

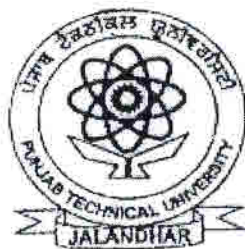

To Confirm the minutes of the 23rd meeting of the Academic Council held at Baba Banda Singh Bahadur Engineering Council, Fatehgarh Sahib.

Minutes of the 23rd meeting of Academic Council held on 22.11.2005 at Baba Banda Singh Bahadur Engineering Council, Fatehgarh Sahib is placed at **Appendix - I.**

Only one observation, that of Indo Global College of Engineering had been received stating that the current even semester would be started after 16th January, 2006. However, the institute had been apprised that the Academic Calendar would commence on 2nd January, local delay by the individual college should be compensated by making use of Saturdays so that number of contact days should not fall short of 90.

Item No. 24.3.

To brief on decision taken in the 21st meeting of BOG.

The 21st meeting of the BOG was held on 20th January, 2006. The following decisions were taken

1. Regulations for B. Tech. & other Courses

The Board considered the report of Dr. R.S. Khandpur committee and decided as under :

The review of academic regulations 2004 must be completed at the earliest. After considering such regulations of other universities and the problems faced by them. Till such time as this exercise is completed, the present Academic Regulations 2004 shall remain in vogue except maximum duration for completing a degree which will be as below:

- "(a) The maximum duration for clearing all subjects of a particular course shall be twice the duration of the respective regular course. This would apply to all the regular courses. All Regulations issued so far are hereby modified to make the above applicable. Whereas this would apply directly to the current students, the pass out students who have not been able to clear their course within the maximum duration stipulated under the unamended regulations may now take additional chance(s) / examination(s) to clear their

backlog. Such examination(s) would, however, be conducted only when the University examination(s) in the respective subject(s) is held in the normal course between January 01, 2006 to December 31, 2007.

- (b) No additional chance to clear the backlog will be given to any pass out student(s) after December 31 2007"

2. Approval of the BOG on Academic Council recommendations (Maximum nos of courses that can be taken in any particular semester)

The Board approved the recommendation of the Academic Council and decided as under :

"A student detained in a course for shortage of attendance can appear for examination only after making up the attendance requirement (whenever the course is offered as regular course). However the student shall be allowed to appear in a maximum of 10 theory subjects in the University Examination at the end of the semester including the regular subject of the semester.

The clarification in this regard has been issued vide Letter No. PTU/DA/300 dated 14.03.2006 (Placed at **Appendix- III**)

3. Supernumerary admissions of Foreign Nationals / PIOs in AICTE / Non-AICTE courses.

Board approved supernumerary quota for foreign nationals / PIOs as per AICTE norms for AICTE and Non-AICTE courses in Institutions affiliated to PTU.

Item No. 24.4

To consider BBA / BCA courses running in AICTE approved colleges.

Recently AICTE has issued a public notice and circular wherein institute / colleges have been advised not to run non-AICTE approved courses alongwith AICTE approved courses in same colleges. Extract of the guidelines is produced as under :

"That the institution shall not conduct any course(s) in the field of technical education in the same premises / campus and / or in the name of the institution without prior permission / approval of AICTE. In case any violation is reported to the Council, appropriate penal action including withdrawal of approval shall be initiated against the institution."

The matter is placed before the council for consideration.

Item No. 24.5**To brief on conduct of CET-2006.**

The University has requested the Government to issue the notification for CET-2006 at the earliest possible. The tentative schedule of CET-2006 is given below

Item No. 24.6**To brief about the eligibility of B. Arch. Course.**

The Council of Architecture vide its gazette notification No. 11 dated 7th January, 2006 has issued guidelines about the eligibility conditions for admission to B. Arch. course. Extract of the notification is reproduced as under:

"No candidate with less than 50% marks in aggregate shall be admitted to the architecture course unless he / she has passed an examination at the end of new 10+2 scheme of senior school certificate examination or equivalent with mathematics as a subject of examination at the 10+2 level."

The council may take a note.

Item No. 24.7.**To brief about the revised Board of Studies of ECE, EIE and Training & Placement.**

As a follow up action of the 23rd meeting of the Academic Council held on 22.11.2005, the Board of Studies for Electronics & Communication Engg. And Electronics and Instrumentation Engineering and Training & Placement has been separated. Further in the Board of Studies of CS & IT services of Sh. N.S. Kalsi, IAS, Secretary, IT Deptt. has been requested to get a more active participation of IT professionals and industries.

