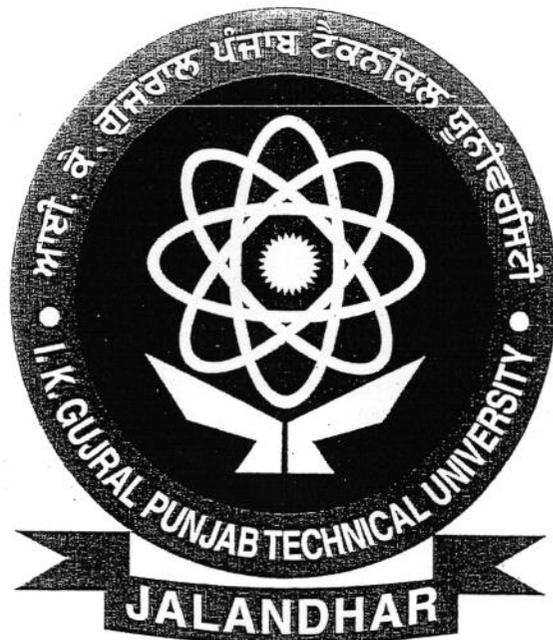

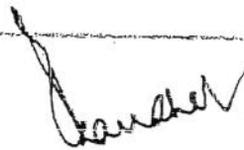

Before taking up the regular agenda, a presentation on achievements, challenges and future plans of each department of the University was scheduled. Due to paucity of time presentation by Registrar office and Department of Academic could only be made. During the course of presentation, various issues were deliberated and discussed as under:

1. Meeting of the Board shall be held every month for next 12 months and progress report in respect of important activities of each department shall be presented to the Board in the meeting to ensure oversight and necessary guidance from the Board, wherever required.
2. While reviewing the matters pertaining to human resources, it was decided to expedite the HR audit and review report being prepared by Mahatma Gandhi State Institute of Public Administration, Punjab and complete it within 30 days and a presentation shall be arranged before the Board.
3. While reviewing the matters pertaining to sports cell, it was decided to expedite the sports calendar for the session 2015-16 and placed before the Board in its next meeting. Various other suggestions regarding setting up of Centres of Excellence, Sports Hostel were discussed and it was decided that suitable proposal may accordingly be framed and placed before the Board.
4. The Board appreciated the efforts of the University in setting up of International Resource Centre-Universal Human Values and various initiatives taken by it. It was further decided that efforts should be made to sensitize all the faculty of the affiliated colleges in universal human values through camps and also providing material online.
5. The Board also discussed about the need to involve students in community and social work to sensitize and inculcate these values in students. It was suggest to explore the possibility of registering a society by every affiliated college, which can act as an NGO, with the involvement of all the students and faculty. This NGO can adopt one village of its choice and contribute towards cleanliness, hygiene, education, poverty and gender challenges etc. Dean (RIC) will coordinate and present a plan in the next meeting.
6. The Board desired that the University must ensure strict policies on all ethical issues whether dealing with unfair means cases or cases of plagiarism etc.
7. The Board accorded top priority to the finalization and official notification of the regulations, which is essential for fair and transparent functioning of the university. The following committee was constituted to finalize the draft regulations applicable to both the Universities (i.e. IKGPTU and MRSSTU) :
 - (i) Prof. Satish Verma, RBI Chair Professor, CRRID, Chandigarh (former Professor and Head Punjab School of Economics, GNDU).
 - (ii) Dr. Paramjeet Singh, Former Director, Distance Education, GNDU, Amritsar.

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- (iii) Dr. Pritpal Singh, Registrar, Shri Guru Granth Sahib World University, Fatehgarh Sahib.
- (iv) Prof. B. S. Ghuman, Department of Political Science, Punjabi University, Patiala.
- (v) Dr. V. K. Bansal, Prof. & Head, Law University, Patiala.

Honorarium of 60,000/- per person will be paid to each member and expenditure for the same will be born jointly by IKGPTU & MRSSTU. It was also decided to provide them necessary secretariat assistance as may be required by them. The Committee shall be asked to submit report within two months failing which suitable deductions would be made from their remuneration. The payment would be made on submission of the report.

8. The Board discussed the Governance issues at length and it was decided that the University shall adopt UGC guidelines in totality. In case UGC does not have guidelines on any subject, then University shall follow other relevant regulatory bodies such as AICTE or MCI. In cases not covered by Regulatory bodies and all other matters, the University shall follow the best practices from other more established Universities rather than reinventing the same. The draft regulations shall take this into account. Any departure in future or in the past, shall be placed before the Board with full justification for its approval and ratification.
9. The Board desired that draft media policy should be prepared keeping in view similar policies of other established Universities and placed before the Board.
10. While reviewing the usage of library facilities and e-resources, it was decided that a detailed presentation would be made by the Deputy Librarian in the next meeting, regarding using the available resources optimally.
11. The Board desired that University shall streamline its online presence and various websites and portals developed by different departments of the University shall be consolidated to give its stakeholders a better user experience and ensure its effectiveness. It was further decided that in order to ensure complete transparency in the functioning of the University, all the agendas, proceedings of BOG, Academic Council and all other committees, various policies and regulations currently being followed by the University and relevant information in respect of Affiliated Colleges shall be uploaded on the website within 15 days. Mr. Sunil Kumar, Deputy Registrar, Computer Cell will be responsible for the same.
12. It was also decided that a page will be created on the website to receive the grievances of students, affiliated colleges, faculty and public with facility of uploading of relevant documents. Mr. Sunil Kumar, Deputy Registrar, Computer Cell of the university will be responsible to develop the page within 15 days. All complaints/reports so received should be electronically forwarded to the Chairman BOG, Vice Chancellor and Registrar.

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Thereafter regular agenda was taken up:

Item No. 55.1 To confirm the proceedings of 53rd and 54th meetings of the Board of Governors, IK Gujral Punjab Technical University

The Board confirmed the proceedings of 53rd and 55th meetings except that the decision was reviewed regarding legal expenses vide agenda item 53.13 should be read as follows:

"All legal expenses in discharge of prescribed duty for PTU officials, members of BOGs shall be borne by the University in furtherance of the interest of the University."
