Agenda Points for 25th Meeting of the Academic Council to be held on 30th June, 2006 at 1100 hours at GNA-IMT, Mehtiana, Near Phagwara.

To confirm the minutes of the 24th meeting of th Academic Council held at RIEIT, Railmajra.

Proceedings of 24th meeting of Academic Council held on 17.03.2006 at RIEIT, Railmajra are placed at Appendix 'A'.

The minutes were circulated vide University letter No. PTU/Reg/1898 dated 03.04.06. The University has not received any comment from any of the members. The minutes may be taken as confirmed.

ITEM No. 25.2 Action taken report on the minutes of the 24th meeting of the Academic Council.

Action taken report of the 24th meeting of Academic Council is placed at Appendix 'B'.

ITME No. 25.3 To brief on decision taken in the 22nd meeting of BOG.

The board approved the following recommendations made by the Academic Council:

- (a) Approved the new courses as recommended under Item No. 24.11 of the Academic Council.
- (b) Levy of Migration Fee as recommended by the Academic Council in Item No. 24.12
- (c) Constitution of UMC Committee as per Item No. 24.13

The board has also approved the following:

(a) Applicability of Regulations for the time being in force, i.e. "Notwithstanding the integrated nature of a course spread over more than one academic year, the regulation in force at the time a student joins a course shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic year. Nothing in these regulations shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the regulations subsequently and the amended regulations, if any, shall apply to all students whether old or new.

(b) Transfer of land and building from M/s PUNTEX Ltd. at Amritsar for the purpose of setting up of Regional Centre of the University. The transfer would cost Rs. 2 crore which has been approved by the Board.

The Academic Council is informed.

ITEM No. 25.4 To inform on status of construction of the University building.

Commencement of construction work was reported in the previous Academic Council under general briefing. Subsequently foundation stone laying ceremony was performed by the hon'ble Chief Minister on 22nd March, 2006. The work is in progress & construction has reached ground level. It is expected that the construction work shall be completed by Dec.-2006. In the meantime the BOG has also approved construction of Guest House, Convention Centre and residence of key personnel. A Sports Track with ground has also been approved to be brought up.

This is for the information of the Council.

ITEM No. 25.5 To approve Academic Calendar 2006-07.

Academic Calendar for the session commencing Aug.-2006 is proposed & included at appendix 'C'. The Academic Council may approve the same.

PTU was established in the year 1997. At that time, there were 9 engineering colleges and few management colleges in the Punjab and were affiliated to the different universities like Punjab University, GNDU, Amritsar, Punjabi University etc. On establishment of Technical University in the State, all

engineering and management colleges of Punjab were transferred to PTU except REC and other universities own colleges. They followed the syllabi of the concerned universities.

The PTU had developed its own curriculum & syllabi and was implemented with immediate effect.

The maximum stipulated time for completion of degree was one and a half times the course duration. However, the University, vide notification no. PTU/REG/924 dated 22.2.06, implemented the decisions of the BOG and enhanced the duration of the course from one and a half time to twice the duration of the course. It has also extended the benefit of additional chances to the old batches students who were not able to complete their degree within stipulated time by giving another four chances in the form of special chances, from January, 2006 to December, 2007 to complete their degree.

As a result the University will have to conduct examinations in varied syllabi and schemes, which cease to exist (even dates back to syllabi of 1993 batch admissions). It is proposed that, in order to circumvent this practical difficulty, all examinations may be conducted in the syllabi inforce. In case of obsolete courses this would be by identifying and notifying the equivalent courses.

If approved the equivalence of the courses could be identified and notified accordingly before commencement of the examinations.

Put up before the Academic Council for its kind deliberation and approval.

ITEM No. 25.7 Ratification of new Colleges and increase in intake.

As many as 10 applications were received for starting new colleges. After initial presentation, only eight (08) proposals were found to be viable. Various Committees had inspected these colleges. The following colleges are recommended for being affiliated to the University. Council may recommend to the BOG for final approval. The Council may recommend the same.

ITEM No. 25.8 It is proposed that the date sheet for various courses is drawn out at the start of the semester. A proposed date sheet is appended at Appendix 'D'. The only change which is required to be incorporated would be the commencement date and subjects applicable.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

ITEM No. 25.9 Nomination to NSS / Sports Cultural Councils.