The composition of the boards is placed at **Appendix - IV.**

Item No. 24.8**To consider M. Pharma Fee Structure.**

Board of Studies of Pharmacy in its meeting held on 18th February, 2006 has recommended the fee of Rs. 1.25 lakhs (including security of Rs. 5000/-) per annum for regular course and Rs. 85,000 per annum for

the courses conducted at the Regional Centres. Break-up of the proposed fee structure is placed at **Appendix - V**

The matter is placed before the Academic Council for recommending to BOG.

Item No. 24.9

To consider eligibility of M. Tech. (IT).

Board of Studies (Computer Science & IT) in its meeting held on 14th December, 2005 has recommended for change in the eligibility for admission to M. Tech. (IT) courses, which is as follows

Previous	Changed
B. Tech. In Computer Science & Engineering/ Information Technology / Electronics & Communication / Instrumentation and Control / Electronics & Instrumentation / Electrical and Electronics AMIE with GATE score. Candidates having valid GATE score will be preferred.	B. Tech. In Computer Science & Engineering/ Information Technology / Electronics & Communication / Instrumentation and Control / Electronics & Instrumentation / Electrical and Electronics OR Master's in Computer Application OR M.Sc. (Information Technology / Computer Science / Mathematics / Statistics) on the basis of Entrance Examination to be conducted by the University. Candidates having valid GATE score will be preferred.

The matter is placed before the council for consideration and also for review to allow AMIE for M. Tech. courses.

Item No. 24.10

To consider revision of Ph.D. Regulations.

Ph.D regulations were framed in the year 1998, which comprise of a synopsis, pre-synopsis presentation & the final presentation. The regulations were amended by enhancing the synopsis submission time from 6 months to 1 year. Further the clause of compulsory residency of minimum years was withdrawn vide Academic Council agenda item No. 16.4. **(Placed at Appendix VI)** These regulations require a revision keeping in view the changed scenario.

It is proposed to constitute a committee to review the Ph.D. Regulations.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

Item No. 24.11

To consider introduction of new courses

Recently, proposals have been received from the institutions to introduce new courses which have been the potential of generating employment especially in the service industry.

The proposed courses are as follows

1. M.Sc. (Bio-informatics) – 2 years
2. M.Sc. (MLT) – 2 years
3. B.Sc. (Bio-technology) - 3 years
4. B.Sc. (Hotel Management & Catering Technology) – 3 years
5. B.Sc. (Bio-informatics) – 3 years
6. B.Sc. (Genetics) – 3 years
7. B.Sc. (Industrial Microbiology) – 3 years
8. B.Sc. (Bio-information (Gene technologies)) – 3 years
9. B.Sc. (Hospitality) – 3 years

The Diploma courses have not been included.

The matter is placed before the council for consideration.

Item No. 24.12

To consider levy of Migration Fee.

The University has been receiving a number of applications from the students for inter-University and intra-University migration. Presently, no fee is being charged for such cases. It is proposed that migration fee of Rs. 500/- for Intra-University and Rs. 2000/- for inter-University migration be charged.

The matter is placed before the council for consideration.

Item No. 24.13

To reconstitute UMC committee.

- (a) The tenure of the present UMC committee is expiring on 30.06.2006. It is proposed to reconstitute a committee.
- (b) Presently the committee members are given an honorarium of Rs. 10,000/- per annum per members and Rs. 500/- per member per session.

It may be recalled that Academic Council in its meeting under item No. 10.13 has approved the following composition of the UMC committee:

1. One retired Judge.
2. One retired Educationist
3. One retired Administrative

It is proposed that to seek services of the reputed persons the honorarium may be revised as under :

Rs. 20,000/- per annum and
Rs. 1000/- per session.

The matter is placed before the council for consideration.

Item No. 24.14

To brief on NSS activities.

During the academic session 20005 – 06, the NSS activities were organized in various colleges / institutions for which a grant of Rs. 4 lakhs was received and the same has been disbursed to the participating colleges.

To further encourage such activities, it is proposed to organize a combined camp at Harike Pattan. Rs. 3.00 Lakhs has been budget for this.

The members may encourage students of their college to boost up students membership of NSS.

The council may take note.

