

Proceeding of the 22nd meeting of the Academic Council held on 2nd September 2005 in CT Institute of Management & Technology.

The 22nd meeting of the Academic Council was held as an emergency meeting on 2nd September 2005 at 1130 hrs in the conference hall of CT Institute of Management & Technology under the Chairmanship of Dr. S.K. Salwan Vice Chancellor, Punjab Technical University. A list of the members who attended the meeting is placed at Appendix-A.

Leave of absence was granted to Dr. J.K.Sharma, Principal Swami Parmanand Institute of Engineering & Technology.

22.1 Confirmation of the minutes of 21st meeting

The registrar informed the council that minutes of the 21st meeting held at Lovely Institute on 17 August 2005 had been circulated to all the members and that no comments had been received. The minutes were confirmed by the council.

22.2 Action taken report


The registrar informed the council that a meeting of the BOG was held on 19 August 2005. In particular the situation arising out of agitation by the students of 2004 batch of was discussed. He informed that the resolution as drawn under 21.2 of the proceedings had been conveyed to the board. The members of the BOG had not accepted any change in the Academic Regulations 2004 and were not prepared to dilute the quality standards.

21.1 The Registrar informed the council that issue of re- introducing six month training would have to be considered by the board of studies of each branch. The chairman directed that this be completed within a period of 30 days.

21.2(b)&(c) Dean academic informed the council that BOS for Computer Science

& Engineering, 17 and Computer Applications had a joint meeting and had arrived following decision.

The registrar informed the council that a notification to the effect is under issue.



21.2 The registrar also informed the council that the BOG had approved continuing of the online system of education in respect of the following courses

MBA, MCA, BBA, BCA, MSc (IT) BSc (IT), PGDCA

21.4 The registrar informed the members that as on date the last date for admission to all the course was 10 September 2005 and that a schedule for checking eligibility of the students had been circulated. He also informed that the eligibilty criteria as specified for various courses must be respected. The onus of ascertaining eligibility in respect of all the courses was an the respective principal and cannot be undermined. In particular students admitted through lateral entry were to be checked to have earned 50% or more marks. He also explained the calculation of weighted awards.

22.3 The Chairman referred to the emergency in holding the meeting and informed the members that this was necessitated because of the ongoing agitation of the students of 2004 batch. He informed the members that the University had received a number of representations from the students and their parents. Most of the students, who had opted for Academic Regulation 2004, had brought out that when they executed the affidavit they were not clear about the Regulation. Some of them represented that they had executed their option under pressure. The Chairman made it clear that the affidavits were to be signed under the guidance of the respective Principal and it was moral responsibility of each Principal to have explained the Regulations to their students. Even now the Principals must ensure that the students were clear about the regulation 2004 and its implication(s).

22.3.1 Since some of the students of a few colleges were agitating in the lawns of the University, it was necessary for the Principals to come down to the University premises, identify their own students and persuade them go back to their respective colleges. The University authorities including the

knowledge growth of the class and may demotivate good students, thus lowering the standard of education imparted.

iv) It was necessary for all Principals to identify weak students right in their first semester and take appropriate corrective action to bring up these students and earn their eligibility to the 3rd semester by end of the 1st year.


22.4 To review briefing on Examination 2005

The Dean (Academic) informed the members of the council on the status of result for examination held in May / June 2005. A copy of these is appended to the minutes. The members lauded efforts of the University in declaration the result in time. The Chairman mentioned that this had been possible only through a full-hearted co-operation of the members of the council and that all the credit truly goes to the Principals & Staff of the Colleges. It was an effort of every one under the PTU umbrella.

22.5 To review admission 2005-06

The chairman informed the council that admission to M Tech, B Tech, B Arch, B Pharma, MBA and MCA had been completed. He also informed that this year there was a better response and the number of students admitted to various courses was likely to surpass figures of the previous College wise lists of the candidates admitted were available on the university website. Instruction had already been issued by the University on the procedure to be adopted by the colleges for admission to the vacant seats.

The meeting came to an end with vote of thanks to the Chair.

Examination 2005 and result thereof.

The University conducted the regular and reappear examination in May 16-05-2005 to 20-06-2005. A total of 7266 students appeared in the regular examinations. After having completed evaluation (table Marking), the results were being declared on priority basis as per dates below:

As per Academic Regulations 2004, the students to be promoted to the 3rd semester should have cleared at least four theory papers out of total nine papers of its first year. Accordingly, about 351 students of 2004 batch first year, students who opted for Academic Regulations 2004 shall be debarred from promotion to 3rd semester.
