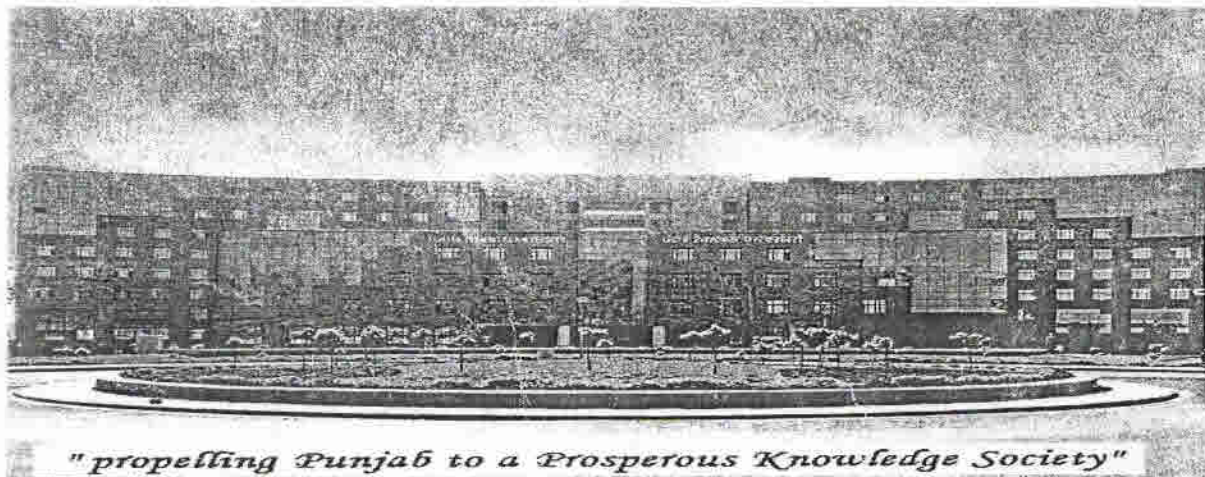

Rayat- Bahra, Hoshiarpur Campus	1. Migration of students: the university issued a notification unilaterally for migration of students without getting No



Objection Certificate from the concerned Institutions, thus favouring some institutions and unfavouring the other.

Policy needs to be clarified with regard to the following:

- i. Migration of students of a branch/ programme from Institutions where all seats were filled up during the corresponding admissions in the first year. (Explanation: A student migrating from such programmes of institutes in the 2<sup>nd</sup> year implies the denying of seat in the parent institution to some other students who was in the waiting for admission. This also involves direct financial loss to the institution, for remaining period of the programme.)
- ii. Migration of students into the institutions where they could not get admission in the first year. (Explanation: Institutions which filled all seats in a branch/ programme in the first year, issued No Objection Certificate to the large number of students to fill seats falling vacant during the years. When the admission to a institute are on merit and such migration is to be allowed then the seats should be thrown open publicity so that the students who are next in the merit at the time of admission gave the first choice. No objection Certificate given by such institutions do not confirm whether there is any merit list prepared before issuing no objection certificate.
- iii. The migration of students from branches in institutions where all seats are not full during the first year. (Explanation: Only the migration from such institutions seems to be in order as these institutions have vacant seats at the time of admissions. This migration of the students result in the financial loss to the institution but does not deny seats to any other potential candidates.
- iv. What is the maximum number of migration allowed from a single institution?
- v. What is the maximum number of migrations that may be allowed to one single institution?
- vi. What should be the acceptable reasons of migration and their procedure of verification?

A clear policy of migration needs to be decided especially when the number of vacant seats in increasing day by day.

2. Teaching of Human Values and Professional Ethics: As per the Boards of Studies guidelines, the HYPE 101 shall be run in Punjabi Language from the session 2012-13.

Even the present teaching faculty trained by PTU finds it difficult and shows resistance for teaching of the paper in Punjabi.

It is suggested that let the teachers teach & students study



	<p>the subject best in the language they both understand. The books (same) be made available in all the three languages i.e. English, Punjabi and Hindi. Question papers be set in all the three languages. Let students attempt the paper in any language (pre-informed) convenient to them.</p>

Internal awards uploaded by colleges are not incorporated causing academic loss to the students and harassment.</p> <p>9. Revision of List of paper setters/examiners: Process may be revised for effectiveness.</p>

**39.01 To confirm the minutes of 38<sup>th</sup> Academic Council meeting held on November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2011**

**39.2 Action Taken Report (ATR) of the 38<sup>th</sup> Academic Council Meeting**

The council noted the action taken report on the 38<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council and also the report of the committee constituted under item No. 38.28, 38.33, 38.34 (c) & 38.34 (d)

**39.03 To inform regarding Admissions- 2012**

The Chairman informed that a full fledged Admission Cell has been established in the Academic Branch to plan for admissions. The campaigning for admissions for various courses during session 2012-13 has already been initiated.