Item No. 24.15

To brief about the Sports activities and to deliberate on organizing Virasat Mela

Annual Sports meet was organized at Baba Banda Singh Bahadur Engineering College, Fatehgarh Sahib from 10th to 12th March, 2006 which was inaugurated by Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor and the Olympian, Dr. Ajmer Singh, Brig. Labh Singh, Brig. G.P. Singh, Mr. Tara Singh, Mr. Inder Singh (Arjuna Awardees) were the Guests of Honour. The details of the sports results are placed at **Appendix - VII**

It is now proposed to organize a Virasat Mela at Swami Vivekanand College of Engineering, Banur.

The council may take a note.

Item No. 24.16

To consider holding of workshop on Personality development programme and organizing Job Melas.

During summer vacations centralized workshop on Personality Development Programme are proposed to be organized at some of the nodal centres for which colleges may volunteer to render their services. Likewise, the proposals are also invited for organizing Job Melas in which industries be invited to participate.

The matter is placed before the council for consideration.

Item No. 24.17

To consider proposal for award of dual degree.

Recently, some of the foreign Universities / colleges have come with the proposal to have a MoU with this University for undertaking dual degree programmes. There is a need to formulate a policy and other guidelines while considering such proposals. These guidelines would be within the frame work of the guidelines issued by the UGC / AICTE / MHRD. The AICTE guidelines for the same are placed at **Appendix – VIII**.

The matter is placed before the council for consideration.

Item No. 24.18

To consider provision of a writer in the University examinations.

Quite often there arises a need for a writer when a students, who is otherwise eligible, may be impaired temporarily because of an injury / malady and may require service of a writer. Currently, the University regulations are silent on the issue of providing an amanuensis. The council may consider the following:

- (a) The Vice-Chancellor may appoint an amanuensis in the case of temporary impairment of ability to write by a candidate.
- (b) The decision at (a) shall be on case to case basis.
- (c) An application by parent / guardian of the students encoding a certificate by a medical specialist in the field and not below the rank of chief medical officer of the district must be forwarded to the University through the principal of the college
- (d) It shall be the responsibility of the controller of examination of the center, where the exam is to be conducted, to arrange for a writer.
- (e) The amanuensis detailed shall not have studied beyond (10+2) level, for a first year student the education level of the writer shall be of matric level only.
- (f) The superintendent of the centre shall, on written order of the controller of the examination of the University, passed through the COE of the centre, make a suitable arrangement for a suitable room for conduct of the examination.
- (g) The following fee and payments are authorized.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE MEETING OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL HELD ON 22ND NOVEMBER, 2005 AT 1130 HOURS IN BABA BANDA SINGH BAHADUR COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING, FATEHGARH SAHIB.

The Twenty Third meeting of the Academic Council was held on 22nd November, 2005 at 1130 hours in Baba Banda Singh Bahadur College of Engineering, Fatehgarh Sahib under the chairmanship of Dr S.K Salwan Vice-Chancellor, Punjab Technical University.

Members as per the list given at Appendix – A attended the meeting.

The chairman in his welcome address mentioned that the University had been able to perform its basic functions satisfactorily. This year there was a record admission of 17477 in various courses under the regular education. The credit of building reputation of the University goes to the members of the Council and all others associated with the team. The result of regular, reappear and re-evaluation examinations conducted in May / June 2005 had been declared as per schedule. This he said was only possible with the cooperation and support of the staff of the evaluation centres.

He further informed that when the 22nd Academic Council was being held, the students agitation was also going on & it got pacified after the decision of the BOG to accept recommendations of the Academic Council in permitting the students to execute another affidavit giving fresh option, either for adopting regulations 2001, or Academic Regulations – 2004.

He cautioned the members that a large number of the students of 2004 batch had not been able to clear 50% of their theory subjects of the first year by May / June 2005. These students had opted for Academic Regulations 2001, hence shall be required to clear all their subjects of first semester for going to 5th semester. Similarly it was necessary to clear their second semester in to-to to be able to register for the sixth semester. This he said, may result in a large number of students not being able to register for 5th semester in August, 2005 and for 6th semester in January, 2007. The members, therefore, must ensure that the students are briefed in advance on this and motivated to make concerted efforts in clearing their backlog well in time.

Further the members also must make it clear to the students of 2005 batch that only Academic Regulations 2004 were applicable to them. It is the responsibility of the Principal and staff of the colleges that their students strive to clear their subjects well in time. For this if required, the weak

students must undertake extra classes. An analysis of the past results had shown that students who had earned more than 50% marks at their 10+2 level were able to clear their 1st year subjects without much problem. However, the same was not true in respect of the students who had earned less than 50% at 10+2 level. In this case the failure rate was very high and it was primarily this group that needed to be given extra classes and guidance.