- (a) The University has conducted NSS activities during the session. A briefing of this has been given from time to time. Presently it has been proposed to hold a joint Camp in the first week of July at Harike Pattan / Kanjali Wet Land. Briefing under article 24.14 referes.
- (b) First ever 'Virast Mela' was held at SPICT, Ramnagar (Banur). The event was well attended. Student participated with enthusiasm and the event gathered large amount of crowd from the neighbourhood. This event henceforth shall be an annual event. 'Virasat-2007' is scheduled for mid March to be held at Sri Sai Group of Colleges, Pathankot.
- (c) As mentioned under agenda item No. 24.15, the University received support from numerous stalwarts of Indian Sports of the region for interacting and guiding development of sports activities of the University.

To undertake above three (03) activities, Academic Council had constituted Committees for the year 2005-06. The Committees did a splendid job in guiding and conduct of the activities. Detail of the Committees are placed at **appendix 'E'**. It is proposed that the same Committees may be asked to continue for the academic session 2006-07. In addition the Chairman Academic Council may nominate other members deemed fit, to the councils. The matter is placed before the Council for consideration & approval.

ITEM No. 25.10 It is proposed to install 'Technology Satambh' award to recognise work of eminent Technologists, Engineers, Scientists and Academicians. Such recognition will be honoured in a functions and award of 'Technology Satambh' bestowed upon them. The Council may approve of installation of above and propose names for the maiden award.

ITEM No. 25.11 It is proposed to celebrate Technology Day in the month of July.

Council may approve the same, propose a venue and appoint a

Committee to commemorate the same.

ITEM No. 25.12 To hold 5th Convocation of the University in Sep.-2006.

It is proposed to held the 5th Convocation on 27th Sep., 2006. The Council may suggest venue for the same.

ITEM No. 25.13 To review Regional Centres and their functioning.

The University had started conduct of Part-Time M.Tech. courses in the regional centres. Primarily this was done to develop faculty of the colleges. Admission to the courses was conducted during session 2003-04-05. It has been observed that whereas initially there was an overwhelming response. The admissions have shown decline in the past two years. Last year a restriction was imposed wherein a course did not fetch for itself 10 admissions, was not permitted to continue. It is proposed to review conduct of M.Tech. Part-Time course in the regional centres for the session 2006-07. The matter is placed before the Academic Council.

ITEM No. 25.14 In order to meet the increasing demand of qualified staff in the field of Pharmacy, it is proposed that the number of Ph.D. candidates which may be guided by supervisor may be

increased to 08 (eight). This would be in line with the other Universities in the State conducting research in Pharmacy namely viz. GNDU Amritsar, Pbi. Univ. Patiala.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration.

ITEM No. 25.15 To inform on the University Calendar 2005.

It has been endeavoured to bring out annual calendar of the University. Draft of the same is ready. The headings as given in **Appendix 'F'** have been included in the Calendar.

Proceedings of the meeting of the Academic Council held on 17 March 2006 at 1100 hrs in Rayat Institute of Engineering & Technology, Railmajra (Nawanshahar)

The 24th meeting of the Academic Council was held on 17 March 2006 of 1100 hrs in Rayat Institute of Engineering & Technology, Railmajra (Nawanshahr) under too Chairmanship of Dr. S.K. Salwan , Vice Chancellor Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar.

Members as per the list given at Appendix -A attended the meeting.

The Chairman welcomed the members and mentioned that university had been able to start the work of construction of its building. He mentioned that excavation work was almost nearing completion and that foundation stone was planned to be laid by Hon'ble Chief Minister, Punjab on 22 March 2006. He invited all the members to participate in the function, which was scheduled to be held at 1530 hrs at the site.

The chairman also informed about the progress made by the university ϕn academic as well as extra curricular activities. Details, he informed, were included as agenda points and were likely be briefed by the university staff.

Examination December 2005 / January 2006 had been conducted smoothly. Some results had been announced and the others were expected to be available within a week time. Even semesters had started well in time and that he was ware of the fact that the academics were in full swing. He stressed upon the members to ensure that the students fulfill the required attendance criteria. End semester examination was likely to be schedule from 15th May 2006 and would be endeavor to completed by mid Julia 2006. The chairman said that it was the responsibility of the each of the members to contribute to the cause of academic quality.

