31.12 To Include the word Medium of Instruction "English" on the reverse side of the Original Degree Certificate.

A number of students have been visiting the University for getting the certificate that the medium of instructions in the courses studied by them is "English". It is proposed to include the word "Medium of Instructions is English for all the regular courses conducted by the University on the reverse side of the Original Degree Certificate. This would save the precious time and the inconvenience caused.

The matter is placed before the Council for consideration and recommendation.

31.13 Relaxation of passing marks from 50% to 40% for B. Pharmacy course.

The University has enforced Academic Regulations – 2004 in which the passing marks to clear a subject for B. Pharmacy course were reduced from 50% to 40%. An option was taken from the students to either opt for Academic Regulations – 2001 or Academic Regulations – 2004. As a result of which the students who opted for new Regulations were declared pass with 40% marks but their previous results were not revised as per the 40% condition.

About 50 students have moved for legal remedy and the Hon'ble High Court in CWP No.7087 of 2007 has given the judgment to revise their previous results.

The item is placed before the Council for relaxation.

31.14 To discuss about the affiliation fee and other related fee to be charged from the Institutions affiliated to PTU.

Various kinds of fees such as affiliation fee, inspection fees, University related fee etc. are to be charged from the colleges. In spite of the number of reminders sent to these institutions, many institutions have not yet cleared their dues till date. The issue of pending dues was discussed in a number meetings and, it was decided that all outstanding dues shall be cleared immediately after the

admission are over. The matter has also come up for discussion in the meeting of Board of Governors which had directed that the Institutions should be asked to clear their dues immediately failing which action be initiated for withdrawal of their affiliation.

The status of amount received / to be received from different colleges is placed at Appendix-VI.

31.15. To consider amendment in Academic Regulations for re-appear examinations.

A committee was constituted to consider conduct of reappear examination for the last semester student.

The committee has given recommendations for overall conduct of reappear examination

Existing regulation	Recommended amendments
The examination duration for clearing all subjects of a particular course shall be twice the duration of the respective regular course. This would apply to all the regular courses. All regulations issued so far are hereby modified to make the above applicable. 31.16 To carry out Online Counselling for admissions in the session 2009 – 10.

The University proposes to carry out Online Counselling for academic session 2009 -10 for admissions in Engineering, Pharmacy & Architecture courses. The job is being entrusted to NIC which is a Government of India organization and has been doing this job for other Universities, State Boards of Technical Education & AIEEE.

The Counselling is proposed to be done simultaneously at different locations of the state of Punjab with headquarters at PTU Campus at Jalandhar – Kapurthala Road. The NIC has been requested to send us a detailed proposal for carry out the Online Counselling. NIC has also been requested to give a presentation for the Online Counselling.

31.17 To carry out admissions in Engineering and Architecture courses on AIEEE rank basis for the session 2010 – 11.

So far the admission to Engineering & Architecture courses in the Institutions located in the State of Punjab has been undertaken through Combined Entrance Test (CET) conducted jointly for colleges affiliated to PTU, Jalandhar, GNDU, Amritsar, Punjabi University, Patiala and PAU, Ludhiana. At the same time the AIEEE conducts admission to these course on the basis of AIEEE ranking and many institutions now are making admission on the basis of AIEEE ranking. The exercise of having another test leads to not only multiplicity of tests but also a cause of inconvenience to students and wastage of time. Further, as per the admissions made under CET – 2008 the total number of students which appeared in the Entrance Test was 23150 whereas the number of seats in these courses in different Universities were as follows :

MINUTES OF THE 30TH ACADEMIC COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 6TH FEBRUARY, 2008 AT 11:30 AM AT SANT BABA BHAG SINGH INSTITUTE OF ENGINEERING & TECHNOLOGY, PADHIANA (JALANDHAR)

The 30th meeting of the Academic Council was held on 6th February, 2008 at 11:30 am at Sant Baba Bhag Singh Institute of Engineering & Technology, Padhiana (Jalandhar) under the chairmanship of Dr S.K Salwan Vice-Chancellor, Punjab Technical University.