The Chairman mentioned that it was necessary to arrive at a solution which was in accordance with the quality of expected standards. He apprised the members that the education imparted in their college must not only be as per the curriculum and of quality but also enable the students to make them competitive to get placement. Each member must, therefore, look at the placement record of his / her institute. The Hon'ble Chairman said that he was happy to inform the Council that with building of reputation of the University as many as 17 foreign Universities of international repute had recognized the degrees awarded by Punjab Technical University. This recognition came only after they had fully satisfied themselves about the curriculum as well as the evaluation process. To further enhance the image of the University, it should be our endeavour to continue to strive improving the existing system.

In continuation to the PTU notification no. PTU/REG/924 dated 22.2.06, the following clarifications are offered in specific reference to clause (b):

Amendment to attendance regulations of the Academic Regulations-2004 clauses 3.2 (iv) and 6.6

The amendment to the above clauses may be read as under:

- (i) A student who is detained due to shortage of attendance shall have to repeat the subject(s) only when the respective subject (s) is offered as a regular course.
- (ii) He/she shall be permitted to appear in the University examination only after having fulfilled the attendance requirement of the said subject (s).
- (iii) The sum of the subjects which a student offers as regular subjects of the semester and the subjects which he/she repeats due to shortage of attendance in the semester shall not exceed to maximum of 10 subjects.
- (iv) However the limitation of 10 number of subjects does not include those subjects where a student had completed attendance requirement and appeared in University examination but failed to clear the subject (s) (Re-appear, RP).

For example, A student who has (m) regular subjects in the semester, opting for (n) repeat subjects due to shortage of attendance in the semester and if he/she has (o) number of reappear subjects, then he/she can appear in m+n+o number of subjects in the University examination subject to the condition that $m+n \leq 10$

Further clarifications in this regard if any, may please be brought to the Academic Council meeting scheduled to be held on 17th March 2006.

ALL INDIA COUNCIL FOR TECHNICAL EDUCATION

REGULATIONS FOR ENTRY AND OPERATION OFFOREIGN UNIVERSITIES/INSTITUTIONS IMPARTING TECHNICAL EDUCATION IN INDIANew Delhi, the 3rd April, 2003

No. F. 37-3/Legal (vi)/2003:- In exercise of the powers conferred under Clause (b), Clause (d), Clause (g) and Clause (n), (o), (p) of Section 10, read with Section 23 of the AICTE Act, 1987 (52 of 1987), the Council hereby makes these regulations with following broad objectives for regulating entry and operation of Foreign Universities / institutions imparting technical education in India.

Objectives:

- a. To facilitate collaboration and partnerships between Indian and foreign universities / institutions in the field of technical education, research and training.
- b. To systematize the operation of Foreign Universities/Institutions already providing training and other educational services including that of coaching of students, in India leading to award of *degree and diploma* in technical education, either on their own or in collaboration with an Indian educational institution or with a private educational service provider, under any mode of delivery system such as conventional/ formal, non-formal and distance mode.
- c. To safeguard the interest of student's community in India and ensure uniform maintenance of Norms and Standards of AICTE;
- d. To enforce accountability for all such educational activities by foreign universities / institutions in India;
- e. To safeguard against entry of non-accredited universities / institutions in the country of origin to impart technical education in India.
- f. To safeguard the nation's interest and take punitive measures, wherever necessary, against the erring institutions, on case-to-case basis.

Short title and Commencement :

1. These regulations may be called the AICTE Regulations for Entry and Operation of Foreign Universities in India *imparting technical education*, 2003.
2. These regulations shall come in force on the date of their publication in the official gazette.

Applicability :

These regulations shall cover and apply to:

1. Foreign universities / institutions interested in imparting technical education in India leading to award of diplomas and degrees including post graduate and doctoral programmes.
2. Indian university / institution and/ or private educational service provider interested in imparting technical education leading to the award of degrees / diplomas of a foreign university through collaborative arrangements.
3. The existing collaborative agreements/ arrangements with Foreign Universities/Institutions offering technical education in India.
4. Any other educational activity carried out in India, in any manner, by the foreign universities/ institutions, as may be decided by the Council to bring such activities under these Regulations.

On commencement of these Regulations no foreign university/ institutions shall establish /operate its educational activity in India leading to award of diplomas/ degrees including post graduate and doctoral without the expressed permission /approval of the Council.

