Item No. 20.1

To confirm the minutes of the 19th meeting of the Academic Council.

Minutes of the 19<sup>th</sup> meeting of Academic Council held on 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2004 at 'Sri Sukhmani Institute of Engineering & Technology, Dera Bassi is placed at **Annexure-I.** As there are no written comments received, the minutes may be confirmed.

Item No. 20.2

The action taken report of the committees constituted in the 19<sup>th</sup> Academic Council.

(a) The 19<sup>th</sup> Academic Council appointed a sub committee to consider the fall out of amendments in attendance rules of the Academic Regulations – 2004. The recommendations of the committee are appended as Annexure-II.

The Academic Council may consider the recommendations for forwarding to the BOG for consideration and approval.

(b) As decided in the 19<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council vide agenda item No. 19.7, the Council for Engineering, Management & Architecture and Pharmacy Council have been constituted. The members and terms of reference of the councils are appended as Annexure –III & IV, respectively.

#### Item No. 20.3

#### To report CET- 2005.

Punjab Government vide notification No. 13/3/2005-1TE2/895 dated 06.04.2005 authorized the PTU to conduct Combined Entrance Test (CET-2005) for admission to Engineering / Architecture / Pharmacy courses. The CET is now scheduled on 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2005 and LEET is scheduled on 17<sup>th</sup> June, 2005.

The notification for Non-AICTE courses will be issued by 10<sup>th</sup> May, 2005.

The Academic Council may note the same.

### To report affiliation for session 2005 -06.

University vide advertisement in leading newspapers / official website invited applications for affiliation for session 2005 – 06. Even after repeated reminders few of the existing colleges have not yet applied formally for continuation of affiliation.

Also, Seven new Engineering colleges, 05 new Pharmacy colleges, 01 Architecture college, 03 in Hotel Management and 04 Management colleges have applied for afflation from session 2005-06. List of all these colleges is appended at **Annexure – V**

Amendments in the examination rules of the University.

Amendments in the existing rules on Preservation of Record, Identification of answer book(s), period of disqualification and attendance detention etc. have been proposed to streamline the activities related to issues of examinations. The same is placed at **Annexure –VI**

#### Item No. 20.7

### To consider new courses from session 2005 -06.

After having considered the report of the review committee on "Revitalizing of Technical Education in the State of Punjab" and on perusal of the affiliation application received from colleges, the following course are proposed to be introduced from the session 2005 - 06:

- B.Sc. (Bio-informatics)
- B.Sc. (Bio-Technology)
- 3. B.Sc. (Medical Electronics & Instrumentation)
- 4. B.Sc. (Fashion Technology)
- 5. M.Sc. (Bo-Informatics)
- 6. M.Sc. (Bio-Technology)
- 7. M.Sc. (Medical Electronics & Instrumentation)
- 8. M.Sc. (Medical Lab. Technology)
- 9. M.Sc. (Fashion Technology)

Academic Council may consider the proposal for implementation and constitute a committee to recommend the eligibility and fee structure for the courses. Also, The Academic Council may constitute a committee to rationalize the fee structure of Airlines and Hospitality Management courses, already existing, in conjunction with other undergraduate and postgraduate courses.

Item No .20.8

To consider amendments with respect to B. Arch. course in Academic Regulations - 2004.

The internal and external assessment under "section 5 Certification" of Academic Regulations – 2004 is stipulated as 40 & 60, respectively. It is suggested that the Internal assessment of courses in Architecture and Town Planning, where a substantial practical component (drawing) is associated with almost all the courses the internal and external assessment could be evaluated in 50 & 50, respectively. This is also in consistency with the practice of evaluation in similar courses elsewhere. Necessary directions on the breakup of the internal assessment may also be given.

The Academic Council may consider the proposal for necessary amendment in the Academic Regulations -- 2004.

Item No. 20.9

To consider special chance for improvement of attendance shortage to the students of 8<sup>th</sup> semester.

It has been reported that due to changes in the syllabi of B. Tech. 2002 batch onwards some of the students of eight semester (2001 batch) could not opt for subjects in which they had <u>detention due to shortage of attendance</u> during the regular sessions. As these students are to complete the programme in July, 2005, they may be given a special chance to improve on attendance shortage on case to case basis before July, 2005.

If approved, the college may invite applications for consideration from the concerned students.