The following members were welcomed on their first appearance at the meeting or on change of institution. Dr. Sharma, Rayar Institute of Pharmacy, Dr. AS Bansal, Bhutta Engineering College, Dr. VP Singh, officiating IET Bhaddal & Dr. Sharma REIT & Bahra.

24.1 To confirm the proceeding of 23 meeting of the academic council held at Rayat Institute of Engineering and Technology at Railmajra.

Observations made by Indo Global College of Engineering had been noted but did not warrant any change in minutes. In most of the institutes the semester had started word in time and it was the responsibility of the Principal to ensure the desired attendance level. There being no other observation from any of the members. The minutes were confirmed.

24.2 Action taken report on the minutes of the 23rd meeting of the academic council.

The committee took note on action taken. In particular the Dean Academia briefed on admission to M.Tech in Regional Centres. He identified that no admission had been made in January 2006 and it was necessary to review the decision to conduct admission to M.Tech twice in a year. The chairman mentioned that the initial rush for admission to M.Tech was over and it was necessary to conduct an introspection and consolidate performance of our regional centres. It could be possible that regional centres may combine resources to run the courses. This would facilitate sharing or faculty and infrastructure.

24.3 To brief on decision taken in 21st meeting of BOG

The council was briefed on the minutes of the BOG.

Regulations for B.Tech. & other Courses.

The Registrar informed the council that maximum duration for competing any of the course had been enhanced to twice the duration of the normal courses and that this provision had also been extended to the students who had already passed out from the PTU system but had not fulfilled the requirement for award of degree. Such students could take additional chances as applicable for the course followed. However, these additional chances in respect of such students could be avail only during the period January 01-2006 to December 31-2007 and also only whenever the university is conducting the examination in the subject.

Approval of the BOG on Academic Council recommendation (Maximum nos of courses that can be taken in any particular semeter).

The Chairman clarified that such restrictions of taking examinations only 10 subjects was restricted to students who had been detained becausishortage in attendance.

24.4 To consider BBA/BCA courses running in AICTE approved Colleges

The issue was deliberated and it was considered necessary that if University should take up with the AICTE for proper utilization of faculty at infrastructure through resource sharing. Whereas physical separation of class room could be possible; total separate faculty for similar courses may not be the right choracter was informed that the AICTE had even objected to use of the common name trunning similar courses. The members pointed out that BBA/BCA were also AICT courses, even though control of these courses had been given to the affiliation. University. Hence, they could not be considered as non-AICTE courses and it would to proper spirit to conduct BBA/BCA, MBA/MCA in the same institute. The chairment oned that the matter would be taken up with the AICTE.

24.5 To brief on conduct of CET-2006.

The council took note of the dates. The Registrar briefed the council on property and constol one Vs two counsellings. The Chairman informed the council that discussively had forwarded its comments to the Government and the decision of the law was awaited. Consequently the same would be incorporated in the notification arms the brochure. Subject: -Report of subcommittee appointed for the regulation regarding spin arrangement for amanuensis (writer) in university examinations.

The Academic Council in 24th meeting vide its item no: -24.18 appointed a subcreto formulate the regulations for provision of amanuensis (writer) in examinations. The committee after detailed deliberations considering the academic well as the practical / aspects associated with issue, the following recommendations:

- 1. A candidate may be allowed help of an amanuensis (writer), if he/shc is:
 - (i) blind

or

(ii) permanently disabled from writing with his/her own hands,

or

- (iii) temporarily disabled from writing on account of fracture of the right arm, forearm or dislocation of a shoulder elbow or wrist etc. The candid produce a certificate from a Professor of the speciality concerned of College and where there is no Medical College, from the Chief Medical the District concerned to the effect that the candidate is unable to write answer-books because of the temporary disablement.
- The Principal/Director/Local COE is required to send all the papers to Blind/Disabled candidates seeking the help of writer to the Dean (Example), Punjab Technical University, Jalandhar.
- 3. The amanuensis shall be of a lower grade of education than candidate at the bear from the same institution to which the candidate belongs, but he/shall not have secured more than 50 percent marks in the last house examination may be relaxed if the qualification of the writer is more one grade lower than that of the examinee.