Definitions :

Unless the context otherwise requires :

- a. AICTE means the All India Council for Technical Education established under section 3 of the AICTE Act (52 of 1987) by the parliament for co-ordinated development of technical education in the country.
- b. NBA means the National Board of Accreditation, authorized body under AICTE Act to accredit programmes of technical education imparted by universities / institutions in India and recommend recognition/de-recognition of institution or the programme.
- c. All other words and expressions used herein and not defined above but defined in the AICTE Act shall have the meaning as assigned to it in AICTE Act (52 of 1987).

Procedure for Registration :

1. Any application to AICTE by a Foreign University / Institution seeking to operate in India either directly or through collaborative arrangement with an Indian University / Institution or a private educational service provider must be accompanied by a No-objection certificate issued by the concerned Embassy in India. The Missions of the concerned countries shall be required to certify genuineness of the educational institutions of their respective countries willing to offer study programmes in India.
2. The concerned Foreign University / Institution shall submit a Detailed Project Report (DPR) to AICTE alongwith application in a prescribed form, giving details regarding infrastructure facilities, facilities available for instruction, *faculty*, prescribed fee, courses, curricula, requisite funds for operation for a minimum period of three years and other terms and conditions of collaboration, if any, alongwith relevant details.
3. AICTE shall after receiving the application alongwith DPR, acknowledge the receipt of the application. The proposal shall then be processed internally and any deficiency shall be communicated and additional documents, if any required, shall be asked for.
4. Once the AICTE is convinced that the proposal is complete in all respects, a standing committee nominated by the Council shall consider the proposal and invite presentation, if warranted.
5. On the recommendations of the Standing Committee, the Chairman, AICTE shall nominate an Expert Committee to visit the institution and assess the compliance of minimum Norms and Standards in respect of infrastructural and instructional facilities to start programmes of technical education and training.
6. The Council shall consider the recommendations of the Standing Committee and the Expert Committee in regard to the quality of education, overall merit of the proposal, credibility of the programme provider of the foreign country vis-à-vis the institution intending to start the programmes in India and decide conclusively on the application regarding grant of approval or otherwise for registration.

7. AICTE shall issue a certificate of registration containing therein the intake fixed for each programme to the concerned educational institution / university declaring its eligibility to perform the prescribed functions and the names of such universities / institutions shall automatically stand included in the list of registered / approved university / institution by the AICTE in their relevant list.
8. The registration so granted shall be valid for a specified period during which AICTE may review the progress made and periodically inform the concerned agencies about the results of such a review. After expiry of the said period, the AICTE may extend the registration or withdraw the registration or impose such other conditions for extension, as it may consider appropriate.
9. *During the period of operation the institution shall be treated on par with other technical institutions in India and shall be governed by all the Rules, Regulations, Norms and Guidelines of AICTE issued from time to time.*

Conditions for Registration :

1. Proposal from the foreign universities/ institutions shall be considered under these Regulations provided that they themselves establish operation in India or through collaborative arrangements with either an Indian institution created through Society/ Trust Act or the relevant Act in India or with a private educational service provider registered as such in India. No franchisee system shall be allowed under these Regulations.
2. *Accreditation by the authorized agency in parent country with higher grades where grading is available, shall be the pre-requisite condition for any Foreign University / Institution to start its operation for imparting technical education in India.*
3. *An Indian technical Institution interested in collaborating in the field of technical education, research or training with a Foreign University / Institution must be an affiliated institution of university in India or a deemed university having adequate infrastructure for imparting technical educational programmes. It shall be desirable for such Indian institution to have acquired accreditation of its programmes by NBA of AICTE or shall be in a position to do so at the earliest possible. However, this clause of accreditation shall not be applicable for a De-novo institution or new project proposals.*
4. The foreign university/ institution shall furnish an undertaking declaring therein *that the degrees/ diplomas awarded to the students in India shall be recognized in*

the parent country and shall be treated equivalent to the corresponding degrees/ diplomas awarded by the university/ institution at home.