Item No. 20.10

#### To consider phasing out of one year Postgraduate Diploma courses.

Academic Council has already permitted the following one year postgraduate diploma programmes offered under the DEP as regular courses in the affiliated colleges:

- (a) Postgraduate Programme in Airlines, Tourism & Hospitality
  Management
- (b) Postgraduate Programme in Service Industry Management. (Vide 15<sup>th</sup> Academic Council meeting)
- (c) PGDCA (Vide 19th Academic Council meeting)

These programmes have been offered as regular courses since session 2004 –05. However, it has been observed that these programmes as regular courses shall have practical difficulties with respect to the maximum duration for completion of the course. It is proposed that the one-year postgraduate diploma programme could be treated as a subset of M.Sc. Degree programme in the respective specializations and admission be given only to the M.Sc. Degree programmes of two year duration.

The postgraduate diploma may be awarded to a student who completes the courses of first two semesters and does not wish to pursue M.Sc. The first year scheme of study shall be developed keeping in view this terminality. Other general rules and regulations shall be as applicable in case of M.Sc. courses.

As a result, two new M.Sc. programmes in Airlines, Tourism & Hospitality Management and Service Industry Management, respectively will be introduced. The M.Sc. (IT) Programme is already existing for PGDCA.

If approved, the same could be implemented from 2005 – 06 and accordingly the present one year postgraduate programmes would be phased out. Also, the formulation of fee structure for the courses could be referred to the committee constituted under item No. 20.7.

MINUTES OF THE 19<sup>TH</sup> MEETING OF THE ACADEMIC COUNCIL HELD ON 26<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER, 2004 AT 11:30 HRS IN THE PREMISES OF SRI SUKHMANI INSTITUTE OF ENGINEERING & TECHNOLOGY, DERA BASSI

The meeting was chaired by Dr. S.K. Şalwan, Vice-Chancellor, PTU. The members as detailed in Appendix – A attended the meeting.

The Vice Chancellor in his welcome address conveyed, to the members and their tamilies, his best wishes for the year 2005. He mentioned that WTO would be effective from 1<sup>st</sup> Jan. 2005. The agreement recognizes education as service industry. He invited all the members to be ready for the coming challenges. The Indian education is already known for its quality, and high end content. These must be improved upon. The University curriculum is versatile and updated regularly. This way we are able to cater to the needs of the industry. In the light of WTO, our market for placement is now global. Even though, WTO considers education as service industry, our primary aim is that of imparting effective knowledge. He cutlined the importance of knowledge economy.

The new year is likely to pose challenges for the academicians and to sustain our reputation and standing, the members of the Council must take innovative action and prove themselves. The University had taken initiative to monitor the academic performance of the students and was in the process of conducting academic audit. He called for fruitful participation of the colleges in aiming at higher standards of technical education. The new regulations were in force and there was overall stability in the University system.

The Registrar briefed on the admissions for the year 2004-05. Various institutes had shown a casual attitude as far as furnishing the information concerning admission was considered. The Vice Chancellor pointed out that dates set by the University

must be respected and in no case any extension will be granted.

Dean(Exam) briefed the Council on the ongoing examination (odd semester-regular). He brought out certain difficulties in conduct of the examination. The Vice Chancellor apprised the members that examination was the responsibility of one and all, and that every effort must be made to ensure that the examinations are conducted fairly and in time. Examination duty is an essential University duty and all staff of the affiliated colleges/exam Centers was duty bound to perform such duties as assigned by the Dean (Exam) or Controller of Exam at the center(college). The Chairman desired that results should be declared within two months of completion of the exam. This, however, was not possible without guidance and indulgence of academic members.

### RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE CONSTITUTED TO CONSIDER THE ATTENDANCE RULES OF THE ACADEMIC REGULATIONS - 2004

- The attendance should be calculated on the basis of scheduled lecturers and not on the basis of periods delivered.
- 2. As the attendance is to be considered for each course individually and separately, clause 3.2.1(iv) "Provided that no candidate shall be eligible to appear in higher semester examination unless he has already fulfilled attendance requirement in the immediately lower semester" need to be amended and course-wise eligibility to appear in the examination is recommended.
- Conditions for promotion at Clause 6.2 of the Academic Regulations –2004,

"A student who has been detained due to shortage of attendance shall not be allowed to be promoted to the next semester and he / she shall be required to take re-admission and repeat all courses in the to said semester along with the new batch of students with payment of full fees." be amended as,

"a candidate detained from appearing in the examination of a course due to shortage of attendance will repeat the course of study only when that is offered as a regular course." However, the total number of courses, a student can take in any semester is to be limited & finalized.

- 4. The clause 7.1 stipulating maximum duration of study for completing the Programme should be amended and the Programme should be open-ended. The student has to take the re-examination as per the syllabus and scheme in-force at that time.
- in the light of the amendments of Academic Regulations 2004, it is recommended that change of option could be allowed and to accept the affidavits filed after the due date with a fixed deadline.