To raise the admissions of foreign students, in the initial phase, the University officials are visiting Nepal and Bhutan.

**39.04 To start B.Tech Integrated programme in PITs**

The Chairman informed that all the PITs will be given academic autonomy to frame their syllabus, question paper pattern etc. The Academic autonomy will also cover the autonomy for examination. All the Examination work including conduct and evaluation will be internal and performed by the concerned PIT on its own. The finally prepared result will be forwarded by the PIT to the PTU for notification and certification. Preference will be given to implement the grading and credit system for continuous evaluation of the students.

The academic matters of the PIT shall be decided by a separate Academic Body of the PIT concerned and till its formation, the Academic Council of the University will look after the academic issues.

The administrative control of the PITs shall be with PTU only.

**39.05 Course structure and regulations for PIT Mansa**

It was informed that the admissions to the PIT Mansa were made last year with the approval of the competent authority to the six year B. Tech. integrated programme. The PIT has become operational in the transit campus at Nehru Memorial College Mansa. The courses designed for this PIT are 6 year Integrated B. Tech. and Five year Integrated BBA/B. Com Professional and B. Sc. Medical etc.. In the first year of six year B. Tech. Integrated programme, 30% seats are reserved for the rural weaker section.

The Council has approved the same.

It was informed that Government has transferred GZSCET Bathinda to PTU as its Campus

It was informed that Giani Zail Singh College of Engineering & Technology, Bathinda (Now PTU GZS Campus Bathinda) has been selected for Sub Component 1.1: Strengthening Institutions to improve Learning Outcomes and employability of Graduates (Modernization and Strengthening of Laboratories for existing UG) under the Technical Education Quality Improvement Program (TEQIP-II) of the Government of India. For the above purpose, autonomous Institution status is required for the Campus.

As being the regional center of the university, the Institution will be given the full academic autonomy and the certification will be made by the university. The Academic autonomy will also cover the autonomy for examination. All the Examination work including conduct and evaluation will be internal and performed by the GZS Campus Bathinda at its own. The finally prepared result will be forwarded by the campus to the PTU for notification and certification. The institution will ensure to implement the grading and credit based system so that continuous evaluation of the students will be made.

The institution will be academically autonomous and the administrative control of the PTU GZS Campus shall be with the university.

All the colleges were requested to tie up with BSNL for the above project so that work can be started.

### 39.16 Web based online application system (ERP system)

University has given this project to NIC for computerization of whole work and to make online all the departmental file work. Sh. Amolak Singh Kalsi, NIC, Jalandhar has briefed the Council about the project.

Dean Innovation, Research and Industrial Consultancy (IRIC) informed that Punjab Technical University (PTU) is seriously thinking about the students of weaker section of society. PTU has taken a step in this direction and Rs. 2.5 Crore sanctioned for the students of weaker section of Society.

The students belonging to following categories can apply for PTU-Free Ship Scheme for financial assistance:

- (i) **Parent less students:** eligible for financial assistance for full free ship of fee, if the total family income of the student is less than 2.50 lakh from all sources.
- (ii) **Father less students:** eligible for financial assistance for half free ship, if the total family income of the student is less than 2.50 lakh from all sources. In case the income of concerned is less than 1.20 lakh then he/she shall be eligible for financial assistance for full free ship.
- (iii) **Low Income Group students:** eligible for financial assistance for half free ship, if the total family income is less than 2.50 lakh from all sources. In case the total family income is less than 1.20 lakh then he/she shall be eligible for financial assistance for full free ship.

**Ph.D in Journalism and Mass Communication**

The course is proposed to be designed, keeping in mind the demands of many media houses and other agencies who are on a look out for trained media researchers.

The council approved the same.

**Item No.S-39.4**

**Concession for the wards of the Kashmiri Migrants for admission during academic session 2012-13**

It was informed that Government of India, Ministry of Human Resources Development has written to the University vide No. 3-1/2012-NER dated 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2012 informing that kashmiri migrants continue to face hardships, it would be necessary to provide concessions to their admission for the coming academics session and requested that following concessions to the kashmiri migrant students in the matter of their admission in your institution during the academic session 2012-13.

- (1) Extension in date of admission by about 30 days.
- (2) Relaxation in cut off percentage upto 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- (3) Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course wise.
- (4) Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/professional institutions.
- (5) Waiving off domicile requirements.
- (6) Facilitation of migration in second and subsequent years.

The council noted the item. As the admission to such cases nominated by the Punjab Government and on the request of the members the chairman has decided to put up the case with Government to fill the vacant seat to such categories on the institution level also.

**Item No.S-39.5**

**Starting of MBA (Executive) at Training Centre of the International Tractors Limited.**

It was informed that a proposal has been received from the International Tractors Limited to start MBA (Executive) at Training Centre of the International Tractors Limited, Jalandhar Road, Hoshiarpur. A committee was constituted to look into the matter. The council has approved the recommendations of the committee to start the above programme.