5. *The educational programmes to be conducted in India by foreign universities / institutions leading to award of degrees, diplomas, shall have the same nomenclature as it exists in their parent country. There shall not be any distinction in the academic curriculum, mode of delivery, pattern of examination etc. and such degrees and diplomas must be recognized in their parent country.*
6. *All such foreign university / institution which is registered in India for imparting technical education leading to award of degrees and diplomas shall have recognition at par with equivalent Indian degrees, subject to the fulfillment of criteria laid down at Clause 7 below.*
7. *The proposal from foreign university seeking equivalence of technical courses/ programmes at degree, diploma or post graduate level for mutual recognition of qualifications for the purpose of imparting such courses in India under collaborative arrangements or otherwise shall be considered by AICTE through its Standing Committee on Equivalence or such other mechanism as may be decided. In case such equivalence has already been established by AIU or any recognized Government body, the same may be accepted by AICTE for the purpose provided those are not in dispute.*
8. *Indian Institutions affiliated to an Indian University and willing to offer programmes of foreign universities leading to award of degrees and/or diplomas must have prior concurrence of the concerned affiliating university.*
9. *It shall be the responsibility of the concerned Foreign university / institution to provide for and ensure that all facilities are available, the academic requirements are laid down and announced prior to starting of the programmes.*
10. *Any course / programme which jeopardizes the national interest of the country shall not be allowed to be offered in India.*
11. *The fee to be charged and the intake in each course to be offered by a foreign university / institution leading to a degree or diploma shall be as prescribed by the AICTE, giving due hearing to the concerned Foreign University/institution.*
12. *Educational innovations including experimentation with different modes of delivery by a foreign university / institution shall only be allowed provided such a system is well established either in their parent country or in India.*

13. *The Foreign University / institution shall have to declare in advance the detailed guidelines for admissions, entry level qualifications, the examination pattern and grading and there shall not be major deviations with the prescribed procedures in their parent country, vis-à-vis in India.*
14. *It shall be the responsibility of the concerned Foreign university / institution offering programmes in India to get their AICTE approved centers, accredited by NBA soon after two batches have passed out from such centers. The study centers/ institutions of collaborating private educational service providers which impart technical education leading to the award of a degree / diploma of a foreign university shall be considered as a center of the foreign university / institution, even though the management may be provided by the Indian educational service provider.*
15. *The foreign university / institution shall be bound by the advice of AICTE with regard to admissions, entry qualification and the conduct of courses / programmes in technical education, as may be communicated to them from time to time.*
16. *For any dispute arising out of implementation of these regulations, arbitration authority shall be the Secretary, Department of Education in the Central Government of India and the legal jurisdiction shall be the Civil Courts of New Delhi only.*
17. *AICTE may prescribe any other condition for registration, if it is expedient to do so in the overall interest of the technical education system in the country.*
18. *The existing Indian institutions having academic collaboration with Foreign University for grant of degree/ diploma will be facilitated to seek AICTE's approval and obtain affiliation with Indian university system with an aim to integrate such institutions with the mainstream of technical education system in India.*
19. *The Foreign Universities / institutions already operating in India in various form shall have to seek fresh approval from AICTE within six months from the date of issuance of this notification or before commencement of ensuing academic session, whichever is earlier and shall be governed by the Regulations and Guidelines of AICTE.*

Punitive Measures and Conditions for Withdrawal :

1. *If a foreign university / institution fails to comply with any of the conditions as contained in the above regulations and/or consistently refrains from taking corrective actions contrary to the advice of the AICTE, the AICTE may after*

giving reasonable opportunity to the concerned university/institution *through hearing or after making such inquiry as the Council may consider necessary, withdraw the registration granted to such university / institution to offer their degrees, diplomas in India and forbid such foreign university / institution to either open Centres or enter into any collaborative arrangement with any University / Institution in India or with a private educational service provider.*

2. The AICTE shall also inform the concerned agencies including Ministry of External Affairs, Ministry of Home Affairs, RBI *of such decisions and advise these agencies to take any or all of the following measures:*

- a. Refusal / withdrawal for grant of visa to employees/teachers of the said foreign university / institution.
- b. Stop repatriation of funds from India to home country.
- c. Forbid the advertisement of said university / institution in print or visual media.

Withdrawal : Once the registration of a Foreign University/Institution is withdrawn, the Council shall make attempts in co-ordination with concerned State Govt. to re-allocate the students enrolled into such programmes to other approved institutions of the Council. The foreign university/institution in such cases, shall have to return the entire fee collected from such students to the allottee institutions in which such students are accommodated. Such foreign institutions *shall not be allowed* to open any other centre/institution or enter into a collaborative arrangement in India.

Annual Reports : The Foreign university / institution shall submit an annual report giving details of the number of students admitted, programmes conducted, total fee collected, amount transferred to parent country, investment made, number of students awarded degree, diploma and any such information that AICTE may ask for.

Interpretation : If any question arises as to the interpretation of these regulations the same shall be decided by the AICTE.

The AICTE shall have power to issue any clarifications to remove any doubt, which may arise in regard to implementation of these regulations.
