In light of the UGC guidelines of XI Plan under the scheme of autonomous colleges, higher education policy in India clearly states that "Colleges with academic and operative freedom are doing better and have more credibility". The following colleges were given the autonomous status by UGC, subsequently autonomous status was granted by the university to the colleges.

- 1. Amritsar College of Engineering & Technology, Amritsar
- 2. Beant College of Engineering & Technology, Gurdaspur
- 3. Shaheed Bhagat Singh State Technical College, Ferozepur



Further as on date the university is having four autonomous colleges and the number is expected to increase in the coming years. In view of the same and in accordance to the IKG PTU Act Clause 19(g) there is requirement to frame the policy/regulations for the governess of these autonomous institutes. 45.12 January Admissions – 2016

Vide notification no. PTU/Reg./Notification 458 to 461 dated 28.10.2014 following guidelines were issued to be followed by the institutes:-

- The student will be admitted directly in January session against vacant seats of sanctioned intake of Academic year in 2nd/4th semester.
- A new batch is to be start for the January admissions.
- The total number of contact hours and teaching scheme and other norms like issuance of final degree after completion of minimum time period and minimum eligibility qualifications must be fulfilled as per University norms.

In the mean time new Notification was issued vide no. PTU/DA/859 dated 20.05.2014, according to which:

 The student shall study three (03) subject of 1st semester during summer vacations (i.e. during June & July) i.e. after 2nd semester and remaining subject after 4th semester respectively.

On the basis of this letter many of the colleges have permitted the students to appear in the examination for two consecutive semesters simultaneously, which is the direct violation of academic rules and regulations.

At the time to start the January Admissions University has given the affidavit in Court to start the January admission as a separate batch. In view of the above and on the basis of undertaking given by the University in the Court is has decided that from now onward for the January admission will be allowed only in the institutes those are ready to start new batch for the January admission.

All the previous guidelines/notification made by the university are cancelled and the fresh drafted guidelines for January admission as applicable from now onward are placed at **Annexure-XIII**.