The Chairman welcomed the members of the Council and introduced the following new members

At the outset the Chairman requested members to have an introspection of progress made the university in different fields and give their worthy suggestions to further improving the quality of Technical Education and in achieving the mission of providing high quality of technical education in the state of Punjab.

Dr. R.P.S. Suker-Chakla: appreciated the efforts made by the university in streamlining the academic schedule and bringing about stability in conduct of examinations as well as the timely declaration of results especially when the university was facing challenge of conducting examination for a large number of students both in regular as well as in distance education streams. He emphasized on recording facilitations for the efforts made by the examination division of the university in this area.

Dr. (Col) H.S. singha: also expressed his satisfaction for the smooth conduct of examinations. He emphasized upon encouragement of R&D in the various streams of engineering and management and appreciated the initiatives undertaken by the university for faculty development programmes.

Dr. K.N.S. Kang: highlighted the achievements made by the University and complemented the team of the university for bringing about speedy reforms which has not only helped to improve the brand image of the university but also in attracting a large number of students from the state of Punjab and outside as in evident from the large number of admissions made in PTU affiliated colleges. The collaboration with various foreign universities of repute was a good indicator of the prestige earned by the university during the last 2-3 years.

Such collaborations at the college level be also encouraged so as to enable our students to prepare them for the globally competitive market.

Dr. Balram Dogra complemented the university for making improvements in all segments of its activities. He suggested that more faculty improvement programmes be taken up on regular

basis. Likewise keeping pace with the market changes more specialized programmes in MBA need to be promoted by the university. The syllabi for specialized courses be designed keeping in view the requirement of user agencies incorporating new areas of studies that are required in such courses.

Dr. G.D.Bansal: expressed satisfaction on various initiatives taken by the university in particularly promoting new courses. He further, emphasized that to keep pace with the challenges the Institutions be liberally supported to take up new programmes. The image of the university has significantly improved as is evident from the encouraging response received from various firms/ agencies which came up for the '*Placement Mela*' organized by CEC, Landran, and which was participated by the students of various affiliated colleges. There was a record number of placements this year, which reflects upon the improved performance achieved by the university in the last 2 years or so.

Dr. R.C. Sharma: complemented the efforts made by the university in all fronts of administrative, academic and examinations. He hoped that the university would continue to work to achieve more in this direction. He further emphasized the need for updating the syllabi of the courses on regular basis incorporating there in the new thrust areas and more practical and skill imparting techniques. He also suggested that the quality of Distance Education need to be further improved.

Dr. H.S. Bhatti: was of the view that B.Tech faculty was not seen as fit enough to teach B.Tech programmes. Therefore, the recruitments of faculty be restricted to at least to M.Tech. Accordingly the university should encourage more faculty development programmes so that the supply of M.Tech faculty could be further improved.

Dr. J.K. Sharma : Complemented the university for brining about improvements in various activities of the university and hoped that the university will continue to work towards bringing about further improvements. He was of the view that complete computerization of the university must be done in respect of administrative, academic and financial matters. The admission process should be put on online and the website of the PTU. Syllabi must be updated regularly. He also expressed that the question papers should be designed to make it balanced. He suggested that a team of experts be constituted to monitor the quality of question papers.

Summing up the suggestions and the views of the members, the Vice Chancellor appraised them about various initiatives taken by University in academic – administrative and financial areas. Such initiatives would not only help to improve the quality of technical education but also make our students more employable and competitive.

The efforts initiated by the University shall be continued within the thrust on achieving the target of imparting high quality of technical education. It shall further enable our pass outs to equip them with the latest technological advances and also make them more employable and useful for the industry and academic Institutions alike. He reiterated that the principals of our colleges was our strength. Their support and cooperation was very crucial in the smooth functioning of the University. The views expressed by them are quite relevant and the university shall give due consideration in implementing the suggestions for improving the quality of technical education. The university was determined to achieve the mission of propelling Punjab to a Prosperous Knowledge Society.

Dr. R.P. Singh Suker-Chakia was requested to workout modules for faculty development programme.

30.8 To brief about examination reforms

Dean (Examinations) informed the Council about the examination reforms and major steps taken in this direction.

The work being done by the Dean (Examination) was appreciated by the members.

It was decided that there will be four nodal centers for evaluation of answer sheets in the next examinations.