1. Suggestion for the improvement in the admission to Management / Engg, programmers' in PTU affiliated.

2. Regarding eligibility condition for the admission in the M. Tech (Part time) Courses.

It was proposed that as per the existing eligibility criteria for the admission in M. Tech. course a candidate with 55% marks in B. Tech/ BE is eligibility in all the categories including SC/ ST candidates. But for the admission in the under graduate course, the eligibility criteria for the SC/ ST candidate is 5% less than the candidate in general category. Therefore the eligibility criteria for SC/ ST candidate in M. Tech admissions should be on the similar pattern as in B. Tech. courses.



Dean (Academics) informed the Council that as the notification regarding the same is under process and the matter will be taken up with the Technical Education department for consideration.

**3. 10% increase in the tuition fee may be allowed every year**

It was informed that every year there is an increase in the expenses of the institutions on account of DA, annual increment & inflation etc. and it was requested that 10% increase in the tuition fee may be allowed every year. This provision for increase of 10% in fee have been approved by Govt of Punjab vide letter no 13/81/92-4/1/8230 dated 30 nov, 1993/01dec 1993 and it is bring follow by Punjab Agriculture University, Every year.

Chairman informed that the meeting of the Finance Committee has been scheduled to be held on 16<sup>th</sup> March, 2012, therefore, this case may be taken up in Finance Committee meeting by Director (Finance).

**4. Initiation of academic audit scheme for benchmarking of the academics Programmes offered by the university**

The academic Audit has already been started and report of the same shall be uploaded on the website.

**5. The result of the students who apply for the revaluation are often declared after the scheduled date of the of the reappear examination these results should be declared on time**

Punjab Technical University is committed to work on translation & language. It is

propose to establish an R & D center in the university to work on research, development and propagation in the field of translation & language. There is a scope of machine translation, PG, M. Phil and Ph.D. in translation & language besides the manual translation in this R&D centre.

Council approved the same.

**(b) Conduct of Special examination for 8<sup>th</sup> semester reappear students**

Member informed the council that there are some cases where students have completed degree but get one re-appear in the end semester of the degree. Such students have to wait for six months to appear in the re-appear papers. Therefore it was proposed that a special examination may be conducted for last semester re-appear students only.

**AMENDMENTS IN REGULATIONS CONCERNING UNFAIR MEANS**

As approved by Board of Governors, PTU in its 46<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 16<sup>th</sup> April, 2012 the following amendments are made in the Chapter XVI of the University Regulations "PREVENTION, PUNISHMENT AND PROCEDURE CONCERNING CASES OF MISCONDUCT AND USE OF UNFAIR MEANS IN OR IN RELATION TO EXAMINATION". These amendments shall come into force from April/May-2012 and onward examinations of the university.

# MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 06.08.2012 REGARDING UPGRADATION OF STUDENTS AND CHANGE OF BRANCH THEREAFTER.

As per the regulations the procedure for upgradation is as under :

The following procedure shall be followed for upgradation of the branches of engineering within College/ Institute affiliated to PTU:

- 1 The upgradation shall be carried out prior to commencement of the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester and shall be on the basis of the result of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semesters.
- 2 Only those students who have passed all the subjects of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semesters can participate in the upgradation process.

Keeping in view the large number of vacant seats available in the colleges, the committee is of the opinion that the upgradation shall be called as **change of branch**.

The following procedure may be followed to change the branch within the college :

The Change of branch shall be carried out prior to commencement of the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester and shall be on the basis of the result of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semesters.

After exhausting all the pass students the merit for reappear students shall be as follows;

~~First~~ The merit of students having one reappear shall be considered on the basis of marks obtained in the pass subject. After exhausting one reappear students, the merit for students having two reappears should be made in similar way. The same procedure may be followed for students having 3 or more reappears.

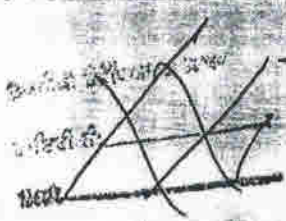

Established in April, 1957, it took over the work of the former All India Khadi and Village Industries Board. It functions under the administrative control of the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises, Govt. of India.

2. The broad objectives of KVIC are; The social objective of providing employment, the economic objective of producing saleable articles and the wider objective of creating self-reliance amongst the people and building up of a strong rural community spirit.

3. KVIC is promoting growth and development of Khadi and village Industries and its products, in cooperation with State Governments and other stake holders by providing support to existing entrepreneurs and encouraging creating of new enterprises.

4. It gives me pleasure to inform you that RSTM Nagpur University, has recently introduced "Bachelor Course in Khadi Production & Design" a three years full time degree course recognized by Ministry of Higher Technical Education, Govt. of Maharashtra and UGC.
